In order for hand washing to be truly effective in the spread of illnesses, it needs to be done correctly. Hands should be wet down with water and enough soap applied to cover all hand surfaces. All surfaces of the hand should them be rubbed together for at least 20 seconds, rinsed with water, dried with a single use towel and the water turned off with the towel. The entire process should take a minimum of 40 to 60 seconds. It is important to scrub in between your fingers, wash both thumbs and your fingertips, as well as, both top and palms of your hands. 




