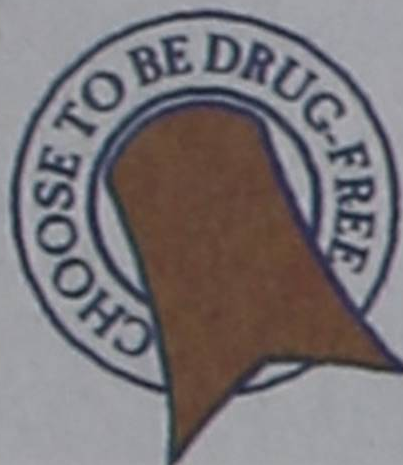

## Medicare enrollment program at PMC Nov 5

Parmer Medical Center is proud to announce their upcoming education program to be held November 5.

As most Medicare recipients are aware, open enrollment started October 15 and will end December 7. Medicare and its plans change every year, especially the prescription drug plans. Part D deals entirely with your prescription medications and although the plan you had for 2014 may have been ideal for your medications, that plan may have changed for 2015. By the time you realize your current plan is no longer the most ap-

propriate, open enrollment is over and no changes can be made on your Part D.

This program is being presented by Area Agency on Aging and they have the capability to review your medications and let you make an informed decision on which Part D plan is most appropriate for your medication needs.

The educational portion of the program will begin at 2:00 p.m. in the conference room at Parmer Medical Center and last

approximately one hour. Immediately following the program, the benefits counselors will stay to assist anyone with questions regarding the Part D plan.

The Area Agency on Aging serves as the advocate for the Panhandle's elderly population and is not an insurance company.

Parmer Medical Center and Area Agency on Aging want to assist individuals within our service area in making informed decisions regarding their

Medicare needs for 2015. Please bring your medication list, any insurance cards, including your Medicare card, and join us on November 5. The one hour program may have a significant impact on your prescription drug costs for the upcoming year.

trict. The Chiefs host Littlefield October 31 and travel to Childress to close out district November 7.

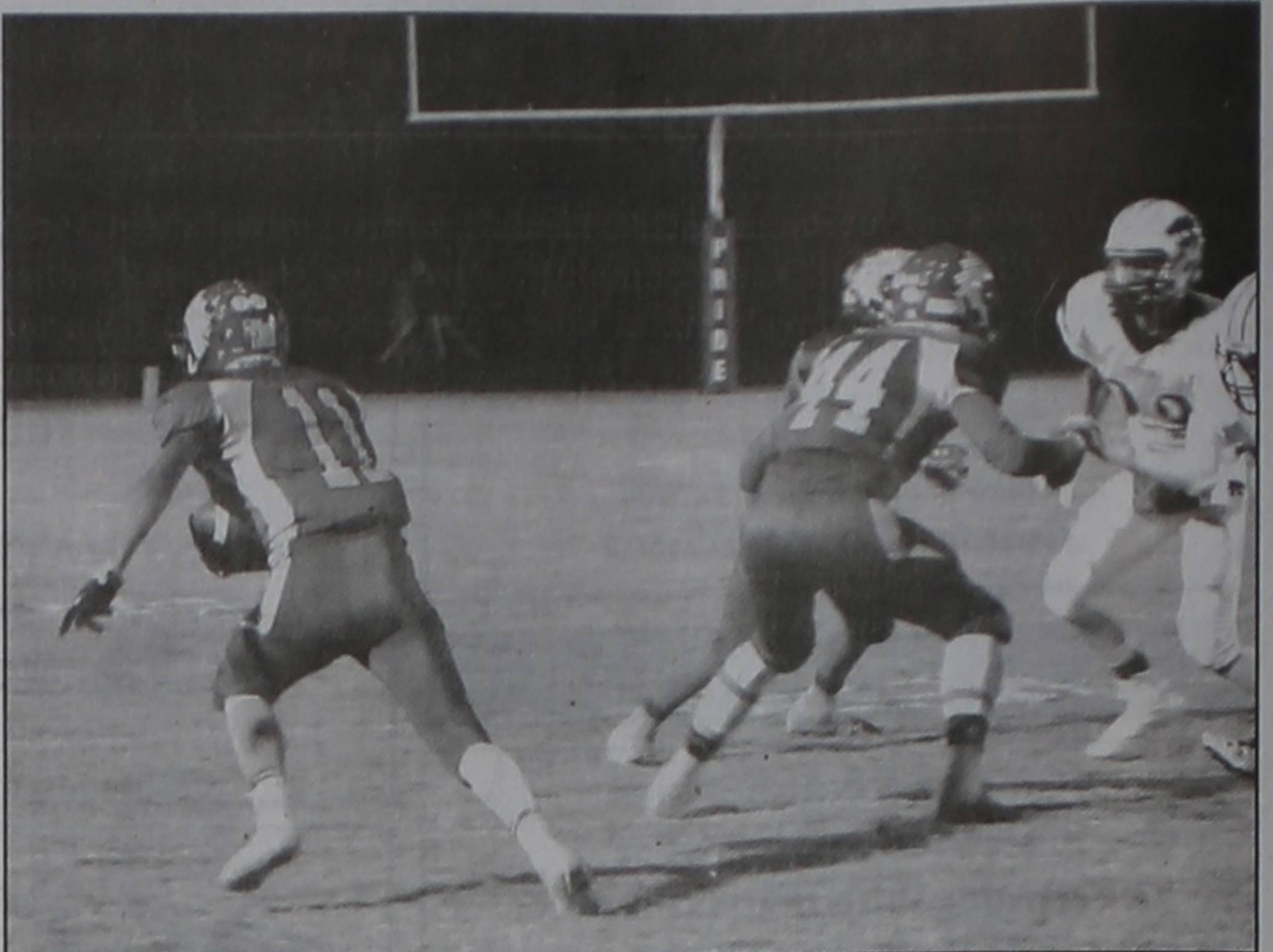

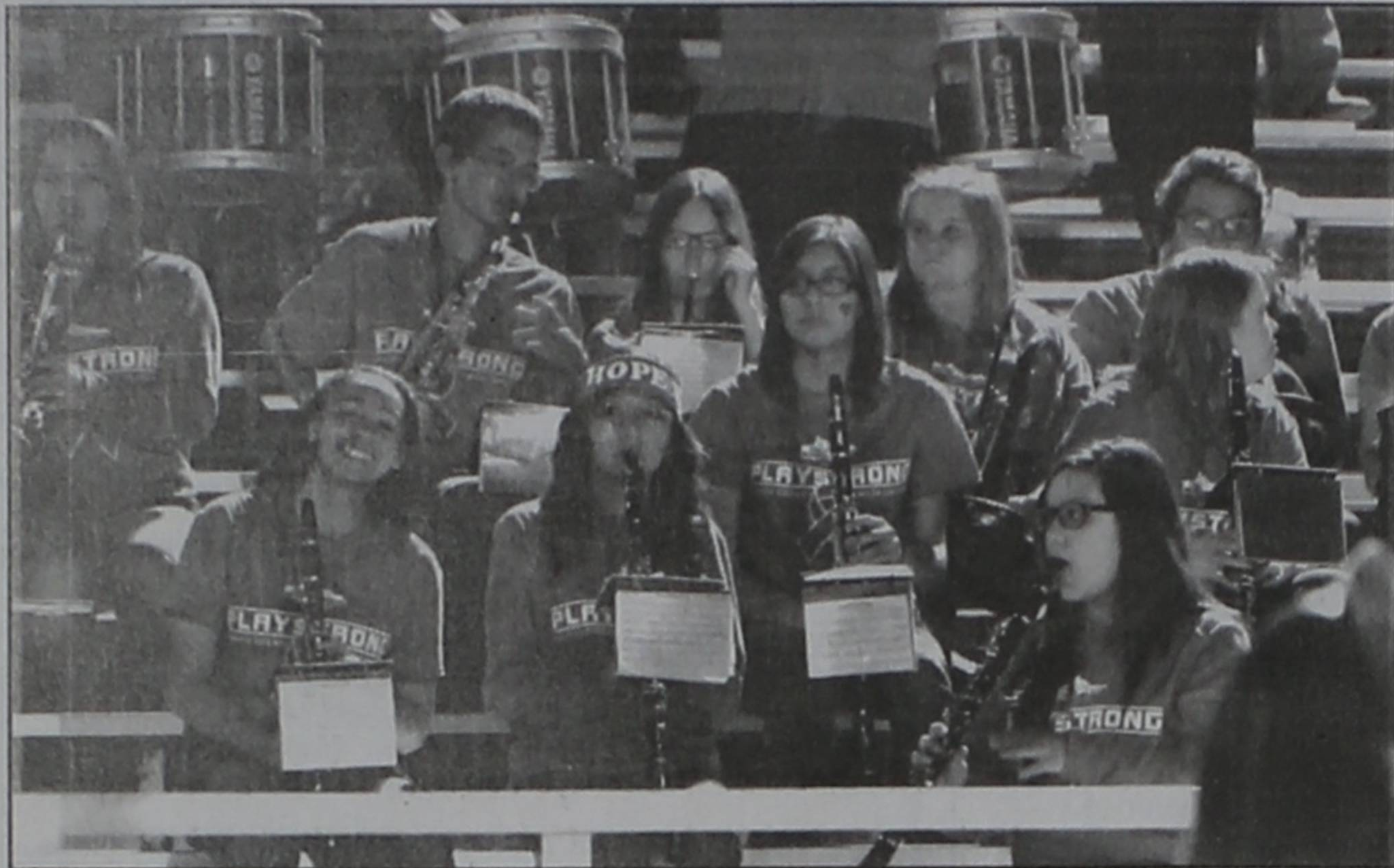
Guerrero was credited with 9 tackles, 5 solo, Antonio Adame had 8 tackles and Mason Mireles was credited with 7.5 tackles.

in district securing second place. Friona will play Sanford Fritch at Canyon High School Tuesday November 4 at 7:30 p.m. in the first round of the playoffs.

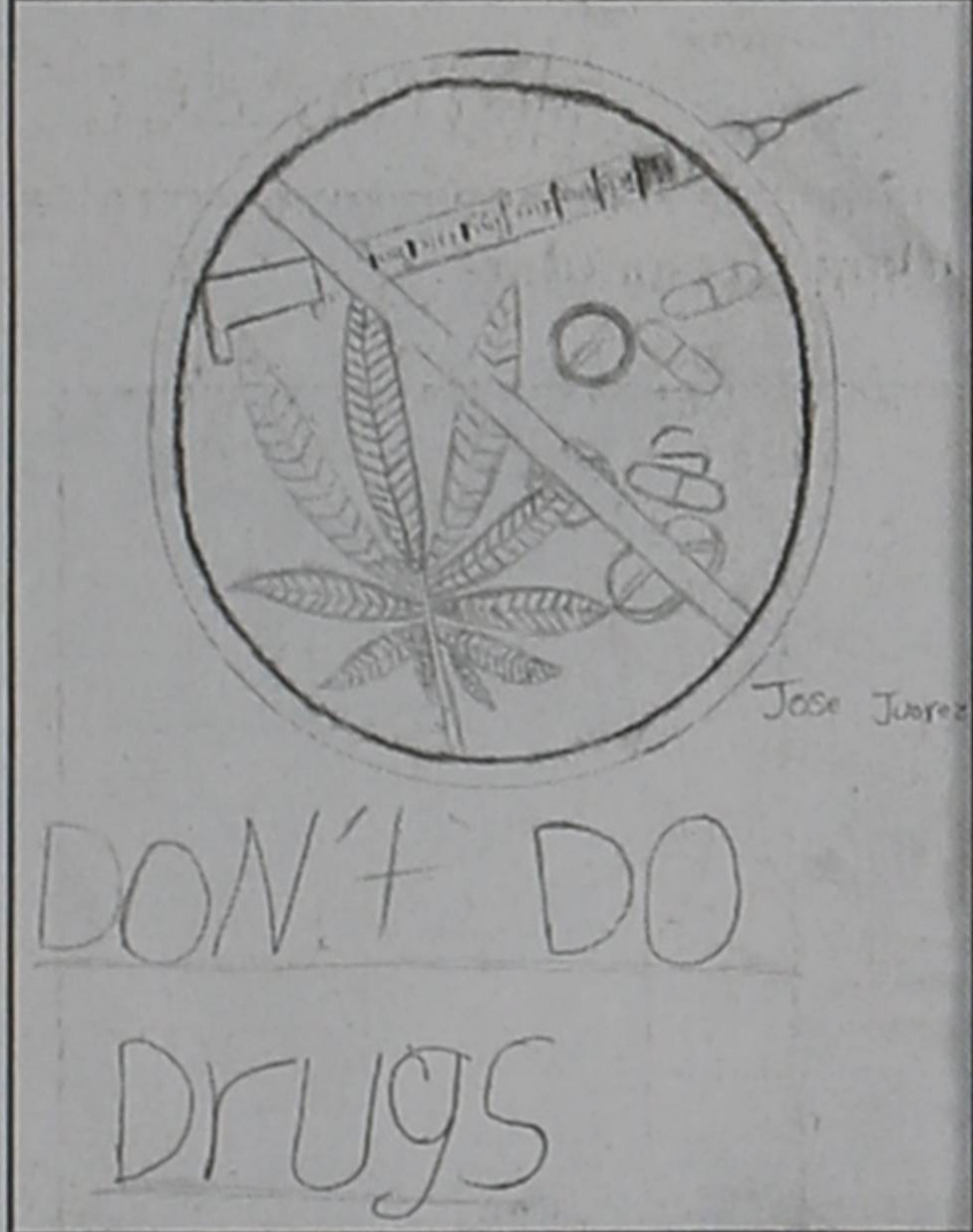

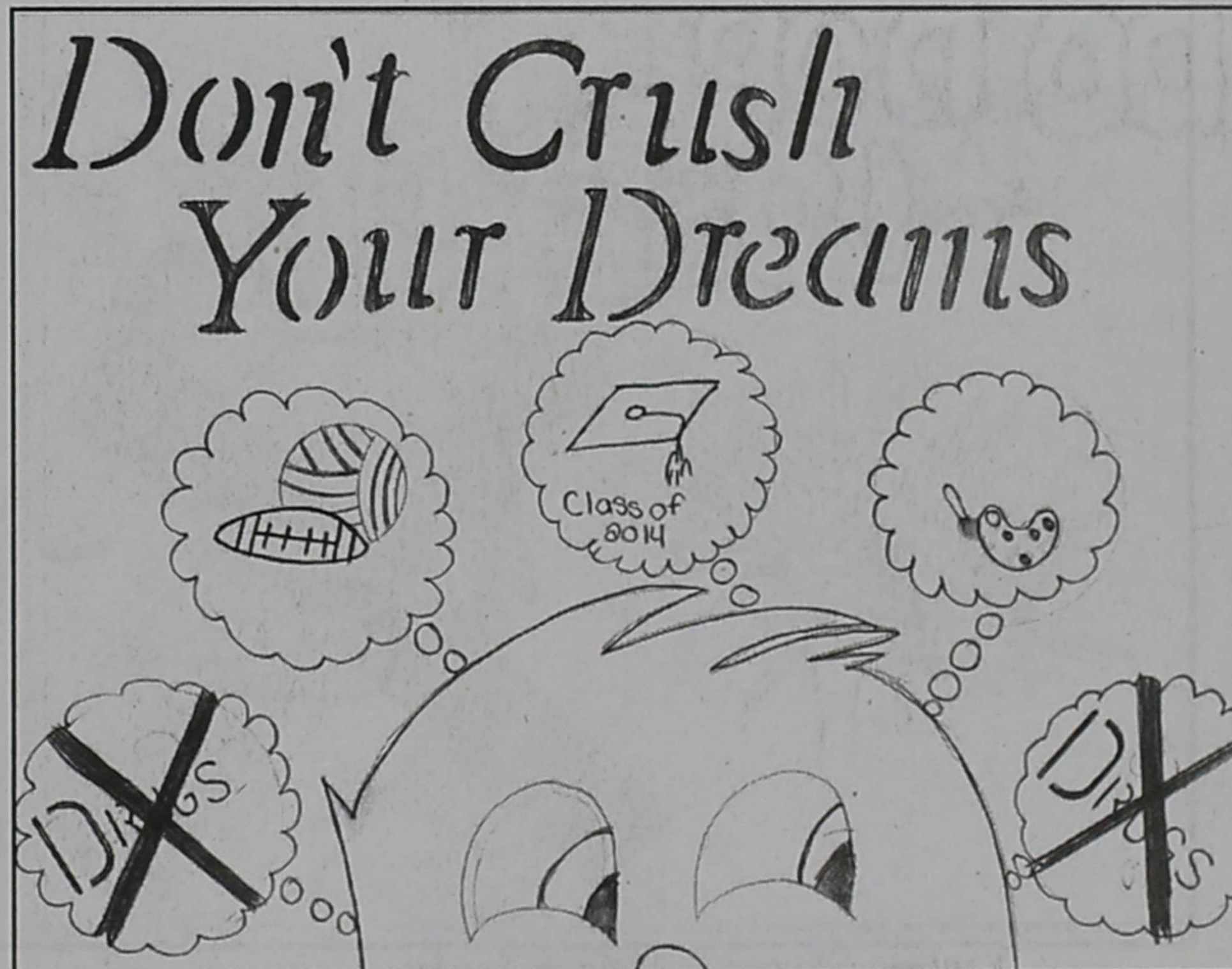
### Lazbuddie robotics qualifies for state

## Cover Your Cough

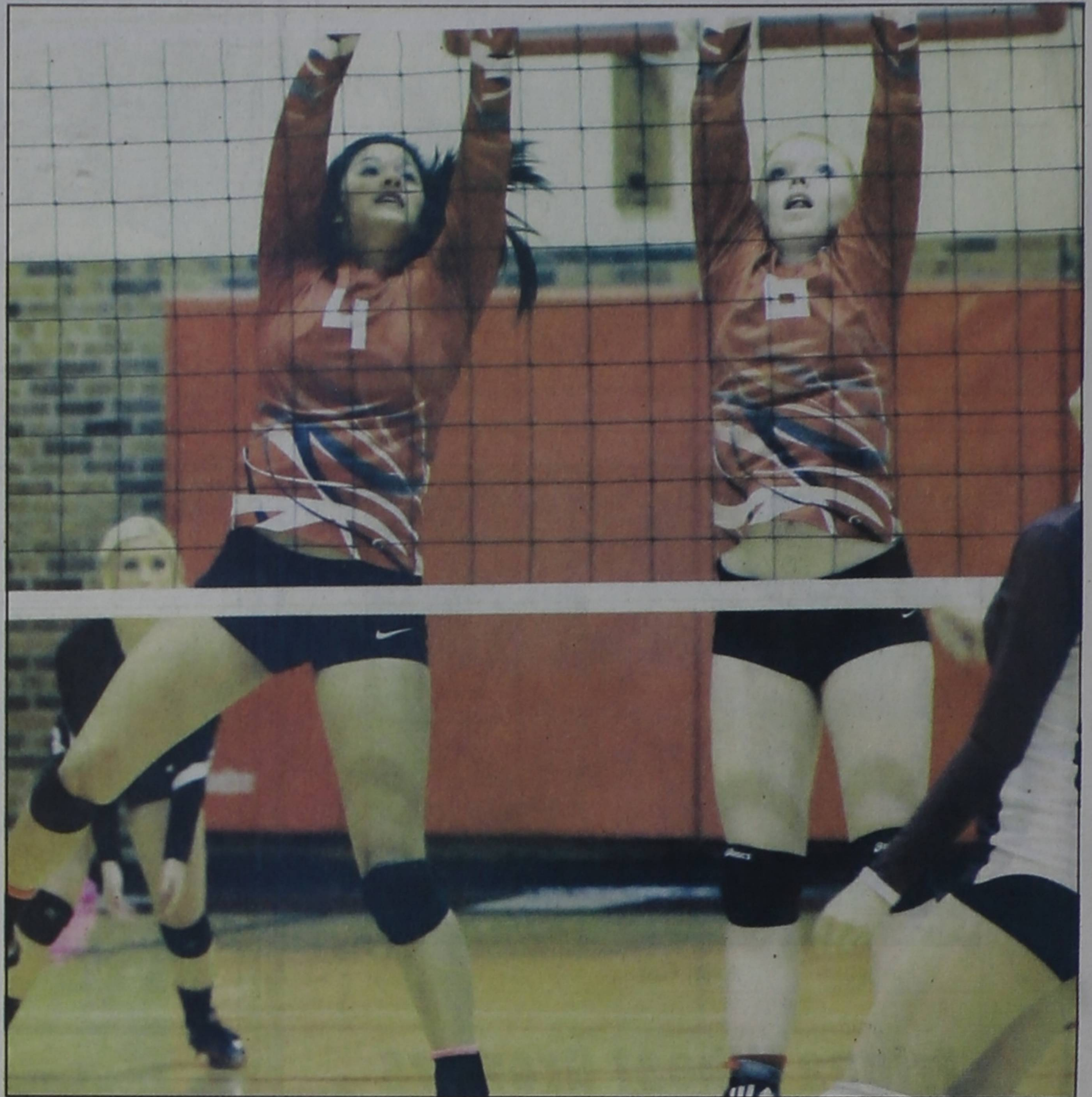

The flu (influenza), colds and other serious respiratory illnesses are spread by coughing, sneezing, or unclean hands. To help stop the spread of germs,

- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze.

Blood is often required to save the lives of accident victims, including auto accidents, industrial accidents and other traumas. A single accident victim can require as many as 100 units of blood.

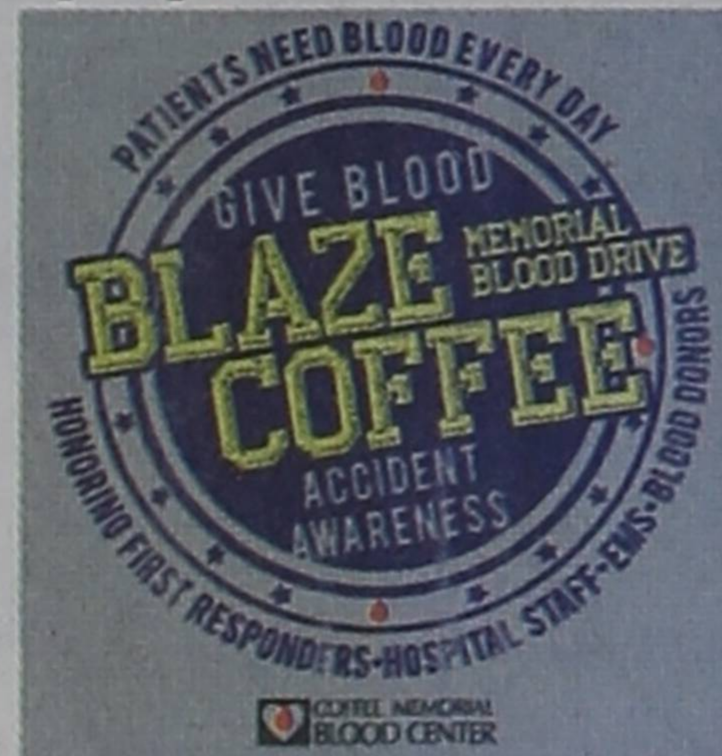
The blood used in an emergency is already available before an event occurs thanks to donors who give each day.
