Cover Your Cough

The flu (influenza), colds and other serious respiratory illnesses are spread by coughing, sneezing, or unclean hands. To help stop the spread of germs,

Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze.

Put your used tissue in the waste basket.

If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your upper sleeve or elbow, not your hands.

Wash your hands often with soap and warm water for 20 seconds.

If soap and water are not available, use an alcoholbased hand rub.

At the entrances to the clinic, hospital lobby, physical therapy entrance and the emergency department, you will find stations with masks and hand sanitizers. We appreciate all of the heroes who save lives each day. We thank them this month in memory of Blaze Coffee, a local young man who was in an industrial accident in 2009.




