The drop in Texas cotton acres is in response

ghum or wheat," said Robinson, noting the demand for corn is altering the number of planted acres for other commodities, thus changing the

ket contracts were trading above 60 cents early Friday.
"The market is still going to grind on and in the short term, there could be a price rally,"
