and possibly the whole country. A few of us have been doing me research on the diseases that come with the bird and found few that really got our attention such as the purple flu, in 1918 ,
which killed 500,000 in the United States and 50 million worldwide. This was related to a string of the bird influenza A. I have also ead on CNN about bird flu (avian influenza). It says bird flu has ed to the deaths of hundreds of millions of wild and domestic birds and to a small number of human deaths. Right now oowever, bird flu remains difficult for humans to contract. Most people who have developed symptoms have had close contact wih sick birds, though in a few cases, bird flu has passed from
one person to another. Health officials are concerned that a major bird flu outbreak could occur in humans if the virus mutates into a form that can
spread more easily from person to person. The grimmest scenario vould be a global outbreak to rival the flu pandemic of 1918 and 1919, which claimed millions of lives worldwide. For now, researchers are trying to develop a vaccine that would protect
