Welch, Reyes earn state track medals

A contingent of Friona fans was on hand last weekend at the state track meet in Austin to cheer on Dillon Welch and Juan Reyes. Dillon made his way to state in the discus and Juan qualified in the 400m run.

Both Chieftains brought home a medal. Dillon finished 2nd in the discus and earned a silver medal and Juan was 3rd in the

400m to bring home a bronze. Here is a report from Coach Rex Cumpton on the weekend:

"It was a great weekend at the state track meet on May 11-12. Friona High School and the community of Friona were represented well by the two young men we sent to the state track meet.

Juan Reyes placed 3rd in the

400 meters with a time of 49.73. This was not his best time of the year, but under the weather conditions it was outstanding (HOT & HUMID). This 3rd place finish put Juan on the medal stand.

Dillon Welch placed 2nd in the discus with a best throw of 164'1". This was not Dillon's best throw of the year but it

also placed him on the medal stand. Both of these young men did an outstanding job of competing at the highest level in the state.

They were going against the best of the best and were both able to finish in the elite top three. These two young men scored 14 points which placed

us 14th overall in the meet. Congratulations to them both. We are very proud of them."

On a side note, Dillon finished 2nd at the regional meet with a best throw of over 170 feet but lost to Sean Regan of Idalou who finished first with a throw of over 180 feet. Dillon got a little revenge at the state

meet though as he placed 2nd ahead of Regan who finished 3rd. Regan did win the state shot put title.

The Lubbock Avalanche-Journal Sunday May 13 edition had photos of Dillon and Idalou's Regan on the front of the sports section. Photos inside showed some of the Friona fans in attendance plus a shot of Dillon's "lucky socks". He wears a neon orange sock on his right foot and a neon green sock on his left after a classmate gave them to him before the state meet last year.

Welch is a junior and his goal is to bring home the gold medal next year. Reyes, a senior, completed an outstanding high school athletic career with his second trip to the state track meet. Congratulations to both boys, their coaches and parents.

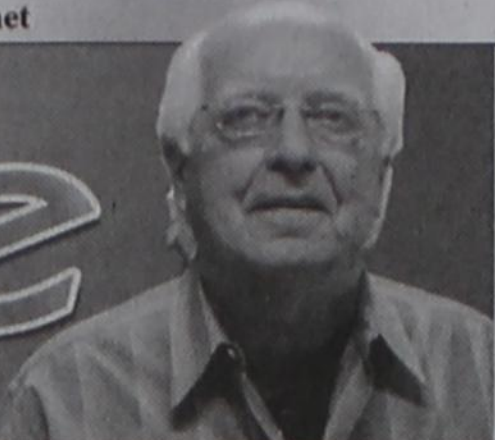

living the life of leviticus

14 If a man marries both a woman and her mother it is wicked. Both he and they must be burned in the fire.

20 If a man sleeps with his aunt he has dishonored his uncle. They will be held responsible, they will die childless.

Leviticus Chapter 20. You can look it up.

Probably wouldn't be the first chapter taught in an elective high school Bible class. Leviticus Chapter 20 is pretty straightforward and sort of brutal. I never realized the Lord required so many different folks and creatures be put to death.

In fact the Book of Leviticus seems to be pretty angry. Maybe it is just me.

Leviticus Chapter 20 Verse 13 is the famous and often disputed homosexual rule. If a man lies with a man he is to be put to death. Doesn't say who is supposed to do the killing though unless I missed that part.

Texas Representative Warren Chisum got part of his Bible in the classroom bill passed but it doesn't have any stickum to it as far as I can tell. The Bible course is not required.

Most schools who don't have

Bible as an elective already will not even think about starting the classes. Too many potential liabilities and budget problems. Ask a superintendent or school board member.

The issue of literal translation of the Bible has always been of curious interest to me. I've had plenty of debates along the way with literal translationists. I'm not one of them. People a lot smarter than me can quote passage after passage in the Bible that debunks the literal translation theory.

It works the other way too, although not as well. A literal translationist can debunk a lot of theories also.

I came across a column by Dave McNeely in last Saturday's Lubbock Avalanche-Journal titled, "Teaching the Bible in schools raises questions." Mr. McNeely is a former political columnist for the Austin American-Statesman.

I'm taking the liberty of reprinting his column here, with some paraphrasing and editing for length. You can draw your own conclusions and make your own arguments.

It may not happen but state Rep. Warren Chisum, R-Pampa, has proposed requiring that the Bible be taught in public

schools.

It probably won't happen but if it does, like some others before me, I've got some questions about parts of the Bible.

I don't have any problem with the Golden Rule (Luke 6:31). It seems sort of like common sense to treat others the way you'd like to be treated and I usually try to do that.

We've also talked about requiring the teaching of the Ten Commandments. But even though some believe in the inerrancy of scripture, I worry that, for example, ordering people not to covet their neighbor's house (Exodus 20:17) could seriously undermine the real estate business.

And I presume the prohibition against working on the Sabbath (Exodus 20:10) is well-intentioned. But it gets a bit harsh when Moses says anyone who does should be put to death (Exodus 35:2). If that indeed is correct, my question is whether we can just stone them or have to use some harsher method.

I wear trifocals but the Bible says I can't approach the altar of God if I have a defect in my sight (Leviticus 21:20) Would Lasik surgery qualify me for an altar approach? Most of my buddies get haircuts, including

the hair around their temples. But Leviticus 19:27 flatly says this is wrong.

My brother has a farm. He plants two different crops in the same field which I've told him is a clear violation of Leviticus 19:19.

I like raw oysters but a friend tells me eating shellfish is an abomination (Leviticus 11:10). However he says it is less of an abomination than homosexuality. Is he correct? Are there degrees of abomination?

I realize it is okay to sell my daughter into slavery, according to Exodus 21:7. I'm giving it serious thought because I need the money. But every time I mention it to either of my daughters they get really, really upset. Got any advice about what to do?

It's entirely possible that Bible study won't be required since other legislators want to water down Chisum's bill, including by requiring use of a textbook rather than the Bible, and letting local officials decide whether their school districts will offer the courses at all.

But if they do, I hope a good teacher can help clear up some of these nagging questions sure to come up in classrooms.

Neugebauer Votes For Drought Relief

Congressman Randy Neugebauer voted for legislation that would provide drought relief for America's agriculture producers.

"Farmers and ranchers in the 19th District and throughout America bore the brunt of a devastating drought in 2005 and 2006," said Neugebauer. "The losses were widespread, and many producers were left with no crops in the field at harvest time. A drought relief package is much needed and long overdue."

Under this legislation, H.R. 2207, producers would be able to choose to be compensated for either the 2005 or 2006 crop year (but not both) as long as they purchased crop insurance for that year.

Eligible farmers must have suffered a 35 percent loss to apply for assistance, and the payment would be 50 percent of the price. Finally, the combination of income from crop receipts, crop insurance, and disaster assistance could not exceed 95 percent of what the value of the crop would have been without a loss.

While the House considered the drought relief bill separately from war funding legislation, a special rule calls for the two bills to be rolled into one package before being sent to the Senate.

However, Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid (D-Nev.) has stated he is not likely to follow this approach. In addition, President Bush has indicated that he opposes the war funding portion of

the bill because it only provides resources for U.S. troops in Iraq for two months.

"I am pleased to vote for this drought relief today, but this flawed process is not moving us any closer to the ultimate goal of getting relief to our agriculture producers," said Neugebauer. "I will continue to push for drought relief until a package is signed into law."

H.R. 2207 passed the House by a vote of 302-120.

Private property saved America

Four hundred years ago 105 men and boys disembarked from three ships and established the first permanent English settlement in North America. They built a fort along what they called the James River, in honor of their king.

The land was lush and fertile, yet within three years most of the colonists died during what came to be known as the starving time. Only the establishment of private property saved the Jamestown colony.

What went wrong? There were the usual hardships of pioneers far from home, such as unfamiliar diseases. There were mixed relations with the Indians already living in Virginia. Sometimes the Indians and settlers traded, other times armed conflicts broke out. But according to a governor of the colony, George Percy, most of the colonists died of famine, despite the good and fruitful soil, the abundant deer and turkey, and the strawberries, raspberries and fruits unknown growing wild.

The problem was the lack of private property. As Tom Bethell writes in his book, 'The Noblest Triumph: Property and Prosperity through the Ages', 'The colonists were indolent because most of them were indentured servants, expected to toil for seven years and contribute the fruits of their labor to the common store.' Understandably, men who don't benefit from their hard work tend not to work very hard.

Over the first two years, more colonists arrived from England, including women. By 1609, there were 500 settlers. And within six months fewer than 100 were still alive. People were desperate. They ate dogs and cats, then rats and mice. They apparently ate their deceased neighbors. And some said that one man murdered and ate his pregnant wife.

By the spring, they had given up. They abandoned the fort and boarded ships to return to England. But miraculously, as they sailed out of Chesapeake Bay, they encountered three ships with new recruits, so they turned around and tried to make another go of it. The additional settlers and supplies kept them alive.

But when a new governor, Thomas Dale, arrived a year after the starving time, he was shocked to find the settlers bowling in the streets instead of working.

Dale's most important reform was to institute private property. He allotted every man three acres of land and freed them to work for themselves. And then, the Virginia historian Matthew Page Andrews wrote, "As soon as the settlers were thrown upon their own resources, and each free man had acquired the right of owning property, the colonists quickly developed what became the distinguishing characteristic of Americans, an aptitude for all kinds of craftsmanship coupled with an innate genius for experimentation and invention."

John Rolfe, the husband of Pocahontas, said that once private property was instituted, men could engage in gathering and reaping the fruits of their labors with much joy and comfort. The Jamestown colony became a success, and people from all over Europe flocked to America.

Private property is essential for economic growth; people don't work and invest if they can't reap the fruits of their labors. Property ensures that people will work to better their own condition and that of their families. And that work and investment then benefits the whole society, much more so

than the attempt to force people to work directly for the common good.

But property does something else. As the American Revolutionary Arthur Lee, great-grandson of a Jamestown colonist, wrote, "The right of property is the guardian of every other right, and to deprive a people of this, is in fact to deprive them of their liberty." Property is essential to making the government dependent on the people, not vice versa. It divides power, limits government,

and protects freedom. No country has ever enjoyed freedom of the press, freedom of religion, or political liberty without secure property rights.

So, on this 400th anniversary, let us remember the original Jamestown settlers, who demonstrated the failure of collectivism. Their suffering during the starving time did more than any book could have done to lay a secure foundation for private property rights and thus for the freedom and prosperity we enjoy today.

Big news for Bovina.....!

According to a story in the Farwell newspaper, the Bovina City Council heard a report at their meeting last week from developer Jerry Spicola, Jr. who plans to purchase 190 acres and build 150 homes and a few businesses along Highway 60.

Spicola plans to partner with Bruce and Patty Hartline of Muleshoe on the project. The tract of land, to be purchased from Don Fortenberry, is bordered on the east by Western Street, on the north by CR1381, and Highway 60 on the south.

The report stated businesses built along Highway 60 could include a truck wash, major truck stop, general store, restaurant, and supermarket. The homes will be 1500 to 1800 square feet and affordable, Spicola told the council. The city would need to annex the property to the city and run water lines to the property.

Spicola has purchased a home in Bovina and is said to spend part of his time in Bovina and the rest in Florida. He recently purchased the former Baker Furniture building on Highway 60 in Friona which is now for rent.

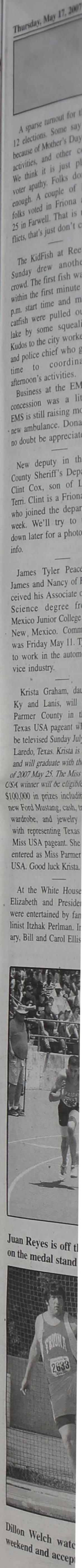

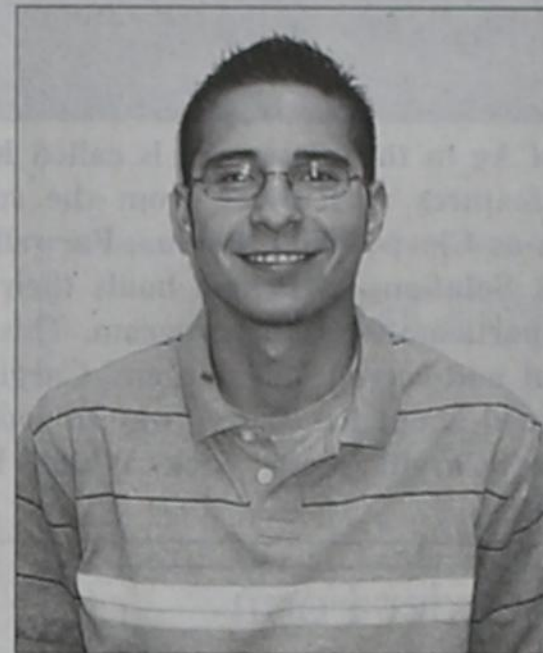
one year then started working. She worked part time at K-Bob's in Durango and became assistant manager.

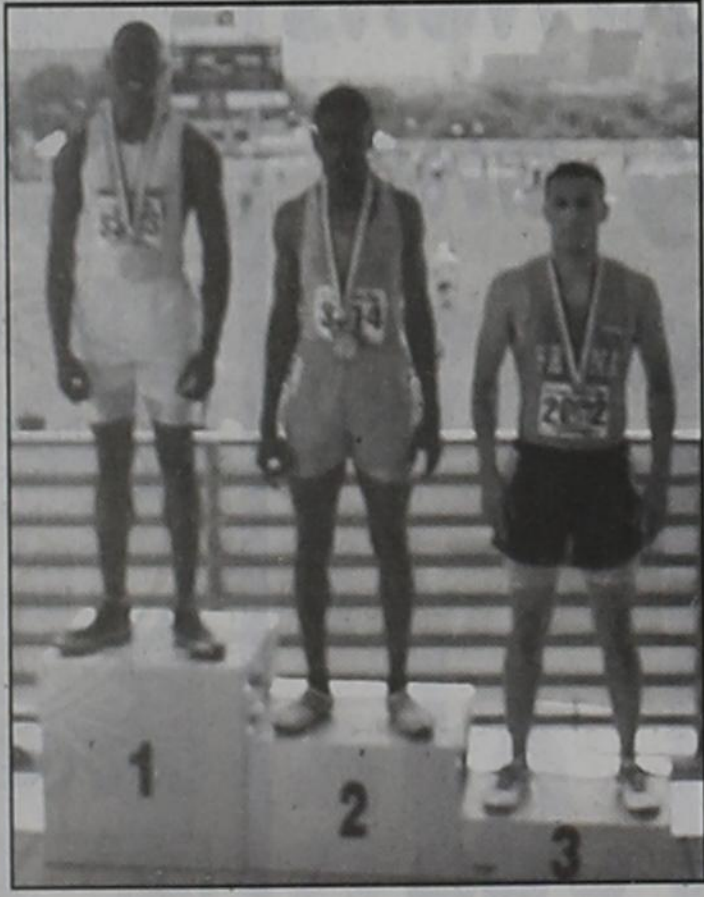

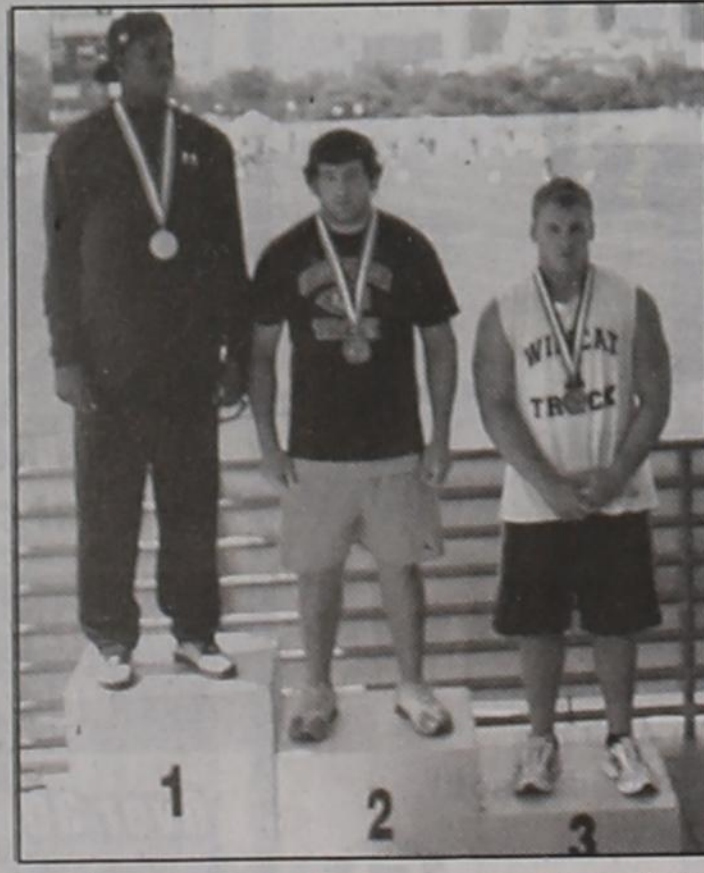
Juan Reyes is off the starting blocks in the 400m run at the state track meet and on the medal stand accepting his bronze medal.

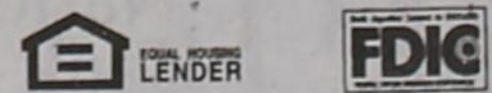

County sales tax revenue

Texas Comptroller Susan Combs announced the state collected \$1.7 billion in sales tax revenue in April, up 10.3 percent compared to April 2006.

"Sales tax revenue continues to show steady growth," Combs said. "This is true at both the state and local levels, and it indicates that our Texas economy is in good health."

May sales tax allocations to local governments represent March sales that were reported to the Comptroller in April by monthly tax filers and January, February and March sales reported to the Comptroller in April by quarterly filers.

Parmer County's May 2007 payment totaled \$53,365.22, broken down as Bovina \$10,297.10; Farwell \$7,631.88; and Friona \$35,436.24. In May 2006 the tax payment total was \$51,178.70.

Comparing tax receipts from the same period last year, payments were up 4.27%, broken down as Bovina up 4.97%; Farwell down -9.50%; and Friona up 7.59%.

For the year, Parmer County cities have received a total of \$206,866.02 as compared to 205,289.22 for the same period last year, a 0.76% change.

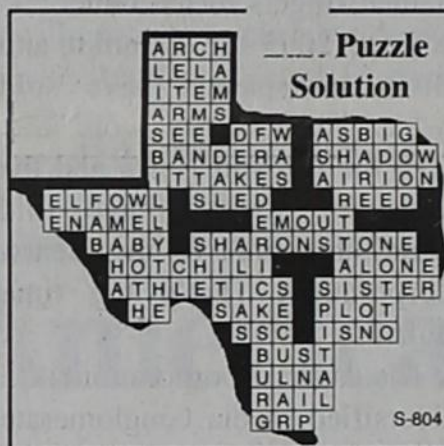

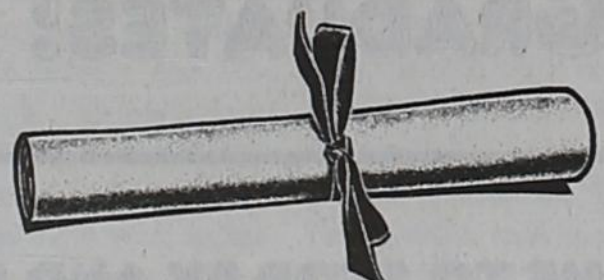

Think about this

God's will for our lives

BY T. LEON TALLEY, Sixth Street Church of Christ

Through God's Word, we have an opportunity to look into the mind of God. To know what God thinks. We can gain God's perspective on what He wants for our lives. What does He want? I Thessalonians 4 has some answers (read vs. 1-8). This text is an affront to the lifestyle of many, even some who profess to be Christians. In this text, Paul states that it is God's will that the Christian be "sanctified". That means, be different, set apart from the world. Then Paul specifies what that means.

It means we "avoid sexual immorality". Sexual immorality satisfies the person's own lusts. But, someone who is trying to follow Christ remembers that they are living to please God, not themselves.

It means that we should "learn to control our own body in a way that is holy and honorable". To set apart our bodies for God, we must practice what God wants us to do. Some people allow their sexual activity to be guided only by what they want or by what everyone else is doing, or by community standards.

There are more instructions in this passage that identify God's will for our lives, but the point is: We must decide to be on God's side. God has called us for a reason and that reason is to be Holy (v. 7).

God calls us today through the gospel, the living, breathing Word of God (note: Hebrews 4:12-13; II Thessalonians 2:14).

The question is, are we listening?

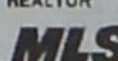



Every month, a resident of Prairie Acres Nursing Home or Friona Heritage Estates, writes a story about his/her life's history for the home's newsletter, "The Prairie Times", for printing in this issue. This month we feature Geraldine Feriar Taylor.

I was born January 11, 1917 in Killen, Texas to John Barton and Sallie McFarland. There were 6 girls and 4 boys. I was second to youngest. One of our neighbors named me after a famous opera singer.

There were so many kids that we had all kinds of games to play. We had to milk the cows by hand. The boys did most of the milking, but we girls had to help sometimes.

In 1925, we moved to Friona where Daddy farmed and had some cattle. There wasn't a hospital when we moved there, so Daddy and my sister, Lora Mae, canvassed the town to collect money to get one started at the old Army barracks. After Daddy died, Mother gave money to build on the McFarland wing at the hospital.

I went to school and graduated from Friona. When I graduated I went to Texas Tech where I got a Bachelor Business Administration Degree. I taught school for three years after I got out of college.

I came back to Friona and married George C. Taylor. He enlisted in the Navy, and later, was attached to the Marines. He was sent back after he was wounded and received a Purple Heart.

In 1943 we had our first child, Suzanne Taylor Wood, who lives in Pampa. Then we later had our second child Lisa Kathryn, who lives in Austin. I have five grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. I taught for one year in Friona. I taught typing, bookkeeping and all that stuff. I've been living at Heritage Estates since March 2007.
