## Austrian election

Waldheim falls short of absolute majority

VIENNA, Austria (AP) - Voters narrowly denied
Kurt Waldheim an absolute majority in an election Kurt Walaheim an absolute majority in an election forcing the former U.N. chief into a runoff election for he Austrian presidency.
Waldheim received 49.64 percent of the votes Sun day, just 16,746 ballots short of absolute majority he
needed. He will face socialist $K u r t ~ S t e y r e r ~ i n ~ t h e ~ J u e ~$ ${ }_{8}$ needed. He will face socialist Austria's first such election since 1951. Of the $5,436,726$ eligible voters, 89.5 percent cas allots. Waldheim, who was U.N. secretary-genera rom 1972 to 1981, received $2,343,387$ votes. Steyre Both candidates agreed that Waldheim, candidate of
the center-conservative People's Party, had been aid the center-conservative People's Party, had been aid-
ed by sympathy votes from people who thought he was being victimized by foreign accusers.
The World Jewish Congress in March publicized the first in a series of accusations: that Waldheim was
enrolled in Nazi youth groups, that he knew of deporta tions of Greek Jews from the Balkans and that he was connected to a trocities against Yugoslav partisans and

"We have one (sensitive) report that indicates we
are spending $\$ 10-\$ 12$ billion more than we would
have to if relations with Iran were normal," he said.

that Iranians in general, and even mainstream Shiites for that matter, are not as viscerally anti-
