

## DPS on patrol over Thanksgiving

As Thanksgiving travelers hit the roadways, all available Texas Highway Patrol troopers will be looking for drivers who are endangering themselves and others by breaking traffic laws. Troopers are participating in Operation CARE— Combined Accident Reduction Effort—a nationwide effort by police agencies to reduce fatalities on major interstate highways during holiday weekends.

A few of the violations that troopers will be looking for are speeding, driving while intoxicated and drivers and passengers who are not wearing safety belts or who do not have children buckled in safely.

During the Wednesday through Sunday Thanksgiving period last year, DPS troopers wrote 16,794 citations for speeding and 607 for driving while intoxicated, plus 41 for minors driving under the influence. They also wrote 2,390 citations for seatbelt violations and 282 for child restraint violations. DPS has a no-warnings policy for seat belt and child restraint violations.

"DPS wants all drivers on Texas roads to have a safe Thanksgiving holiday," said Col. Thomas A. Davis, Jr., director of the DPS. "Highway Patrol troopers will be out in force to remind drivers that in order to arrive safely at their destination, they should follow Texas traffic laws by driving sober, not speeding, and remembering to buckle up."

DPS expects a large number of travelers on the road and encourages drivers to leave themselves plenty of time to get where they're going. Avoid bad driving habits that lead to

- road rage, such as:
- \* Not using turn signals \* Driving in the passing lane
- \* Tailgating, flashing lights or honking
- \* Using high beams in traffic
- \* Not allowing adequate time for a given trip When confronted with aggressive drivers, the DPS recommends that you:
- \* Put your pride in the back seat and move aside. \* Do not speed up, block lanes, slam or tap on brakes.
- \* Report extreme cases of reckless driving to the appropriate authorities when the incident occurs.
- \* Do not retaliate, gesture or make eye contact. \* Make sure everyone is buckled up.

### An interesting holiday side dish

If you have a vegetarian in your holiday gathering, I found another out-of-the-ordinary recipe you could try. This one was in the USA Weekend magazine supplement in Sunday's Amarillo Globe News. Maybe you saw it. They called it an interestingly different side dish. I would call it a weird combination. But then I like blue cheese. Not everyone does.

A lady named Nigella Lawson who hosts Nigella Express Sundays at 10:30 a.m. on the Food Network came up with this dish. They say it will serve 6 but that depends on how many blue cheese lovers you have in the family. Good luck.

Sweet Potatoes with Pecans and Blue Cheese

4 ½ pounds sweet potatoes, unpeeled, cut into 1-inch cubes 3 Tbs. olive oil

6 sprigs fresh thyme (or ½ tsp. dried).

1 cup crumbled Roquefort or other blue cheese Preheat oven to 425 degrees

Combine sweet potatoes and oil in a roasting pan; sprinkle with leaves from 4 thyme sprigs. Roast for 30-45 minutes or

Transfer the sweet potatoes to a serving bowl. Gently toss with pecans and cheese. Salt and pepper to taste. Garnish with remaining thyme sprigs. Serves 6.


We had our amendment voting last Tuesday. It was a very low turn out. Precinct 101 had 118 to vote.





#### November sales tax results

The state collected \$1.65 billion in sales tax in October, up 3.1 percent compared to October 2006.


"This increase is less than the growth seen in recent months, but it is an increase over exceptional October 2006 collections," Texas Comptroller Susan Combs said. "The lower growth rate is a reflection of a general easing of sales activity, most noticeable in the retail trade sector, and is consistent with a slowing economy."

October state sales tax collections and November sales tax allocations to local governments represent September sales reported to the Comptroller in October by monthly tax filers and July, August and September sales reported to the Comptroller in October by quarterly tax filers.

Parmer County's November 2007 payment totaled \$44,829.48 broken down as Bovina \$7,460.02; Farwell \$7,952.39; and Friona \$29,417.07. In November 2006 the tax payment total was \$41,817.26.

Comparing tax receipts from the same period last year, payments were up 7.20%, broken down as Bovina up 4.03%; Farwell down -15.37%; and Friona up 16.50%.

For the year, Parmer County cities have received a total of \$444,188.08 as compared to \$441,811.90 for the same period last year, a 0.53% change.


## Three FHS students make all-region choir




