They provided traffic control around the area, on-site security, safety supervisors, a kitchen trailer that provided breakfast, lunch, and dinner, and shuttle service from downtown to the city's RV park at Reeve Lake.

1 1/2 cups Smucker's Natural Creamy Peanut Butter

You'll need toothpicks and waxed paper too.

1/2 cup butter or margarine, softened

1 tsp vanilla ½ tsp salt

3-4 cups confectioners sugar.

Coating:

1 lb chocolate flavor candy coating

2 tbsp Crisco shortening

1. Combine peanut butter, butter, vanilla and salt in large bowl. Beat at low speed until blended. Add two cups sugar and beat until blended.

2. Continue adding ½ cup sugar at a time until mixture shaped into ball will hold onto toothpick. Shape into 34 inch balls, place on tray, chill.

3. For coating, combine candy coating and Crisco into microwave safe bowl.

4. Microwave at 50% for 30-seconds. Stir. Repeat until mixture is smooth. Insert toothpick into candy ball. Dip threefourths of ball into melted coating. Scrape off excess.

5. Place on waxed paper lined tray. Remove toothpick. Smooth over holes. Refrigerate until coating is firm then remove from paper. Store at room temperature in covered container.

Cream of Peanut Soup

Makes 8 servings

1/2 cup chopped onion 1/2 cup chopped carrot

½ cup chopped celery

2 tbsp butter or margarine 14 cup all-purpose flour

2- 12 1/2 oz cans chicken broth

1- 12 1/2 oz can vegetable broth

1 cup Smucker's Natural Chunky Peanut Butter 1/2 cup half and half

Cook onion, carrot, and celery in butter over heat in medium saucepan until tender. Stir in flour, mix well. Add chicken broth and vegetable broth; stir until thickened.





DPS crime labs receive international accreditation

The 13 Texas Department of Public Safety crime laboratories have received international accreditation, the most difficult accreditation to attain.

The DPS laboratory system is the largest internationally accredited system in the program. Only three other state police laboratories in the United States have received the international rating: Oregon, Utah, and Idaho. Including the 13 DPS labs, only 55 labs in the United States have achieved this level of accreditation.

The laboratories were awarded the international accreditation-which provides the highest set of standards for which a forensic laboratory can be accredited-after a stringent evaluation process that lasted several years.

The accreditation means that the American Society of Crime Laboratory Directors/Laboratory Accreditation Board recognizes the DPS labs as meeting both the ISO 17025 standards for testing and calibration laboratories, as well as supplemental requirements for forensic-testing laboratories. The accreditation lasts for five years, with annual surveillance inspections performed each year for the next four years.

The DPS laboratories are located in Austin, Garland, Houston, El Paso, Waco, Corpus Christi, McAllen, Tyler, Lubbock, Midland, Abilene, Amarillo and Laredo. "We are proud that the accreditation organization recognized the high level of professionalism in all of our crime labs," said Col. Thomas A. Davis, Jr., director of the DPS. "Gaining this honor took a lot of hard work by hundreds of DPS employees-and keeping the accreditation will take even more hard work. We are ready for the challenge."







I have an important amendment, for example, that would make combating childhood obesity a priority in the largest Agriculture Department expenditure-the food stamp program. When we are spending \$190 billion on nutrition, we have an obligation to ensure we are not pushing unhealthy diets on young people and increasing obesity-related health risks.

There are other problems with the bill that affect Texas. One provision would dramatically increase federal regulation of the livestock industry by prohibiting meat processors from owning or controlling stock until only a few days before slaughter.

Texas ranchers have worked hard to create some of the best stock our country has to offer, including the highly sought-after Santa Gertrudis breed. As a result, they often enter into contracts with feeders and processors earning higher prices. I do not believe the federal government should dictate how our ranchers can sell their products.

Even so, this farm bill promises continuity in a vital segment of our economy. Our recent farm policies have brought stability to Texas agriculture, lower prices to consumers, nutritional assistance to many, and vastly increased exports. We should continue that winning formula.

THE CHIEF'S CORNER

Animals at Large

There are certain requirements that animal owners must meet in order to have animals in the city limits of Friona.

According to City Ordinance Section 2.103:

a. It shall be unlawful for any dog or other animal possessed, kept harbored to run at large.

b. No owner shall possess, harbor or keep more than a total of deje corer por donde quiera. four (4) dogs and cats over the age of four (4) months, and or ten a kennel, cattery or veterinary facility.

c. FIERCE, DANGEROUS, OR VICIOUS DOGS. The owner shall confine within a building or secure enclosure, every fierce, danenclosure unless the dog is securely muzzled.

d. Every female dog or cat in season shall be confined in a bozal. building or a secure enclosure or a veterinary hospital or boarding contact with it except for controlled breeding purposes.

e. The supervisor of animal control or any animal control officer propositos de enjendrarlos. acting under his direction is authorized to impound such animals certain conditions.

The definition for running at large, means not completely otras condiciones. confined by a building, wall or fence of sufficient strength or construction to restrain the animal, except when such animal is on a secured leash or chain, not more than 20 feet in length, or held property.

If you keep and feed an animal for a period of seven (7) days propiedad. or allow an animal to remain on or about your premises for ten days, you will be considered the owner of such animal.

The fine for having an animal at large is approximately \$140.00. This includes the fine and court costs. 
