

### **Hill Country Salsa**

1 can (15 oz) black beans, drained & rinsed. 1 can (11 oz) sweet kernel corn, drained.

- 4 lg tomatoes, chopped
- 1 avocado, peeled & chopped
- 1 lg green pepper chopped
- 6 green onions chopped
- 1 lg jalapeno diced
- 1/4 cup fresh cilantro chopped
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup fresh lime juice
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 tsp salt
- 2 tsp ground cumin

Combine all ingredients in a large bowl and toss gently. Cover & chill. Serve with baked tortilla chips. Thanks to Angie Shriver of the Pedernales Electric Cooperative for this salsa recipe.


