



Panhandle Texas Master Naturalist training scheduled

The Panhandle Chapter of Texas Master Naturalists will launch a new session of training this spring and is seeking applicants for the classes that will be conducted from February through April.

An open house for prospective members will be held Saturday, February 7, from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Southwest Library in Amarillo. Those attending will have a chance to meet Panhandle Chapter members and view a slide show of TMN activities in the region.

The Texas Master Naturalist program is cosponsored by the Texas Parks & Wildlife Department and Texas AgriLife Extension and has 39 chapters across the state. Training topics include interpretation and management of natural resources, ecological concepts, eco-regions of Texas and natural systems management.

Volunteers are expected to give 40 hours of service a year in community education, demonstration, and habitat enhancement projects, and are also expected to pursue a minimum of eight hours of advanced training each year in areas of personal interest.

Training sessions for the Panhandle Chapter this spring will include five Saturday sessions from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. at various BOVINA. Panhandle sites, plus seven Thursday instruction periods from 6:30 to 9 p.m. Dates for training in 2009 are February 28, March 5, 7, 12, 26, and 28, and April 2, 4, 16, 23, 25, and 30.



However, writing fiction was a hobby for Haines and one he planned to pursue once he retired. His first mystery novel "Orphan" is now in publication and receiving accolades across the country.







Trooper shot in traffic stop

A DPS Trooper working patrol in Hartley County Sunday January 18 stopped a green 1994 Lincoln with New Mexico registration for a traffic violation.

The vehicle was traveling south on U.S. 385. The traffic stop was at 2:15 p.m. The Lincoln pulled into a café parking lot with the Trooper's vehicle behind. When the Trooper exited his patrol car the driver also exited his vehicle and shot the Trooper in his lower leg. The passenger also exited the vehicle and ran.

The Trooper returned fire striking the driver nine times according to a report in the Amarillo Globe-News. Hartley County deputies arrived on scene and treated the Trooper's wound. He was transported by ambulance to the Dalhart Hospital where he was treated and released.

The driver, 21-year-old Sabino Gardea of Clayton, New Mexico, was pronounced dead at the scene at 2:30 p.m. The passenger, 24-year-old Steven Vigil of Clayton, was apprehended in an abandoned house in Channing. He was wanted on felony warrants out of New Mexico and is being charged with attempted capital murder, evading arrest, and failure to identify fugitive from justice.

The Trooper, who was not identified in the press release, was put on 3-day leave with pay which is standard DPS procedure in this type incident.

Pre-plant soil moisture survey underway

Personnel from the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District No. 1 and the U.S. Department of Agriculture-Natural Resources Conservation Service (USDA-NRCS) are now gathering data for their annual joint pre-plant soil moisture survey.

High Plains Water District and USDA-NRCS personnel use moisture meters to gather data at more than 200 permanently-installed soil moisture monitoring sites within the district's 15-county service area.

Readings are taken at six-inch intervals throughout the five-foot soil profile by lowering a probe into an aluminum access tube at the site. These data are later processed to calculate the moisture level in the soil (available moisture) and how much moisture the soil can still hold for plant use (deficit moisture). Maps are constructed illustrating the location of soil moisture monitoring sites within the district and the crop type, irrigation application method, and amount of soil moisture in the upper three feet and upper five feet of the soil at each site.

"This information allows producers to review soil moisture conditions for several sites in their area, and then make pre-plant irrigation decisions based upon information from those sites and their own on-farm soil moisture test," said Scott Orr, agricultural group supervisor.

The High Plains Water District and the USDA-NRCS strive to provide timely soil moisture information to assist producers with management decisions for the 2009 growing season. Results of the 2009 pre-plant soil moisture survey will be provided to news media and published in The Cross Section, the Water District's newsletter.

Judge William H. "Bill" Sheehan

Judge William H. (Bill) Sheehan was born of humble origins in Childress, Texas on March 6, 1928. His Irish-born father was a circuit-riding revival pastor until his death when Bill was only three. He was raised by his mother, Maize Sheehan Blankenship, and his stepfather who owned

and operated Doc's Shoe Shop in Childress. Bill acquired a lifelong passion for opera at the age of 13 by listening to the radio in Childress. Bill worked in Doc's Shoe Shop from the age of ten until he entered the Army in World War II. He served in the 10th Mountain Division where he was a ski instructor and the boxing Champion of his regiment.

Prior to his enlistment, he attended Texas A&M University. Subsequently, he attended Baylor University

where he graduated from the law school in December 1950. He was in the Army Reserves and was called up during the Berlin crisis when he served in Texas as a post legal officer. While in the Army he served in ranks from enlisted private to Major.

He worked as a general practice lawyer, both civil and criminal, for 28 years in Friona and Dumas, Texas. He was elected to the bench of the 69th District Court in 1978 and retired from the District Court in 1989. Judge Sheehan was often requested as a visiting judge by both parties to the litigation in other Courts around Texas. He was also a regularly sitting Senior Visiting Judge in Dallas for many years after his retirement. Both sides of the litigation often indicated that he was both a good and fair judge.

While he has many achievements, his greatest passion was for helping children. He felt that one of his greatest contributions to this effort was founding the first rural Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) program in the United States. He was a founding member and Texas CASA's first Board President serving on the Texas CASA board from its inception until now. In acknowledgement gates of gold. These narrow gates: First, "Is it true?" Then, of his lifetime contributions to the welfare of Texas children, he was recognized at the annual meeting of Texas CASA in October of 2008. During his tenure as a member of the Board of Directors of the Department of Protective and Regulatory Services, he enjoyed the singular distinction of being the only statewide appointee by Governor Ann Richards that was subsequently reappointed by Governor George W. Bush.

He was an active member of the community in Dumas for 30 years where he served as President of the Chamber of Commerce, Chairman of the Board for the Dumas YMCA, and was active in many other community organizations such as the Lions Club. He was recognized as the Moore County Man of the Year.

He was married for 60 years and is survived by his wife, Mary Sheehan; five children, Tom and Mary Margaret Ballenger, Kathleen Sheehan, Michael and Doedy Orchowski, John Sheehan, and Jack and Kellye Sheehan; and five grandchildren, Dan Taylor, Jared Sheehan, Cody Sheehan, Holland Klar, and Grant Sheehan. He enjoyed a long and loving relationship with all of his extended family who will miss him very much. He had a life well lived.

Bill served on the Executive Board of the Baptist General Convention and was an active church member his whole life. Bill also served on the Development Board of the Baylor Law School. Bill and Mary Sheehan are members of Park Cities Baptist Church in Dallas where the memorial service will be held on February 5, 2009 at 2:00 p.m. The service will be in the Ellis Chapel followed by a reception. A visitation will be held on February 4, from 5:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. at his daughter's home (10101 Chisholm Trail, Dallas, Texas). A memorial service will also be held at the First Baptist Church in Dumas, Texas on February 7 at 2:00 p.m.

J.B. Douglas and Patricia Phipps are retiring Chamber Board members. Alexander expressed thanks to both for their time and expertise they gave to the community.



On or about sixteen (16) days after the date of this publication, the City of Friona will submit a request to the Office of Rural Community Affairs for the release of Community Development Block Grant funds under Section 104(f) of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 as amended, to undertake a project known as Project No. 728140 - Water System Improvements.

The purpose of the proposed project is for the construction of a new ground storage tank and the installation of new booster pumps to improve pressure and ensure an adequate supply of water to meet minimum state standards. Construction shall include the installation of 1 new ground storage tank including steel rings, valves and fittings, 2 new booster pumps and all necessary appurtenances. Construction shall take place in the southwest portion of the City of Friona at the intersection of 7th and Pierce. The estimated project cost is \$296,300.00 (\$46,300.00 - City of Friona local funds) (\$250,000.00 - TxCDBG grant funds).




