The Friona school board met in regular session Monday April 13 at the administration building.

Primary school principal Tracy Ellis visited with the board about hiring a music teacher at the primary school. The board agreed to consider the request and respond at

a later date. High school principal Chris Morrow informed the board of his intention to hold the 2009 graduation ceremonies at Chieftain Field on May 29 at 8 p.m. Board members Mitchell Smiley, Danny Hand, and Tracy Bunker were

selected to assist with graduation. Principal Morrow also informed the board of possible changes to the extracurricular policy dealing with absences. Morrow outlined several options and the board asked for input from the high school staff. The matter will be discussed at a later date.



The May 9 school board election was cancelled and board members Mitchell Smiley, Brent Loflin, and Andy Montana were declared as elected unopposed.

The board approved an inter-local agreement with the city authorizing use of the adult softball field and noted the city council approved the closing of W. 8th St. from the alley to Euclid during school hours.

Salary increases for custodial staff, paraprofessional staff, and maintenance and secretarial staff were approved.

County receives April sales tax

Texas Comptroller Susan Combs announced the state received \$1.58 billion in sales tax revenue in March, down 3.8 percent compared to March 2008.

"Continued weakness in many important sectors, such as retail trade, mining and construction, resulted in a significant decrease in March sales tax collections," Combs said. Apr. 21-Rex Bracken, Norma Alexander, Riley Rector, Vandra "While year to date sales tax revenue is up 1.9 percent for fiscal 2009, further declines are expected this year.

local governments represent sales that occurred in February.

Parmer County's April 2009 payment totaled \$36,023.93 broken down as Bovina \$5,036.43; Farwell \$8,118.72; and Friona \$22,868.78. In April 2008 the tax payment total was \$35,049.21.

Comparing tax receipts from the same period last year, payments were up 2.78%, broken down as Bovina -11.81%; Farwell 1.11%; and Friona 7.31%.

For the year, Parmer County cities have received a total of \$162,407.77 as compared to \$155,761.94 for the same period Apr. 25-Allison Hardgrove, Levi Landrum, Darrell Roth, Mike last year, a 4.26% change.
