Council cancels May 9 election, closes 8th St. during school hours

The Friona city council met in regular session Monday April 13 at 6:30 p.m. in council chambers on Main St.

After the previous meeting minutes were approved and no one spoke during the public hearing time, Mayor John Taylor issued a proclamation declaring April 12-19 as National Library Week.

In other action the council

approved the closure of 8th St. at Euclid during school hours. The former M&M Welding Building at that corner was purchased by the school district and has been remodeled for use as the migrant center and other pre-school classrooms. The increased use of the intersection by students and staff prompted the request for closing the street.

The council approved the cancellation of the May 9 city election since only incumbent council persons signed up for re-election and were unopposed. In a separate meeting the school board also approved the cancellation of the May 9 election since there was no opposition for school board seats. There will be no May 9 election in Friona.

Only one bid was received for roofing at Heritage Estates, Prairie Acres, and the Redeemer Center. Fortenberry Roofing of Littlefield submitted the lone bid. The council approved

the bid, discussed the insurance settlements, and noted that Fortenberry carried the required workman's compensation insurance required by the state.

The council approved participation in an FTC Identification Theft program designed to protect the identity of persons that have water turned on in their names. It was noted there is currently an intercity program designed to catch people that skip on a water bill here and request water service in another town.

An \$8,500 expenditure by the Friona Economic Development Corporation (FEDC) to conduct a low cost housing study was approved. It was said that Cargill is interested in assisting with low cost housing in the area to accommodate its workers.

Permission was given to Samuel Rando to move a manufactured home onto the property at 302 E. 6th St. Permission was also

given to the Cemetery Association to construct a 30x30 building at the cemetery to accommodate graveside services during inclement weather. The cost will be paid by the association.

After discussion among the council and city attorney, approval was given to advertise for bids on a new water ground storage tank and booster pumps at the East Water Plant, located at 7th and Pierce. It was noted during the discussion that Mayor Taylor received a certified letter from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) that the East Well might be contaminated with gasoline seepage and would need to be monitored before any new construction could take place.

City manager Patricia Phipps said the city is presently blending the water at

the East Plant with water from other wells. A notice will be sent from the city to all water customers in the next 30 days. The council decided to go ahead with the advertisement for bid (included in this issue of the Friona Star) anyway since it is a Texas Block Grant bid that has an expiration date if not used.

Police Chief Tino Salinas's report noted the police department had 320 calls for service during March. Officers had 10 arrests, issued 95 citations and 96 warnings. The police department still has an opening for one officer and for a dispatcher.

The next meeting of the Friona city council will be Monday, May 11, at 6:30 p.m. in the council chambers. The public is invited to attend all city council meetings.

2009 graduation will be held at Chieftain Field!

The Friona school board met in regular session Monday April 13 at the administration building.

Primary school principal Tracy Ellis visited with the board about hiring a music teacher at the primary school. The board agreed to consider the request and respond at a later date.

High school principal Chris Morrow informed the board of his intention to hold the 2009 graduation ceremonies at Chieftain Field on May 29 at 8 p.m. Board members Mitchell Smiley, Danny Hand, and Tracy Bunker were selected to assist with graduation.

Principal Morrow also informed the board of possible changes to the extracurricular policy dealing with absences. Morrow outlined several options and the board asked for input from the high school staff. The matter will be discussed at a later date.

The school calendar for the 2009-10 year was approved, including a waiver for six early release days. The TAKS results were reviewed for the first administration of the Reading TAKS for 3rd, 5th, and 8th grades.

The May 9 school board election was cancelled and board members Mitchell Smiley, Brent Loflin, and Andy Montana were declared as elected unopposed.

The board approved an inter-local agreement with the city authorizing use of the adult softball field and noted the city council approved the closing of W. 8th St. from the alley to Euclid during school hours.

Salary increases for custodial staff, paraprofessional staff, and maintenance and secretarial staff were approved.

The next meeting of the school board will be 7 p.m. Monday, May 11, at the administration building.

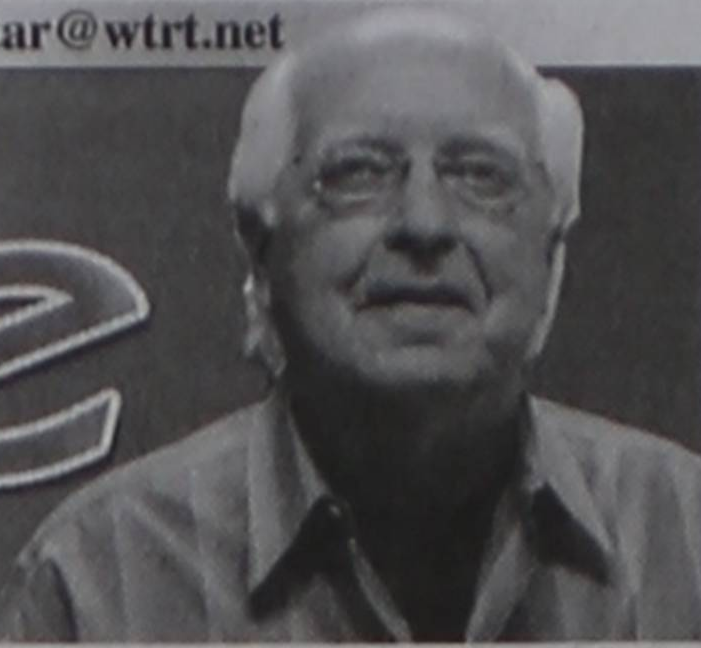

selling a car? take the plates

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) has a page on Facebook.

You thought it was just for silly teenagers and old mid-life crisis people. A quick check Monday showed TxDOT had 103 fans on their Facebook. Not bad out of a population of 17 million Texans. By comparison, my sons Zac and Casey have more than 600 friends on Facebook. I have 34.

Why does TxDOT have a Facebook page with "The Protector" superhero woman? To help Lone Star motorists better understand how to protect their vehicle's title.

TxDOT says when you sell your car or truck you need to protect yourself by removing and transferring

the license plates, registration sticker, and filing the online Vehicle Transfer Notification. In other words, tell the state that you no longer own the vehicle.

Sounds easy but TxDOT says less than 1 out of 10 Texans who sell or trade-in a vehicle follow the two simple steps that will help them keep out of trouble. Your license plates are registered to you. Leaving them on the vehicle means you could be held responsible for the buyer's parking fines, toll violations, or red-light camera tickets. Or it could be used as a getaway car in a bank robbery.

Signing the title on the back or trading it to a dealer does not change the record of ownership in the Texas motor vehicle database.

When you trade a vehicle to a dealership, the dealer does not change the title until it is sold to a customer. The dealer may sell your trade-in to another dealer or sell it to an auction house. While your old vehicle is moving around and changing hands, the name on the title isn't. You are still the registered owner.

TxDOT says they get calls all the time from customers who say they are receiving bills for hundreds of dollars in fines and violations from a Texas city that might be a thousand miles from where they live.

One man reported trading a car to a San Antonio dealer, who sold it to an Austin dealer, which in turn sold it to a Houston dealer. Then the vehicle was stolen from the Houston dealer. The man's name was still on the title. For two years he received letters about toll fines and calls from police. He said, "Every time that vehicle was used to break the law the authorities came looking for me."

To help ensure you won't be held responsible for what the buyer does with your car, file a Vehicle Transfer Notification online. It's free. Go to www.txdot.gov and type "Vehicle Transfer Notification" into the homepage and fill in the information then print out a copy of the confirmation page so you have a record.

Once you file the form, the buyer becomes the presumed owner and that removes your liability.

Taking the license plates off the vehicle protects you and also forces the buyer to re-title the vehicle. When you take off the license plates you also need to remove the registration sticker from the windshield. Remember the sticker is customized for your vehicle and has the license plate number on it.

The other way to protect yourself is for you and the buyer to go to the county tax office together to re-title the vehicle.

You can transfer your old plates to another of your vehicles. If you are the buyer and the owner takes the plates, you can download a Vehicle Transit Permit so you can drive temporarily without plates or a sticker until you get it registered in your name.

Which brings us back to Facebook. If you are a Facebook user, search "Protect Your Title, Texas" and The Protector superhero will share tips about filing and transferring your plates. New updates will include videos, podcasts, and information to help Lone Star motorists better understand how to protect their vehicle title. This has been a public service announcement courtesy of Facebook, TxDOT, and the Friona Star. What's a podcast?

Food lovers should know migas

Migas (Spanish for 'bits and pieces') is a versatile Tex-Mex classic. A recent edition of Relish Magazine gave information about migas along with the following recipe. Basically it is broken up tortilla chips, eggs, peppers and an iron skillet.

Because you cook bits and pieces you can throw in a variety of ingredients, sometimes tomatoes and onions, sometimes cheese. Butter, Tabasco Sauce, and strong coffee are also recommended. Serve it with warm flour tortillas and refried beans.

The recipe is from Bill and Cheryl Jamison's cookbook, *A Real American Breakfast*.

Migas: A Tex-Mex scramble

Serves 4

- 2 ripe plum tomatoes
- 2 fresh poblanos
- 1 fresh jalapeno chile
- 9 eggs
- 3 tbsp water, milk, or heavy cream
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 1 small onion, slivered
- 30 tortilla chips, broken into bite-sized pieces
- 1 cup shredded sharp Cheddar cheese
- 2 tbsp minced fresh cilantro
- Extra whole tortilla chips, diced tomato, grated Cheddar cheese, cilantro sprigs, and sour cream for garnish.

1. Preheat broiler.
2. Place tomatoes, poblanos, and jalapeno on a baking sheet. Broil until browned all over and blackened in spots. Place poblanos and jalapeno in a plastic bag to steam as they cool. When cool enough to handle, chop tomatoes and their charred skin. Peel poblanos and jalapeno. Slice chiles open and remove seeds and veins. Slice poblanos into thin strips; mince jalapeno.
3. Combine eggs, water, and salt; whisk.
4. Heat oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Add onion; sauté until tender. Stir in tomatoes, chiles, and their juices. Cook until thoroughly heated and liquid evaporates. Pour in egg mixture, stirring from the bottom. When eggs are nearly done, add chips. Stir and cook until done. Remove from heat and stir in cheese and cilantro, if using.

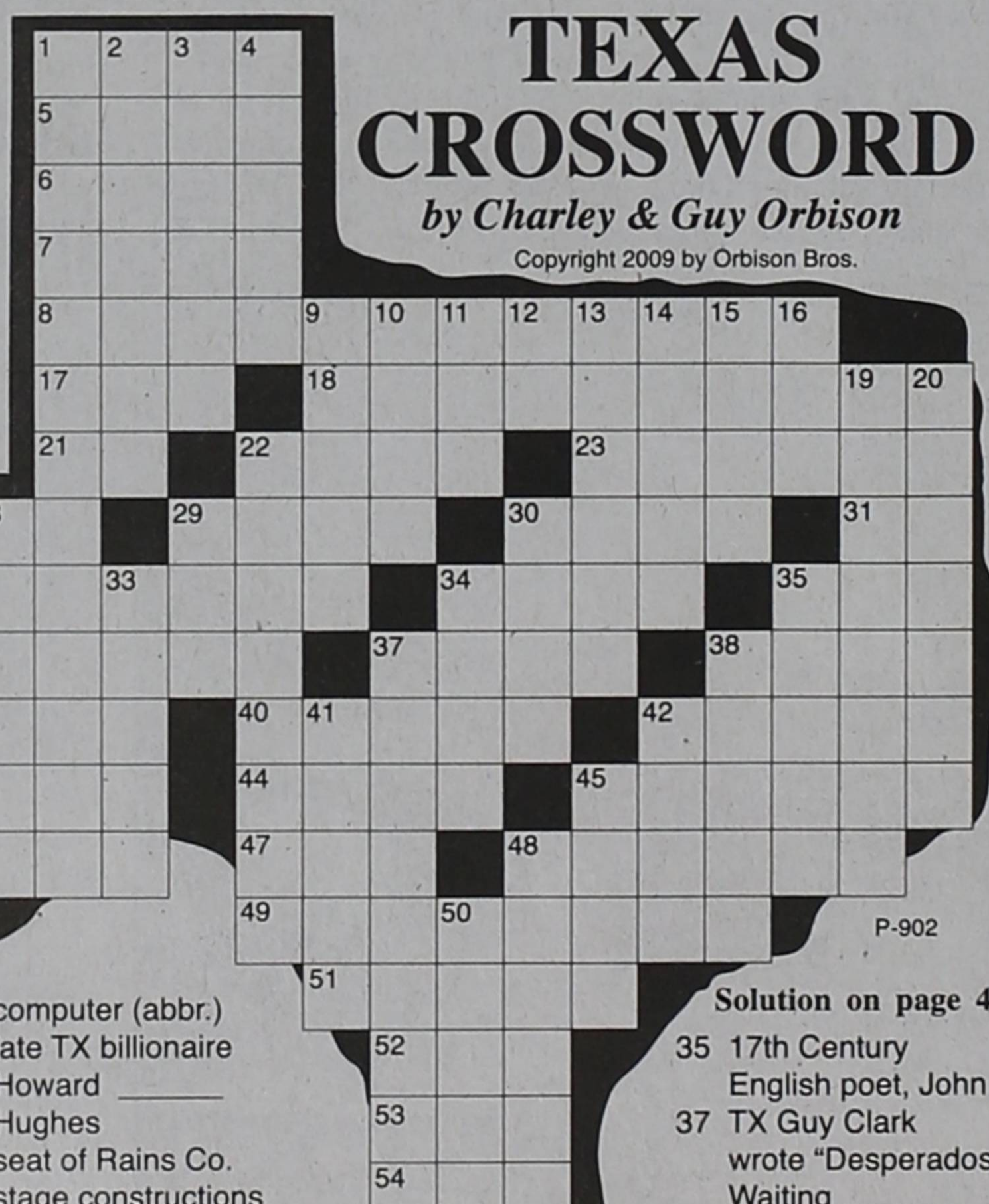

A couple of weeks ago at the St. Teresa's senior class dinner I complimented the ladies on their salsa and asked about sharing the recipe. So Mercedes brought us a batch of salsa this week and the recipe. The homemade salsa is great stuff. It would give Victor Leal's salsa a run for the money.

Mercedes attributed the recipe to Monica Bermea, another of the St. Teresa's ladies. Pam Kendrick and Mercedes also have their versions. It looks simple enough and is the first recipe I have seen that calls for a "fistful" of something. Mercedes says you can use regular salt instead of onion salt but she prefers the onion. Is this a great town or what? We have included the salsa recipe below. Try it. Thanks again Mercedes for sharing.

Monica's Hot Sauce
3-4 boiled jalapenos (boil just until the skin and stem slip off easily)
3 cloves fresh garlic
1 fistful fresh cilantro
1 tsp onion salt
2 - 28 oz cans whole peeled tomatoes
Chop the jalapenos, garlic, and cilantro in a food processor. Add onion salt and tomatoes. If you drain

the tomatoes the sauce will be chunkier. You may also use fresh tomatoes: just boil them when you boil the jalapenos. Keep it refrigerated and the salsa will be good for a couple of weeks.

Friona Capital Improvements Project TCDP East Plant Booster Pumps & Ground Storage Tank

Sealed proposals addressed to the Honorable Mayor and City Council of the City of Friona will be received at City Hall, 623 Main Street, Friona, Texas, 79035, until 2:00 PM, Tuesday, May 5, 2009 for furnishing all necessary materials, machinery, equipment, superintendence and labor for construction of the East Plant Booster Pumps for the City of Friona, Texas, including other incidental items of work as called for in the specifications. All bid summaries shall be read aloud in the Council Chambers at City Hall on the date stated above.

The **Base Bid** includes all site-work, excavation and construction of 1 (250,000 gallon) Steel Ground Storage Tank and piping necessary to tie the tank in with the existing distribution systems. All piping, valves and structures necessary to operate the tank are included in the base bid. 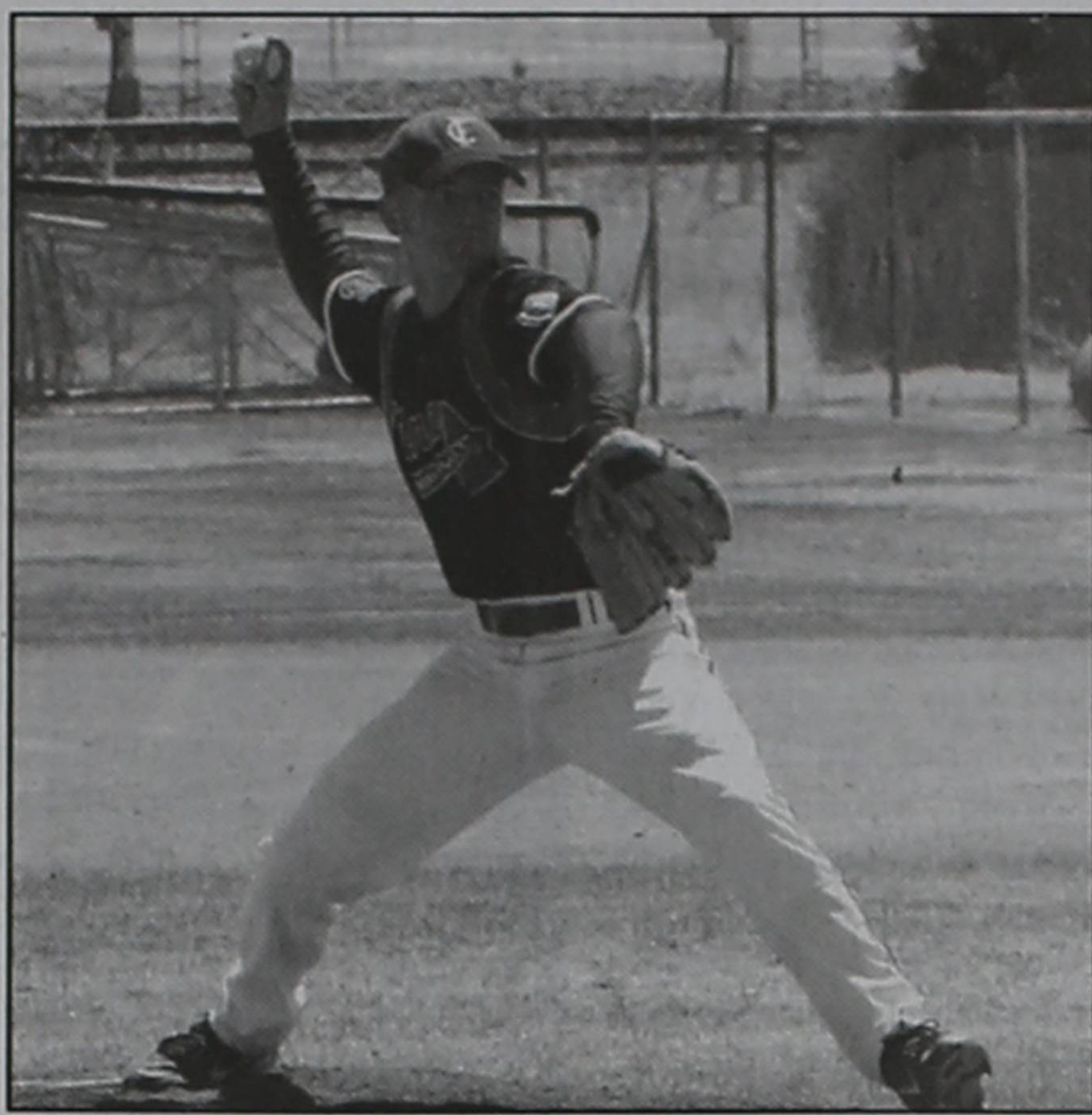

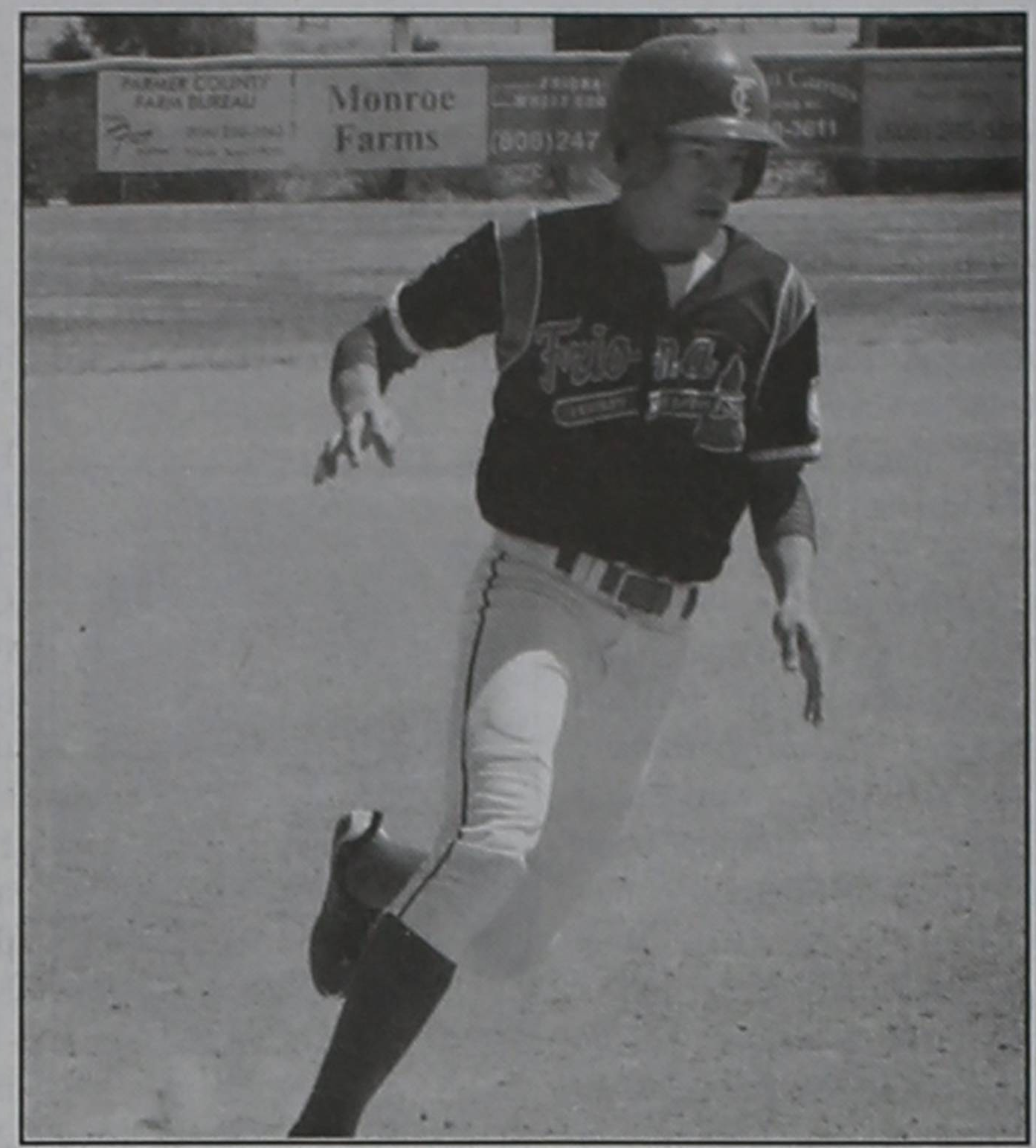
