

Hannah Eugenia Brown Carr Lookingbill will be 90-yearsold Friday, May 29, 2009.

Mother was born in 1919 near Hillsboro. Back then Hillsboro wasn't much. She went to school in a oneroom schoolhouse in Union Bluff, west of town. She still talks fondly of those Union Bluff days even today.

She married my dad, Ancel Carr, while in her late teens. When she was 20, I came along. That was in 1939. Made it easy for me to remember her age by adding 20 years to mine. .

Mom and Ancel had four kids. My sister Gena Beth came along when I was 9, sister Kathye arrived when I was 11, and baby brother Rick surprised us all when he came along in 1956. I was then almost 17 and a senior in high school.

Life was simple in Hillsboro during those growing up years. Mom worked in a beauty shop, daddy worked at the gas company, and I went to school. Most of all, through the years, mom worked and took care of us kids. Ancel wasn't much of an influ- or \$20 before I went back. ence in our lives.

He later became addicted to prescription drugs. He made a mess of his life and those around him. Through those awful days, mom worked and took care of my sisters and brother. (I was working in Dallas by then.) Mom and dad finally divorced in the early 1960s.

Life wasn't easy for her but she didn't let on about Dallas on the weekends,







Potato salad is potato salad? BY RON CARR

It seems to me that once you know how to make potato salad you make it the same way forever. Sort of being stuck in a potato salad rut. I've attended a lot of catered co-op meetings over the years and the first item in the buffet line is usually the same old potato salad (followed by the same old coleslaw).

This recipe can get you out of the rut temporarily. It was submitted to American Profile magazine by Phyllis Wong of Laughlin, Nevada. Spice up your next backyard BBQ with this potato salad twist.

Potato salad with olives & jalapenos

Serves 6 3 medium baking potatoes, peeled if desired (about 1

pound)

2 quarts water

3/4 tsp salt, divided 3/4 cup light mayonnaise

1 1/2 tsp Dijon mustard

1/8 to 1/4 tsp cayenne pepper 6 jalapeno chile-stuffed olives, thinly sliced

1/2 cup finely chopped celery

1/4 cup finely chopped onion

2 hard-cooked eggs, chopped 1/4 teaspoon black pepper

1. Combine potatoes, water, and 1/2 tsp salt in a stockpot. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer, covered, until potatoes are tender when pierced with a fork, 30-35 minutes. 2. Drain well, cool completely, about one hour. Cut

cooled potatoes into cubes.

3. Combine mayonnaise, mustard, remaining 1/4 tsp salt and cayenne in a large bowl, mix well. Stir in olives, celery, and onion. Add potatoes, eggs, and black pepper; stir gently. Serve immediately or cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate until needed.

Tip: To speed the cooling process, cut hot potatoes in half and refrigerate 15 minutes. Cut into cubes.


Welch throws discus at SPC


The South Plains women's team also won the championship for the second consecutive year. Both the men and women won the national indoor championship last winter. They are coached by Chris Beene.

The family suggests memorials to the Bovina United Methodist Church, P.O. Box 127, Bovina, TX 79009.








