6 jalapeno chile-stuffed olives, thinly sliced
$1 / 2$ cup finely chopped celery
$1 / 4$ cup finely chopped onion
2 hard-cooked eggs, chopped
1/4 teaspoon black pepper

1. Combine potatoes, water, and $1 / 2$ tsp salt in a stockpot Bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer, covered, until
potatoes are tender when pierced with a fork, $30-35$ minutes. 2. Drain well, cool completely, about one hour. Cut cooled potatoes into cubes.
2. Combine mayonnaise, mustard, remaining $1 / 4 \mathrm{tsp}$ sal and cayenne in a large bowl, mix well. Stir in olives,
celery, and onion. Add potatoes, eggs, and black pepper;
 and refrigerate until needed.

Tip: To speed the cooling process, cut hot potatoes in
half and refrigerate 15 minutes. Cut into cubes.
