## Corn and cotton planting completed

From Northwest Plains Pest Management News, published by Monti Vandiver, Extension Agent-Integrated Pest Management, in the Texas AgriLife Extension Service office in Farwell:

Most corn and cotton planting operations have been completed. Earlier planted corn has emerged and is growing rapidly. Some cotton has emerged and is looking very good. Dryland conditions are poor for seeding a crop and in most cases will require significant rain to get a crop established.

As a whole, area wheat has been rated fair to poor. Much of the area wheat appears stressed and continues to exhibit injury due to freezing temperatures as well as symptoms consistent with several viral diseases. Results from laboratory analysis have confirmed

wheat streak mosaic virus and barley yellow dwarf in most samples submitted.

Adult thrips have been abundant in area wheat and will migrate to other hosts including cotton as the wheat matures. Fields with no preventative treatment (soil applied or seed treatment insecticide) for thrips will likely require at least one and probably two insecticide applications to keep thrips suppressed.

High Plains Scout School will be held Friday, May 29, at the Texas AgriLife Extension Center in Lubbock. Registration is from 8-8:30 a.m. EPA worker handler training will be included and an EPA pesticide handler card issued.

## happy birthday to our mother

Hannah Eugenia Brown Carr Lookingbill will be 90-years-old Friday, May 29, 2009.

Mother was born in 1919 near Hillsboro. Back then Hillsboro wasn't much. She went to school in a one-room schoolhouse in Union Bluff, west of town. She still talks fondly of those Union Bluff days even today.

She married my dad, Ancel Carr, while in her late teens. When she was 20, I came along. That was in 1939. Made it easy for me to remember her age by adding 20 years to mine.

Mom and Ancel had four kids. My sister Gena Beth came along when I was 9, sister Kathy arrived when I was 11, and baby brother Rick surprised us all when he came along in 1956. I was then almost 17 and a senior in high school.

Life was simple in Hillsboro during those growing up years. Mom worked in a beauty shop, daddy worked at the gas company, and I went to school. Most of all, through the years, mom worked and took care of us kids. Ancel was our daddy but he wasn't much of an influence in our lives.

He later became addicted to prescription drugs. He made a mess of his life and those around him. Through those awful days, mom worked and took care of my sisters and brother. (I was working in Dallas by then.) Mom and dad finally divorced in the early 1960s.

Life wasn't easy for her but she didn't let on about it. When I came home from Dallas on the weekends,

she would often slip me \$10 or \$20 before I went back. It was a lot of money back then.

Mom cooked. She always cooked. Breakfast, lunch, dinner. She fed us. I remember going home for lunch during high school with a full meal on the table, not just a snack.

She continued the struggle after the divorce. She kept food on the table, she sewed clothes for us all, and she never wavered from her love and

care of her kids.

Through a mutual friend she met a widowed farmer named Harry Lookingbill. He lived in a place called Friona.

None of us knew where it was at the time. They corresponded, talked, met, and married February 25, 1970. She moved to Friona in March, 1970. Harry was 60, she was 50, and baby brother Rick was 13.

Thus finally the good years began for our mother. She quickly adapted to the role of farmer's wife. Her

cooking skills were highly valued. Harry was a crusty old fellow and mom is a strong-willed woman so they had their battles. But Harry cared for and looked after and loved our mother and I will always be grateful to him for it. They had 31 great years together. He passed away in November 2001 at the age of 91.

Through the years we four kids caused more than a lot of worry and heartache for mom. Through marriages, divorces, grandkids, stepkids, and boundless other forms of strife we piled up, mother always loved us. Sometimes she showed her love by yelling at us and telling us we were acting like idiots.

In 2001 our sister Kathy died after a long battle with cancer. It hit mother harder than she let us all see. She grieves to this day. She says mothers are not supposed to outlive their children.

In 1995 life wasn't going so great for me. At mother's suggestion, I moved to Friona. She said, "Why don't you just move out here?" I did and that is where the name of this column later came from. The rest is history I suppose.

I'm grateful for the past 14 years here near our mother. I'm grateful to you mom for caring about me when I didn't deserve it. I'm glad we have had these past few years in Friona together. From Rick and Gena and me. And Kathy. Happy 90<sup>th</sup> birthday. We all love you very much.

P. S. This is a lot better than a birthday card isn't it?

## Potato salad is potato salad?

It seems to me that once you know how to make potato salad you make it the same way forever. Sort of being stuck in a potato salad rut. I've attended a lot of catered co-op meetings over the years and the first item in the buffet line is usually the same old potato salad (followed by the same old coleslaw).

This recipe can get you out of the rut temporarily. It was submitted to American Profile magazine by Phyllis Wong of Laughlin, Nevada. Spice up your next backyard BBQ with this potato salad twist.

### Potato salad with olives & jalapenos

Serves 6

- 3 medium baking potatoes, peeled if desired (about 1 pound)
- 2 quarts water
- 3/4 tsp salt, divided
- 3/4 cup light mayonnaise
- 1 1/2 tsp Dijon mustard
- 1/8 to 1/4 tsp cayenne pepper
- 6 jalapeno chile-stuffed olives, thinly sliced
- 1/2 cup finely chopped celery
- 1/4 cup finely chopped onion
- 2 hard-cooked eggs, chopped
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper

1. Combine potatoes, water, and 1/2 tsp salt in a stockpot. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer, covered, until potatoes are tender when pierced with a fork, 30-35 minutes.
2. Drain well, cool completely, about one hour. Cut cooled potatoes into cubes.
3. Combine mayonnaise, mustard, remaining 1/4 tsp salt and cayenne in a large bowl, mix well. Stir in olives, celery, and onion. Add potatoes, eggs, and black pepper; stir gently. Serve immediately or cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate until needed.

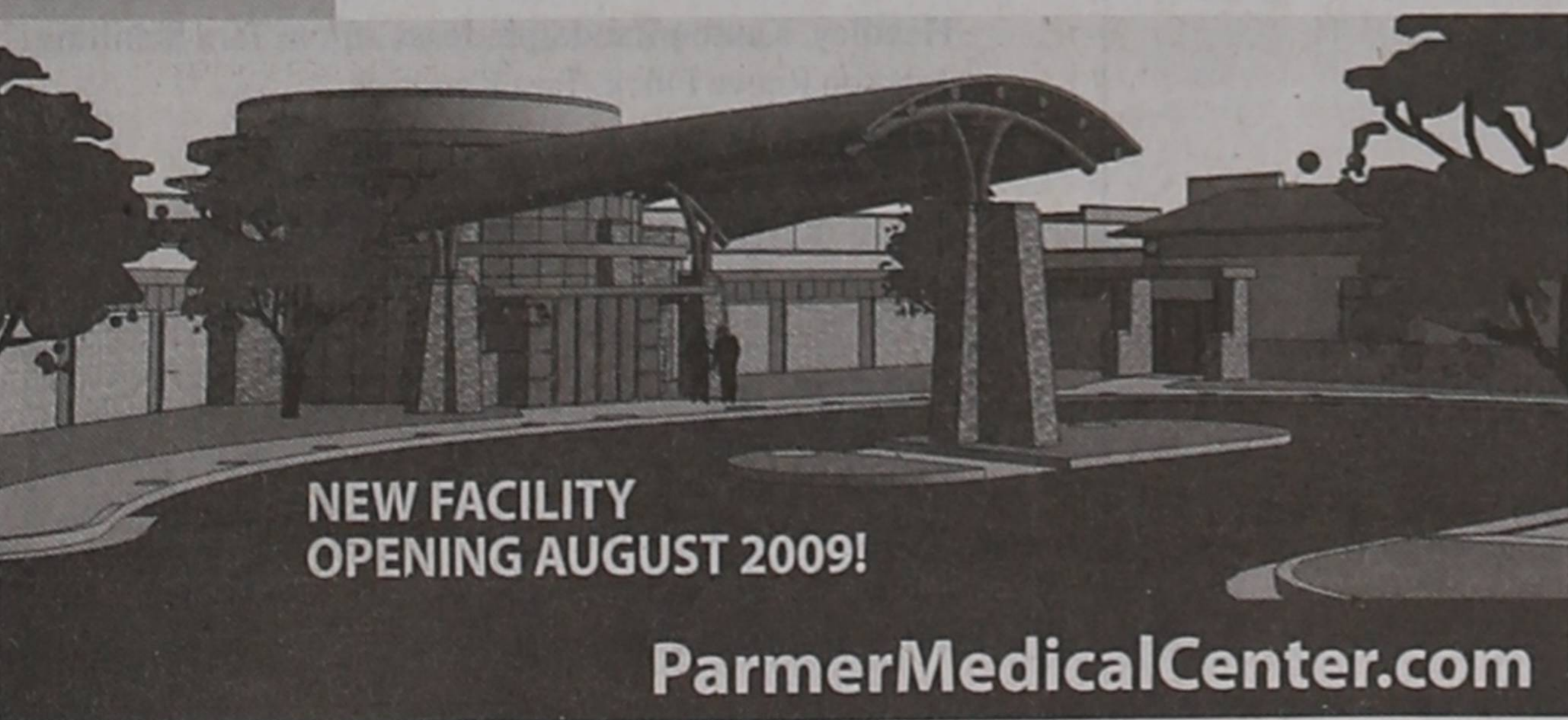
Tip: To speed the cooling process, cut hot potatoes in half and refrigerate 15 minutes. Cut into cubes.

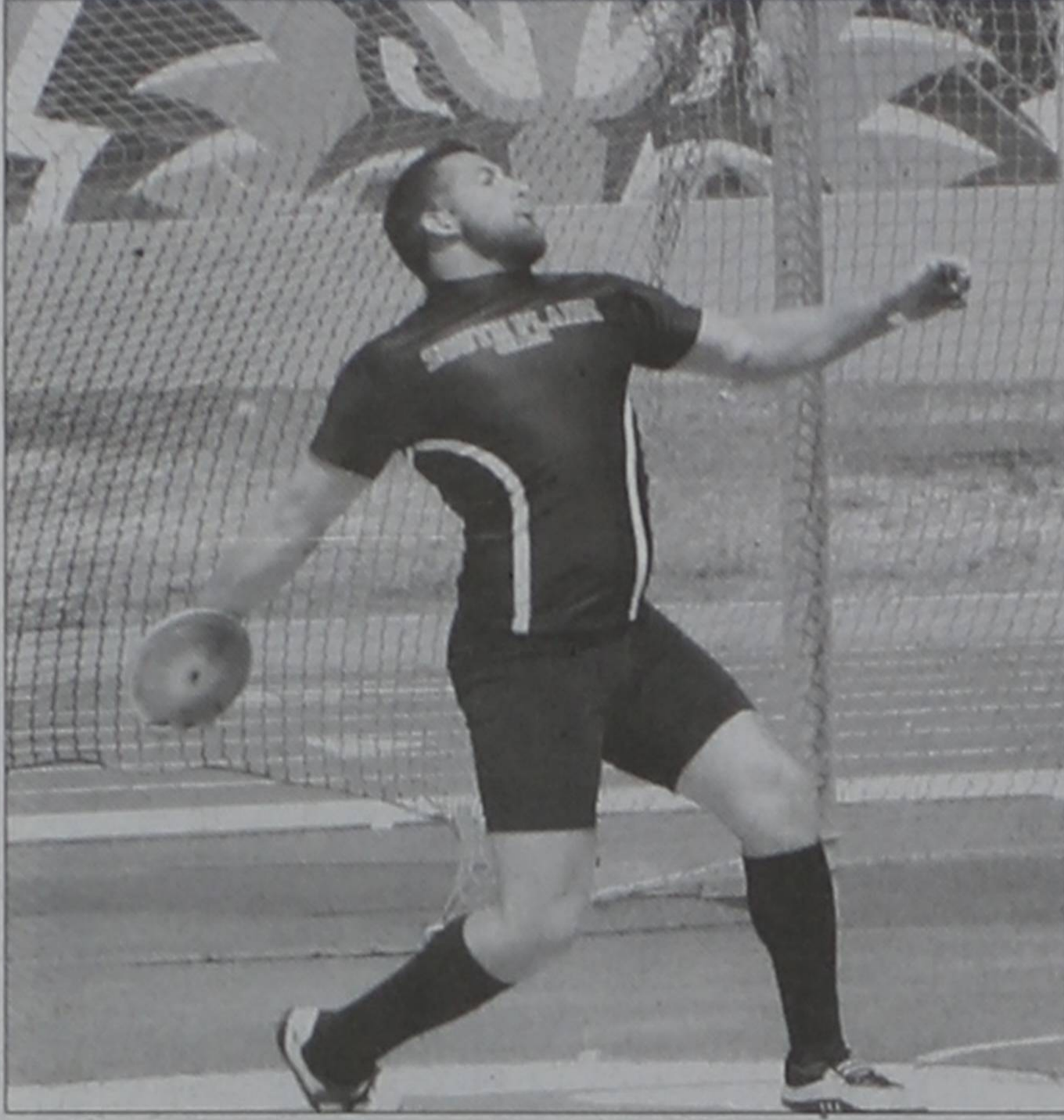
## Welch throws discus at SPC

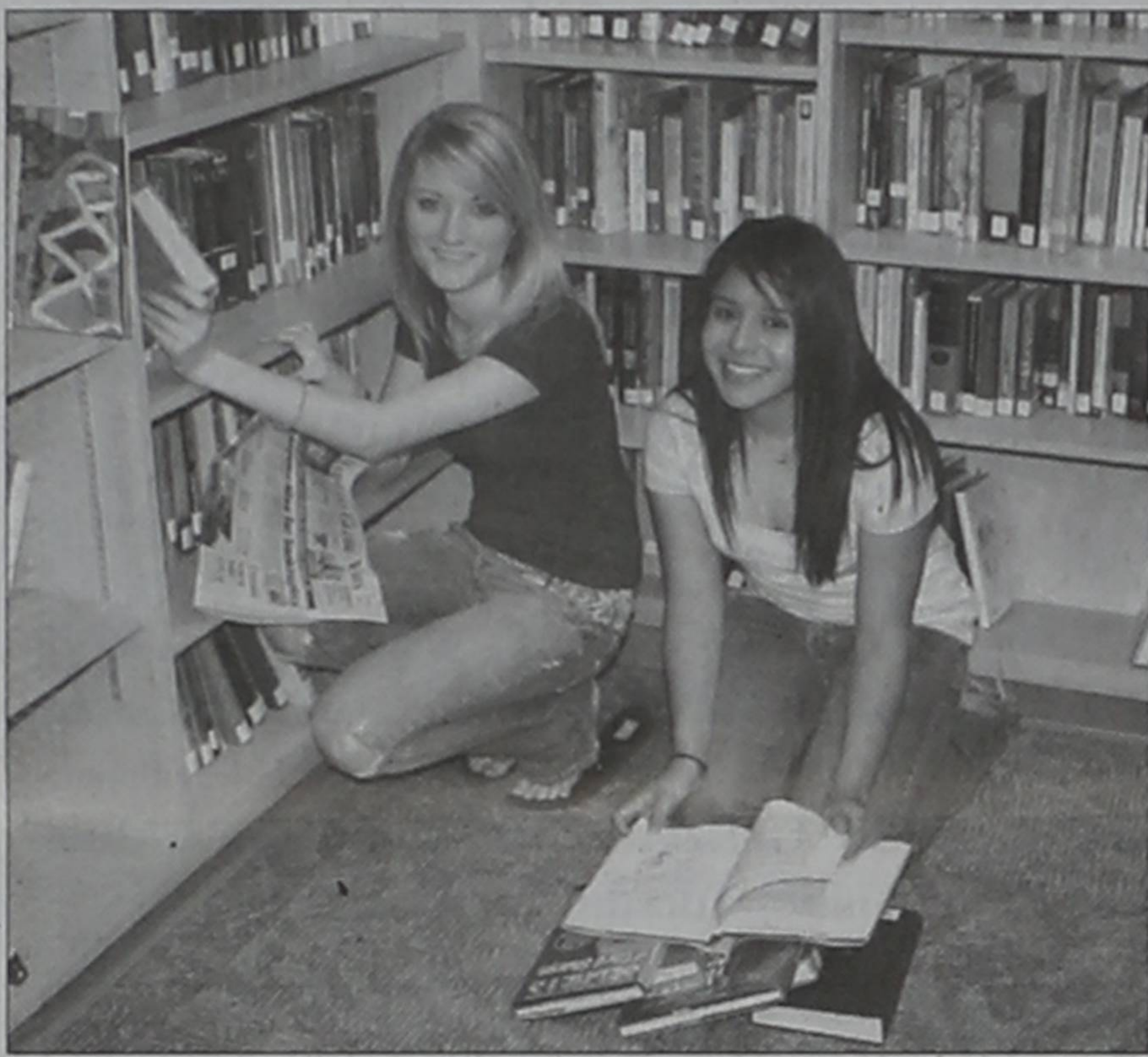
The South Plains women's team also won the championship for the second consecutive year. Both the men and women won the national indoor championship last winter. They are coached by Chris Beene.

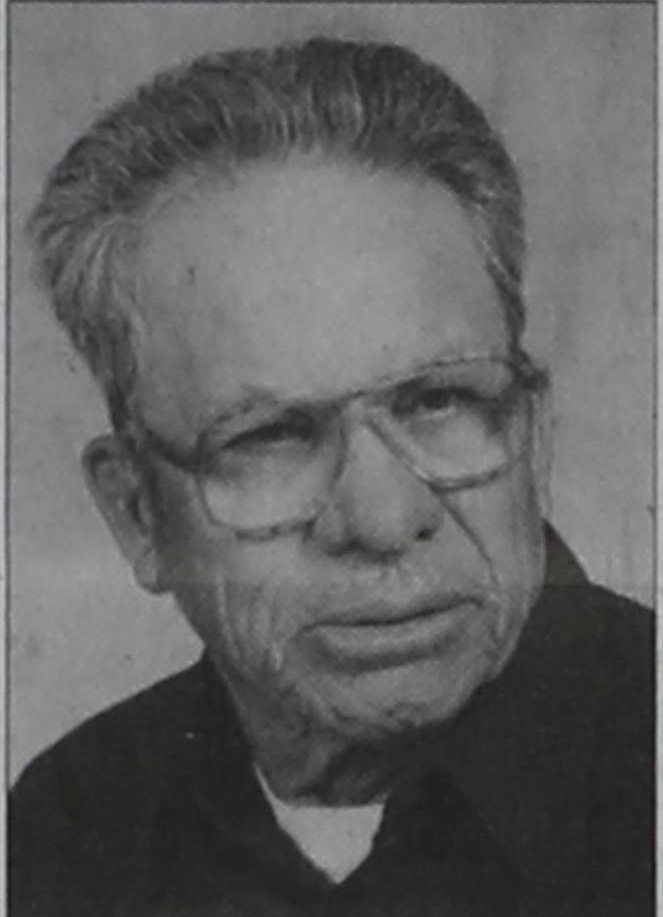
She was preceded in death by four brothers and one sister.

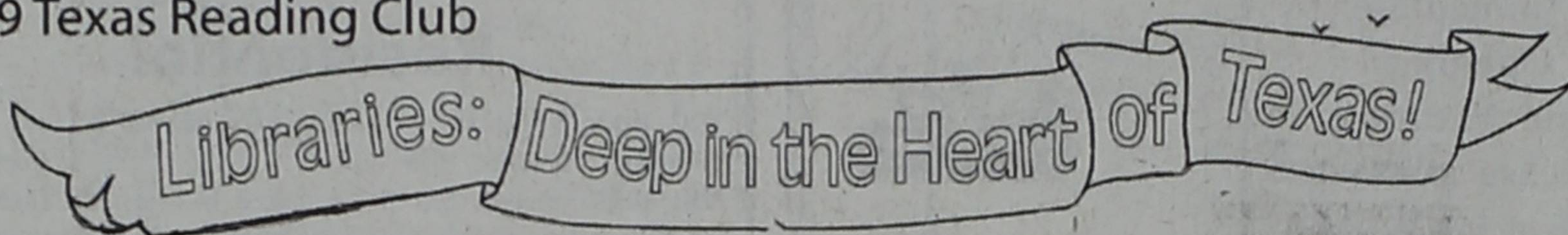
