1 cup butter, softened
1 egg
1 tsp vanilla extract
$11 / 4$ cups all-purpose flour
$1 / 3$ cup cocoa powder
$1 / 3$ cup cocoa powder
$1 / 2$ tsp salt
3 cups uncooked quick oats
6 ozs semisweet chocolate chip

1. Preheat oven to 350 . Lightly grease a cookie sheet. 2. Combine sugar and butter in a large bowl. Beat with a mixer at medium speed until fluffy. Beat in egg and
vanilla. 3. Sift together flour, Aoca, bats and chocolate chips
into creamed mixture. Add oats Dough will be very stiff. Add up to $1 / 4$ cup water if needed. Form tablespoon-size balls and place on prepare cookie sheet. Flatten slightly. Bake 10-12 minutes.
Tip: This batter can be refrigerated for an hour to firm it and $1 / 2$ cup of chopped walnuts are also good in this soft and chewy cookie. About 100 calories per cookie. Enjoy.
