Slow cooker bbq beef sandwiches
$1(21 / 2-3$ lb) boneless beef chuck roast
1 cup barbeque sauce
$1 / 2$ cup apricot preserves
$1 / 2$ med green bell pepper, chopped
1 tbsp Dijon mustard
$11 / 2 \mathrm{tsp}$ brown sugar
1 med red onion thinly sliced
$3 / 4$ cup jarred mild or medium salsa
12 Kaiser rolls or hamburger buns, split \& warmed

1. Trim excess fat from roast and cut into large pieces. Place in a $31 / 2$ to 4 -quart slow cooker 2. Combine bbq sauce, preserves, bell pepper, mus-
tard, brown sugar, red onions, and salsa in a medium bowl. Pour over beef. Cover and cook on low 9 hours or on high $41 / 2$ to 5 hours, until beef is very tender. 3. Remove beef to a cutting board. Pull apart with a
fork or cut into thin slices. Serve on Kaiser rolls ar fork or cut into
buns with sauce.

Tip from the test kitchen: This is the perfect recipe to
cook overnight. If desired, return beef to slow cooker after shredding and reheat for 30 minutes.
