


Lazbuddie native new **Neugebauer director**

The Best Coleslaw

Serves 8

1 small head cabbage, shredded (about 1 lb.)

1 med carrot, grated

1/2 cup sugar ¹/₂ cup light mayonnaise

1/3 cup olive oil

¹/₄ cup cider vinegar

1 tsp prepared mustard

1 tsp celery seeds

1 tbsp prepared horseradish

1. Combine cabbage and carrot in large bowl.

2. Mix sugar, mayonnaise, olive oil, vinegar, mustard, celery seeds, and horseradish in a small bowl; whisk to blend. Toss mayonnaise mixture with the cabbage mixture.

Tip from the test kitchen: For more heat use 1 tsp dry mustard instead of the prepared mustard. Use less mayonnaise for a drier coleslaw.



The Tower of Babel

T. LEON TALLEY, Minister, Sixth Street Church of Christ (Genesis 10-11) After the flood, man lived for a while in a period of harmony. The day comes when men begin to be consumed by ambition, note "Let us" in 11:3. They decide they will build a city and a tower that will reach to heaven. This is a likely description of what will later be identified in Babylon as a Ziggurat. A Ziggurat was a large tower shaped like a pyramid that was usually between 70 and 300 feet high. It was often made in seven terraces, centered on a temple area with a shrine on top. In short, it was a center of idol worship. Babel in 11:9 means "Gate to God".






