## Pumpkin Black Bean Soup

2 cans black beans, drained and rinse
$\mathrm{can}(14.5 \mathrm{oz}$ ) diced tomatoes
1 can $(16 \mathrm{oz})$ pumpkin puree
2 garlic cloves minced
4 tbsp olive oi
4 cups vegetable broth
1 tbsp ground cumin
1 tsp each kosher salt, cinnamon, allspic
$1 / 2$ tsp ground pepper
Baked pumpkin seeds for garnish
Place oil, red onion, garlic, and seasonings into a large
pot.
Cook on low-medium heat until red onion and garlic
brown.
Puree the beans and tomatoes with half of the vegetable broth. Add pureed ingredients, pumpkin,
and rest of broth to your pot.
Simmer uncovered until thick, about $40-45$ minutes.
