Makes 6 dozen
2 cups all-purpose flour
$1 / 2$ tsp coarsely ground black pepper $1 / 2$ tsp coarsely ground
$1 / 2$ spp cayenne pepper
$1 / 2$ tsp salt
$1 / 2$ cup grated Parmigiano Reggiano cheese 1 cup ( 2 sticks) butter
$1(8 \mathrm{oz}) \mathrm{pkg}$ cream chees
$1 / 4$ cup prepared pesto
$1 / 4$ cup fresh basil leaves finely chopped 1 cup chopped walnuts, chopped almonds, or whole $\quad$ pine nut
Kosher salt

Sift together flour, peppers and salt. Stir in cheese 2. Combine butter and cream cheese; using a mixer, beat until well combined. Add pesto and mix well. 3. Add fiour mixture, basil leaves, and nuts. Mix well.
4. Divide dough in half and roll into logs $1-1 / 2$ inche in diameter. Roll each log in kosher salt. Wrap in waxed paper and chill until firm. If baking later, freeze shaped dough and defrost slightly before baking.
5. Preheat oven to 350 .
6. Slice dough $1 / 4$ ihch thick. Place on ungreased cookie sheets. Bake 18 to 20 minutes, until edges are
