May weather report

Official weather guy John Gurley says the city received 2.12" rain during the month of May with the last rainfall day May 26 including small hail. The high temperature was 92 on May 23 and 90 on May 7. A low of 36 was recorded on May 14 with several other days showing 37 as a low.

Smiley era ends at Friona Wheat Growers

Friona Wheat Growers, Inc. just won't be the same after June 1, 2010. After 41 years of dedicated service, and for the first harvest since 1969, long-time Manager Ron Smiley will not be there; he is retiring. Ron became manager on May 1, 1973 having been employed by the elevator since September 1, 1969 when he was just 32 years old.

A myriad of changes have taken place in the grain business and at Friona Wheat Growers during this time. Among the most noticeable physical changes are the acquisition and/or construction of Sante Fe Grain in 1973, four metal storage tanks,

the Gearn's grain cleaner structure on top and satellite receiving stations at Rhea in 1984, Lakeview in 1987, at Grady, New Mexico in 1997 and at Hub in 2009 bringing the total capacity to 6,800,000 bushels—more than double the capacity of 3,170,000 bushels when he became manager in 1973.

When asked what he considered to be his most significant achievement during his tenure, Mr. Smiley said, "that it was keeping the business going during some of the really tough economic times". Considering how important the grain elevator business is to our local

economy and tax support base plus the generous contributions they make to so many different organizations through advertising and donations, we are very grateful for this achievement as well.

Friona's first grain storage was 'on the ground' nearby the Archison, Topeka and Sante Fe Railway which was built in the 1880s and is the forerunner of our current Burlington Northern Sante Fe Railway double tracks today. Then, the first of two wooden elevator structures was built in 1916 and later these two structures became Oklahoma Wheat Producers with storage capacity of 30,000 bushels.

In 1934, a group of local farmers purchased the firm to 'save the business' and re-organized as Friona Wheat Growers, Inc., a local co-op. Incorporating officers included Floyd W. Reeve, President; Clyde V. Goodwine, Secretary-Treasurer; Ford N. Welch, Elmer Euler, and E. B. Whitefield. In the years since 1934, members of other generations of these families have served on the Board of Directors. Current Board members are Davy Carthel, President, Von Edelman, Michael Rushing, Jason Wright all of Friona, and Ted Rush of Grady, New Mexico.

The first concrete columns were built in 1949 with extensions continuing in 1950, 1954 and 1955 until the familiar concrete colossus once billed as the 'longest country elevator in the world' was finally completed with storage of 3,170,000 bushels. FWG acquired Sante Fe Grain (formerly Continental Grain) in 1973 and built the new office building at 103 E. 5th in 1981, which soon became the home of many 'round table' community discussions

over countless cups of coffee. In fact, the elevator probably helped save more damage to our residential area during the June 1995 tornado which destroyed Hi-Pro Feeds.

Storage, once an integral part of the elevator's annual income, is no longer the money maker it once was. Since we now live in an area of deficit grain production, we are no longer able to produce what our local industries—dairies, feed yards and feed mills can consume. Most of the locally produced grain is sold, hauled and used locally and not shipped by rail to the gulf and west coasts for export as it once was.

This led to the addition of FWG trucking in 1986; eventually the business would operate two trucks to cover local hauling as well as hauling grain in from the satellites to the main elevator. The Co-Op also operated a fertilizer business for a short time in the 1990s.

Ron Smiley first came to Friona in 1957 for a summer job while visiting with his sister and brother-in-law, Olive and Meryl Massie. As a native of Dickens County and a recent graduate of Patton Springs High School in 1956, he also attended Texas Tech University. While in high school he excelled in athletics, band, and worked summers as a lifeguard at the natural springs swimming pool at Roaring Springs.

In December of 1957 he married Melba Bracken, a Friona native, and they have made Friona their home ever since. They raised three children and ten grandchildren in Friona; by 2015 all will be Friona High School graduates.

Mitchell and Kim (Frye) Smiley have five children.

Mitchell is manager of Parmer County Farm Bureau and Kim teaches kindergarten at Friona ISD.

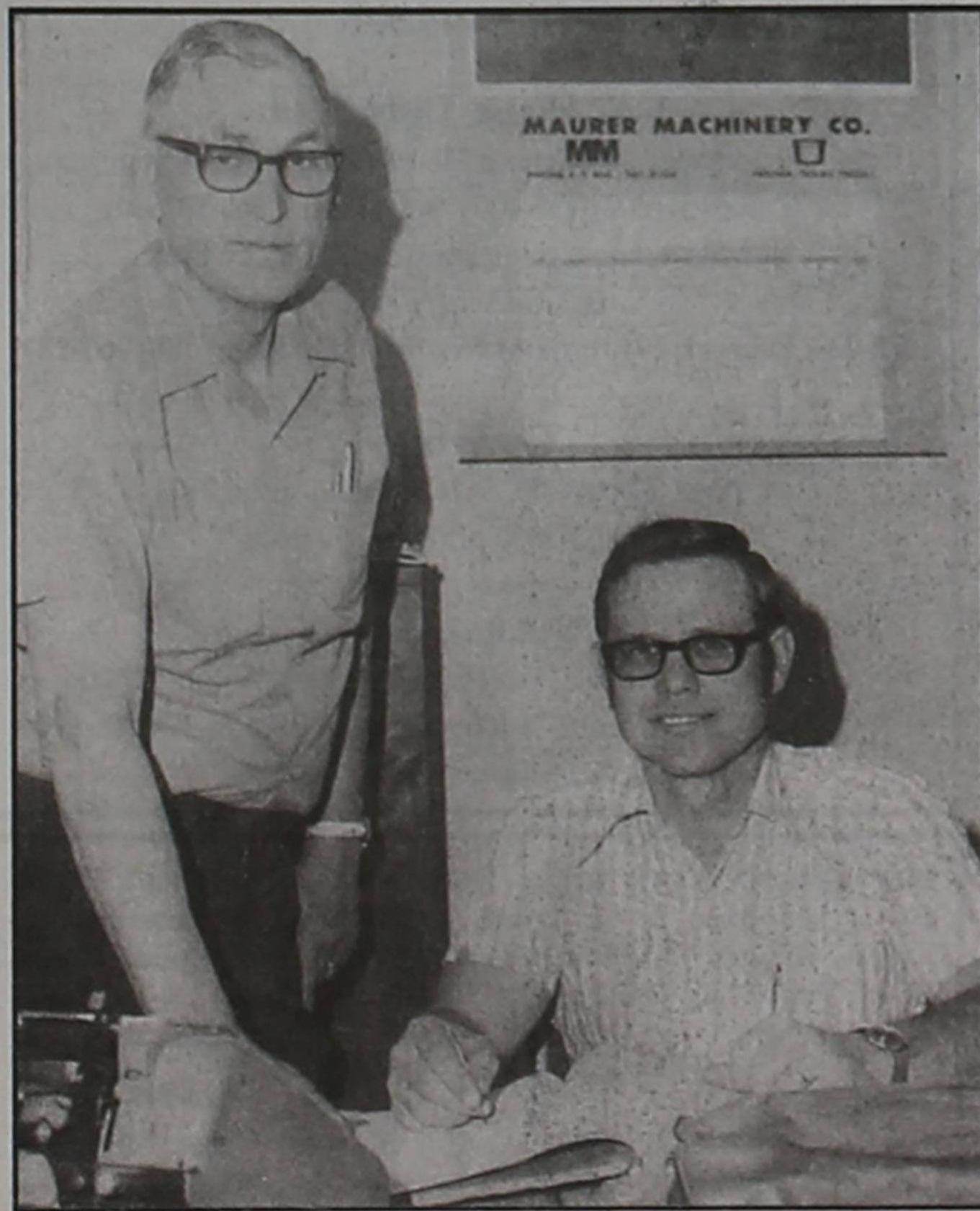
Cindy (Smiley) and Jerry Butman have three children and now reside in Lubbock where Jerry is the manager of the Lubbock Cotton Growers, a state-of-the-art cotton gin facility built in 2009, and Cindy is employed with Farmers Co-Op Compress.

Vickie (Smiley) and Dennis Field are both teachers at Friona ISD where they have a combined total of over 50 years service and have two children. Melba and Ron are also proud to now have a one-year-old great-grandson, Grayson Gutierrez, of El Paso, Texas.

Ron has been a dedicated civic servant for Friona including Jaycees, Chamber of Commerce (Man of the Year in 1980 and Most Courteous Employee),

School Board, Volunteer Fire Department, Little League, as well as serving as an Elder in the Tenth Street Church of Christ, and has given us some of the best years of his life—he is now 72. In the words of Ron Harkey, his former assistant manager, in a 1995 letter to the editor in the Friona Star: "Ron Smiley taught me about the grain business, how to treat customers, how to treat employees, how to serve your community and how to be a good citizen. His example of all these good qualities set a standard that I have tried to do myself. He is a good role model."

"Thanks to all the loyal customers and dedicated employees during my time at Friona Wheat Growers. I appreciate each and every one of you."

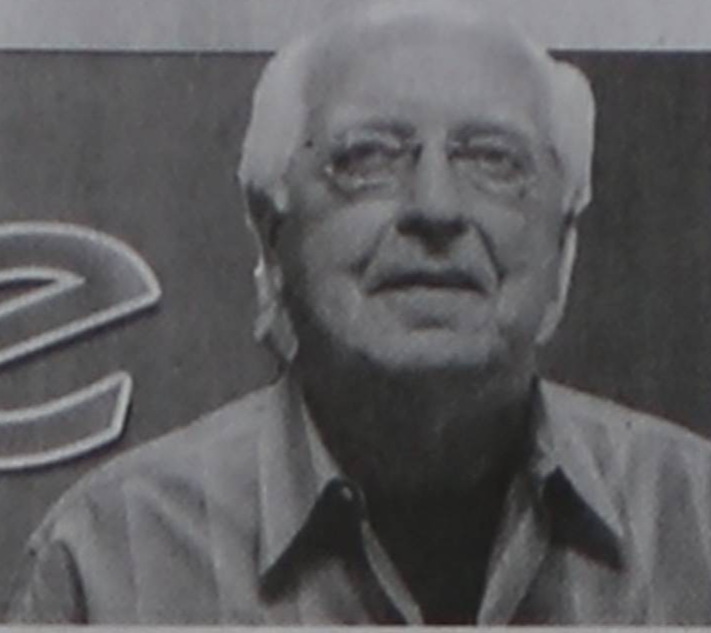

the cemetery fifteen years later

A cemetery is a place of reverence.

It is a place of respect and often a rich source of history. Many people visit old cemeteries as a hobby, exploring historical monuments, taking photos, and researching the history of an area through its previous inhabitants.

Fifteen years ago this week, June 2, 1995, the tornado that swept through Friona did major damage to our cemetery. The gazebo was in tatters, headstones were tossed around and coated with thick mud, and a boxcar used for equipment storage was blown through the cemetery grounds causing damage as it tumbled along.

Almost all of the large old trees and evergreens at the cemetery were damaged beyond saving and had to be pulled up. Later on many trees were replanted and have since grown to add their silent beauty to the hallowed grounds.

Our cemetery has come a long way since 1995. It is an orderly place once again. The gazebo is rebuilt. A new chapel building has been constructed. The sign went up last Friday. Headstones are in their proper place and all is well again for now.

City employees and city manager Patricia Phipps are to be commended for their care of the cemetery, especially during times such as last weekend's Memorial Day observance. The cemetery looked very nice.

American Legion members and the folks who volunteered to help, placed more than 300 flags on graves and along the north fence between the entrance roads. It was indeed a colorful, patriotic remembrance of our veterans. Thanks to Bill Hardin and his volunteer crew for replacing the crosses and flags.

We have a Civil War veteran buried in the Friona Cemetery. His name is Robt.

S. Houlette, born Nov. 24, 1846, died April 2, 1923. His marker says he served in the 10 Ill. Cav. He was local resident Dale Houlette's grandfather. I'll be writing more about Mr. Houlette in subsequent weeks. Interesting story.

We found a couple of 100-year-old markers. They are both for young girls, Joy Flanders 1901-1909, daughter of Charles M. and Louvica C. Flanders. And Geneva Alta Morris, 1894-1908, daughter of W.B. and A.A. Morris. Their markers are side-by-side underneath the cedars on the west side of the cemetery, near the entrance. That is all we know at this point. Anybody shed any light on these two girls let me know.

Was the present cemetery actually a cemetery 100-years ago? We recently celebrated the 100-year centennial of Friona 1908-2008. Back in the era of 1900-

1908 the present location of the cemetery was a long way from Main St. in Friona. There were no paved roads, probably no roads at all. It is fascinating to speculate about life and death back then and when the cemetery became the official cemetery. City manager Patricia Phipps said she is now opening the south end of the cemetery for burial plots. It seems the grounds just south of the flagpole are full or spoken for.

If anyone has knowledge of the early history of the cemetery I would appreciate hearing from you. There are many graves there from back in the 20s and 30s.

I took several photos around the cemetery over the weekend. Always like to visit there when the flags are out. We will post them on our website at frionaonline.com.

Fifteen years later, all is well again at the Friona Cemetery.

In Friona he served on the Administrative Board of the Methodist Church, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, President of the Chamber of Commerce, Chairman of the Steering Committee to build a 60 bed nursing home and upon completion served as first Chairman of the Board of Prairie Acres Nursing Home, Director and past President of the Senior Citizens Organization and the Evening Lions Club. 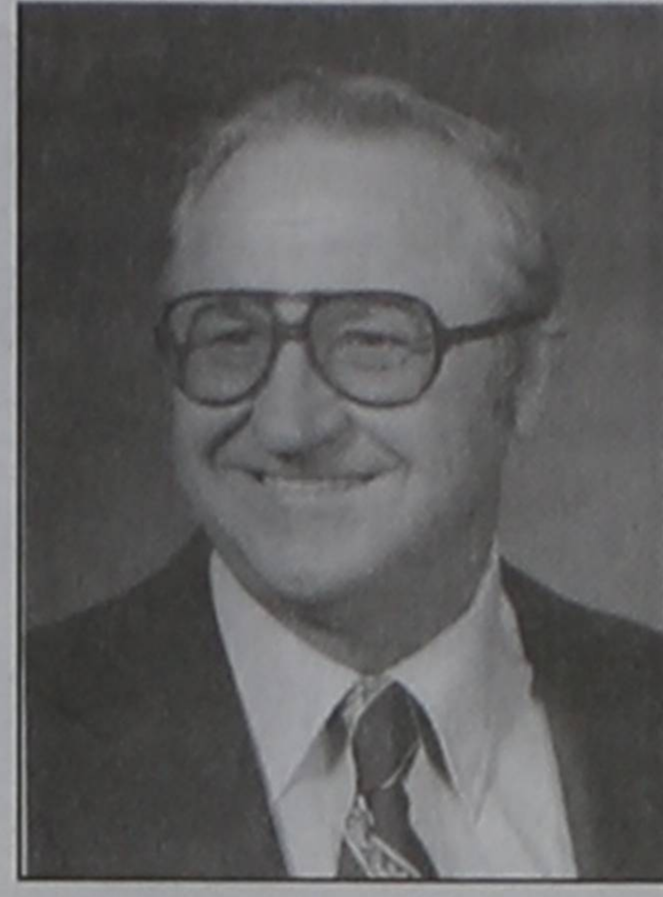
He was preceded in death by his parents; two sisters, Vera Cox and Jewel Parsons; and a brother, Conner Parsons.

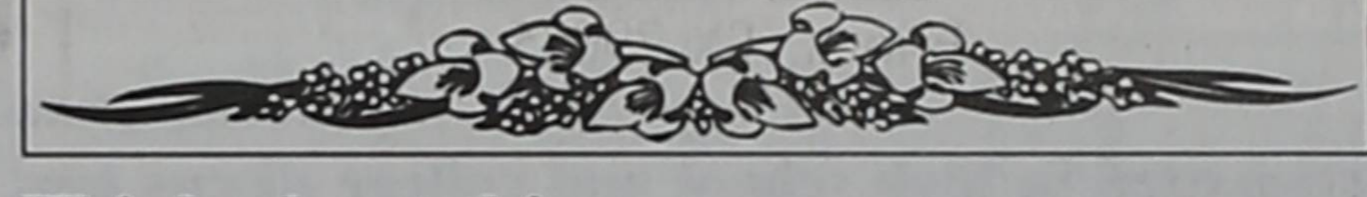

Picking up the pieces and going forward

How do you go on after devastating sin has affected your life? In 1 Samuel 13, Saul sinned, and the consequence was that his family would not rule over Israel after he dies, but until then, he is still king. Unfortunately, though, Saul is crippled by the consequences of his sin and is not focused on his God-given role. He was unwilling to repent or commit and courageously go forward for God, in spite of the consequences.

Thankfully, Jonathan, Saul's son, steps up to the plate just in time, because the Philistine army is set to attack (1 Sam 14:1-23). What follows is God's deliverance, brought about by Jonathan's boldness to pick up the pieces and focus on the battle at hand. His focus was not on the Israelite's inability, but God's ability and agenda to preserve his people. Saul snapped out of his paralysis when he got his focus off of himself and the disadvantages before him, and focused on God's plan for his life, which as a king included leading the troops to war.

Sin and its consequences are devastating, but the key to moving forward is repenting of the sin before God, committing to God's direction for your life, and courageously focusing on it, even though the consequences of sin may linger for a lifetime.

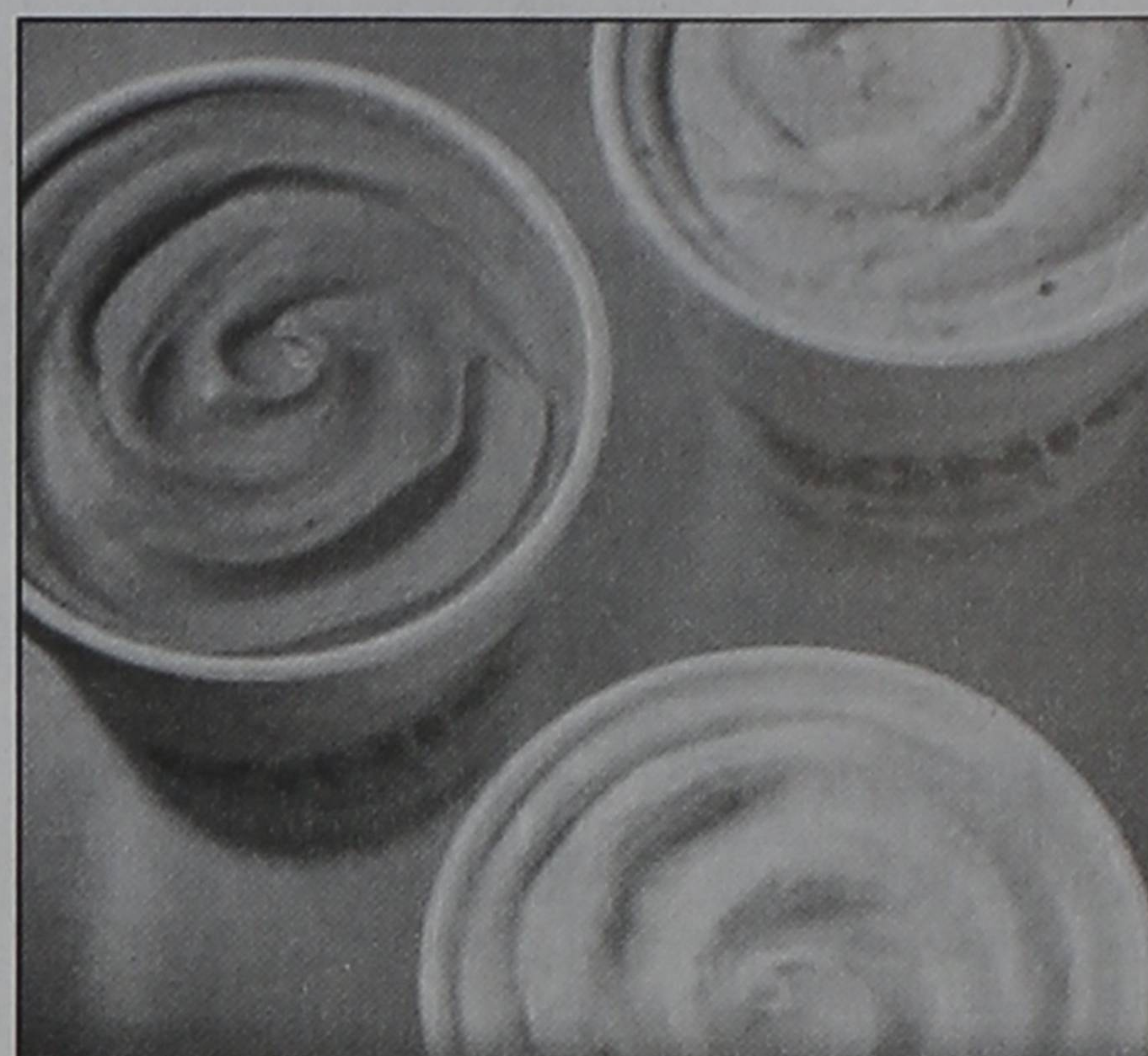

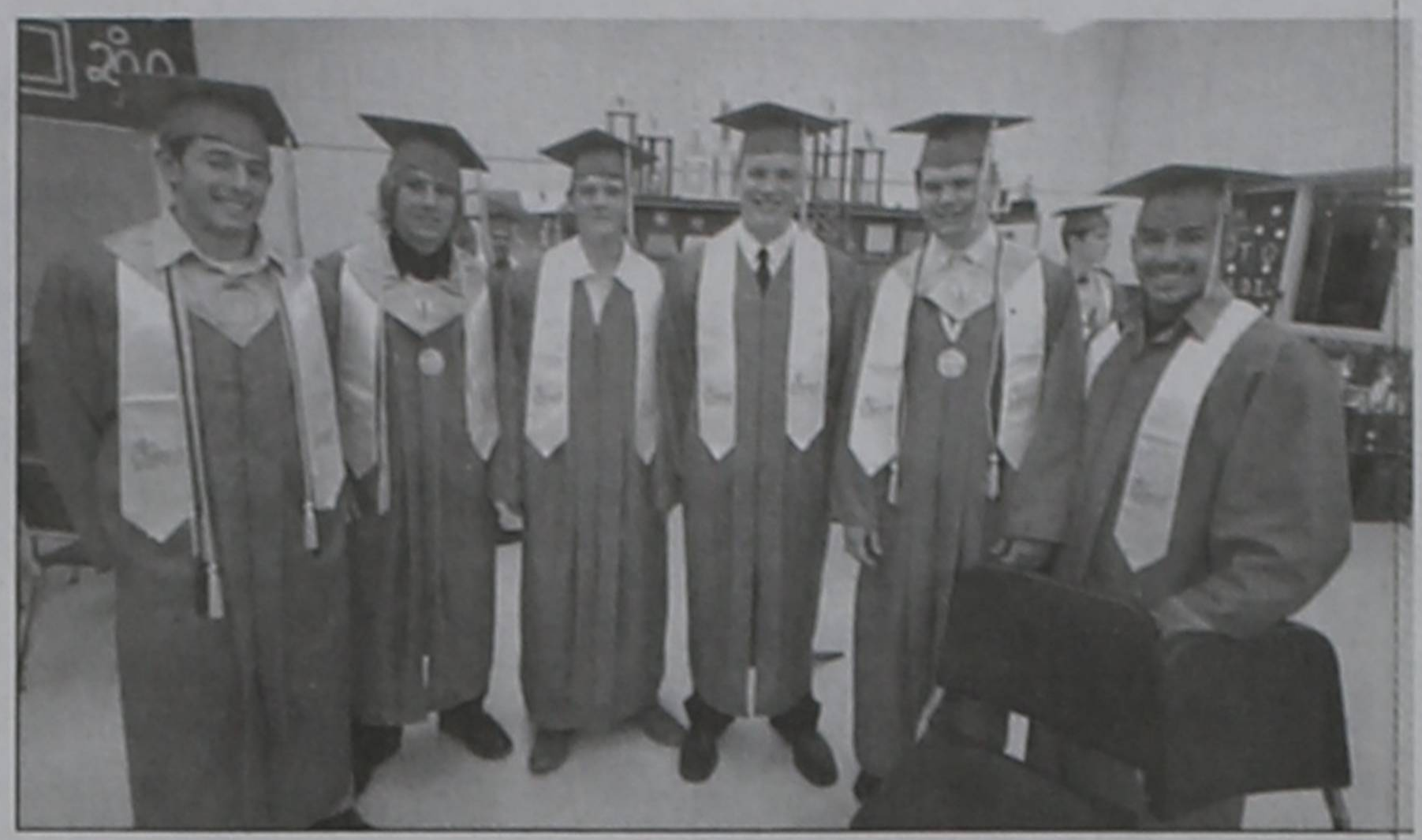
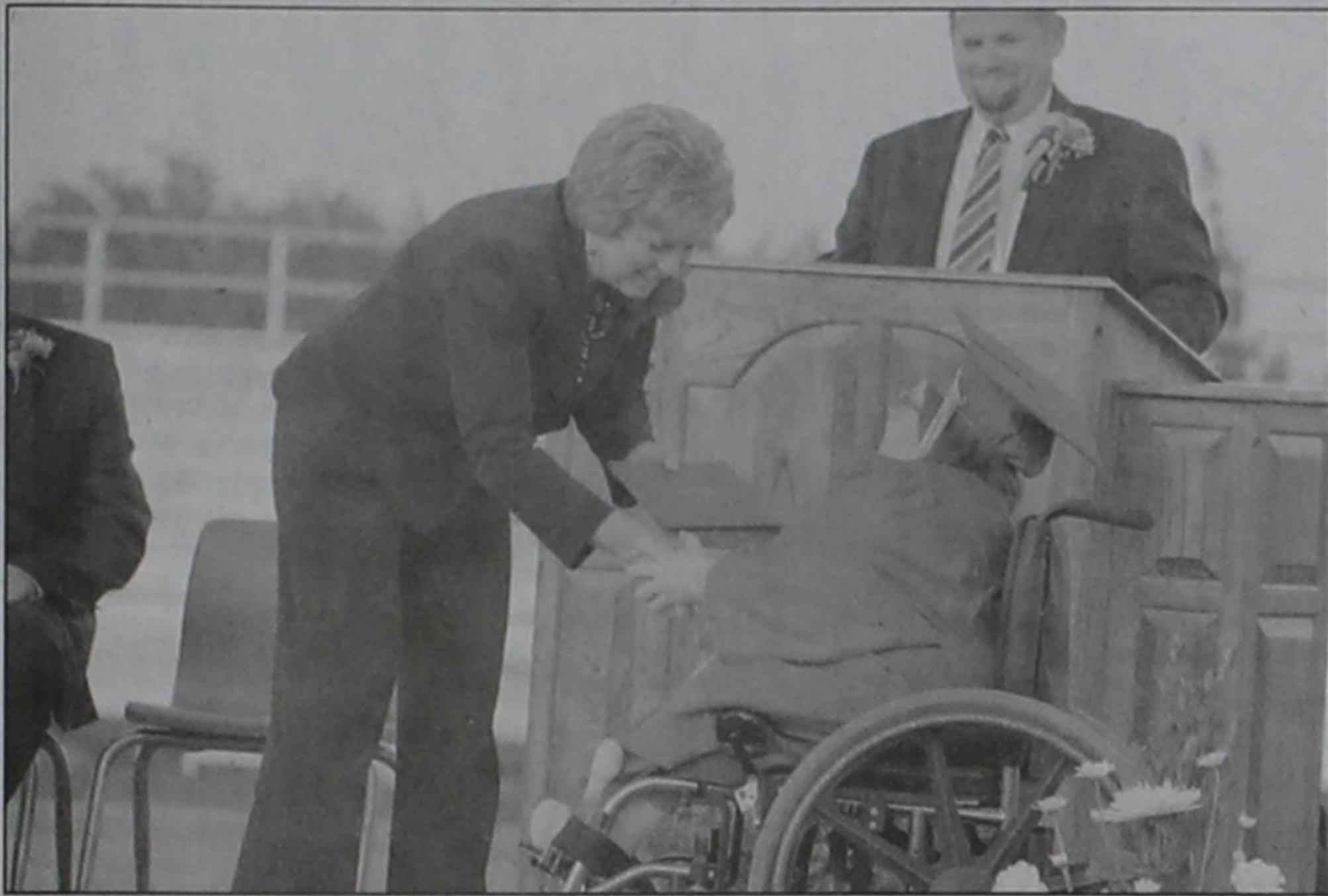
