The truck driven by D.T. King of Friona was involved in a head-on collision 21-miles south of Perryton last Wednesday June 30. King suffered multiple injuries and was flown by helicopter to Northwest Texas Hospital in Amarillo where he remains in critical condition.

Friona man injured in truck collision near Perryton

D.T. King, 77, of Friona, was the driver of a semi-involved in a head-on collision 21 miles south of Perryton on Highway 70 last Wednesday June 30.

According to DPS reports and the Perryton Herald newspaper, a south-

bound tanker truck veered out of its lane when it first entered the curve at the 21-mile corner. It slammed into the left front section of the northbound cattle truck driven by Mr. King. The two trucks were said to have collided at highway

speeds scattering debris over hundreds of yards of the roadway.

According to the Perryton Herald report the cab of King's truck "exploded apart at impact, the diesel engine ripped completely out by the force of the collision."

King's truck was in its lane at impact and when the truck came to rest afterwards.

According to DPS Trooper Rick Martinez, the skid marks were about 50-feet long so the driver had very little time to respond. "Maybe half a second," he said.

The southbound tanker truck was destroyed also. The trailer snapped off and rolled to rest about 25 yards from the truck. Neither of the trucks were loaded. Both drivers were transported by helicopter to Amarillo's Northwest Texas Hospital.

Council to consider community development grant

The Friona city council will meet in regular session at 6:30 p.m. Monday, July 12, at 619 Main St. All council meetings are open to the public. Time is allotted at the beginning of the meeting for public comments. By law the council cannot vote or take action on public comments made at a regular meeting.

The first item of business is a public hearing concerning the submission of an application to the Texas Department of Rural Affairs for a Texas Community Development block grant. (The official public hearing notice is printed elsewhere in this issue of the Star.)

After the public hearing, the council will consider

and take action on Resolution 10.07.12 authorizing submission of an application to the Texas Department of Rural Affairs for the community development fund grant. Also a part of the resolution is authorizing City Manager Patricia Phipps to act as the city's executive officer and authorized representative

in all matters pertaining to the grant program.

The money from the grant, if received, will be used to replace city water lines. The first line replacement will be from the east water plant at 7th and Pierce east to Washington St. Phipps said the long term goal is to replace old lines with 10-inch water

lines to improve the city's water pressure.

The council will consider and take action on the financial statement for June 2010 and the quarterly financial statement ending June 30, 2010.

Agenda items published here are subject to change. The final and official city council agenda is posted at city hall 72 hours prior to the meeting.

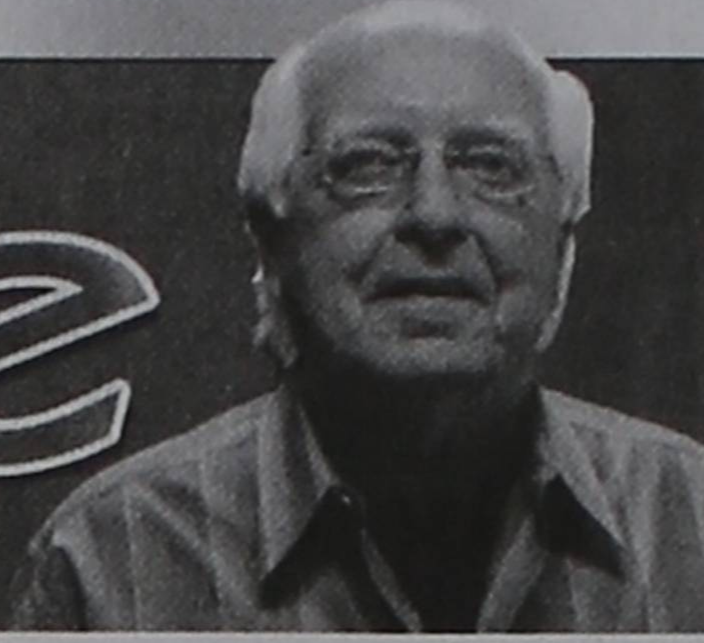

HHS establishes PCIP for Texas.

In case you are not into government speak, the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) has established a new Pre-Existing Condition Insurance Plan (PCIP) for folks unable to obtain health insurance due to a pre-existing health condition.

To qualify for PCIP you have to have been uninsured for at least six months, have been unable to get health coverage because of a health condition, and be a U.S. citizen or residing in the United States legally.

States were given the option of administering the plan themselves or letting the government do it. Texas elected to let the US government operate the program. There is no matching fund requirement. The US government will cover the entire cost of the PCIP. Twenty-one states elected to let the government operate the plan while twenty-nine states will operate their own program.

The government set aside \$5 billion to run the

PCIP until 2014 when all insurance companies are banned from discriminating due to pre-existing conditions. Of course \$5 billion will not be enough to cover this type of insurance for the next three years.

In simple terms, the government will provide pre-existing condition insurance for the next three years, until 2014 when the Affordable Care Act kicks in. In 2014 insurers are banned from discriminating and individuals and small businesses will have access to more affordable private insurance through Exchanges. The HHS press release also says, "In 2014, members of Congress will also purchase their insurance through Exchanges."

I believe that about as much as I believe anything the government says. In the three years between now and 2014 it is possible Congress could tweak the Affordable Care Act to their advantage.

The HHS says PCIP will offer comprehensive coverage at a reasonable price. It is fashioned after

the children's insurance CHIP program. The PCIP will cover primary and specialty care, hospital care, and prescription drugs. Eligibility is not based on income and the PCIP does not charge a higher premium because of a medical condition.

Here is what the official HHS position says: "Participants will pay a premium that is not more than the standard individual health insurance premium in their state for major medical and prescription drug expenses with some cost-sharing."

Whether the average Texan in need of pre-existing condition insurance can afford the premiums at any price remains to be seen. A Fox News report Monday estimated the PCIP could cost many families around \$900 per month in premium payments. On the other hand, that may be a bargain. If a family member has a condition that costs several hundred thousand dollars, maybe even a million, a year, \$900 per month is a good deal, but only if you have the

\$900.

Enrollment for Texans is now open effective July 1. Apply by July 15 to begin coverage by August 1. Information on how to apply for PCIP is available at www.HealthCare.gov where Texans will be linked directly to the federal application page.

I browsed the website. Application looks simple enough. About 7 pages. Here is an important requirement: you have to submit a letter from an insurance company that denied coverage due to a pre-existing condition (see qualifications in paragraph 2 above).

You also have to submit proof of citizenship or legal immigrant status. The application is submitted to an office in New Orleans and they will let you know if you are accepted and how much your monthly premiums will be.

I hope this is a helpful solution for those who suffer severe physical and economical pain from serious illness. I hope it is. We'll see.

Good luck. Good health. Long life.

Rice, water, eggs, veggies

In the Bovina First Baptist Church's Fruit of the Spirit cookbook, on page 77, is a recipe submitted by Darlene Miller. It is called Fried Rice but closer scrutiny reveals an interesting dish with lots of "stuff" in it. You should try it. Sounds like fun cooking and mixing it all up.

Fried Rice

- 1/2 lb beef
- 1/2 sm. onion
- 2 tbsp margarine
- 1 cup brown rice
- 1 cup long grained rice
- 2 cups water
- 2 eggs finely scrambled
- 1 box each, frozen peas and carrots
- 3 tbsp soy sauce

Saute beef and onion in 2 tablespoons margarine for 15 minutes or until brown. Add rice, water, and eggs. Simmer for 20 minutes and add vegetables. Add the soy sauce and salt and pepper to taste.

To use Repeat Dialing:

1. After you receive a busy signal, hang up the phone.
2. Pick up the phone and dial *66. If the line is still busy, the number of the last call you dialed will be called back for 30 minutes.
3. As soon as the line becomes available, your telephone will ring with a different ringing pattern to alert you. Simply pick up the phone, and the number that was busy earlier will be ringing.

To turn off repeat dialing:
If at any time after you have dialed *66, you decide you don't want to call the busy number back, pick up the phone and dial *86 to cancel your request.

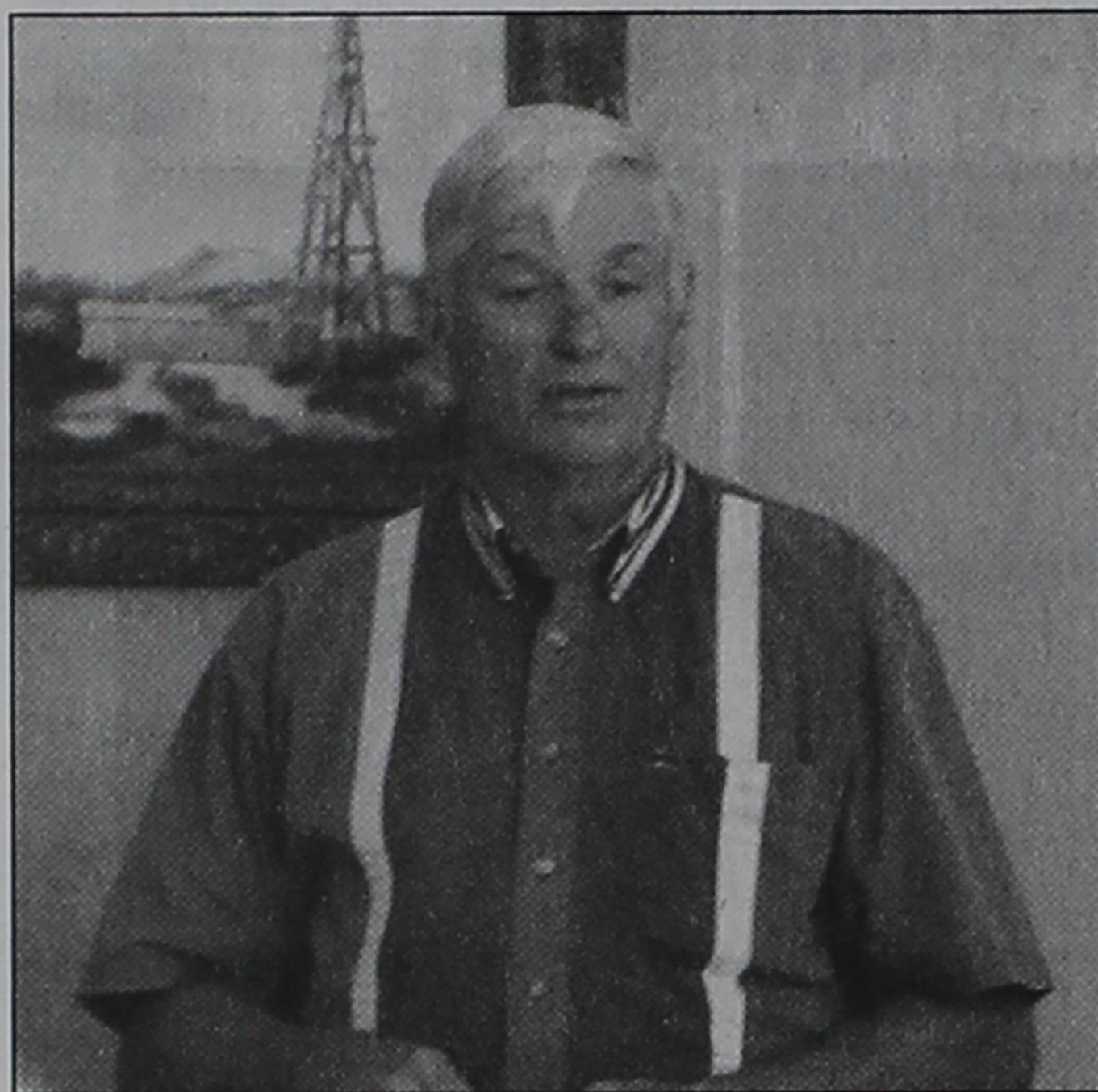

DRT help to trace Texas ancestry

General James Smith Chapter of Daughters of the Republic of Texas in Lubbock will spend July and August assisting others in tracing and documenting Texas ancestral lineage prior to the 19th day of February, 1846.

The Lubbock DRT Chapter presently includes membership from twenty South Plains and other Texas cities, and from the states of New Mexico, Iowa, and Florida.

In April of this year, the Chapter dedicated a Real Daughter Memorial Medallion at the graveside of Ida Ball Ellis in the City of Lubbock Cemetery.

Mrs. Ellis's parents lived in Texas during the ten-year period between 1836 and 1846 when the State was known as The Republic of Texas. Her father, Dr. Isaac Mitchell Ball, from Barber County, Alabama, arrived in the Republic of Texas in 1839 and practiced medicine in Bowie County. Mrs. Ellis's mother, Lou Corley Ball, arrived in 1844 from Tennessee. Mrs. Ellis became a charter member of the Lubbock DRT chapter in 1954, known as General James Smith Chapter.

Pipeline Group dinner program in Muleshoe

The Pipeline Group's annual "Public Education - Contractor Awareness Program" will be held at 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, August 10, 2010, at the Bailey County Exhibition Center, 2206 W. American Boulevard, in Muleshoe, Texas. The program will be sponsored by a group of companies with a common goal of preventing accidents and damages to underground pipelines and utilities.

A free dinner will be catered by Homestyle Cooking and Catering for all persons involved in excavation related activities in Bailey, Castro, Lamb, and Parmer counties. Following the dinner, a brief safety program will be presented which stresses the importance of accident prevention by identifying pipeline and utility rights of way, use of one-call systems, and the importance of working with pipeline and utility companies to safely excavate in the vicinity of underground facilities.

The Texas law requiring notification to a one-call system before excavating will be discussed. Sponsors will provide promotional materials, including notification information for their companies, safety related brochures and other safety reminders.

Each year many lives are injured or lost, plus millions of dollars in repairs and lost products are incurred due to "third party" incidents - someone digging into a pipeline. Thousands of communications, some life-threatening, may be disrupted when expensive fiber-optic cables are damaged or severed. These types of excavation can be financially devastating to the responsible party. This safety program is an attempt to help those who do excavation work, to avoid such situations.

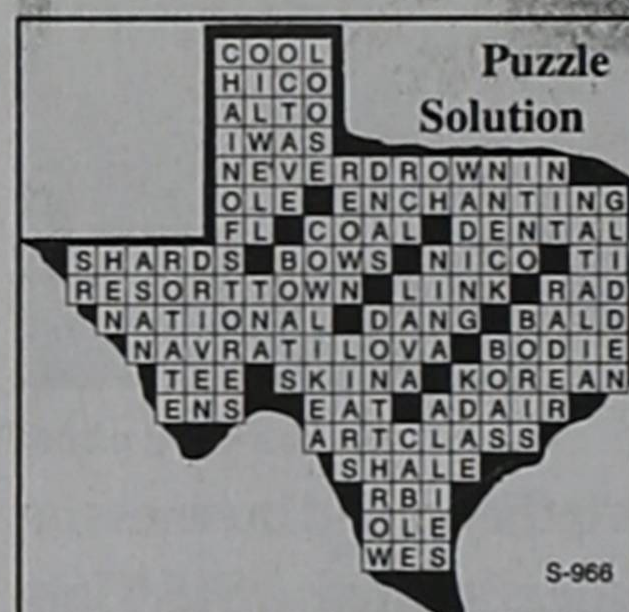

Special guests included members and families of the Pens and Pages Writer's Guild who also hosted a luncheon for the author and his wife, Jody. Rooster

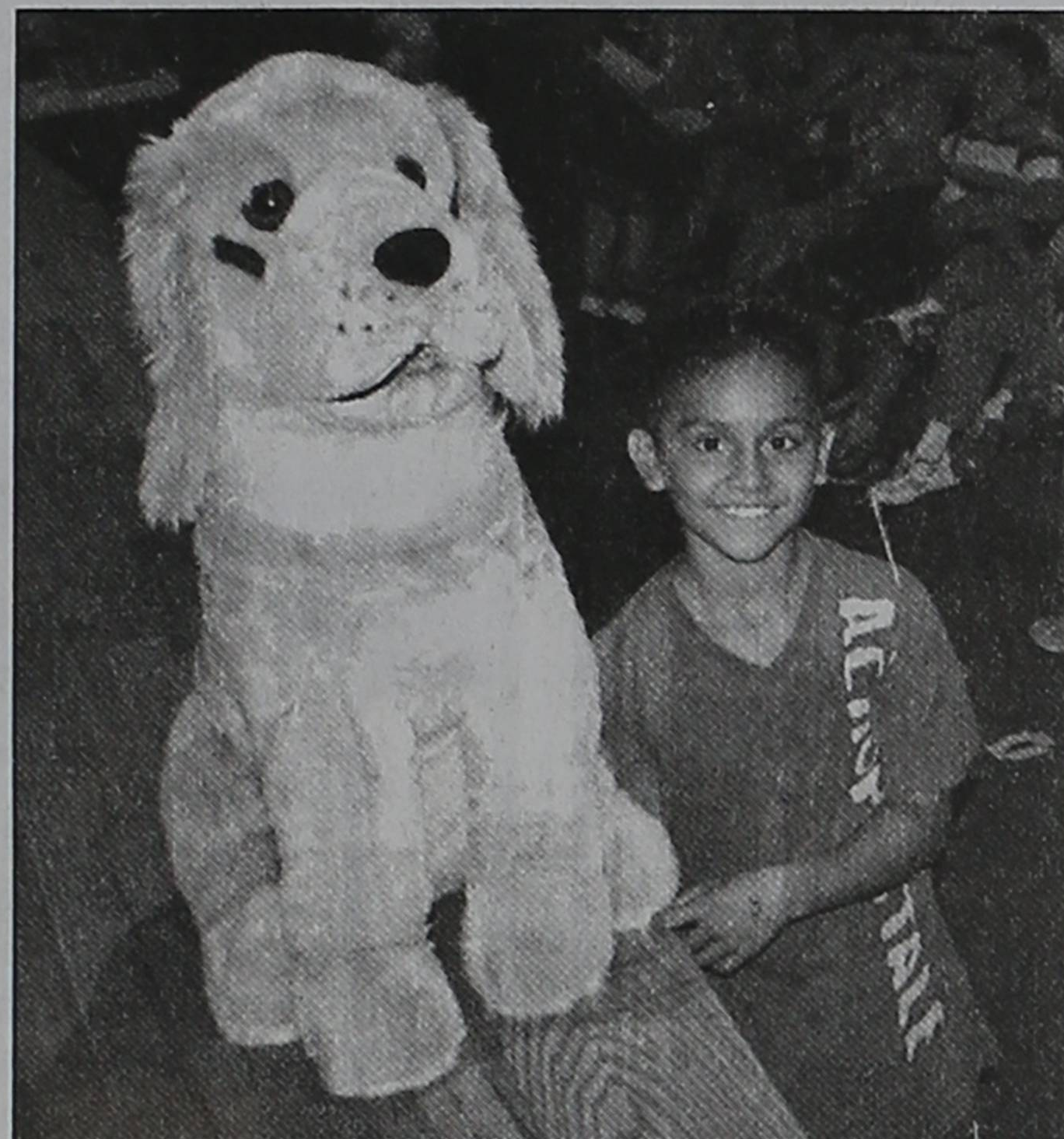

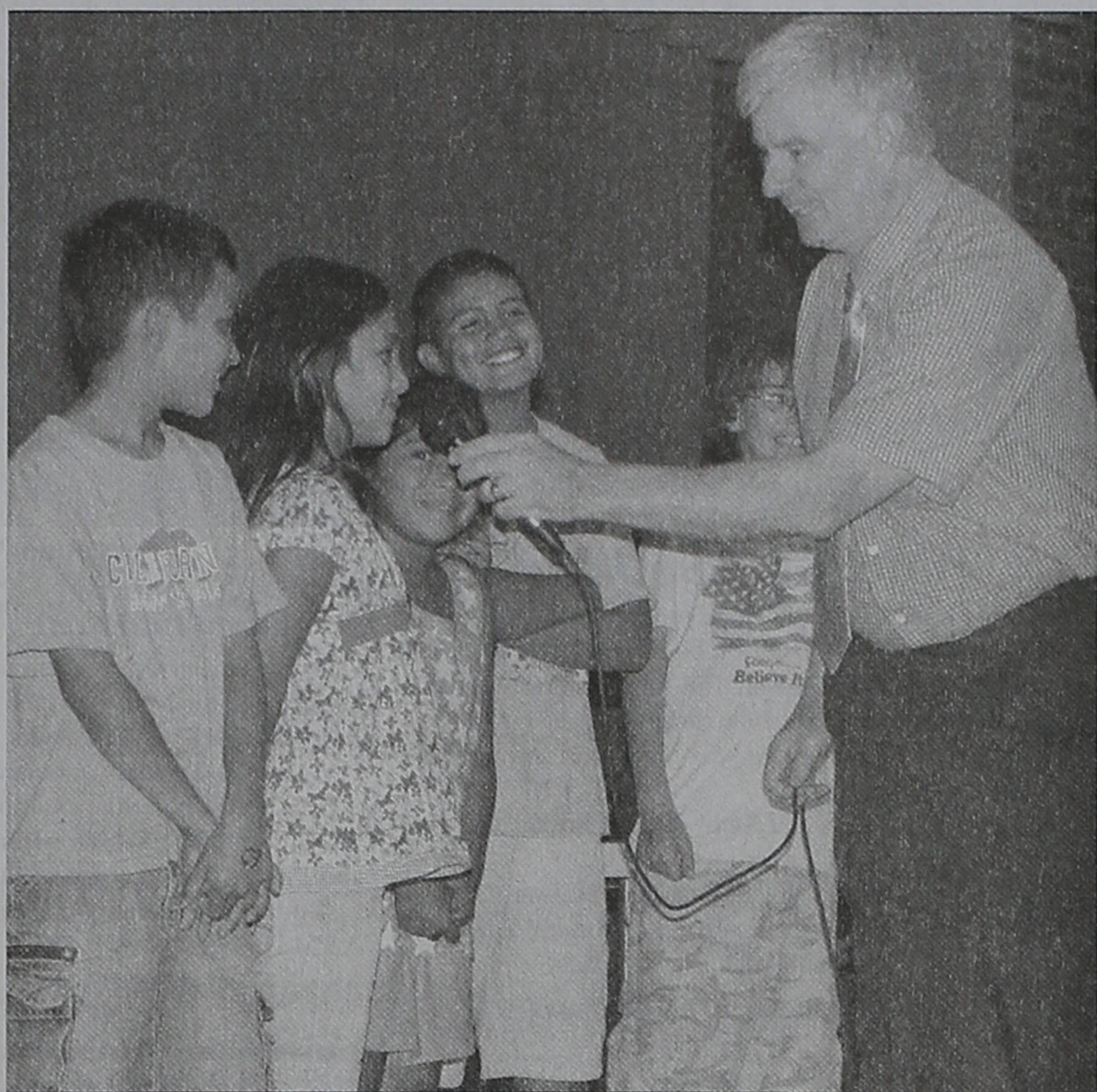
Morris, as well as a t-shirt, backpacks, pens and rulers. Rover, the reading dog mascot, donated by Thomas Reed, also found a home.

Car show at Cheeseburger Cook-Off

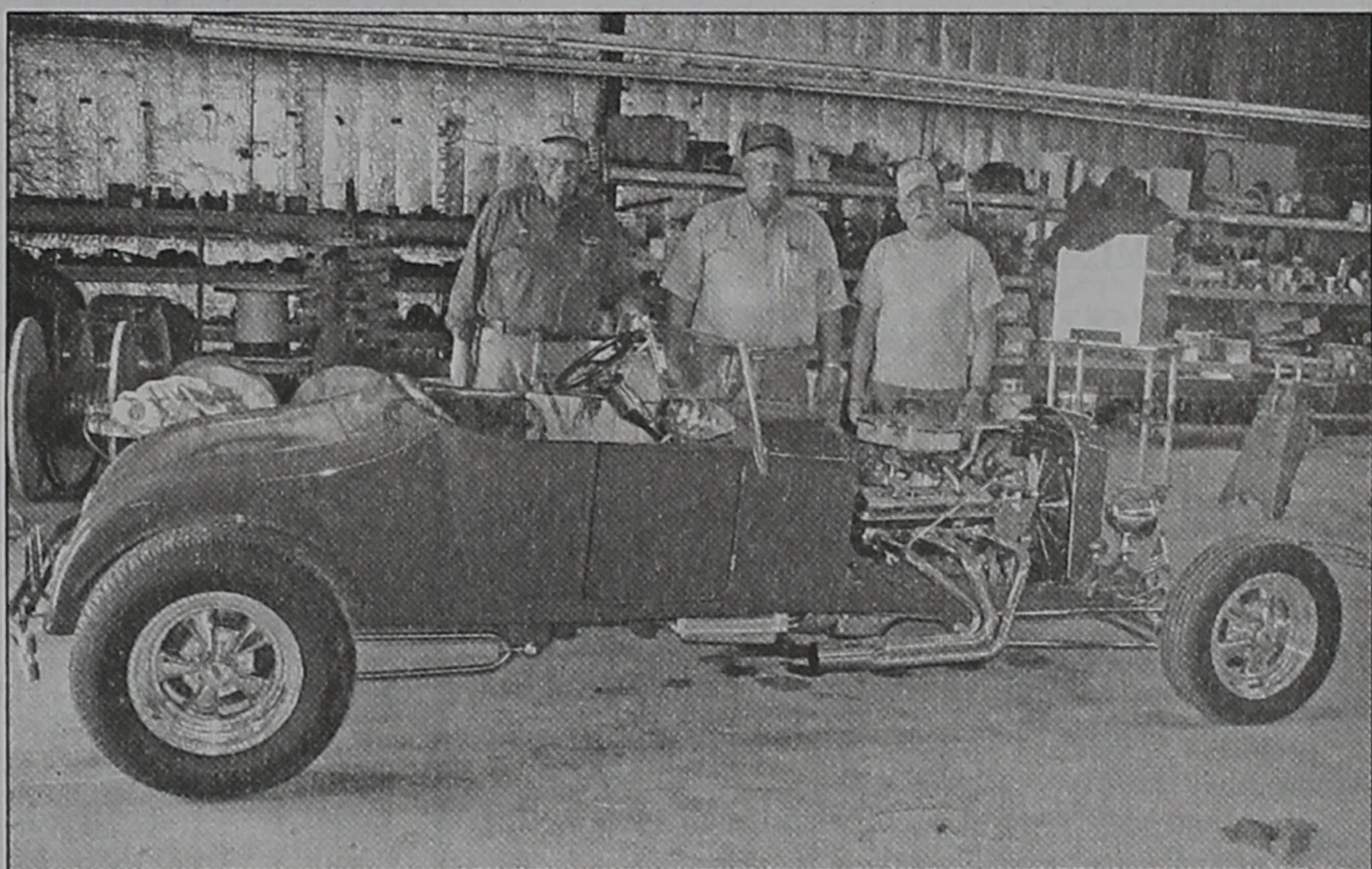

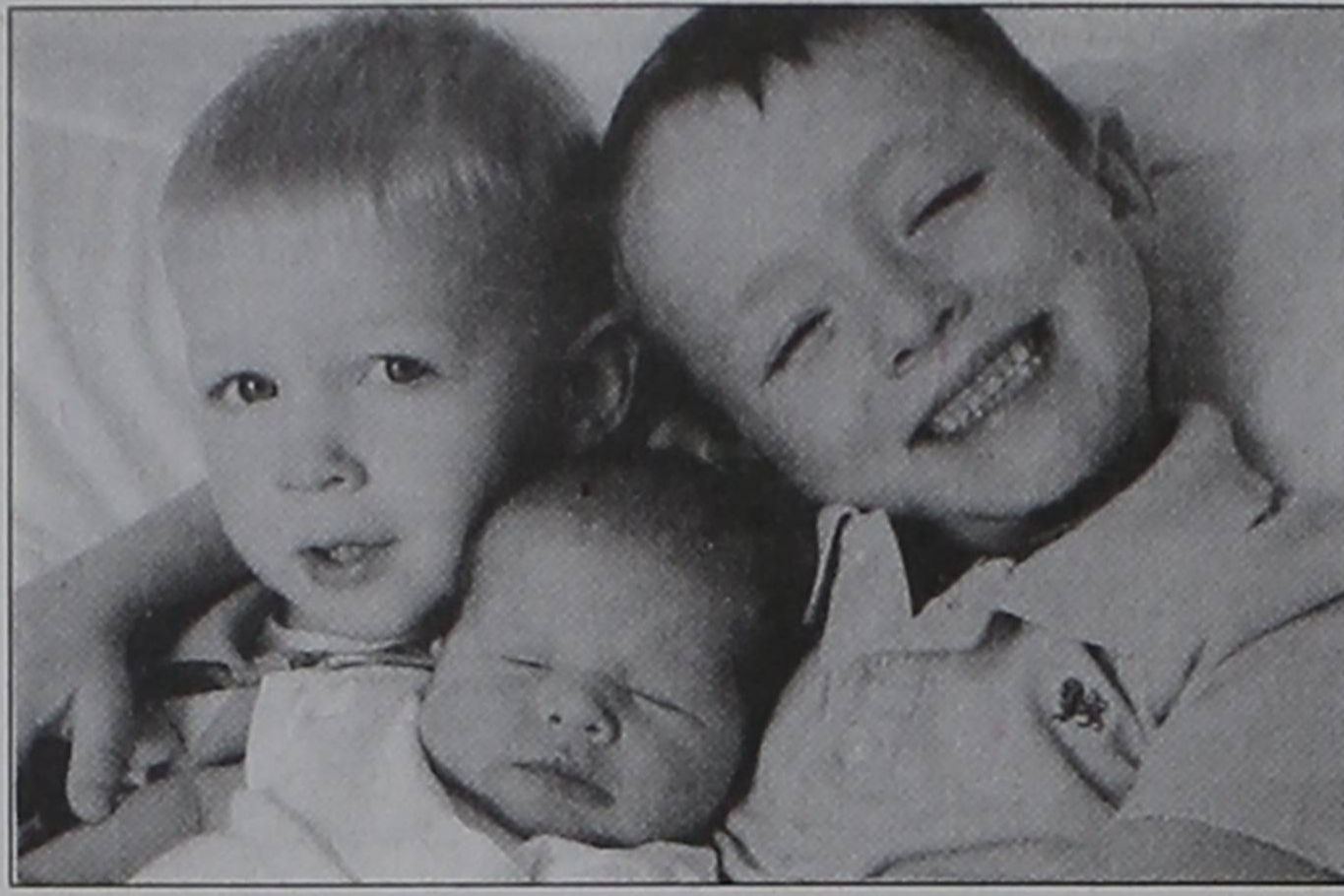

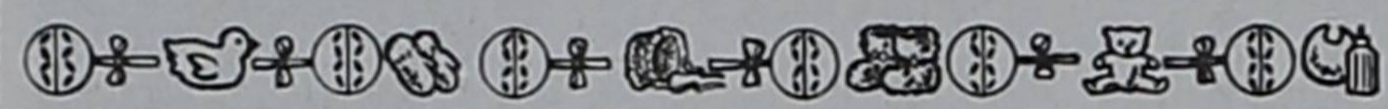

Moses then uses several word pictures to identify the brevity of man: "Dust; watch in the night; flood; grass". The point, life is short. Verses 3-6 are very somber statements about life. Even in the shortness of life's span, it is filled with trouble. All of our secret sins are exposed in the eyes of God's omniscience.

How are we to deal with all of this? We are to number our days, consider what we're doing with our life. We should use the little time we have wisely.

Moses concludes with a prayer asking God to invest the labors of His people with meaning, significance and purpose.

We need to connect our work with God's work and thus glorify His name with our lives.
