## All Friona campuses earn Recognized status

Friona ISD superintendent Kenny Austin has announced that Friona ISD and all campuses received state accountability ratings of Recognized for 2009-2010. The district and all campuses also met federal Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) criteria.

Austin said Friona ISD was rated as a Recognized District for 2009-2010. All sub-groups (all students, white, Hispanic, African American, and economically disadvantaged) in grades 3-11 had an overall passing rate of 80% or higher in reading/English language

arts, math, science, social studies, and writing or met required improvement over last year.

The completion rates for students in grades 9-12 was 96.2%. The largest improvement for the overall district came in math passing rates,

which increased from 77% to 82%.

To meet AYP a district or campus must have passing rates above 67% in math and 73% in reading/English language arts in grades 3-8 and grade 10 and participation rates of 95%. Subgroups for

AYP include all students, white, Hispanic, African American, economically disadvantaged, special education, and limited English proficient (LEP).

Superintendent Austin said, "Congratulations to all FISD staff on a job well done."

## Record potential for 2010 cotton crop

Shawn Wade of Plains Cotton Growers in Lubbock reports that 2010 could have record breaking potential for U.S. cotton production.

A recent USDA crop production report indicated that there is a potential 52% increase in U.S. cotton production in 2010 over 2009. Fortunately for High Plains producers, who are ex-

pected to produce one in every three bales on 2010 U.S. cotton, the news is what many expected and hoped for.

"Taking a closer look at the number," Wade said, "it appears growers who opted to switch back into cotton made a great decision as price and demand forecasts have steadily improved throughout

the year while cotton stocks have been dropping worldwide."

Overall U.S. growers planted about 40% more acres in 2010 than they devoted to the crop in 2009. Production prospects on the increased acres are good in most areas culminating in a forecast of 18 million bales, 52% more cotton than

was produced in 2009.

Texas prospects are among the brightest in the land, according to Wade, with 5.5 million Upland acres headed for harvest. According to the USDA the state is poised to produce just over 8.8 million bales, 300,000 more than the state's current record production level of 8.48 million bales

set in 2005.

Wade says good growing conditions and timely rains over the next 6-8 weeks could still push yield forecasts for a majority of the Texas crop higher. However, prospects could be dampened just as quickly if the region's September weather pattern does not cooperate, he said.

## Zachary's old wood crosses will stir memories at the all-school reunion

Ex-students registering for the all-school reunion will take home a piece of school history thanks to Friona resident Gene Zachary. The All-School Centennial Reunion will be held September 10-11 in conjunction with Maize Days.

Zachary, a 1959 FHS graduate, makes crosses as a hobby. For several years he has fashioned crosses from nails which he sells at various craft shows in the area. He also enjoys working with wood.

Zachary and his wife Karon both retired from the Friona Independent School District in 2005. He was an 18-year employee and Karon retired after 20-years. During his tenure with the district, Zachary recovered some wood from the original 1950 high school gym floor (now the junior high gym) and from the original high school football field bleachers.

The current junior high gym served as the high school gym from 1950 to 1965. In 1980 the gym floor was replaced and some of the wood, which Zachary thinks was milled around 1940, was salvaged and stored in the attic above the gym and auditorium. The junior high gym during the 1950-65 period was where the junior high band hall is now.

The wooden bleachers at the football field were installed

in 1965 and remained until replaced with aluminum seating. Zachary says over the years the wooden bleachers were repainted several times with red or gray. A few years back he recovered some of the bleacher wood from Richard Bermea, whose construction company replaced the wood bleachers with aluminum.

Zachary has turned the historic wood into crosses of various sizes. Many of the bleacher crosses still have original red paint on them. His wife Karon makes jewelry, which also incorporates the nail crosses.

The Zacharys will have a booth in the city park during the September 11 Maize Days celebration selling their crosses and jewelry. He has put together a set of two 3" crosses, one each from the bleachers and gym floor. He also has larger crosses made from the old wood. They hope to see many ex-students in the park and later at the all-school reunion.

A special treat is in store for ex-students at the all-school reunion. Zachary has fashioned over 400 small crosses, about 1 1/2 x 2 1/4 inches, from the 1950 gym floor wood and each ex-student registering at the junior high cafeteria on September 11 for the all-school

reunion will receive one.

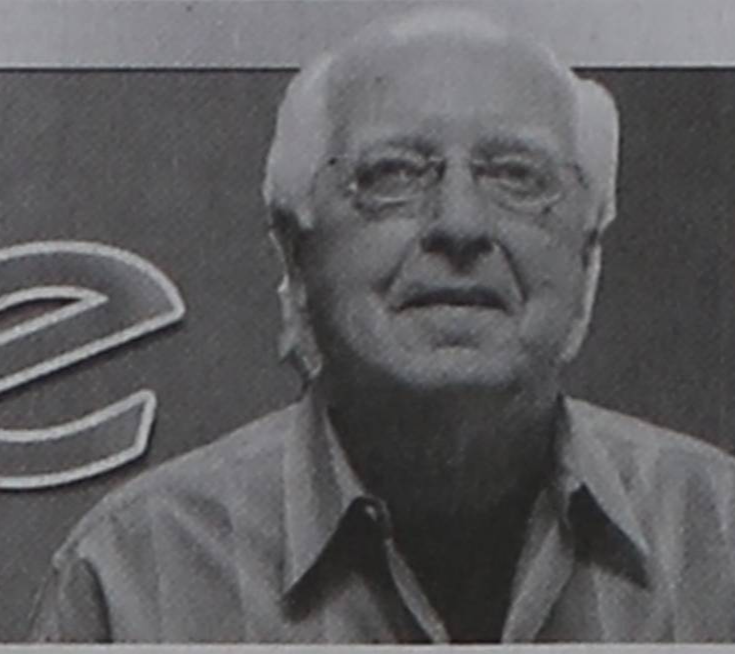

## to mosque or not to mosque

Cassius Clay became Muhammad Ali. Lew Alcindor turned into Kareem Abdul Jabbar.

The name changes of these two guys were the first time I ever remember hearing anything about Muslims. Didn't know much about it back then and still don't.

Have no idea of the difference between Muslim and Islam. But then I don't get the difference between Baptist, Catholic, and Church of Christ either. I do know that when you convert from one Christian religion to another you don't have to change your name.

I thought it was pretty weird these two athletes would mess up their names and I remember wondering why they did it but I didn't dwell on it for long. Not sure there was a reasonable explanation other than they had converted to the Muslim religion.

## Cover your dogs with beef

Celery, onion, brown sugar, and cornstarch. Just a few of the ingredients for a jazzy sweet hot dog topping. Remember this recipe comes from a Church Supper Cookbook which means it will feed a bunch of folks. Betty Ann Miller of Holmesville, Ohio, says, "Jazz up plain hot dogs by topping them with this slightly sweet meat sauce. They're a lot more filling and everyone comments on the great flavor."

Looks like a crumbled up hamburger/hot dog combination to me. Probably sloppy but good. Might want to squeeze some mustard on top even though the recipe doesn't call for it. What's a hot dog without mustard.

About five packs of dog buns and weenies and off you go to the church social. Or to a big backyard party. After all, football season will soon be here.

### Coney dogs for a crowd

Serving: 32-40

- 2 lbs ground meat
- 2 celery ribs chopped
- 1 medium onion chopped
- 1/4 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/4 cup cornstarch
- 1 tsp salt
- 1/4 tsp pepper
- 1 bottle (32 oz) ketchup
- 2 cups tomato juice
- 4 pkgs (1 lb each) hot dogs
- 32-40 hot dog buns

1. In a large saucepan, cook the beef, celery, and onion until meat is no longer pink: Combine the brown sugar, cornstarch, salt and pepper; stir into beef mixture. Add ketchup and tomato juice. Bring to a boil; cook and stir for 2 minutes or until thickened. Reduce heat; simmer, uncovered, for 15-20 minutes or until heated through.
2. Cook the wieners according to package instructions; place on buns. Top each with about 1/4 cup of the beef mixture.

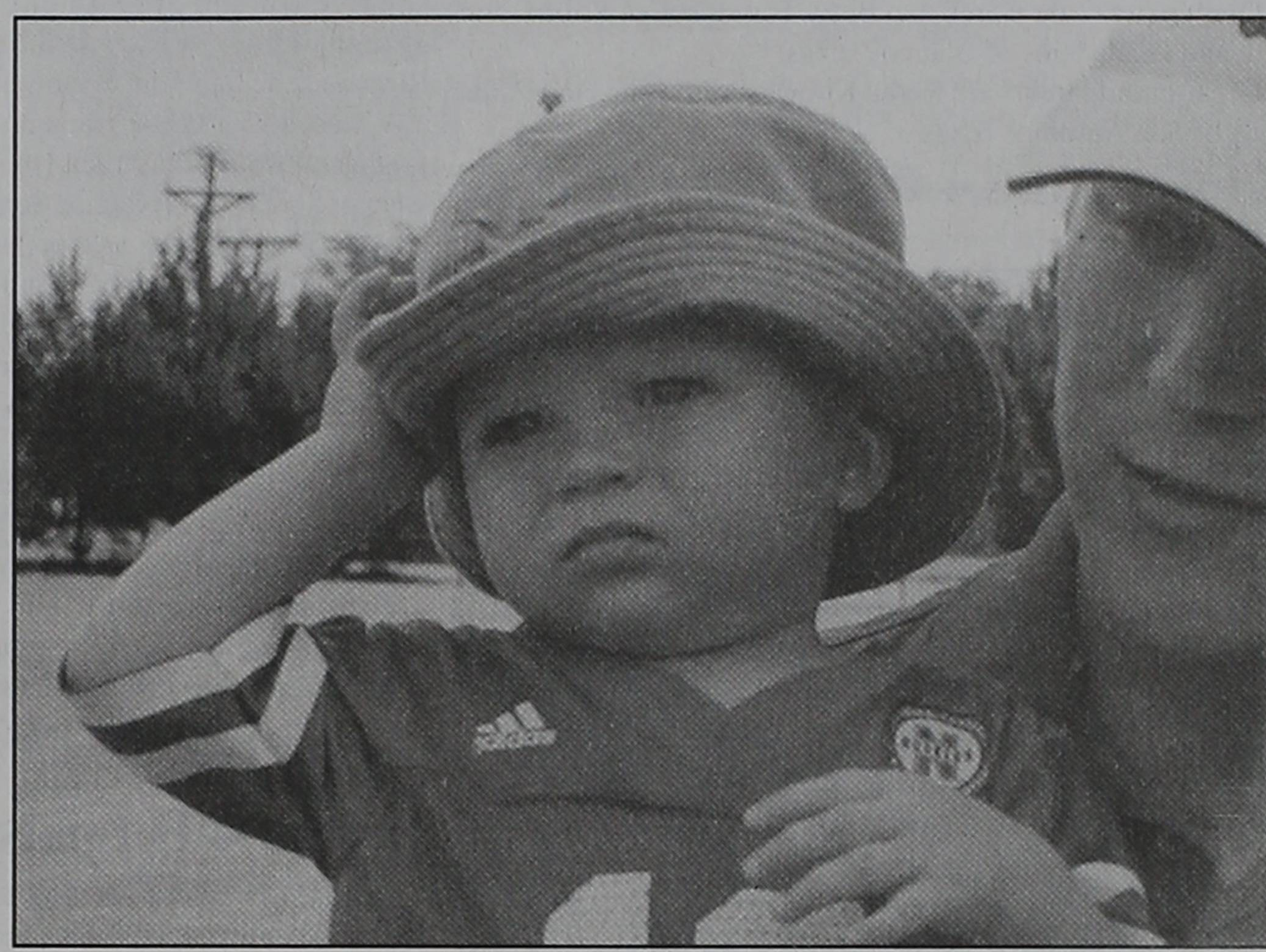
A group from the Hereford Church of the Nazarene recently returned

## County sales tax received

Texas Comptroller Susan Combs said state sales tax revenue in July was \$1.69 billion, up 2.2 percent compared to one year ago.

"Total monthly sales tax revenue has now exceeded year-ago levels for the last four months," Combs said. "Sales tax collections in major sectors such as retail trade, the oil and natural gas industry and construction are up from a year ago. We are monitoring these sectors to see if collections are returning to consistent growth."

August sales tax allocations represent sales taxes collected in June by businesses that file sales taxes monthly, and sales taxes collected in April, May and June by quarterly filers.

Parmer County's August 2010 payment totaled \$47,778.07 broken down as Bovina \$8,666.06; Farwell \$8,950.51; and Friona \$30,161.50. In August 2009 the tax payment total was \$42,702.40.

Comparing tax receipts from the same period last year, payments were up 11.88%, broken down as Bovina 13.26%; Farwell 8.01%; and Friona 12.68%. For the year, Parmer County cities have received a total of \$324,169.61 as compared to \$328,431.66 for the same period last year, a -1.29% change.

Due to the Labor Day holiday, the Comptroller's next sales tax allocations will be delayed until Monday, September 13.

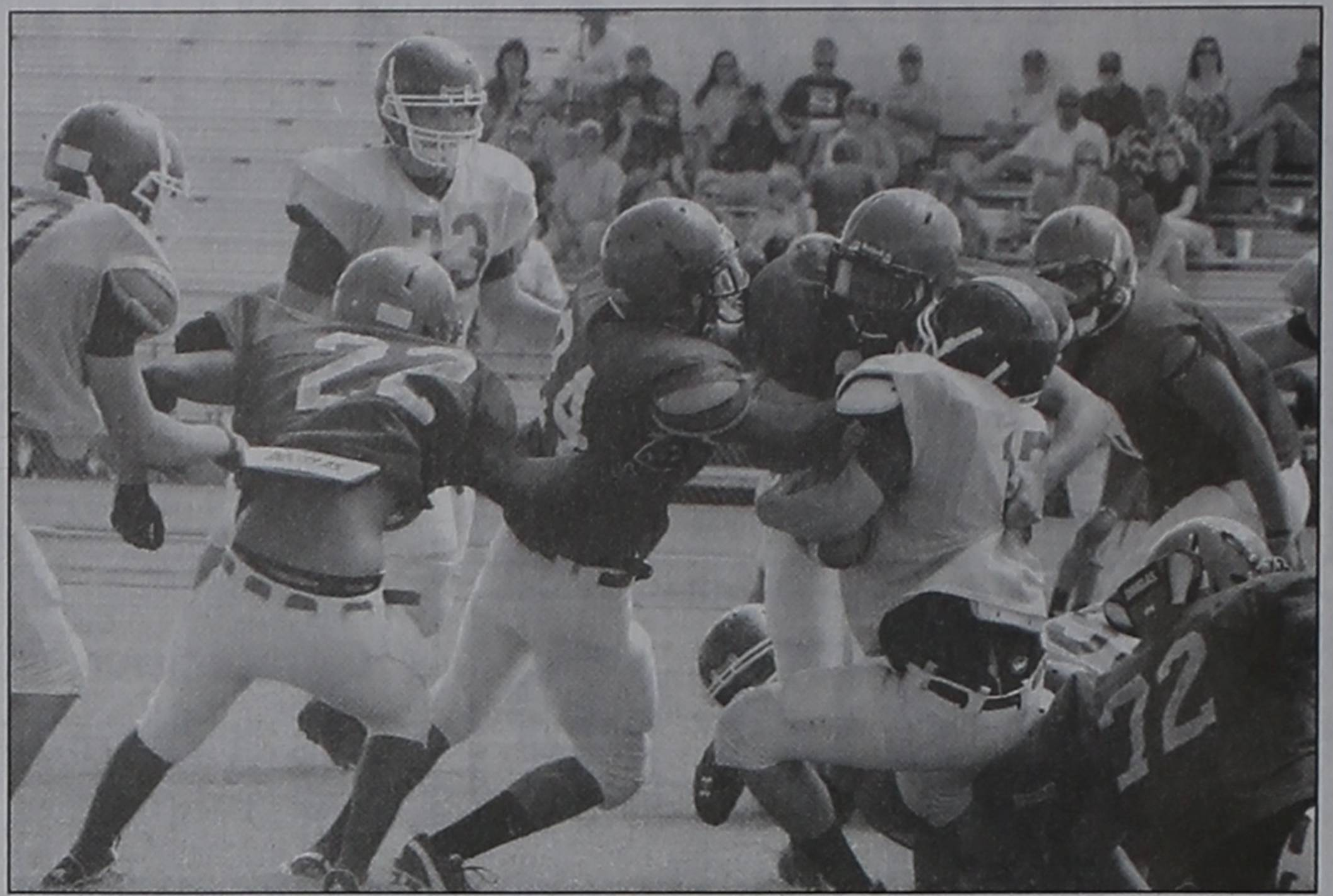

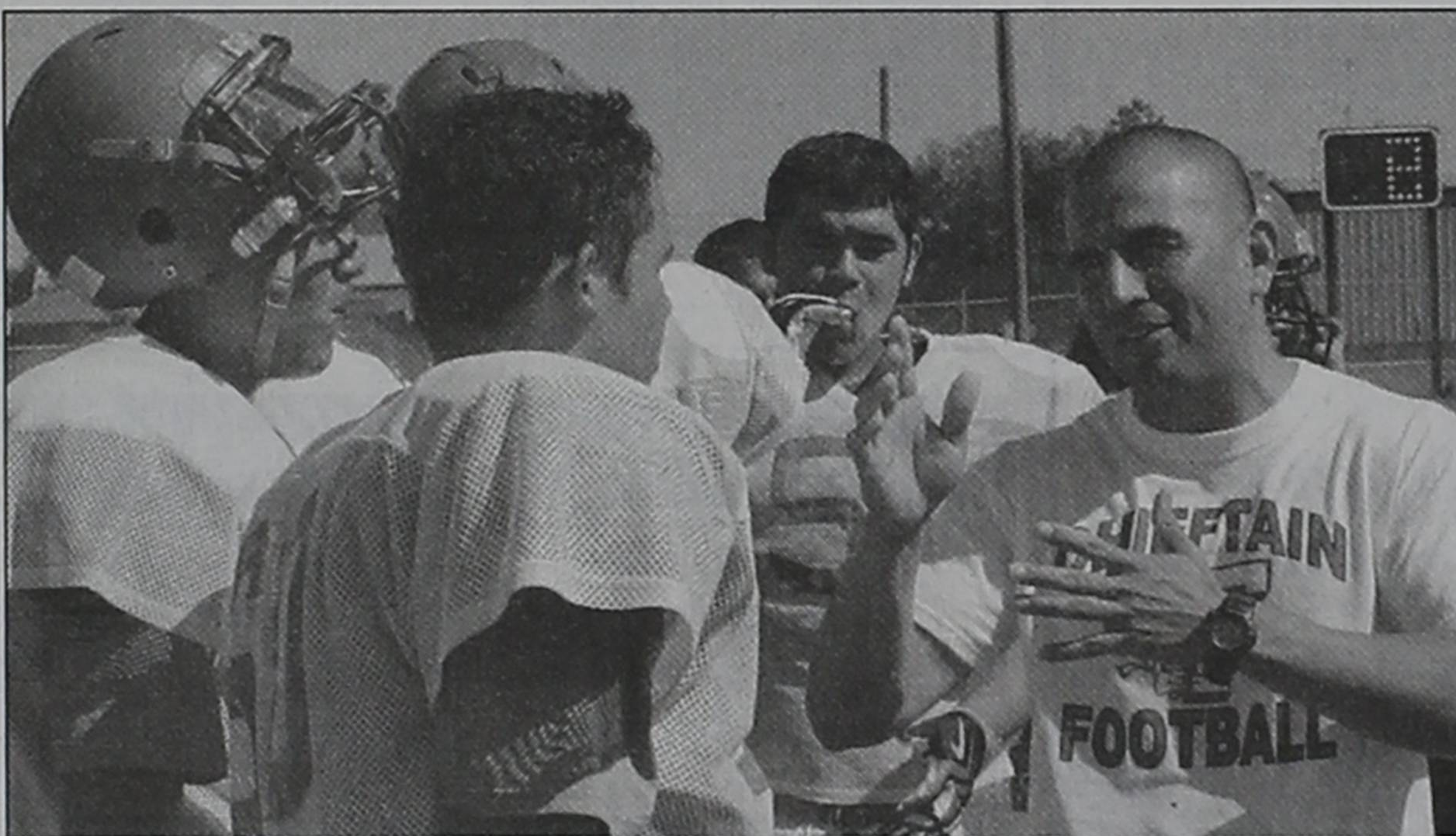
