$1 \lg$ onion chopped
1 med fresh poblano pepper, finely chopped
1 lg red sweet pepper, cut into $3 / 4$ inch pieces 2 tsp unsweetened cocoa powder
1 tsp ground cumin
1 tsp ground cumin
$1 / 2$ tsp garlic powder
$1 / 8$ tsp ground cinnamon
Dash cayenne pepper
114 oz can chicken brot
$115-\mathrm{oz}$ can pumpkin
$1 / 4$ cup whipping cream
Fresh cilantro (optional)

1. In a Dutch oven cook pork in hot olive oil over me-dium-high heat 5 minutes or until browned. Stir in onion, poblano, and sweet pepper
til tender. Stir in cocoa powder, cumin, garlic powder, cinnamon, and cayenne.
2. Stir in pumpkin, cream, and salt and black pepper to taste. Return to boiling; reduce heat. Simmer 5 minutes. Top with fresh cilantro.
