

deer camp at gander mountain

Say hello to Harry the Deer Decoy. .

I took a gander at the Gander Mountain sales flyer that came with Sunday's Amarillo paper. It was hard to find because everything was camouflaged.

In my youth I did a fair amount of dove and rabbit hunting. When I got older someone suggested we go deer hunting. I was all for it until I found out the colder the better for hunting deer and you need to get up by 4 a.m. to sit in an unheated blind and freeze 'till the sun comes up and hope some deer es of cheap plastic scrubbers came along. I never went deer hunting.

The Gander Mountain sales flyer was promoting a 3-day Deer Camp sale. On the front was a photo of Harry the Deer Decoy. He cost \$99.99 and has realistic hide and head and his tail moves in the breeze. You can adjust Harry's head up or down to appear that he is eating. I wondered why they call him

Harry. You'll need some scent killer at the deer camp. A 12-ounce spray can was free after a \$4 mail-in rebate. Wonder how many real deer hunters would take the time to fill out the paperwork for only \$4. One of the scent preventers comes with a deer drag harness. If you don't know what that is for you have no business going deer hunting. Apparently smells and

sounds are a big concern for hunting deer. You don't want them to smell you, so there is a spray for that. Another spray emulates doe urine (or estrous) to lure the old bucks close enough to kill them. For you non-deer folks like me, estrous is a doe in heat smell. I looked it up. Doesn't seem fair but hey, hunting is not always a fair sport.

The Gander Mountain folks also had a couple of sound imitators that might be helpful at the deer camp. The Pack Rack Rattling system (\$14.99) looks like two piecthat you rub together to simulate a couple of bucks doing some antler fighting. Also for \$14.99 there is the Up Roar Triple Threat Deer Call. Sounds include an aggressive grunt, an estrus bleat, or a wheeze tube. I reckon a veteran hunter would know which call to use.


You can't go into the woods with freshly laundered clothes, which is good news for most hunters anyway. The deer can smell a detergent scent. For \$24.99 Gander has ScentPrevent Laundry Detergent and Dryer Sheets. Wash your camo clothes in this and hunt with confidence.

Another item of importance to take along is a camera. If you are crafty enough to kill a big buck, of course you need the obligatory photo of yourself on one knee with your rifle and holding the dead deer's head up to send to the local newspaper. Gander has several models of camouflage digital cameras to lug along. The Trophy Cam is yours for \$229.99. It is compact, camouflaged, and good for 10,000 images. That's a lot of deer.

Other items that you need at the deer camp. A couple of knives. Probably need a rifle scope or at least a good pair of binoculars. A rangefinder would help out. Might even want a handgun to take care

of snakes or small varmints. Camo jackets, light or heavy. Camo boots, regular or tall. Don't forget some version of a GPS so the rescuers can find you before you actually freeze to death. There is much more. It's all there on Gander Mountain. Deer season starts soon. Don't forget to get your license and practice safety.

If you go over to Gander Mountain, tell Harry the Deer Decoy hello and good luck. If I was Harry, I'd just as soon stay in the nice warm store.




Dear Ron,




Letter to the Editor:







The students are working hard to earn money for the trip but can use as many opportunities as possible. So they have planned a rent-a-kid plan.








The Friona Noon Lions met Thursday October 22 with 14 members and one guest present. Patty Haile was a guest of Lion Allan Haile.

There are more playa lakes around Friona than any place in the world! One of the valuable purposes of playa lakes is to recharge the Ogallala Aquifer, the underground water supply for this region. This is of critical importance because the water level under Parmer County is lower than any place throughout the eight states the aquifer supports.

As a Fall treat to its members and the community at large, the Trailblazers 4-H Outdoor Activity Group will host "Raptor Revelry" on Saturday, October 30, at 11 a.m. at the Texas AgriLife Extension Center, 903 14th Street.

The event, open to the public, will give participants an opportunity to view live birds of prey at close quarters and to learn factual information on them from an expert.

Dealing graciously with your enemies

Dealing graciously with your enemies is just as much an oxymoron as cruel kindness, but it is the standard for Christ's followers. In 1 Samuel 24, the fugitive and future king, David, shows us what this looks like. Once again, Saul is hunting him down to kill him. One day, as David and his crew are hidden in a cave, Saul's army makes a pit stop so Saul can take a restroom break in a certain cave that was the occupied by David and his troop.

Saul never knew a thing, but David finally had his biggest enemy in his hands. Here was David's chance to get even, torture, payback and slay his enemy! But David resisted the temptation to become like murderous Saul, and dealt graciously with him by only cutting off a piece of Saul's robe. After Saul finished his business he headed back to his army, but someone was calling his name from the mouth of the cave, with a piece of his robe in their hand.

The temptation to "repay evil for evil" is a reality, often accepted by our society and possibly endorsed by those you hang around, yet it is contrary to God's desire for His children. You may ask, "Why should I deal graciously with my enemies?" You should deal graciously with your enemies, because that is how God dealt with you, in sending His Son, Jesus Christ, to pay the penalty for you and I (Rom 5:10).

The temptation today, is to deny Christ, by assimilating to worldly standards when dealing with our enemies, instead of reflecting God's treatment of us while we were at enmity with Him.

burrowing owls, as well as a red-tailed hawk, Mississippi kite, American kestrel, and peregrine falcon, among others.

She is completing her third fall of making presentations on birds of prey at Playa Festivals sponsored by Ogallala Commons.

This fall's Playa Festival schedule has also included presentations at Tulia, Shallowater, Abernathy, Whiteface, Brownfield, Denver City, Crosbyton, Farwell, Nazareth, and Dimmitt.

Not surprisingly, she finds an important part of working with the educational owls, featured in her presentations, is eye contact.

"Once I look into their eyes and they come to know me, we establish a bond and they let me work with them. It's mutual attraction," she explains.

The owls she utilizes in her programs are fully flighted, but due to physical problems or other issues, they are unable to survive in the wild as hunters. One of her favorite raptor program partners is a 17-year-old barn owl, Jasper, that essentially considers Gail his mate.

She teaches school kids about the life routines and hunting habits of raptors, their physical features, and works to dispel myths about the creatures that have persisted through generations. Different cultures have varied beliefs about owls. Early Indian folklore held owls as a symbol of wisdom, and fortunately, the owl has again been considered an icon of wisdom in the late 20th and early 21st centuries," she said.

"Some fear owls due to religious or cultural beliefs, and there are falsehoods attached to other raptors including hawks. At nearly every program that I present I end up dispelling a myth about raptors and showing people that they aren't scary or threatening, but useful creatures that play a role in ecosystem. "Not many people are lucky enough to get to pursue their passion as a purpose in life, but I do. I love doing wildlife rehab and education.

"Raptor Revelry" is scheduled for outdoor presentation, but in the event of inclement weather, will be moved inside the AgriLife Extension Building. Those planning to attend should be on hand early and are asked to register when they arrive.

The presentation is expected to start promptly at 11 a.m. and a question and answer session will follow the display of the live raptors.




