## Two Chieftain games to be shown Saturday

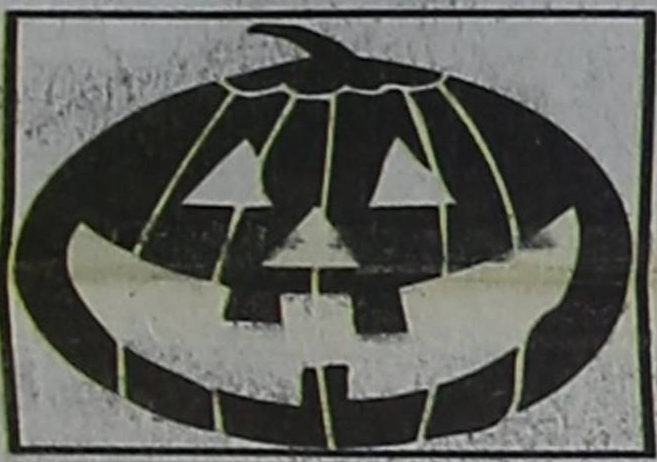

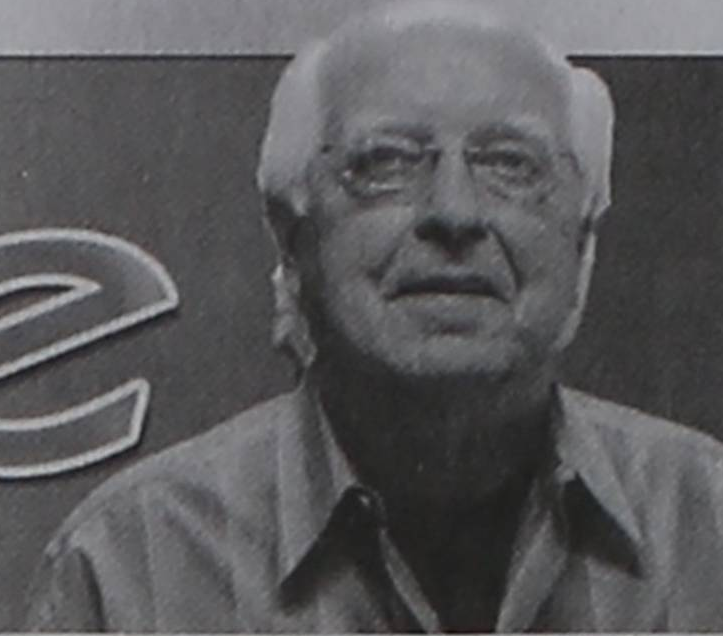

## deer camp at gander mountain

Say hello to Harry the Deer Decoy.

I took a gander at the Gander Mountain sales flyer that came with Sunday's Amarillo paper. It was hard to find because everything was camouflaged.

In my youth I did a fair amount of dove and rabbit hunting. When I got older someone suggested we go deer hunting. I was all for it until I found out the colder the better for hunting deer and you need to get up by 4 a.m. to sit in an unheated blind and freeze 'till the sun comes up and hope some deer came along. I never went deer hunting.

The Gander Mountain sales flyer was promoting a 3-day Deer Camp sale. On the front was a photo of Harry the Deer Decoy. He cost \$99.99 and has realistic hide and head and his tail moves in the breeze. You can adjust Harry's head up or down to appear that he is eating. I wondered why they call him Harry.

You'll need some scent killer at the deer camp. A 12-ounce spray can was free after a \$4 mail-in rebate. Wonder how many real deer hunters would take the time to fill out the paperwork for only \$4. One of the scent preventers comes with a deer drag harness. If you don't know what that is for you have no business going deer hunting. Apparently smells and

sounds are a big concern for hunting deer. You don't want them to smell you, so there is a spray for that. Another spray emulates doe urine (or estrous) to lure the old bucks close enough to kill them. For you non-deer folks like me, estrous is a doe in heat smell. I looked it up. Doesn't seem fair but hey, hunting is not always a fair sport.

The Gander Mountain folks also had a couple of sound imitators that might be helpful at the deer camp. The Pack Rack Rattling system (\$14.99) looks like two pieces of cheap plastic scrubbers that you rub together to simulate a couple of bucks doing some antler fighting. Also for \$14.99 there is the Up Roar Triple Threat Deer Call. Sounds include an aggressive grunt, an estrous bleat, or a wheeze tube. I reckon a veteran hunter would know which call to use.

You can't go into the woods with freshly laundered clothes, which is good news for most hunters anyway. The deer can smell a detergent scent. For \$24.99 Gander has ScentPrevent Laundry Detergent and Dryer Sheets. Wash your camo clothes in this and hunt with confidence.

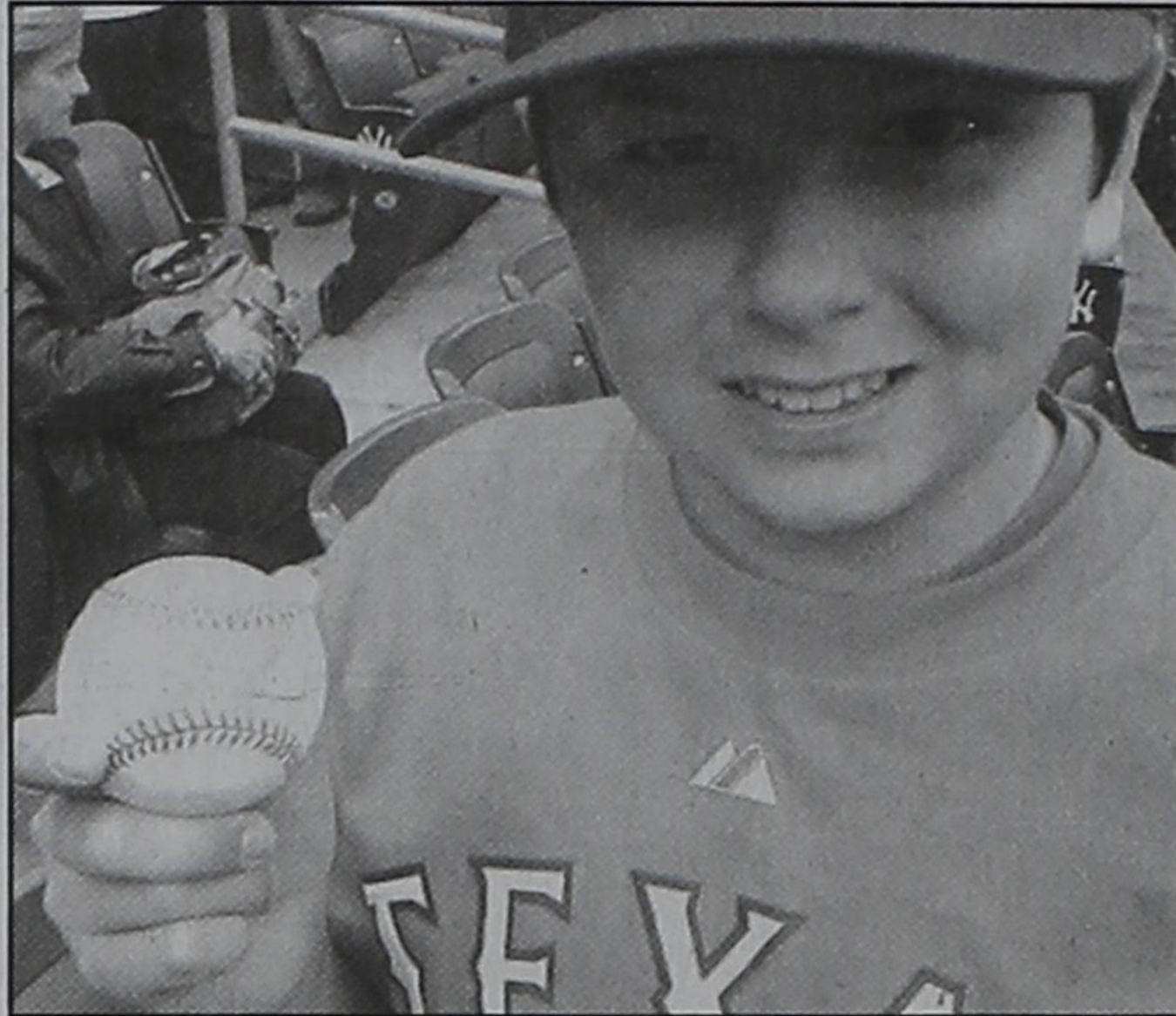
Another item of importance to take along is a camera. If you are crafty enough to kill a big buck, of course you need the obligatory photo of yourself on one knee with

your rifle and holding the dead deer's head up to send to the local newspaper. Gander has several models of camouflage digital cameras to lug along. The Trophy Cam is yours for \$229.99. It is compact, camouflaged, and good for 10,000 images. That's a lot of deer.

Other items that you need at the deer camp. A couple of knives. Probably need a rifle scope or at least a good pair of binoculars. A rangefinder would help out. Might even want a handgun to take care

of snakes or small varmints. Camo jackets, light or heavy. Camo boots, regular or tall. Don't forget some version of a GPS so the rescuers can find you before you actually freeze to death. There is much more. It's all there on Gander Mountain. Deer season starts soon. Don't forget to get your license and practice safety.

If you go over to Gander Mountain, tell Harry the Deer Decoy hello and good luck. If I was Harry, I'd just as soon stay in the nice warm store.

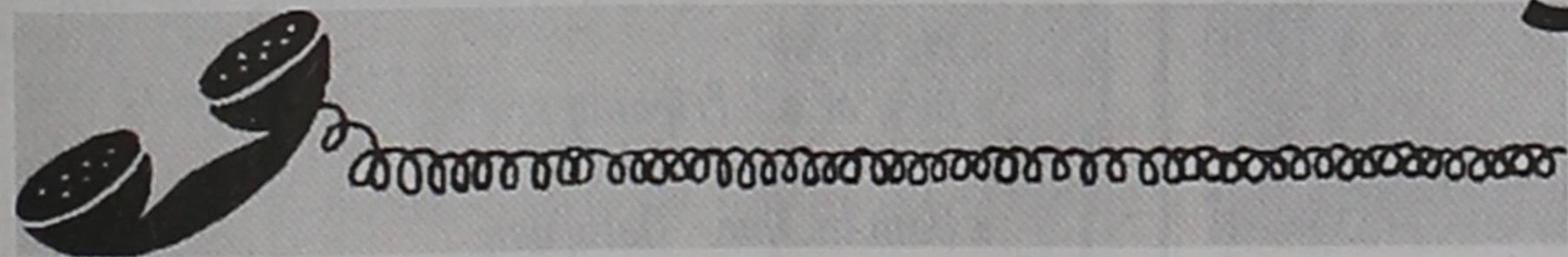

New parking and entrance at PMC

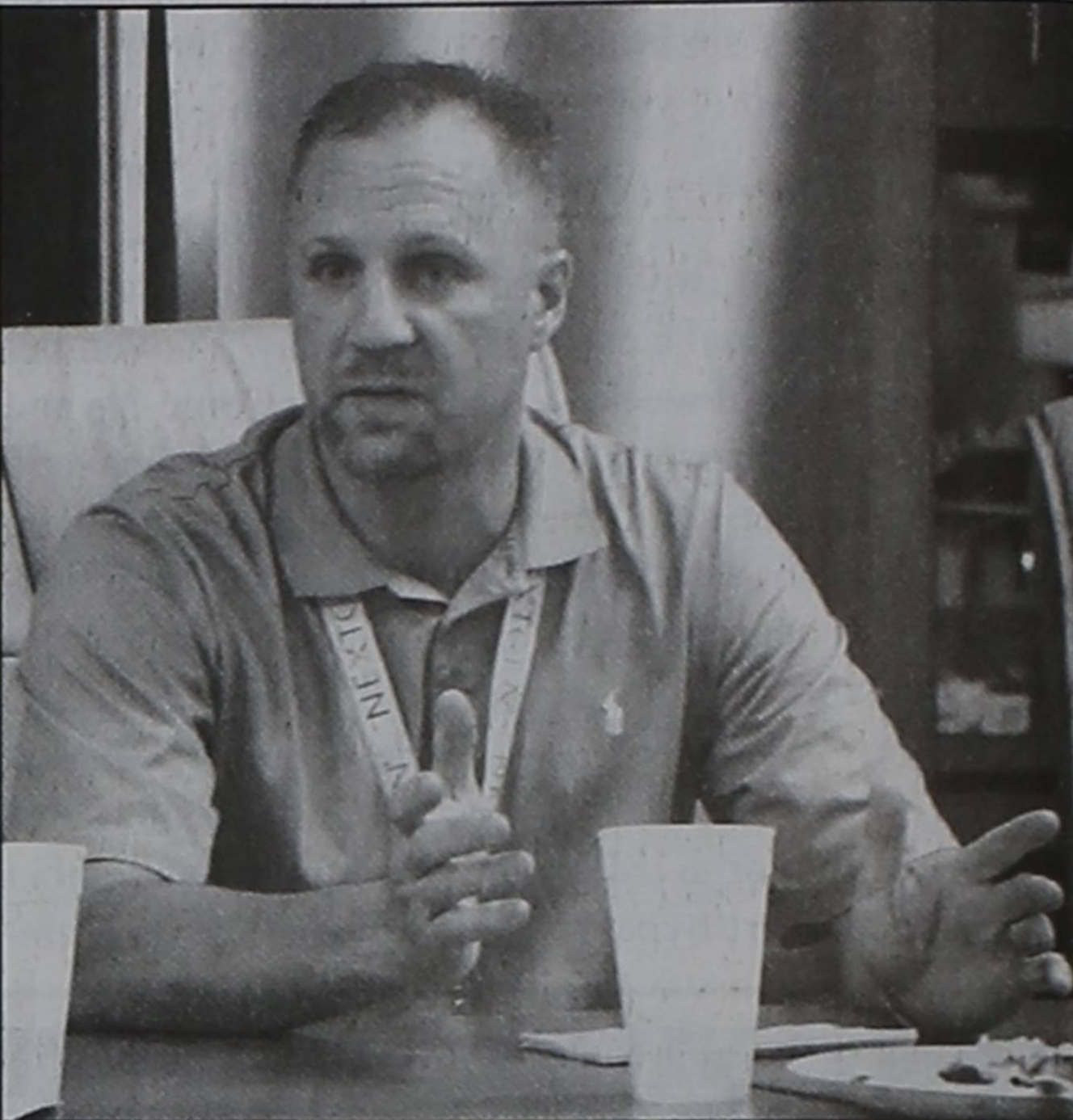

Junior, Matthew Teague, was selected for his efforts in the classroom. He has a positive attitude and does well in class.

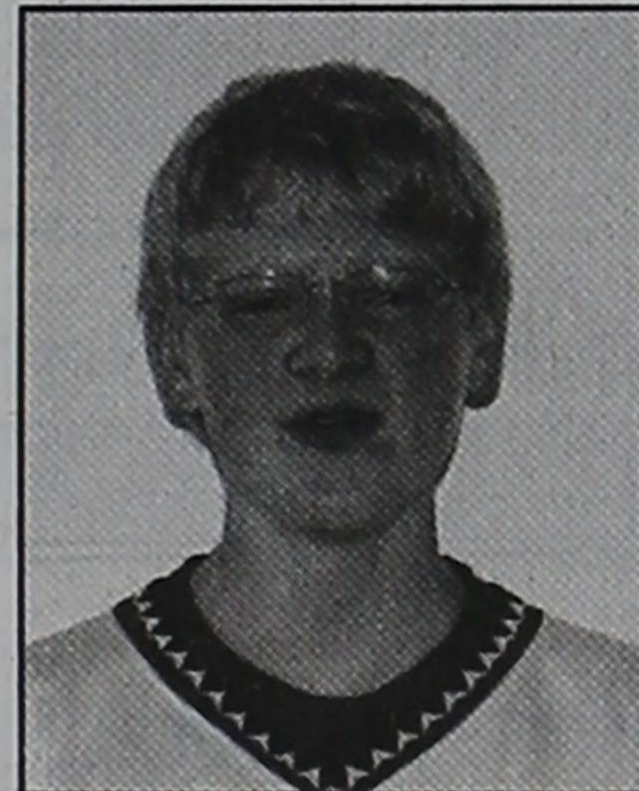

and works to make it a better place for all students."

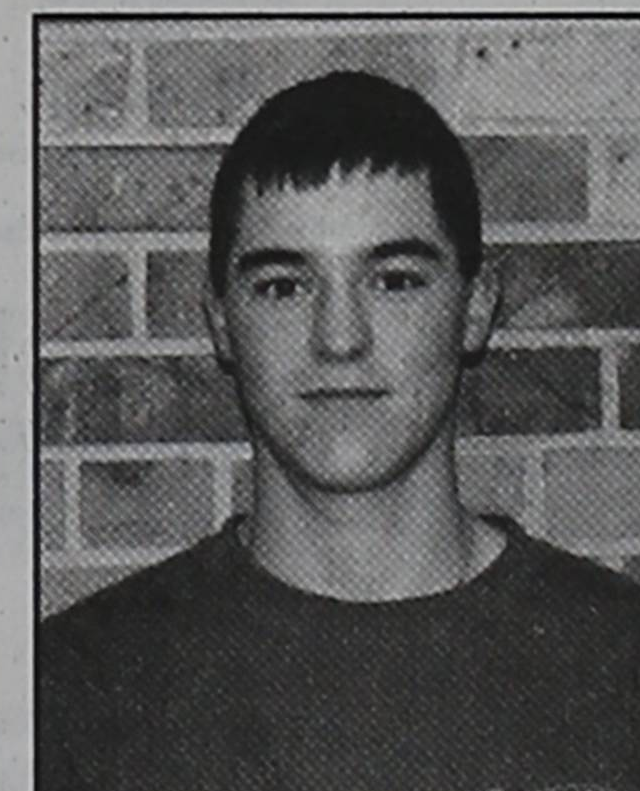

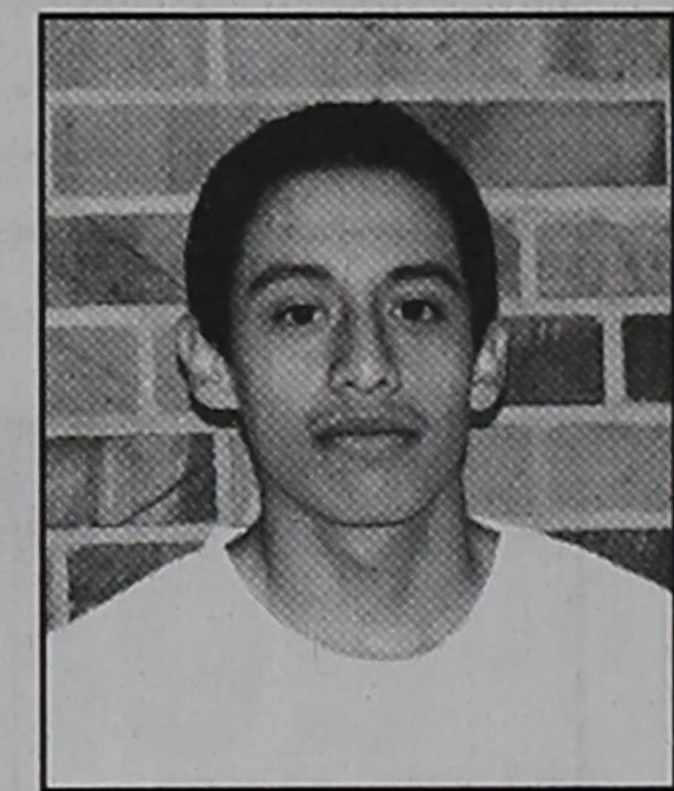

# Playa Lake Festival teaches students about water supply

There are more playa lakes around Friona than any place in the world! One of the valuable purposes of playa lakes is to recharge the Ogallala Aquifer, the underground water supply for this region. This is of critical importance because the water level under Parmer County is lower than any place throughout the eight states the aquifer supports.

The Playa Lake Festival is a tradition that combines students from the fifth grade, High School Education and Training classes, and many organizations to learn about the temporary wetlands and their role in the future of Friona.

Tonda Clark, fifth grade science teacher wrote and received a Healthy Habitats Grant from Encana Energy, Texas Parks and Wildlife, and Service Learning Texas because this is such an important concern for the high plains and the state of Texas.

The students adopted the name of the "Playa Posse" as they are working to help the playa lakes thrive and flourish.

On October 5, the fifth grade students and staff traveled to Nazareth to explore Dr. Birkenfeld's outdoor classroom. They experienced the playa habitat with specialists from Texas Tech University and author and Jim Steiert, who has written books about playa habitats.

On October 6 and 7, the fifth grade classes went to the Friona Community Center and Reeve Lake where the high school students taught activities about the importance of water conservation, playa lake habitats, and what we can do to save the playa lakes. Activities included all curriculum areas and each activity developed by high school students was connected to a fifth grade essential knowledge or skill. The Festival included tours

of local prairie playalakes led by the NRCS and trips to the Friona City Water Treatment Center.

Fifth graders used GPS units on a playa geocache, weighed and measured materials discovered in field investigations, and re-created nests from common playa inhabitants. Each student created a playa lake model with Randall clay and bird and plant specimens. In one conservation activity, fifth graders measured the amount of water it takes to brush your teeth if you leave the water running while you brush.


This is a favorite service learning project for the high school students because they can share what they have learned with the fifth grade classes. In the future, the Playa Posse would like to involve even more of the community, so that everyone in Friona will know how important it is to conserve the Playa Lakes and their habitat.

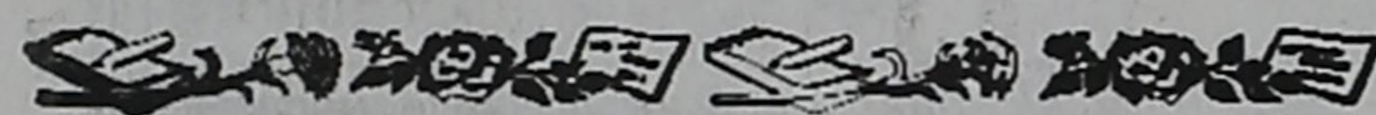
### Oscar Mario Rodriguez

## "Raptor Revelry" in Hereford October 30

As a Fall treat to its members and the community at large, the Trailblazers 4-H Outdoor Activity Group will host "Raptor Revelry" on Saturday, October 30, at 11 a.m. at the Texas AgriLife Extension Center, 903 14th Street.

The event, open to the public, will give participants an opportunity to view live birds of prey at close quarters and to learn factual information on them from an expert.

Gail Barnes, a licensed wildlife rehabilitator and volunteer at the South Plains Wildlife Rehabilitation Center in Lubbock, will present her popular program on birds of prey and will display an array of live owls and other raptors.

Admission is by donation for adults, with a suggested minimum donation of \$5 per family. All proceeds and honorariums from the local program will benefit the South Plains Wildlife Rehabilitation Center.

Mrs. Barnes has been volunteering at the South Plains Wildlife Rehabilitation Center for over a decade, initially for two days a week. In 2002 she became a full time volunteer. She also works through her own nonprofit organization with the appropriate title of Night Wings. Whenever she can spare the time from duties at the Lubbock rehab center, Gail roams the Panhandle and South Plains giving programs featuring an array of raptors including barn, great horned, barred, and

burrowing owls, as well as a red-tailed hawk, Mississippi kite, American kestrel, and peregrine falcon, among others.

She is completing her third fall of making presentations on birds of prey at Playa Festivals sponsored by Ogallala Commons.

This fall's Playa Festival schedule has also included presentations at Tulia, Shallowater, Abertathy, Whiteface, Brownfield, Denver City, Crosbyton, Farwell, Nazareth, and Dimmitt.

Not surprisingly, she finds an important part of working with the educational owls, featured in her presentations, is eye contact.

"Once I look into their eyes and they come to know me, we establish a bond and they let me work with them. It's mutual attraction," she explains.

The owls she utilizes in her programs are fully flighted, but due to physical problems or other issues, they are unable to survive in the wild as hunters. One of her favorite raptor program partners is a 17-year-old barn owl, Jasper, that essentially considers Gail his mate.

She teaches school kids about the life routines and hunting habits of raptors, their physical features, and works to dispel myths about the creatures that have persisted through generations. Different cultures have varied beliefs about owls. Early Indian folklore held owls as a symbol of wisdom, and fortunately, the owl has again been considered an icon of wisdom in the late 20th and early 21st centuries," she said.

"Some fear owls due to religious or cultural beliefs, and there are falsehoods attached to other raptors including hawks. At nearly every program that I present I end up dispelling a myth about raptors and showing people that they aren't scary or threatening, but useful creatures that play a role in ecosystem. "Not many people are lucky enough to get to pursue their passion as a purpose in life, but I do. I love doing wildlife rehab and education.

"Raptor Revelry" is scheduled for outdoor presentation, but in the event of inclement weather, will be moved inside the AgriLife Extension Building. Those planning to attend should be on hand early and are asked to register when they arrive.

The presentation is expected to start promptly at 11 a.m. and a question and answer session will follow the display of the live raptors.

## Dealing graciously with your enemies

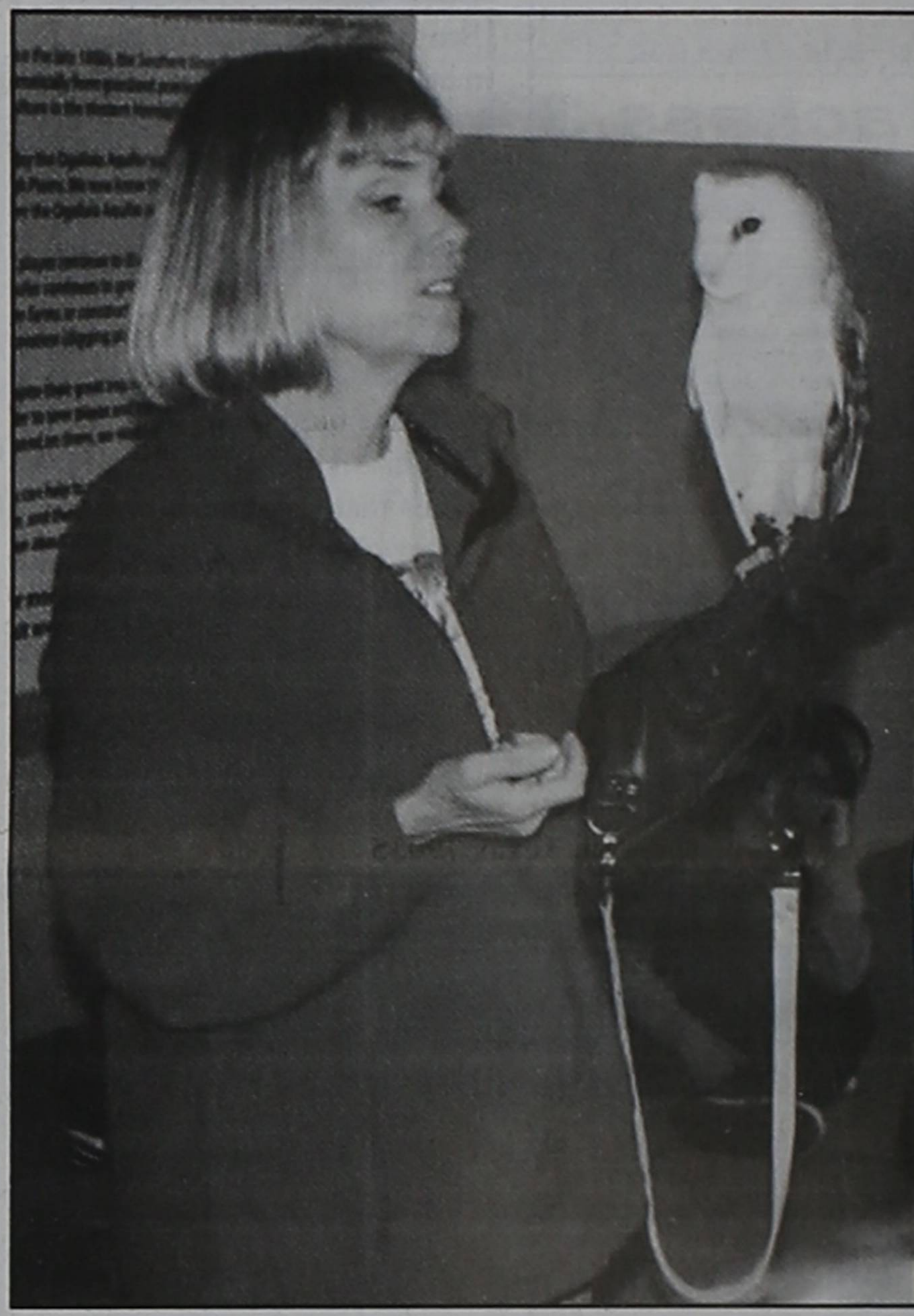

Saul never knew a thing, but David finally had his biggest enemy in his hands. Here was David's chance to get even, torture, payback and slay his enemy! But David resisted the temptation to become like murderous Saul, and dealt graciously with him by only cutting off a piece of Saul's robe. After Saul finished his business he headed back to his army, but someone was calling his name from the mouth of the cave, with a piece of his robe in their hand.

The temptation to "repay evil for evil" is a reality, often accepted by our society and possibly endorsed by those you hang around, yet it is contrary to God's desire for His children. You may ask, "Why should I deal graciously with my enemies?" You should deal graciously with your enemies, because that is how God dealt with you, in sending His Son, Jesus Christ, to pay the penalty for you and I (Rom 5:10).

A late drive by the Tigers brought them within 2 points with a little over a minute left in the game. Slaton's on-

side kick attempt did not go ten yards and the Chiefs took over to run out the clock for the 21-19 victory.

The Chiefs kicked off to the Tigers to open the game. Slaton fumbled on their first offensive play and the Chiefs recovered on Slaton's 35-yard line. On the Chief's first offensive play of the game, quarterback Brenner Barnett launched a 35-yard touchdown pass over the middle to Kirby Frye. Diego Licerio kicked the extra point and the Chiefs had a 7-0 lead only 22 seconds into the 1st quarter.

Barnett completed 8 of 13 passes for 155 yards and two touchdowns. A second TD pass was complete to Caleb Monroe along the left sideline as Monroe made a great catch over a Tiger defender. Barnett also scored a touchdown on a 2-yard run. Lic-

erio was good on all three extra point attempts.

Monroe had four receptions for 54 yards, Dominique Kellum caught 3 passes for 66 yards. Barnett led rushing with 14 carries for 63 yards. Serafin Vazquez rushed 11 times for 59 yards, Chris Garcia was 6 for 30, Kellum carried 9 times for 40 yards, and Licerio was 3 for 12 yards.

The Chiefs host Littlefield Friday October 29. Littlefield lost to Muleshoe last week 43-8 and are in a three-way tie for the district lead with Muleshoe and Bushland, all with 4-1 district records. The Chiefs improved to 2-3 in district.

The Littlefield game is the final home game for Chieftain seniors. The seniors and their parents will be honored prior to the start of the game. Kickoff is 7:30 p.m.

Since Slaton does not have a freshman team, the Friona Chieftain freshmen tangled with Bovina last Thursday October 21. The score at the half ended up being the final score as the Chiefs won 22-12, with all points scored in the first half.

The Chiefs had 23 rushes for 261 yards and three touchdowns. The Friona defense held Bovina to 165 yards and two touchdowns. It was all ground yardage as neither team

attempted a pass during the game.

The Friona JV Chiefs traveled to Slaton Thursday October 21 but their game was canceled by the strong storms with lightning that blew through the South Plains.

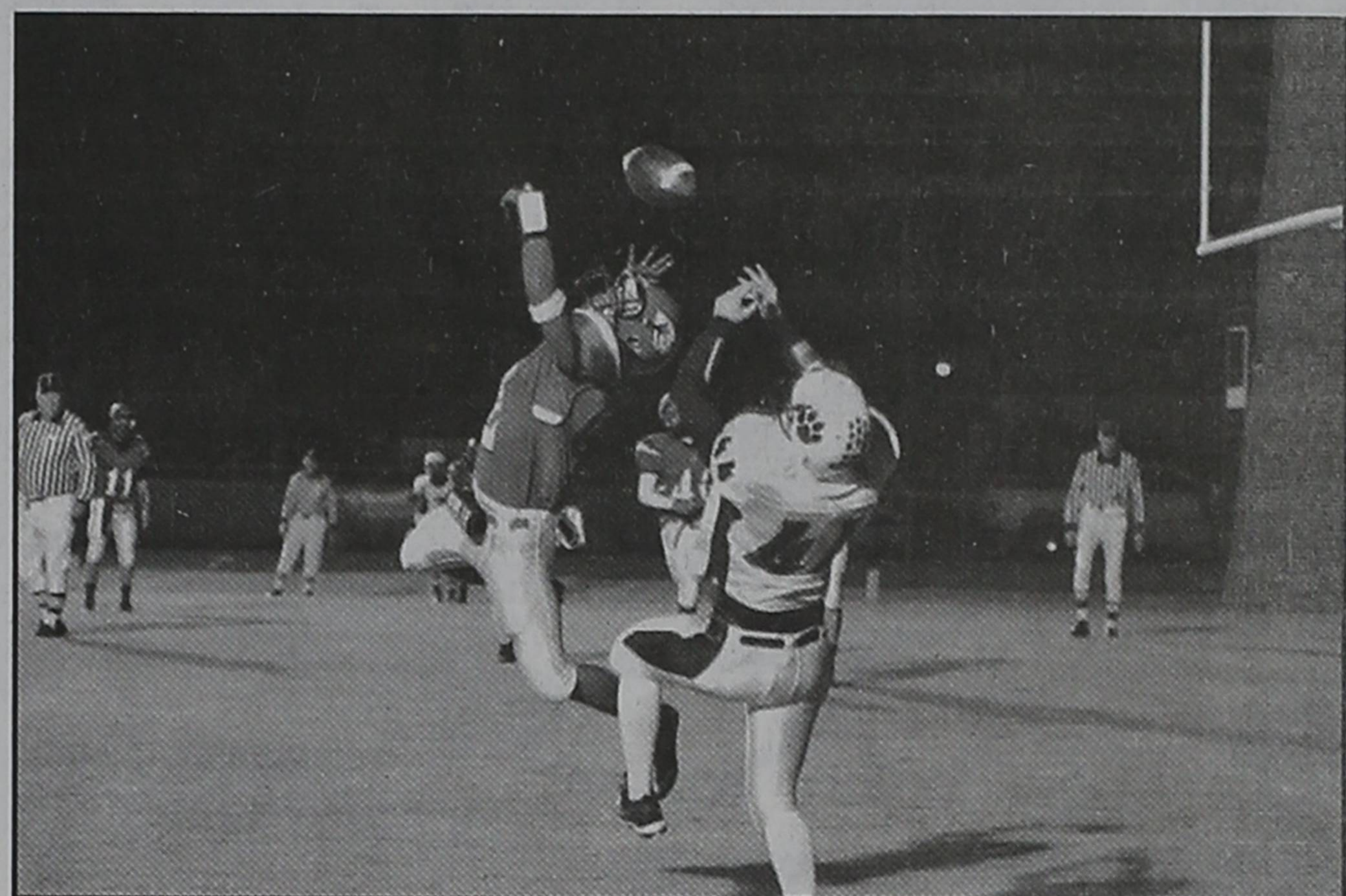
