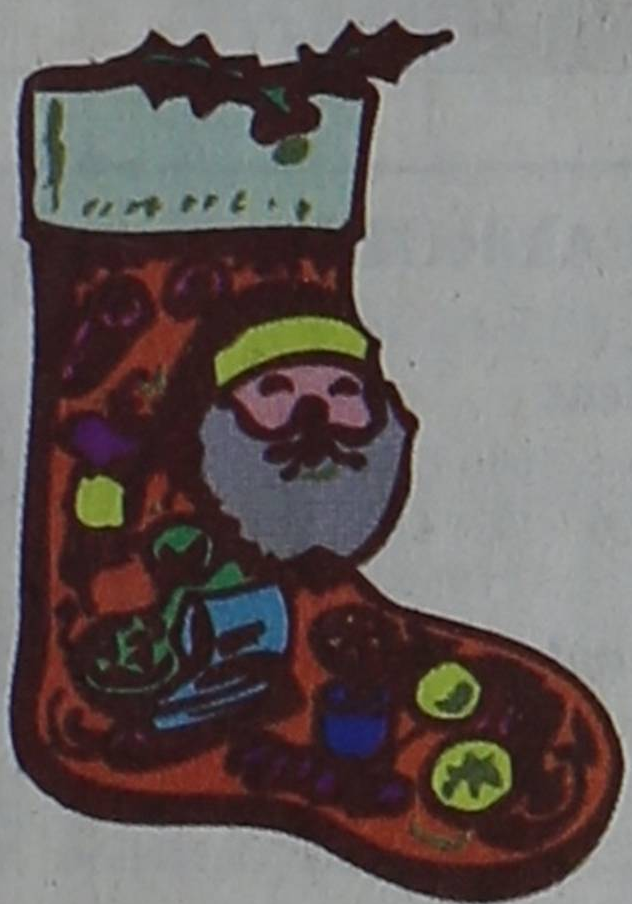

Squaws win, Chiefs lose to Farwell

We'll catch you up on Chieftain/Squaw basketball action since the holidays. This weekend, December 2-4, both varsity teams will participate in the Vega tournament. A junior varsity tournament will be held here in Friona during the same time.

The Chieftains traveled to Lubbock last week to take on the top private school team in the state, Lubbock Trinity. The final score was a resounding Trinity victory as they swamped the Chiefs 95-33. The score at the half was 35-21 but Trinity ran away with a 60 point second half.

Chief scoring was led by Nick Ortiz with 11 points. Other scoring was Ryan DeWit 10, Brenner Barnett 6, Caleb Monroe 2, Michael Ortiz 2, and Simon Zajicek 2.

Tuesday night November 30 Friona played host to the Farwell Lady Blue and Farwell Steers. Although Farwell is still in the football playoffs, four of their basketball starters do not play football so the game was on. Those four players accounted for all of the Farwell scoring as the Steers beat the Chiefs 68-53.

Scoring for the Chiefs was led by Nick Ortiz who drained five 3s for 15 points. Dominique Kellum had 8, Ryan DeWit 7, Brenner Barnett 7, Simon Zajicek 6, Caleb Monroe 6, and Michael Ortiz 3.

The Squaws handed the Lady Blue a 31-26 defeat in a low scoring defensive contest. Only four girls scored in the game, led by Regan Anthony's 14 points, Ester Sarabia, 10, Maddie Murphree 5, and Liz Trevino 2. The girls were 11 of 19 from the free throw line.

In a game last week, The Squaws had a one-point loss at Plains. The final there was 34-33. The game was tied at 26-26 at the end of the 3rd quarter. A big difference in the game was missed free throws. The Squaws were only 13 of 30 from the free throw line. Ester Sarabia was the point leader with 12, Murphree 8, Anthony 7, Trevino 5, Miller 1, and Stormes 1. District play begins for the Squaws when they travel to Floydada December 14 to meet the Lady Winds.

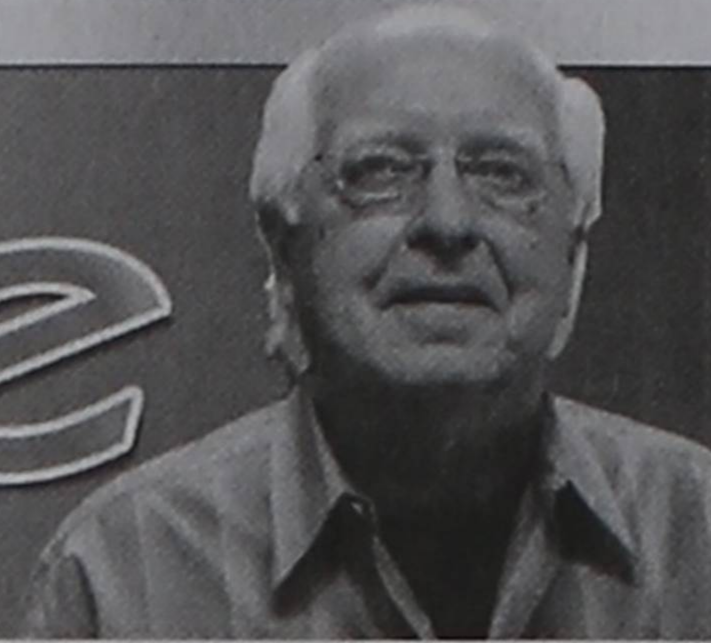

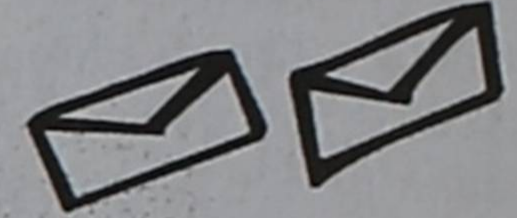


Letters to the Editor

Carrot cake and baked cheetos

Here are a couple of short holiday favorite recipes sent in by Friona residents Owen and Melody Drake. We invite any of our readers to submit favorite recipes to share.

Melody says the carrot cake is very good. The Coated Cheetos recipe really got my attention, especially the part about the ingredients foaming up. Baked Cheetos. Interesting. Hope you are able to enjoy both of these during the holidays and thanks to the Drakes for sending them along.

Coated Cheetos

Put two bags of regular Cheetos in a large grocery bag. In a large saucepan cook 1 stick oleo, 1 cup brown sugar, 1/4 cup white Karo. Add a dash of salt and bring all this to a boil. Remove from heat.

Add 1/4 tsp cream of tartar, 1/4 tsp baking soda, and 1/2 tsp vanilla. This will foam up so be sure saucepan is large enough.

Pour over the Cheetos in the bag and shake well. Pour out the coated Cheetos on two foil lined cookie sheets. Bake at 250 for 30-40 minutes. Loosen and stir the Cheetos often.

Turn onto foil laid out on the counter. Separate pieces to cool. Enjoy! This can also be done with popcorn.

Carrot Surprise Cake

In a mixing bowl sift 2 cup flour, 1 1/2 cups sugar, 2 tsp cinnamon, 1/2 tsp nutmeg, dash of salt.

Add 3 eggs, 3/4 cup mayo, 8 oz crushed pineapple, 2 cup shredded carrots, 3/4 cup nuts.

Bake in two 9" cake pans at 350 about 30 minutes. Cool in pans about 10 minutes. Top with cream cheese icing.

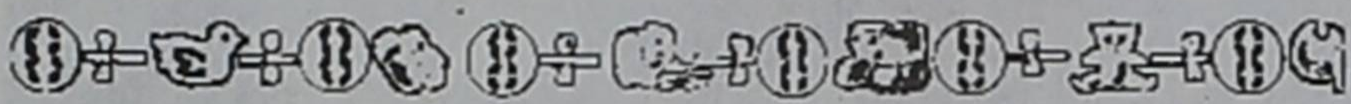
Mason Brook Eads

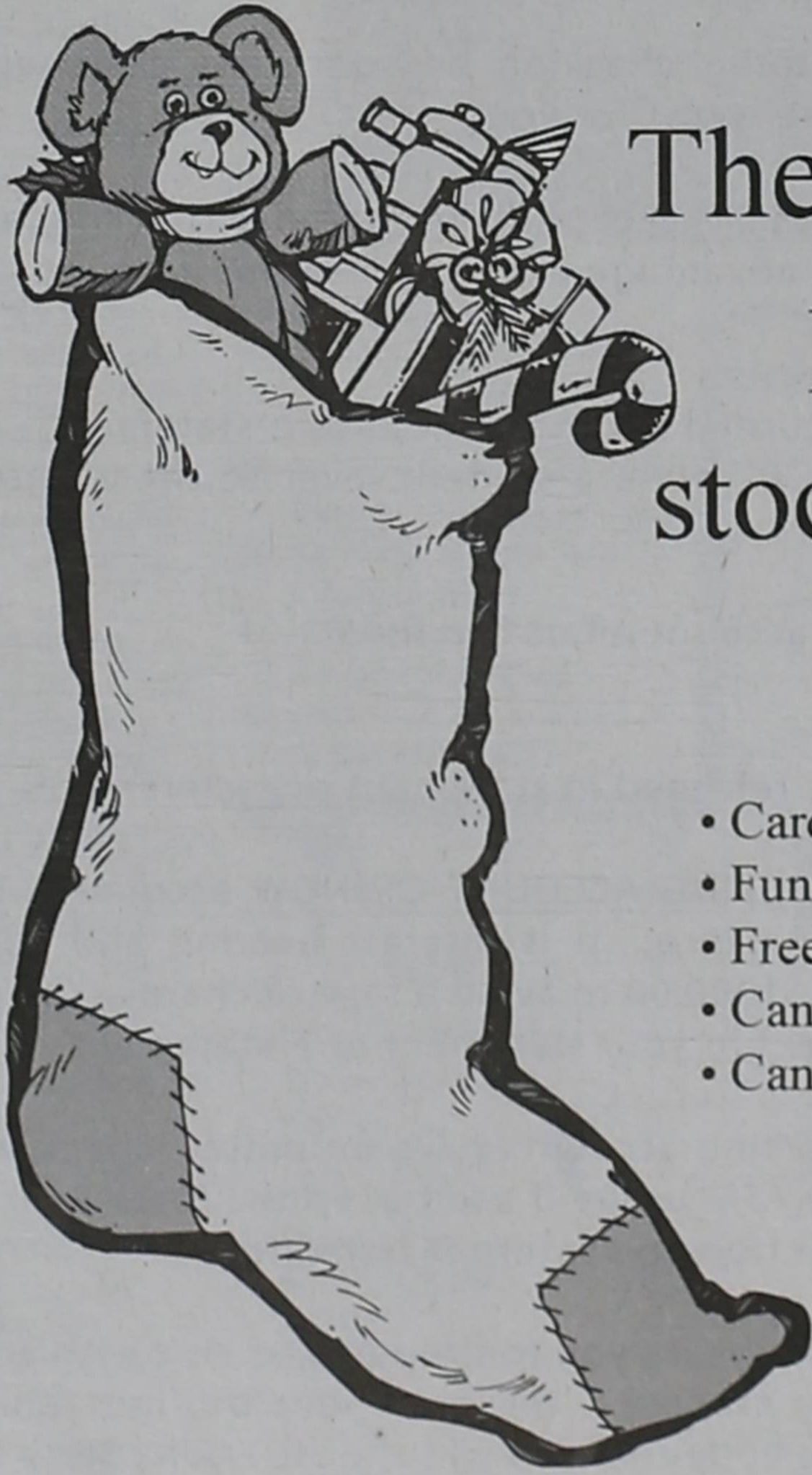

Water district taking well measurements

Beginning December 1, High Plains Underground Water Conservation District field data collection personnel will make annual depth-to-water level measurements to determine the effect of 2010 pumpage on groundwater levels of the Ogallala Aquifer within the district's service area.

These measurements are made in a network of more than 1,200 privately-owned water wells. These observation wells are spaced at a density of about one well per nine square miles throughout the district.

A depth-to-water level measurement is made by lowering a steel tape to a pre-determined depth in the observation well. The first few feet of the tape lowered into each well is coated with carpenters' chalk, which turns a darker shade of blue when it contacts water. The distance from land

surface to the static water level is determined by subtracting the amount of tape with the darker blue chalk from the total feet of steel tape extended into the well.

After the measurement is made, a blue vinyl sticker with the observation well number, the depth-to-water level measurement, and the date of the measurement is affixed to the well equipment or other appropriate surface near the well site.

High Plains Water District field data collection personnel measure the same wells in the observation well network each year, as long as the individual wells are accessible and continue to provide satisfactory data. The current depth-to-water level measurements in individual wells are compared to those of previous years to determine the average annual change in water levels in the Ogallala

Aquifer within the district.

Maps showing the location and well number of the observation wells in each county or portion of a county served by the Water District are published each year in The Cross Section. The April issue contains tables listing observation wells in each county within the district and the average annual change in water levels for one year, five-year, and ten-year intervals.

"With the November 2 special election complete, district personnel will contact landowners to establish the observation well network in the newly-annexed portions of the district, which include the northwest quadrant of Hockley County, the southwest quadrant of Lamb County, and all of Swisher County. Depth-to-water level measurements made in 2011 will not contain these data," said Manager Jim Konkwright.

On January 19, the Production Session:

Setting the Stage for the Next Five Years segment will include talks on Production Costs and Parameters for Cow-Calf Production in North Texas and New Mexico by Stan Bevers, AgriLife Extension, Vernon; You and Your Heifers by Rob Hogan, AgriLife Extension, Ft. Stockton; Managing Fertility in Cows and Bulls by Manny Encinas, New Mexico State University Cooperative Extension Service, and Bruce Carpenter, AgriLife Extension, Overton; and Cow Fertility in Arid Environments by Milton Thomas, New Mexico State University.

Panhandle unclaimed property list coming Sunday December 5

One in four Texans has missing money waiting to be claimed from the state's unclaimed property fund. Are you the one?

Folks in the Panhandle region have a chance to check the annual Unclaimed Property List in regional newspapers on Sunday, December 5. Every person and business on the list has at least \$250 they can claim, or abandoned stock certificates or safe deposit box contents of unknown value.

"This is an opportunity to get money back from the state government," said Texas Comptroller Susan Combs. "It's yours — claim it." Combs returned

more than \$163 million to its owners in fiscal 2010, a \$16 million increase compared to 2009.

The Panhandle Unclaimed Property List will appear in the Sunday, December 5 editions of the Abilene Reporter-News, Amarillo Globe-News, Lubbock Avalanche Journal, San Angelo Standard-Times and the Wichita Falls Times-Record-News. It will include names of unclaimed property owners in 76 counties who have had at least \$250 in unclaimed property reported to the state within the past year.

"Even if you don't find your name on the news-

paper list, the publication should serve as a reminder to check the Unclaimed Property website at www.ClaimItTexas.org," Combs said. "In our online database, you can find any amount of unclaimed property, large or small, from any year."

The state is holding about \$2.2 billion in unclaimed property, a total that will keep growing as long as Texans keep forgetting about old bank accounts and safe deposit boxes, utility deposits, insurance policies, unopened checks, unclaimed wages and other money that is eventually turned over to the state.

Parmer County harvest update

Harvest is finally beginning to wind down across the county. There is very little corn left standing.

The year has been a good one with all of the rain that came the past summer. There were some fields of dryland corn around that made a yield and irrigated yields were good for the most part. The hot dry August was hard on the corn crop.

Much of the grain sorghum was late planted behind hauled out crops and yields have also been fair. The month of September

with its warm temperatures were good for the late planted grain sorghum and cotton crop. This year's cotton has been good across most of the county. Yields and grades are coming back on the positive side. Many producers are finished harvesting cotton while there

are a few still finishing up in the next week or so.

The rain and snow of two weeks ago was a great benefit for the wheat crop. Cattle are getting turned out all across the county and the dryland wheat crop was in great need of a drink before turning out any cattle on it.

4-H/FFA livestock clinic December 5 in Lubbock

The Texas AgriLife Extension Service will conduct the free North Region 4-H and FFA Species Clinic on Sunday, December 5, from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. at the Texas Tech Animal Science Building in Lubbock.
