Council meeting agenda is brief

The Friona City Council will hold a regular meeting Monday December 13 at 6:30 p.m. in council chambers at 619 Main St. All regular council meetings are open to the public.

The tentative agenda has five items of business to consider but is subject to change. The final agenda is posted at city hall 72 hours prior to the meeting.

The council will approve minutes of the November meeting, consider approval of renewing an agricultural lease contract with Jerry Loflin, take action to re-appoint members to the city planning and zoning commission, and consider and discuss the accounts payable

and November financial statements.

Item 7 on the agenda reads: Consider and take action on Resolution 10-12-13, denial of Southwestern Public Service Company's proposed rate increase submitted to the city on May 17, 2010; requiring the reimbursement of municipal rate case expenses; finding that the meeting complies with the open meetings act; making other findings and provisions related to the subject; and declaring an effective date.

Time to hear public comments is set aside at the beginning of every meeting immediately following roll call, invocation, and pledge of allegiance.

Christmas lights and music

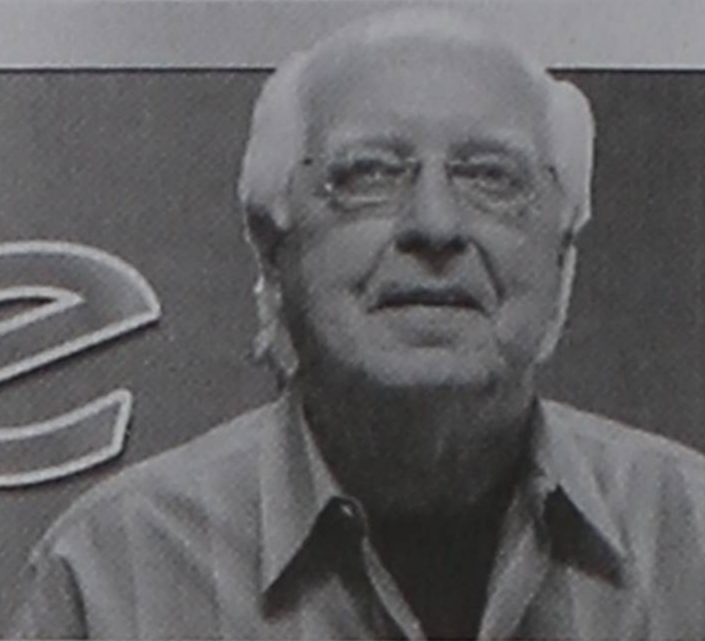

The official airline of the Dallas Cowboys.

From 1966 to 1968 I was a Braniff Airlines sales representative in the downtown Dallas office. Being an airline sales representative was mostly a public relations job. We called on business accounts, civic organizations, and even other airlines to encourage them to "Fly Braniff". We also attended a lot of cocktail parties after business hours.

In those glory days almost every domestic and international airline had a sales office in downtown Dallas. It was a close knit but competitive group. Our big competitors were American and Delta. All domestic airlines were still regulated by the government. All fares to all destinations were the same. The only advantage an airline had was inflight service (think china, champagne, and cloth napkins) and convenience of schedules.

I was taken back to those glory days when I heard that Don Meredith died. In 1967 Braniff was the official airline of the Dallas Cowboys. It was an important account, both financially and politically.

The Cowboys flew to out-of-town games on

chartered Braniff aircraft. A fellow salesman, Jimmy Huff, was assigned to travel with the Cowboys. The rest of us envied Jimmy but he kept telling us it wasn't as much fun as we thought. I found out later he was telling the truth.

Jimmy was promoted to Braniff's Seattle office as football season began. He recommended me to take over the Cowboy charters. So the Dallas Cowboys became my account. I coordinated their on-board meal requirements, departure schedules, and any other special requests the club asked for.

Tex Schramm, Coach Landry, and the other coaches rode up front in first class. So did the owner, Clint Murchison, and invited sportswriters from the Dallas Morning News and local TV channels. Verne Lundquist was along on my first charter flight. It was also his first trip with the Cowboys. We flew to San Francisco and Verne and I prowled the local nightlife until the wee hours (but that is another story).

Jimmy briefed me on my duties during the charter weekend. At one point he said, "This is the most important thing I am going to tell you. If you don't

do this you might not get home alive."

For the return charter flight the first class section had first class service including the bar cart with those miniature bottles of booze. The players sat in the back and were handed their individual allotment of two cans of beer as they boarded. No hard stuff allowed in back. Except.

Jimmy said, "You leave the game in the third quarter and head for the airport. Take a dozen of those miniature bottles of whiskey and put them in the seat pockets behind the last row of seats." He said if I valued my health the bottles better be there.

I made it to the airport and stowed the twelve bottles of whiskey in the rear seat pockets. The 49ers won the game and the players were not happy when they boarded the flight home. The beer was iced down in a tub and the flight attendants handed two to each Cowboy as they boarded.

After takeoff the attendants closed the curtain that separates first class and coach. When the seatbelt light went off, Don Meredith, Lee Roy Jordan, Bob Lilly, and Ralph Neely headed for the rear lavatory. So did Chuck

Howley and John Niland. When we arrived in Dallas I made sure the empty bottles were properly disposed of.

Jimmy was correct. It was the most important duty I fulfilled that day and on future charters. I passed the test and became a popular guy with Dandy Don and his veteran teammates. Yes, he was a heck of a nice guy, always joking, win or lose.

I only flew with the Cowboys to finish the rest of that season. Being on the Cowboy charters made me a hero to the kids in my neighborhood. But Jimmy was quite right, flying the Cowboy charters was not as much fun as it sounded. General manager Tex Schramm could be demanding. After all, they were the Cowboys.

Don Meredith was the first real Dallas Cowboy hero. There have been many since then. Several of the players I flew the charters with are in the Cowboy Stadium Ring of Honor.

It was a pretty big deal for this country boy from Hillsboro, Texas, to be in charge of a Dallas Cowboys charter airplane.

Thank you Don Meredith for the memories. RIP!

Did You Know???

A 100 watt light bulb costs \$.50 per month in average use.

Replacing one regular light bulb with a compact fluorescent light bulb would prevent 90 billion pounds of greenhouse gas emissions from power plants.

Compact fluorescent light bulbs use two-thirds less energy than regular bulbs to provide the same amount of light, and they last up to 10 times longer.

Compact fluorescent light bulbs produce about 75% less heat, so they are safer to operate and can cut energy costs associated with home cooling.

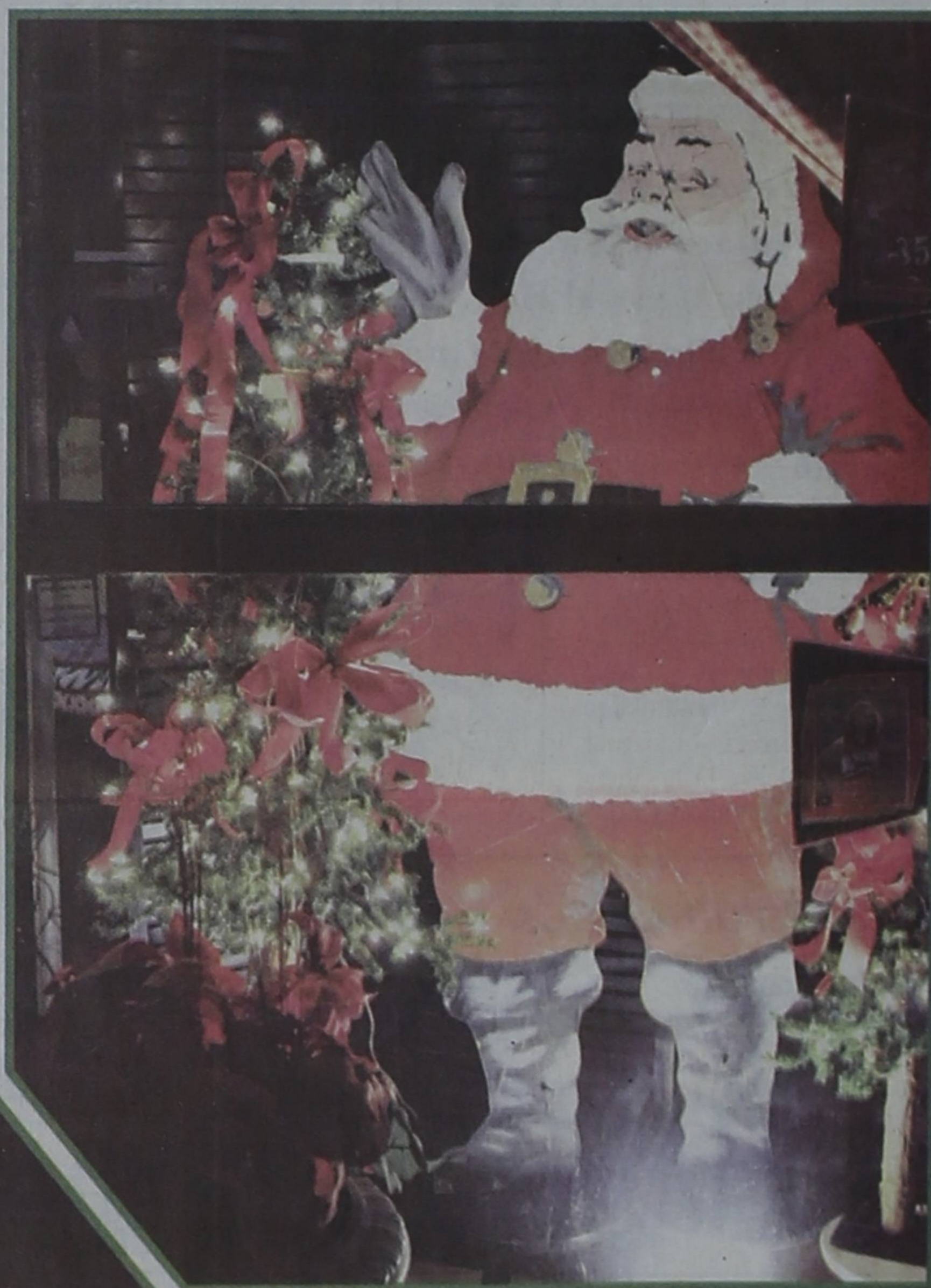
