U.S. administrations have blown hot and cold over Pakistan's efforts - always denied in Islamabad, despite convincing evidence - to develop nuclear weapons. Presi-
dent Carter cut off all U.S. aid, then a modest $\$ 85$ million, in 1977; the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan led to a restoration of aid in 1981, a much larger $\$ 3.2$ billion ove six years. In 1986, based on strong evidence, President
Reagan threatened a cutoff, but with the Soviets still in Reagan threatened a cutoff, but with the Soviets still in
Afghanistan, nothing came of it; indeed, Congress apAfghanistan, nothing came of it; indeed, Congress ap proved a six-year, \$4 billion aid package in 1987 .
Now, with the passing of a crucial deadline mandating an automatic cutoff of aid, there are good reasons for the United States to proceed:

- The Soviets are out of Afghanistan, and a diplomatic
resolution of the civil war there now resolution of the civil war there now seems possible. in August with the dismissal of Prime Minister Benazir Bhutto and the installation of an interim regime dominated from the shadows by the military.
- Evidence that Pakistan is lying about its nuclear activities is so strong that the Bush administration failed to go through the charade of certifying on Oct. 1, as the law
requires, that Pakistan has no nuclear weapons. Instead the White House wants to fudge the issue by getting a con gressional waiver to allow continued aid even without the ig leaf of certification.
The initial response from Capitol Hill has been negative, properly so. Yet cutting all aid, military and
economic, would hit Pakistan when its already weak economy is reeling from the impact of the Persian Gulf crisis, in which it has dispatched troops on the U.S. side Such draconian U.S. action might close diplomatic doors U.S aid would be Pakiy be reopened. Painful as the loss of France is supplying a $\$ 1.5$ billion nuclear power plant and there are other willing sellers of raw materials and technology to help fuel its arms race with India, which already has a nuclear capability.
Washington would do better to stop military aid, roughly 40 percent the next and crucial step ought for a diplomatic offensive, ideally with Moscow's help, aimed at persuading India and Pakistan to sign the globa nuclear non-proliferation treaty. Pakistan says it will sign only if India does, and so far India refuses. Wrong as Pakistan's secretive nuclear program is, it is no more so
than similar efforts by others.
State Department officials argue that U.S. aid should continue for at least six months beyond Pakistan's Oct. 24 parliamentary elections, thus allowing time to obtain assurances from the new government. That's unconvincing: Pakistan's military, which is determined to match power, whatever the outcome of the election. Repeated U.S. warnings of an aid cutoff have been shrugged off in Islamabad on the correct assumption that they were hollow. Nothing less than tangible evidence of U.S. displeasure will have any credibility. At the same
time, maintaining economic assistance at least temporarily would give Washington continued leverage with country whose cooperation in arresting a frightening

dition should improve. Usually we see improvements in children with brain injuries in the first six monlimits ono years. But we don't set prove until they stop improving.' Doctors feared the boy wouldn't survive in the weeks following the accident when they discovered bleeding in his head.
"It was pretty touch and go," Marks said."It was about $50-50$ for a while."
Sally Barnhart, Jason's mother, said he has improved steadily since mid-July surgery repajred an aneurism on the brain and placed a shunt - a small tube that drains fluids - inside his skull
Insurance will cover Jason's medical bills, now nearing $\$ 200,000$, Greg Barnhart said.
Three fund raisers have col lected $\$ 15,000$ to help pay for Jason's full-time home supervision not covered by insurance.
"We've only been in Azle for six years, but I want to be buried here" Greg Barnhart said. "These people have bent over backwards to help us."

Lili lurked off the shore of North Carolina, a weakling among hurricanes, spinning Outer Banks. Its winds were clocked at 75 mph - barely over the hurricane threshhold of 74 the hurricane threshhold of 74 mph.
But the convergence of Lili and Marco, plus the dying remnants of Tropical Storm Klaus, brought a third day of rain and dangerous foutheast.

Forecasters said gale-force winds could extend 75 miles inland along the route of the storm. Tourists in North Carolina packed ferries to flee the Outer Banks, although the most noticeable signs of the storm were waves big enough to thrill surfers.
"I'm a little bit nervous, for my parents' sake," said Tom Sherer, 18, of Coinjock, N.C., who was riding a skim board on the waves. "They're sort of worried.

Worried we're going to get hurt," added 16 -year-old Mike Vernon of Currituck, N.C
The real danger for the time being lay farther south, in Georgia, where four people drowned in rising floodwaters that ravaged the

Augusta area. The floods were blamed on the remnants of Tropical Storm Marco, which blew north out of the Gulf of Mex ico on Thursday.
The victims included an 80 -year-old man who drowned as he and his wife struggled to leave their car at a flooded railroad track north of Augusta. Coroner Thomas King said the man was his wife managed to escape. his wife managed to escape. Three people drowned in Jeffer-
son County, about 50 miles southwest of Augusta, sheriff's southwest of Augusta, sheriff'
Deputy Mark Williamson said. Deputy Mark Williamson said. drowned in South Carolina, while one person drowned and two died in storm-related traffic accidents in North Carolina.
In Augusta and surrounding Richmond County, officials closed all roads and declared a state of emergency, Ms. Smith said.
"All of our roads are flooded," she said. "People are trapped in their homes. People are hollering out for help through their win dows. Some are on the rooftops, There are people in their cars floating down the road.
Emergency officials began evacuating families in the Augusta area early Friday morning.
Ms. Smith estimated that several hundred people had been moved from their flooded homes by boat or four-wheel-drive vehicles by afternoon. About 100 had been taken to a shelter, and the remainder stayed with friends or family, she said.

## O'Meara threatens 90-hole PGA record

LAS VEGAS (AP) - A combina- tion of ideal playing conditions, some friendly little resort courses and the need for aggressive play have put the PGA Tour's 90 -hole scoring record in jeopardy.

Mark O'Meara, the man with the best chance of breaking the 27-under-par 333 mark in the 5 -day, really isn't interested.
