I have a story to tell. My name is Francisca Miramontes. I came to Friona in 1969. I started my nursing career in New York City and prior to coming to Friona I nursed in Ruidoso, NM.
I received my Texas Nursing License in 1972 in Hereford, TX. 1received my Texas Nursing License in 1972 in Hereford, TX.
Vve nursed here in Friona at Prairie Acres as charge nurse in ve nursed here in Friona at Prairie Acres as charge nurse in
1974 and in surrounding nursing homes in Hereford, Muleshoe, and Dimmitt until 1986. I married the love of my life, Margo Miramontes, and now reside in Delicias, Chihuahua, Mexico, for the past 24 years.
I came back to Friona in December of 2009 to visit my children that live here and I became very sick. What started as a sdmple gall bladder problem ended up being a bowel puncture
