Researchers will study arsenic in drinking water
Researchers from the Texas Tech University Health Sciand Community Health have been awarded approximately and Community Health have been awarded approximately
$\$ 500,000$ from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to study the long-term health impacts of drinking water that contains low levels of arsenic.
Project leader Sid O'Bryant, Ph.D. and others will conduct the study through the ongoing rural health Project FRONTIER, a study of factors impacting health among rural West Texans.
O Bryant and colleagues will recruit 600 people for the
study over a two-year period from Cochran, Bailey, and ParStudy over a two-year period from Cochran, Bailey, and Par-
mer counties. "O'Bryant said, "Fhis grant will enable us to determine if rural adults and elders are at increased risk for negative health consequences due to the water they drink." He added, "No one in the U.S. has ever explicitly studied how drinking water that contains arsenic at levels below
what the EPA has deemed acceptable might be harmful in what the EPA has deemed acceptable might be harmful in
