Good aftemoon, everybody. On Friday, we learned that the United States received a downgrade by one of the credit rating agencies - not
so much beccuuse they doubt our ability to pay our debt if we make good somuch because they doubt our ability to pay our debt if we make good ing the debt ceiling, they doubted our political system's ability to act The markets, on the other hand, continue to believe our credit status is AAA. In fact, Warren Buffett, who knows a thing or two about good investments, said, "If there werea quadruple-Arating, I'd give the United
States that." 1 , and most of the world's investors, arree. States that." $I$, and most of the world's investors, agree. That doessn't mean we don't have a problem. The fact is, we didn't proach to deficit reduction. That was true last week. That was true last year. That was true the day I took office. And we didn't need a rating agency to tell us that the gridlock in Washington over the last several oonths has not been constuctive, to say the least. We knew from the atset that a prolonged debate over the debt celing - a debate wher damage to our economy and the world's. That threat, coming after string of economic distuptions in Europe, Japan and the Middle East, has now roiled the markets and dampened consumer confidence and owed the pace of recovery.
So all of this is a legitimate source of concem. But here's the good news: Our problems are eminently solvable.* And we know what
we have to do to solve them. With respect to debt, our problem is not confidence in our credit - the markets continue to reaffimm our credit as among the world's safest. Our challenge is the need to tackle our deficits over the long term.
Last week, we reached an agreement that will make historic cuts to
defense and domestic spending. But there's not much further we cut in either of those categories. What we need to do now is combine those spending cuts with two additional steps: tax reform that will ask those who can afford it to pay their fair share and modest adjustments o health care programs like Medicare.
Making these reforms doesn' trequire any radical steps. What it does dequire is common sense and compromise. There are plenty of goo to achieve long-term deficit rediction that doesn hamper economic growth right now. Republicans and Democrats o the bipartisan fiscal commission that I set up put forth good proposals Republicans and Democrats in the Senate's Gang of Six came up with some good proposals. John Boehner and I came up with some goo roposals when we came close to agreeing on a grand bargain. lack of political will in Washington. It's the insistence on drawing ines in the sand, a refusal to put what's best for the country ahead of self-interest or party or ideology. And that's what we need to change. size of the facilities and ships is amazing and the outomation is overwhelming. They use robots to unload grain from rail cars and a single computer operator controls every function from grai unloading, storing, and loading ships.
