Medicare steps up equal visitation Today, the Department of (HHS) announced new guidance to support enforcement of rules that protect hospital patients' right to choose their own visitors during a hospial stay, including a visito
who is a same-sex domestic partner. These rules, finalized by the Centers for Medicare \& Medicaid Services (CMS) in November, apply to all hospitals that participate
in Medicare and Medicaid The Medicare and Medicaid. The guidance also supports enforcement of the right of
patients to designate the perpatients to designate the per-
son of their choice, including a same-sex partner, to make medical decisions on their behalf should they become incapacitated.
"Couples take a vow to be with each other in sickness and in health and it is unac-
ceptable that, in the past, ceptable that, in the past,
some same-sex partners were denied the right to visit their loved ones in times of need," said HHS Secretary Kathleen Sebelius. "We are releasing guidance for enforcing new rules that give all patients, in-
cluding those with same-sex cluding those with same-sex parners, the right to choose
who can visit them in the hospital as well as enhancing existing guidance regarding
the right to choose who will help make medical decisions on their behalf." The rules updated the
Conditions of Participa tion (CoPs), which are the health and safety standards
heare the hall Medicare- and Medicaidparticicipating hospitals and critical access hosppitals must meet, and apply to all pa-
tients of those hospitals even tients of those hospitals even if they are not on Medicare or Medicaid. Among other
