session August 29, 2011. All members were present along with Superintendent Kenny Austin and business manager Dianna Wright.
The board approved a $1.5 \%$ raise for non-contract employ cafeteria employees. After discussion and amendments the school board approved a 2011-2012 budget of $\$ 10,244,081$. The board called for a Special Bond Election to be held on November 8 in an amount not to exceed $\$ 4$ million. The elecion will be held as a joint election with Parmer County. Vo ers will cast ballots for ten state constitutional amendments and the special bond election. The school district hired the nderwood Law Firm as bond counsel
The bond election will fund several projects on school cam activity center attached to the high school gym.
Superintendent Austin says the building will be built onto the east side of the gym and extend into the parking lot. It will house a wood floor for volleyball/basketball practice, rubber floor for other athletic activities, and a new weigh room. There will also be minimal seating for use in JV o junior high games.
Along with the activity center construction will be convert ing the south end of the parking lot area along 7th St. into by the activity center

House Bill 252 requires a copy of the homeowner's Texas driver's license or state identification card and the homeowner's vehicle registration receipt be sent with the homestead exemption application. If the homeowner does not own a vehicle they can send a along with an affidavit provided in the appli long with an affidavit provided in the appli-
cation indicating non-ownership of a vehicle. The address on the documents must match the address for which the homestead exemption is requested. The new requirement does not apply to homeowners who already have homestead exemptions. It affects only new applications for exemptions sent to appraisal districts.

ORDINANCE 2011.09.12D amending Friona Code of Ordinance Section 13.203 increasing residential and commercial sewer rates and setting an effective date.

The City Council of the City of Friona voted to increase water and sewer rates as of Sep tember 12th.
The base residential and commercial water rate will increase by $\$ 1.75$ for a $5 / 8$ inch meter. The per thousand gallons of water used will increase by $\$ 0.25$ to $\$ 0.50$ depending on amount of water consume
2,001-10,000 $\$ 2.50$ increased by $\$ 0.25$

20,001-50,000 $\$ 3.50$ increased by $\$ 0.50$
Over $50,001 \quad \$ 3.75$ increased by $\$ 0.50$
5,000 gallons of water will cost $\$ 25.75$. The average cost from the Texas Municipal League state survey is $\$ 29.05$.

The base residential sewer rate will increase by $\$ 0.50$ to $\$ 18.00$ each month. The average cost from the Texas Municipal League state survey is $\$ 25.46$.

The base commercial sewer rates category \#1, category \#2 and category \#3 will increase by $\$ 0.50$ plus an additional $\$ 0.05$ to $\$ 0.10$ per thousand gallons of water used over 2,000 .
