School board authorizes bond election on November 8 ballot

The Friona Independent School District board of trustees will be seeking approval of a \$4 million bond election on the November 8 ballot. Voters will go to the polls in the county to vote on ten amendments to the state constitution. On a separate ballot will be a vote for or against the proposed school bond.

A major portion of the bond money will be spent

to build an activity center onto the high school gym and replace the roof and the heating and air conditioning and windows at the high school. The activity center will have two additional basketball courts and a new weight room to accommodate practice sessions for basketball and volleyball teams. The facility will have limited seating and could be used for junior high and JV games.

All facilities, lighting, and construction will be built to energy efficient standards.

Other projects covered by the bond will be two new activity buses, a separate restroom facility at the football field which will allow expansion of the existing concession stand, renovation of the primary

school playground, new projector equipment for the junior high, improved lighting in the junior high auditorium, and landscaping around the primary school, elementary school, and junior high cafeteria.

The activity center, to be built on the east side of the gym, will require reconstruction of the high school parking lot. This project will include removing some trees on the south part of the current parking lot along 7th Street.

Superintendent Kenny Austin says the two newest activity buses used by the district are 17 years old. The new tax rate will be \$1.04, including the additional 12-cents per \$100 property valuation. For example, he said, on a home appraised at \$100,000 the increase would be \$120

per year. The bond payoff will be 10 years. After the bond is issued and the bond debt is incurred, the district can apply for state aid funds to help with the indebtedness. Residents over 65 years-old who have homestead exemptions that freeze property taxes will not be affected by the tax increase.

Early voting on the bond

issue will begin October 24 through November 4 during regular business hours at the FISD administration building. A complete Notice of Bond Election is printed in both English and Spanish in this issue of the Friona Star. Architect drawings of the proposed activity center and the parking lot area are also included in this issue.

Council publishes bids to buy backhoe, sell old computers

The Friona city council met in regular session Monday October 10, 2011 at 6:30 p.m. in council chambers, 619 Main St. Council members Martha Barker and Charlie Pope were absent. Mayor J. B. Douglas presided.

As required annually, the council approved the Friona Star as the official newspaper for the city. The federal/county emergency mitigation plan was approved. The plan is designed for coordination of all county agencies in the event of a disaster emergency.

The bid to sell the 1987 Case backhoe was awarded to high bidder Charles Ray for \$11,600. City manager Patricia Phipps was authorized by the council to accept bids to purchase a backhoe loader 2007 model or later and to publish a bid notice to sell various computer equipment and a welder. Both bid notices are included in this issue of the Star.

To be announced later will be an opportunity for the community to dispose of used computer equipment with roll off boxes/trailer being furnished. Details to be advised.

The accounts payable for September, and the monthly and quarterly financial statements were discussed and approved. The mayor officially proclaimed November 7-11 as Municipal Court Week.

The council went into executive session at 7 p.m. to discuss a real estate situation of land owned by Jerry Loflin adjacent to the city wastewater treatment plant. After returning from executive session the council authorized the mayor to discuss purchase of the land with Mr. Loflin.

The next meeting of the city council is Monday November 14 at 6:30 p.m. All council meetings are open to the public.

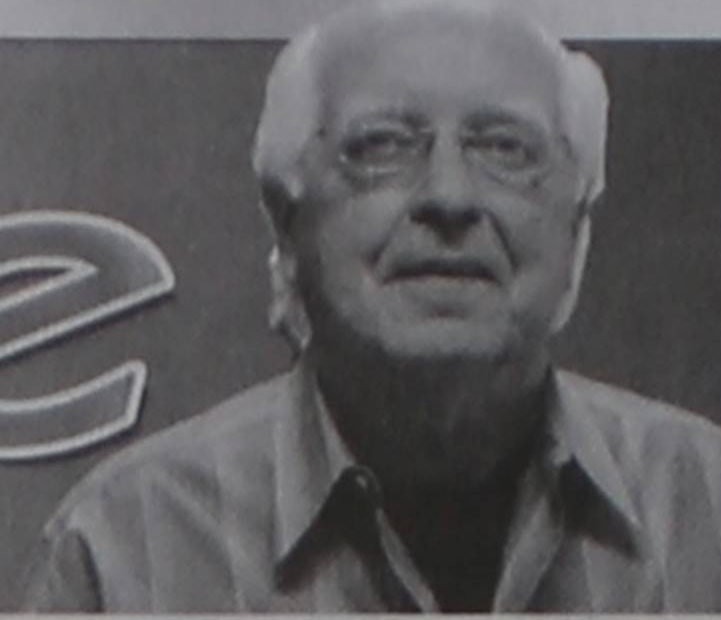

life is all debits and credits

My Uncle Ernest wanted me to study accounting.

In the 50s during my high school years, Uncle Ernest tried to get me to take a correspondence course in accounting. He 'kept the books' for a local car dealer in Hillsboro and did tax returns on the side. Said it would be a good career for me.

After high school I did take a couple of college accounting courses. Even tried the correspondence course but soon decided numbers and ledgers were not my niche. Just couldn't make the debits and credits balance. Besides I was too impatient to spend a lot of time looking for nickels and dimes. I wanted to be a salesman and hire somebody to keep the books.

Later, when I had my own travel agency business, the importance of debits and credits (income and expense) became very clear. I learned by trial and error the importance of keeping up with your money, whether

you have a little or a lot.

The federal government pays scant attention to debits and credits. Those protesters camping out and hollering at the rich Wall Street bankers need some debit and credit counseling.

Here it is. You get a paycheck, that is a credit. Your rent, food, cell phone, and Netflix movie rentals are all debits. Your debits should not exceed your credits or you could end up bankrupt and homeless. It is a harsh lesson to learn for many people.

Yes it is obscene the amount of money some corporations and individuals earn. Why are they not protesting professional athletes who are paid millions? Go protest on the golf course where a guy earns over a million bucks for playing four rounds of golf. Shouldn't the protesters be able to get a portion of the winnings?

They should be camped out in front of the White House, protesting the mountain of regulations the government imposes on

business and individuals. They should be protesting the tax code which someone described as a book of political favors.

The BIG BANKS are about to charge customers \$5 a month if they use their debit card and folks are threatening to riot in the streets about it. "It's my money" they say. They are charging me for my money. Well then, go to the bank and get your money and keep it in a shoebox.

Banks of all sizes have overhead (debits) and with government regulations of all kinds, they have to find a way to make money (credits) to be able to account for all of those debit transactions you make. The big bank fees will drive many customers back to the community banks that do not charge such fees (for now).

My son Zac graduated from college earlier this year. He is currently living in Austin, working for a food co-op called

Wheatsville and hoping to break into the theater business. He is learning a lot about the debits and credits of everyday living. He will now be required to pay his 'fair share' as long as he lives. He is only 22 and his love affair with the government is just beginning.

At this point he is sympathetic with the protesters, most of whom are in his age bracket. Not sure he has a goal of getting some of the rich folks money though. Right now he is wrestling with his first checking account and sharing living expenses with a couple of roommates.

I've concluded that in the end life is about debits and credits. We can work hard and help others and hope we accumulate more credits than debits. It is a daily battle Zac. Keep on straight ahead. Remember your debits and credits.

cogitations & aphorisms of jodok

From the December 6, 1935 Friona Star. Uncle John ruminates about farmers and the government and the value of education and libraries. Other front page news is also submitted. Imagine Friona in 1935.

I have just been reading an article in the Producer-Consumer. One of the statements in which I especially agree with him is: "Every industry should be, to a very large degree, self-governing. Why should the destiny of the American farmer be left to any other group with Congress or State Legislatures deciding on policies and mapping the future course of production or marketing? Not only the farmer himself, but the farmer's family as a unit should become thoroughly familiar with the present day problems and have definite ideas as to how they should be met."

I have always held the view of the matter and have contended that the farmer is his own and only salvation, from an economic standpoint and still contend that the only way he will ever achieve economic supremacy, or even an equal footing with all other lines of industry or professions will be through his own prowess, and that government 'dabbings' in his affairs will only retard and postpone this achievement.

In his battle for this supremacy or equality, he has all the guns and ammunitions at his disposal. He does not even need to call a siege as a mere armistice while maintaining a war status would be sufficient to bring his enemy to terms.

Well! In cogitating over this matter I find my cogitations so productive and my aphorisms so responsive that I am about to get 'all steamed up' over it so I had better close the damper for awhile.

He gives expression to this statement with which I heartily agree: "Our public school

system furnishes the youth of the land the tools of education, but real education that directs the affairs of the nation comes in adult years. The University that stands ready to furnish this training is the library." The Prof then quotes from the Civil Statutes of Texas the following, "A public library is the flavor of the modern forms of cooperation, which secures for the individual, luxuries which he could not afford otherwise."

Here again I most heartily agree with the Professor and maintain as I have always maintained that education is the greatest and, perhaps the only, factor in the final, absolute supremacy of mankind. I am still of the opinion that the public library is, following the 'high school course, the greatest disseminator of education or knowledge that the world affords, even though it be merely a library in a country school room. "The public school is for but one portion of the community-the younger portion-while the public library is for all, young and old."

There is in my opinion nothing that would be of more abounding and permanent benefit to the entire community than a good public library with a competent and efficient person in charge of it.

As I glance back about four decades into the dim past I can recall the time when a little school library was established in the school room of a small but progressive rural district, and I can further recall the great amount of pure and wholesome entertainment as well as the great amount of mental development or progress that came from the use of that same little library, which was constantly increased by the regular addition of new volumes.

Somehow it has always been my good fortune to live all my life in progressive communities.

Items on the Friona Star front page, December 6, 1935

Mr. Mettle of Fanning County moved his household goods to Friona arriving here Tuesday afternoon, and on arriving the driver of the truck learned that the house that was to have received them was rented to another party and he experienced considerable difficulty in locating another satisfactory house.

Such conditions cannot be construed otherwise that that houses in Friona are in demand and that the population in again on the increase which is no bad sign for the city.

Mr. Mettle has purchased a tract of land not far from Friona and will live in town until he has made arrangements for moving to the farm.

Representative Randy Neugebauer issued the following statement regarding the Crop Risk Options Plan (CROP) Act, which he introduced in the House of Representatives on October 5, 2011. This bill would give producers new options for federal crop insurance:

"This bill builds on a concept I introduced as part of the last farm bill that would enable producers to insure crops against shallow losses, which can be 25-30% of a farmer's expected production. These shallow losses do not always trigger an indemnity with the existing multi-peril insurance plans, which can quickly add up across several thousand acres on the modern family farm.

This bill's county-level trigger for area plans would closely mirror a farmer's production. This bill would also change the way the Risk Management Agency (RMA) determines yield histories, moving from a 10-year average to a seven-year Olympic average. This modification would result in yield histories that more closely follow the actual yield levels of modern crop production practices.

I believe this bill would enhance the current crop insurance program for farmers as they face weather risks. I am committed to ensuring farmers and ranchers have cost-effective crop insurance options that work."

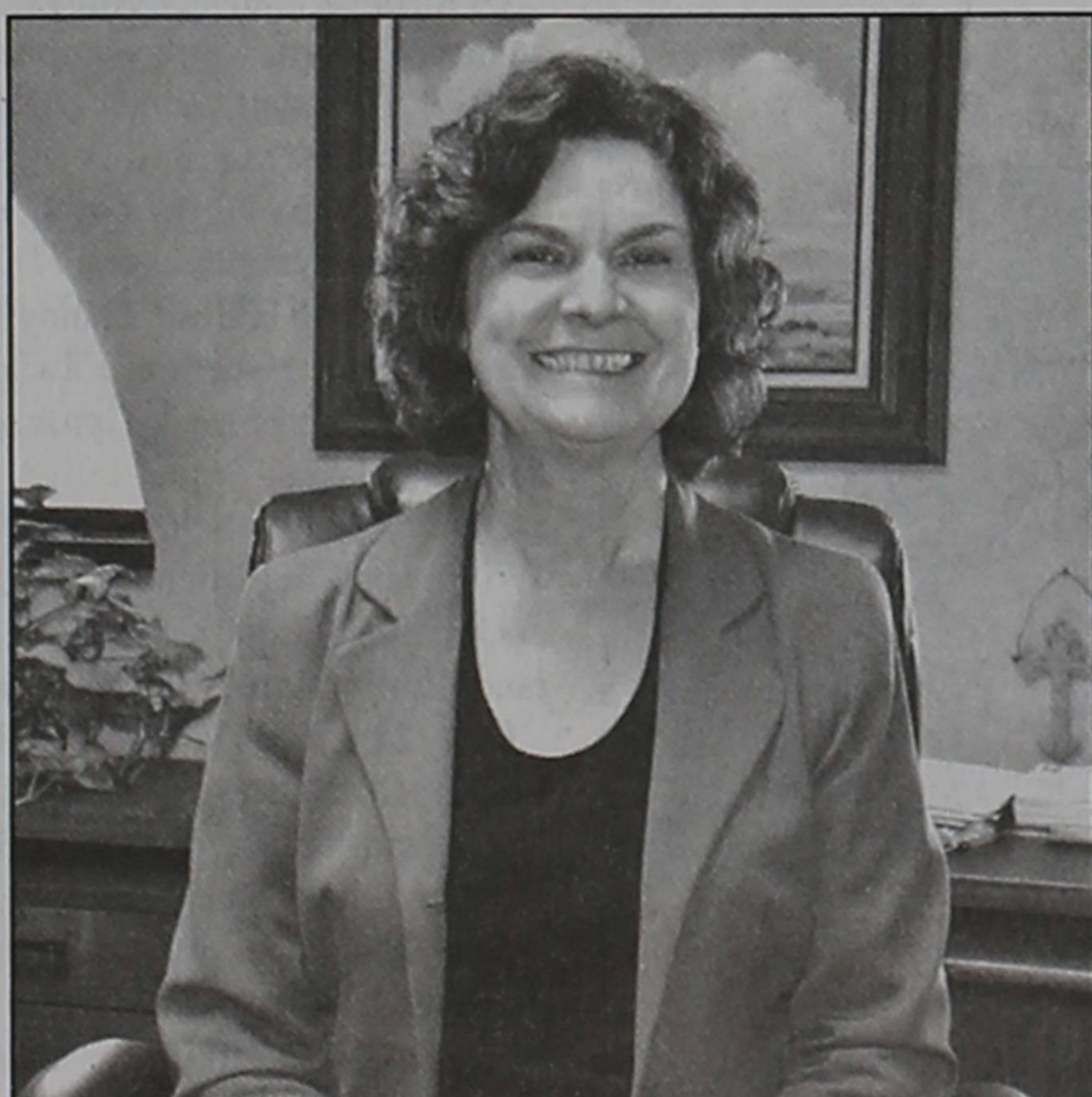
Carolyn worked at Rock-

Chiefs win the battle of the wind

The Farm Bureau crew needed help to hold down the inflatable run-through for the Chiefs at Bushland Friday night. The relentless Panhandle wind blew out of the southeast at 30-50 mph during the entire game, creating some interesting strategies by the coaches for both teams.

The Chiefs, who entered the game as 20+ point underdogs, scored 19 points (with the wind) in the 1st quarter and led 19-7 at the half. Bushland came back with 16 fourth quarter points to take the lead with about three minutes left in the game.

Bushland had 16 seconds left. They moved the ball to

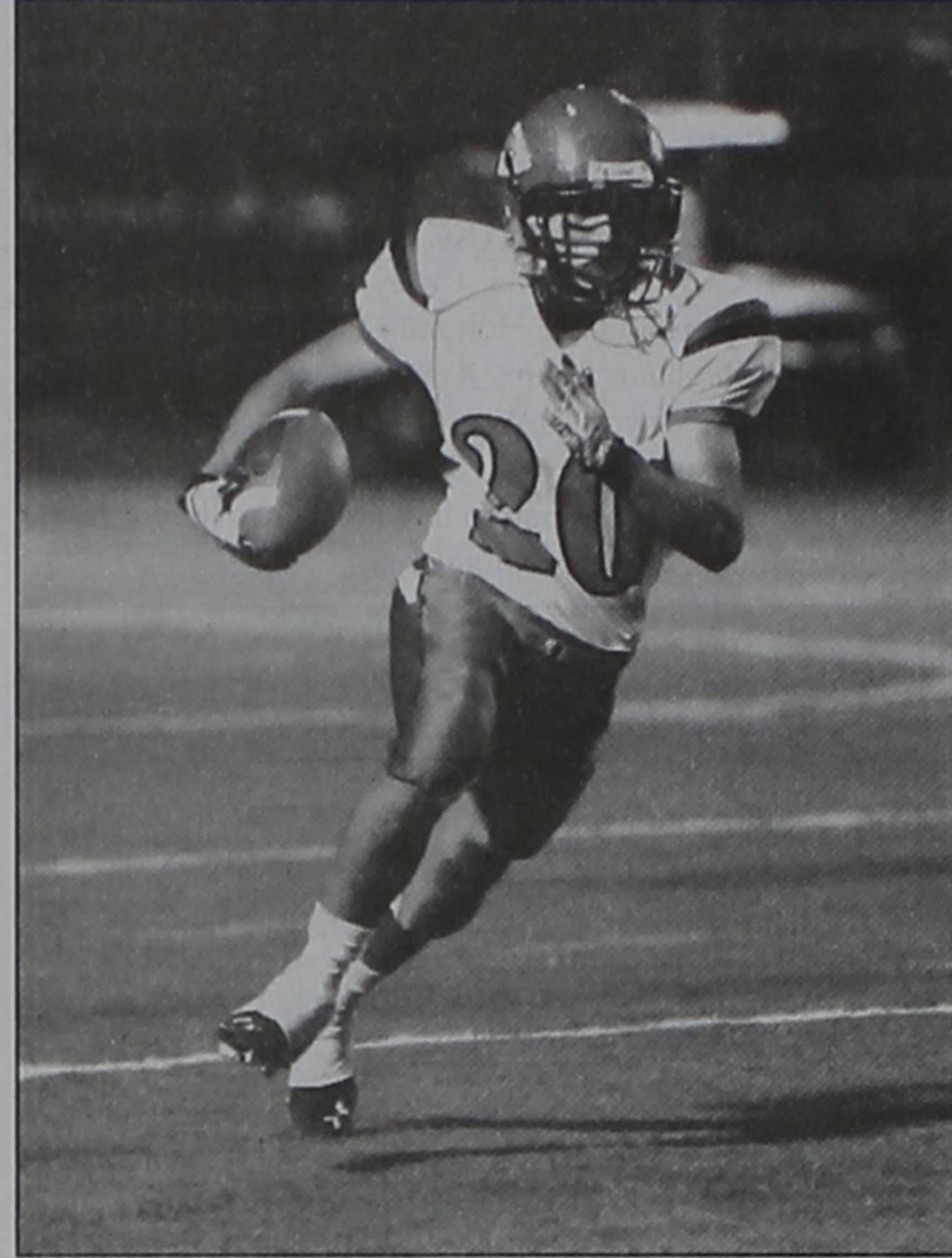

The Chiefs attempted only 7 passes and completed two for 16 yards while the Falcons threw 32 times for 194 passing yards and rushed for only 85 yards. Chieftains Brad Stowers and Serafin Vasquez were on the receiving end of the two completions.

Rushing stats: Monroe carried 19 times for 102 yards, Eduardo Rojas 19-83, Diego Licerio 7-27, Francisco Martinez 6-32, Serafin Vasquez 4-15, Stephen Dominguez 3-14, Richard Rodriguez 3-16, and Sawyer Osborn 2-10.

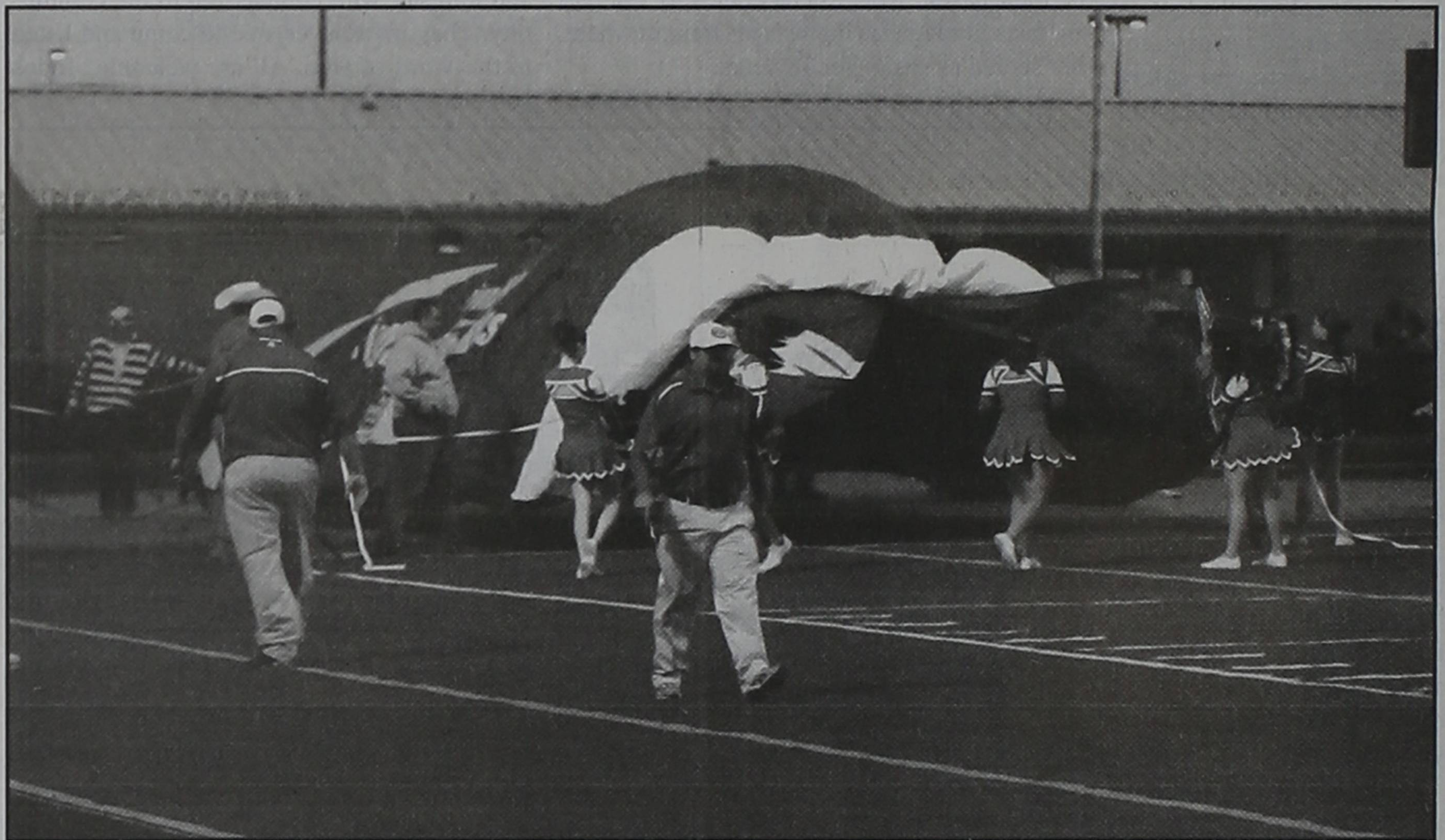

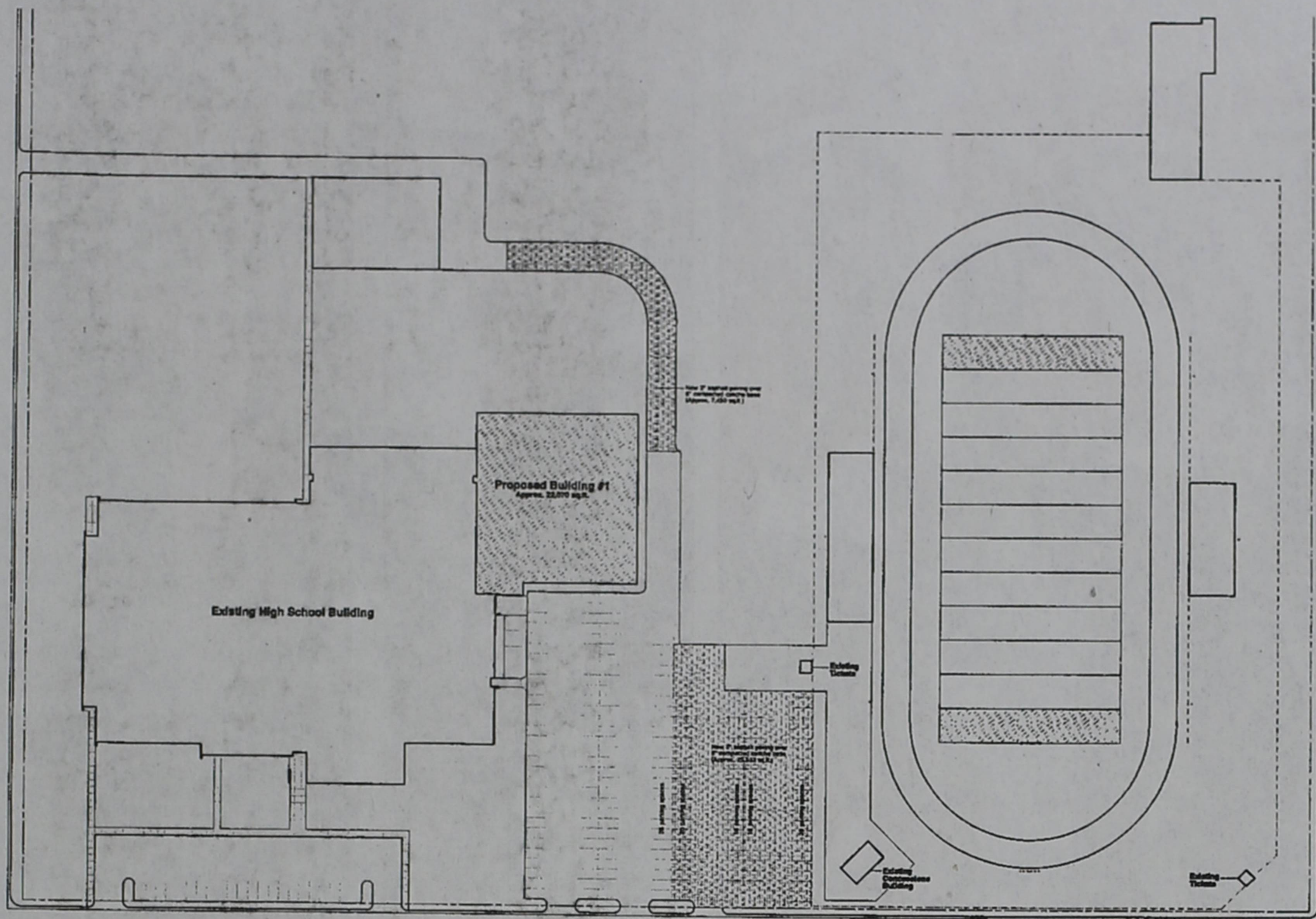
