Council approves 911 move to Farwell

The Friona city council met in regular session Monday December 12 at 6:30 p.m. in the council chambers at 619 Main St. All members were present. Mayor J.B. Douglas presided.

A resolution to transfer the 911 emergency service dispatch to the Sheriff's office in Farwell was discussed. The 911 service in the Panhandle is at the Bluebonnet Home coordinated by the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission (PRPC) in Amarillo. Mike Peters, the PRPC 911 coordinator was present to answer questions posed by council members. Peters told the council he thought 911 service was started in Friona about 1989 or 1990. He indicated that in the future, as technology develops, there will likely be future local dispatch offices throughout the Panhandle as offices will be consolidated into larger operations. After discussion, the council voted to approve the

transfer of the Parmer County 911 dispatch to Farwell. The cost of \$2, 000 to \$3,000 will be paid by the county.

Fire Chief Jim Taylor asked to council to reimburse the fire department about \$900 in travel expense spent to send two firemen to California to bring back a new tanker truck. The city had already paid over \$500 in related expense to get the truck DOT inspected and repair three valves that froze during the drive back when the firemen ran into a snow storm in Flagstaff, Arizona. City manager Patricia Phipps told council members the city had paid \$73,000 in fire department expenses this year and had received \$27,000 from the county commissioners fire fund. The council approved the \$900 reimbursement to the fire department. The tanker is currently being lettered and outfitted for use by the local fire department.

Reappointed to the Friona planning and zoning board were Carroll Cook and Doug Kelley. The council approved the November accounts payables and financial statements.

A discussion was held about locating a used tire recycling trailer in Friona. The PRPC representative said the \$7,000 trailer would be provided free to the city. Citizens will be able to dispose of used tires of all sizes in the trailer at a per tire fee yet to be determined. A recycling company from Denver City, Texas, will come to Friona and haul away the used tires for \$1,100, paid by the fees collected. The council approved a resolution to apply for the grant, through PRPC, to fund the tire recycling operation.

The next meeting of the city council will be Monday, January 9, 2012. All city council meetings are open to the public.

Well owners need to make initial readings for 2012 water use

The High Plains Under- provide their initial informaground Water Conservation District reminds owners / operators of certain wells or well systems that it is time to make initial readings to determine a "starting point" for 2012 groundwater use reporting.

Recent High Plains Water District rule amendments now require flow meter readings or readings from alternative measuring methods to be recorded from December 15 to January 15 of each year. This information is needed to report annual water use to the district by March 1 of the following year.

"In preparation for reporting in the 2012 calendar

Parts of the database will become active within the next 30 days and additional parts will become active in stages after that for recording/reporting of meter readings.

metering/reporting The requirements apply to all groundwater use within the High Plains Water District including agriculture, livestock and dairy operation, manufacturing, municipalities, oil and gas production, public water supply systems, and steam-electric generation.

The month of November was a steady month for us down at the station. We had a total of seven calls, with five fires, one wreck, and a false alarm.

On November 7 we had a call about a fire near the railroad tracks that ended up being a false alarm. A-Tex Dairy had a front loader on fire November 11. Cattle outlook for 2012 BY BENJI HENDERSON, CEA

The dry year we have been through in 2011 across Parmer County and the rest of Texas should lead to strong market for cattle in 2012. The Texas drought has led to a reduction of more than 600,000 cows in the state (12%), the second largest decline in history since 1934-35 (18%).

Nationally, a 12% decline in 2011 in beef cow inventory is the second largest decline in history as 550,000 head of cattle were sold off during that time. With the low numbers of calves to be born this spring it will be tough to fill the demand for beef. It will simply be a supply and demand market for cattle. Some higher records could be set as we move into 2012 and look at cattle prices.

County sales tax report


Texas Comptroller Susan Combs announced that state sales tax revenue in November was \$2.07 billion, up 12.2 percent compared to November 2010.

"Sales tax revenue in all major economic sectors improved over a year ago," Combs said. "While sales tax receipts associated with oil and natural gas production remains the strongest source of growth, there were strong increases from the consumer-driven sectors of retail trade and restaurants."

The sales tax figures represent sales that occurred in October.



Water District begins winter water measurements

What effect did 2011 pumpage have on groundwater levels of the Ogallala Aquifer within the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District service area?

That question will soon be answered-with the Dec. 1 start of annual Winter Water Level Measurements in a network of more than 1,200 privately-owned water wells.

These observation wells are spaced at a density of about one well per nine square miles throughout the district's 16-county service area. Depth-to-water level measurements are made by lowering a steel tape to a pre-determined depth in the observation well. The first few feet of the tape lowered into each well is coated with carpenters' chalk, which turns a darker shade of blue when it contacts water. The distance from land surface to the static water level is determined by subtracting the amount of tape with the darker blue chalk from the total feet of steel tape extended into the well. After the measurement is made, a blue vinyl sticker with

the observation well number, the depth-to-water level measurement, and the date of the measurement is affixed to the well equipment or other appropriate surface near the well site. High Plains Water District personnel measure the same wells in the observation well network each year, as long as the individual wells are accessible and continue to provide satisfactory data. The current depth-to-water level measurements are compared to those of previous years to determine the average annual change in water levels in the Ogallala Aquifer within the district. Maps showing the location and well number of the observation wells in each county or portion of a county within the district are published each year in The Cross Section. The annual Winter Water Level issue contains tables listing observation wells in each county of the district and the average annual change in water levels for one-year, five-year, and 10-year in-



Panhandle Parables What Child is this?





Sign-up period for Conservation Stewardship program

USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) State Conservationist Salvador Salinas announced January 13, 2012 as the first ranking cut-off period for the Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP).

"CSP gives conservation minded producers the ability to apply and build on their current stewardship efforts," said Salinas. "Farmers and ranchers actively engaged in natural resource conservation practices have the opportunity to earn financial rewards through CSP."

CSP is a voluntary five-year program offered to landowners statewide through continuous signup. Producers interested in CSP should submit applications to their local NRCS office by the deadline so their applications can be considered during this first ranking period.

In fiscal year 2011, Texas awarded 206 CSP contracts on nearly 500,000 acres with a total of \$5.1 million in payments to help farmers and ranchers implement conservation practices that provide public benefits, such as cleaner water and improved air quality.

"CSP is a strong program in Texas and we are hopeful more farmers and ranchers with stewardship goals will participate in the 2012 CSP," said Salinas.

Eligible lands include cropland, pasture- mat land, rangeland and nonindustrial forestland www and agricultural land under the jurisdiction of DA


Indian tribes. Individual landowners, legal entities and Indian tribes may be eligible to apply for CSP assistance. Participants will have the opportunity to receive payments for practices that maintain and improve water and soil quality, as well as enhance wildlife habitat.

A CSP self-screening checklist is available to help potential applicants determine if CSP is suitable for their operation. The checklist highlights basic information about CSP eligibility requirements, contract obligations and potential payments. It is available from local NRCS offices and on the CSP Web page.

As part of the CSP application process, applicants will work with NRCS field personnel to complete a resource inventory using a Conservation Measurement Tool (CMT), which determines the conservation performance for existing and new conservation activities. The applicant's conservation performance will be used to determine eligibility, ranking and payments.

"I encourage farmers and ranchers actively involved in conserving their natural resources to apply for CSP in order to maintain or improve existing conservation activities, and implement additional practices on their land," said Salinas.

Interested producers can obtain the information from the Texas NRCS website http:// www.tx.nrcs.usda.gov or contact their USf DA-NRCS field office.
