financial decision, said Assistant Superintendent E Moughon. "Our fiscal year ends Auperint. 31. To balanc This sis common at the end of the institution's fisca
year, Moughon said. Near the end of the 1991 fisc ear, about eight temporary personnel were laid
These tepmporary employees are hired knowin their jobs could last as little as two months, he said They would have all gone home unquestionably The primary reason for the increase in temporar personnel - from eight last year to 15 this year the increased need placed on the institution by an
above-budget census. The institution is budgeted for 401 patients, but has been steadily running about 440 Rosenburg.
There were no permanent positions lost in the ter
minations, he said.
Moughon said all of the temporary personnel ar
encouraged to reapply for permanent positions. This encouraged to reapply for permanent positions. Thi
is how the institution acquires many of its full-tim employees. The turnover

New EPA rules designed to protect farm workers

The Environmental Protection Agency on Thursday released a list
of rules requiring agricultural employers to make efforts such as
training workers in handling pesticides and making sure they
have a place to wash their hands have a place to wash their hands.
It took eight years to finalize the rules. They were caught in a strug
gle between the Agricultur gle between the Agricultur
Department, which said they coul hurt the agricultural industry, and tions didn't go far enough. tions didn't go far enough.
The EPA says the new regula tions will affect nearly 4 million people and could prevent 10,000 to
20,000 pesticide-related injurie and illnesses a year.
The rules will apply to farm workers, employees of nurseries,
forests and greenhouses, and anyone who handles pesticides us ed in such places. It could cos
companies up to $\$ 60$ million a year to comply, the EPA said. Under the new regulations handling pesticides and in usin protective equipment, such as gloves or goggles. Workers mu
have a place to wash and access emergency medical care. Employers must post notices
treated fields warning workers Spanish and English of pesticid risks and bar them from the field for 12 to 72 hours after spraying
