City council agenda for Monday

The Friona city council will meet in regular session Monday June 11 at 6:30 p.m. in council chambers, 619 Main St. All council meetings are open to the public.

New councilman Greg Lewellen will be joining the council for his first regular meeting. The council will elect a mayor pro-tem for 2012-2013.

Minutes of the May 14 regular meeting and the May 29 special meeting will be considered. They will also consider moving the Monday July 9 regular meeting to July 10. In other business items the council will consider approval of the May accounts payable and May financial statement. Mayor Douglas will give notice of the appointment of Deborah Campbell as Municipal Court Judge for a two-year term, 2012-2014.

The council will consider and take action on approval of the 2012 debt structure schedule for the \$1 million certificate of obligation being issued for wastewater treatment improvements. And the 2011 Consumer Confidence annual report for the drinking water will be considered.

These agenda items are provided by the city and are subject to change. The official and final meeting agenda is posted on the city hall front door 72 hours prior to the meeting.

Some thoughts on voting.

We are apt to hear a lot about voting this year since Mr. Obama's forces will be trying to figure out how to squeeze as many votes as possible.

The Voter ID law that has been approved in about 17 states, including Texas, is being challenged by the Obama Justice Department as being discriminatory. Evidently poor people have no form of photo identification; evidently many poor people do not have a birth certificate in order to get a photo ID; and supposedly some states let dead people vote as long as they vote Democrat. In Wisconsin the state spent over \$60 million on a recall election of their governor, Scott Walker. People all over the country try to cheat the system. Petitions have forged signatures, homeless and poor people are paid to vote for certain candidates, and in some instances false ballots are submitted by mail.

Then there is the money. Wisconsin losers are claiming that millions of dollars were spent by out of state donors that "bought the election." About the same time Mr. Obama flew to New York (on taxpayer

paid jet fuel) to attend a \$40,000 per plate fundraiser dinner at the home of Sarah Jessica Parker. Hope they at least get to keep the plate.

I guess I just don't see a significant result from voter fraud and cheating. Some will still say that George W. Bush won in 2000 by a bunch of voter cheats and hanging chads in Florida. Poor Al Gore has never been the same since he got cheated out of that election. He suffers today from post traumatic election syndrome, traveling around trying to convince people that the sky is falling and the glaciers are melting. His loving wife Muffy, or whatever her name was, even kicked him to the curb.

I shall definitely vote in November. I already know whom I will vote for. No need to be busing in folks to knock on my door. Take me off the robo-call list. Call our cemetery association if you want to buy a list of dead voters.


Kidz Health & Safety Fair held



This article is shared by Calvary Baptist Church pastor Rick Burton. It is from a 1942 or 1943 edition of the Paducah Post of Paducah, Texas. Cletus Burton is Pastor Rick's father and Durwood Burton is his uncle. Both of these gentlemen, if they were still alive today, would be in their mid-90s.

Burton Boys Guests of the Lions Club

Cletus and Durwood Burton were the most interesting honored guests at the Lions Club luncheon Thursday that the organization has had in a long time. The two brothers belong to the navy, Cletus with four years and Durwood with seven years service.

To say that these two brothers have seen service under the Stars and Stripes would be putting it very mildly. Cletus was in Pearl Harbor on a cruiser when it was bombed. His ship was shot from under him. He has been in every engagement of any importance between the U.S. and Japanese fleets., including the Solomon Islands and the Coral Sea.

Durwood was on a cruiser on the Coral Sea when the vessel was sunk by Japanese dive bombers. One of the planes dive-

bombed into the vessel. Cletus remarked that he "knew there was one dead Jap."

The crew from the sinking vessel took to life boats and were picked up five days later by a destroyer. In this engagement seven planes were shot down and as the remainder went out of sight some of them were in smoke. Twenty-one planes attacked the ship.

There were many questions asked the boys they would not answer, only saying the information would be given when "it is over." Durwood stated that it would take two years at least to end the war.

These two boys have a determined look in their eyes. They know there is a job out there that must be done and they are going to help do it. If people generally could look into their faces and hear them talk there would be very little shirking of duty by the people on the home front.

These boys were called home on account of the illness of their mother. Neither knew the other was coming until they ran into each other here at home. They left Thursday afternoon to take their places again in the navy.

Summer Time Means Gardening

Growing up we always had a garden. We had the "small" garden in our backyard. This garden was for our table vegetables. We always had tomatoes, peppers, onions and squash. Some of the time we would have a few other things such as green beans, black eyed peas and sweet corn, but usually those vegetables were reserved for the "farm" garden.

The farm garden was for the vegetables that would be canned or frozen. was always planted in the field and it was always big! I can remember standing at the end of those half mile rows of green beans or black eyed peas promising myself I would never plant a garden.

Having a garden does not mean you have to go to those extremes. Even

or plant a few vegetables in containers to enjoy through the summer.

Last year I tried planting herbs in the flower pots in our front yard. (This was after I had killed all the flowers, twice!) I was truly surprised that not only did they live, they grew. I decided that I would continue to plant herbs in these pots.

This summer I bought several different varieties of herbs to try. I am not good about using fresh herbs when I cook but I hated the farm garden. Container gardening is becoming more and more popular because of the small amount of time and space that is needed to be successful. Clay pots, half barrels and window boxes if you live in town you are the most commonly can have an herb garden used containers, but any


sturdy container that has ample space for root development and adequate drainage will do.

Sunlight is a very important factor to the success of your container garden. Make sure to check the amount of sunlight that is needed for each of your plants. Group plants with similar needs together.

With our West Texas winds and hot summers, it is very important that your containers are watered regularly. Make sure to keep the soil moist but you do not want your plants standing in water. Use a watering can or a spray attachment on a garden hose and use cool water to stimulate root growth. Also look for a water soluble fertilizer that you can apply weekly to provide your plants with the nutrients that they need.

With a little time and attention, you too can boast of being a gardener.
