Council approves tax rate, lets bids for motor grader

The Friona city council met in regular session Monday August 13 with all council members present. Mayor J.B. Douglas presided.

Parmer County chief tax appraiser Jill Timms addressed the council regarding the 2012 effective tax rate for the city. The taxable value of property in the City of Friona for 2012 is \$109,892,297, an increase in valuation of \$13,492,706

over 2011. After review and discussion the council adopted a tax rate of \$0.7900/\$100, the same tax rate used for the past nine years.

Because of the increased property valuation the overall tax revenue will increase. Two public hearings are scheduled by the city on the tax proposal. They are August 23 and August 27, both at 6:30 p.m. in the city council chambers. See the Notice of Public Hearing elsewhere in this Star.

In other business the council granted a variance at 211 W. 6th St. for a carport, approved renewal of an agriculture lease with John Mars for three years, authorized the city manager to seek bids on the purchase of a 1996 or newer motor grader and to seek bids to sell the city's 1967 motor

grader. Both bids are published elsewhere in this Star.

A rate increase of 1% requested by Allied Waste was discussed and approved. This increase raises the city's cost and an increase to the public will be considered in a later meeting. The July accounts payable and financial statement were approved and the city manager was authorized to reimburse the city water/

sewer fund from the proceeds of the recent Certificate of Obligation which have been received by the city.

City manager Phipps told the council that for now there will not be water usage restrictions in the city. The next regular meeting of the city council will be Monday September 10, 2012 in council chambers at 619 Main St. All council meetings are open to the public.

New rules for vehicle titles, registration

Texans titling a vehicle in the state and first-time registrants will soon have to show identification, enhancing public safety and paving the way for more customer-friendly automation.

The Texas Department of Motor Vehicles (TxDMV) Board passed new identification rules at its Thursday meeting. The

rules were required as part of two new state laws (HB 2017 and HB 2357) that mandate identification for titling a vehicle and first-time registrants. This change does not apply to registration renewals.

The identification requirements are a two-phase process designed to give Texans, tax as-

essor-collectors and businesses an opportunity to become educated on the new procedure. Beginning September 3, 2012, vehicle buyers can show any government photo identification if it includes a current photo, unique identification number, birth date and expiration date.

The new identification re-

quirements are another step towards creating more electronic services for customers, and ensuring the integrity of the motor vehicle database.

Next year Texans can expect to see the replacement of paper titles with electronic ones or "eTitles", that will take the burden off vehicle owners to keep track of their title and help to reduce title fraud. The eTitle system is expected to launch in fall 2013.

The TxDMV plans to further automate the motor vehicle database so vehicle owners can be found by name. Currently the system can only find an owner in the database by the vehicle identification or license plate number.

Eventually this will allow vehicle owners to access their own information in the motor vehicle database. "We want to deliver to Texans a customer-centric system that is both useful and secure," said TxDMV Executive Director Whitney Brewster.

The agency is in the process of securing a vendor to retool its Registration and Titling System so it can support additional online services for customers and streamline business processes.

The TxDMV continues to offer registration renewal, email registration renewal reminders, specialty plate ordering, customer address changes, vehicle transfer notifications and vehicle transfer permits online. Consumers can also check whether a moving company is licensed and any complaints filed with the TxDMV against moving, bus or truck companies on the TxDMV website, www.TxD-MV.gov.

"The TxDMV is dedicated to improving customer service and convenience for citizens," said TxDMV Board Chairman Victor Vandergriff. "Our employees and board members are focused on our mission to promote and protect the interests of the motoring public and citizens in the state of Texas."

New school zone hours will be in effect this year

Friona ISD advises that the flashing school zone lights on Highway 60 will flash longer hours and there has been a noon flashing signal added.

The school zone area is from Main St. west to Summit St. The flashing lights, warning of the school zone speed limit of 20 mph, are operated by TxDOT. The hours of operation will be 7 a.m. to 9 a.m.; 11 a.m. to 2 p.m.; and 2:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m.

Superintendent Kenny Austin submitted a different version of the school zone times but TxDOT advised FISD that the times could not be altered. Friona ISD thanks everyone for their patience and cooperation. Drive carefully in a school zone.

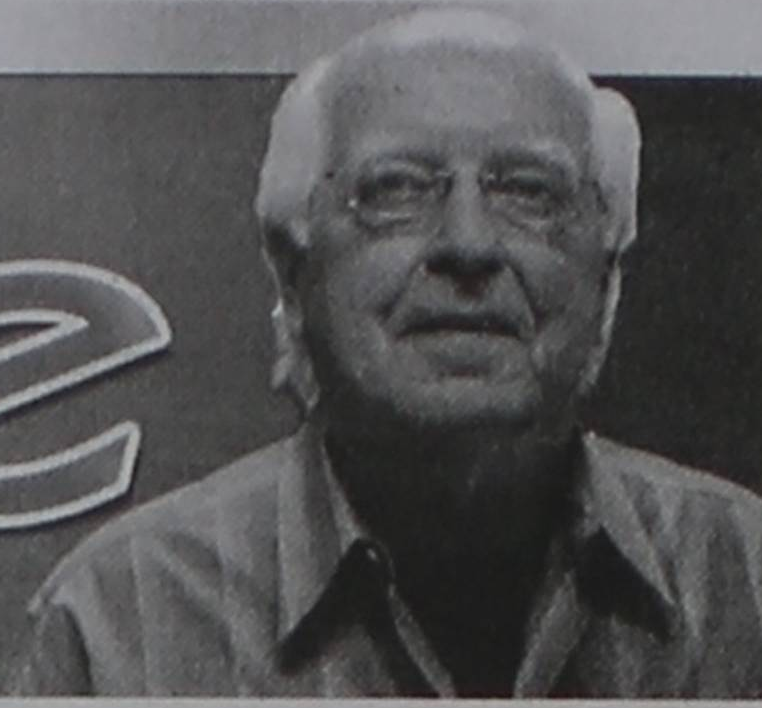

I'm Barack Obama and I approve this message.

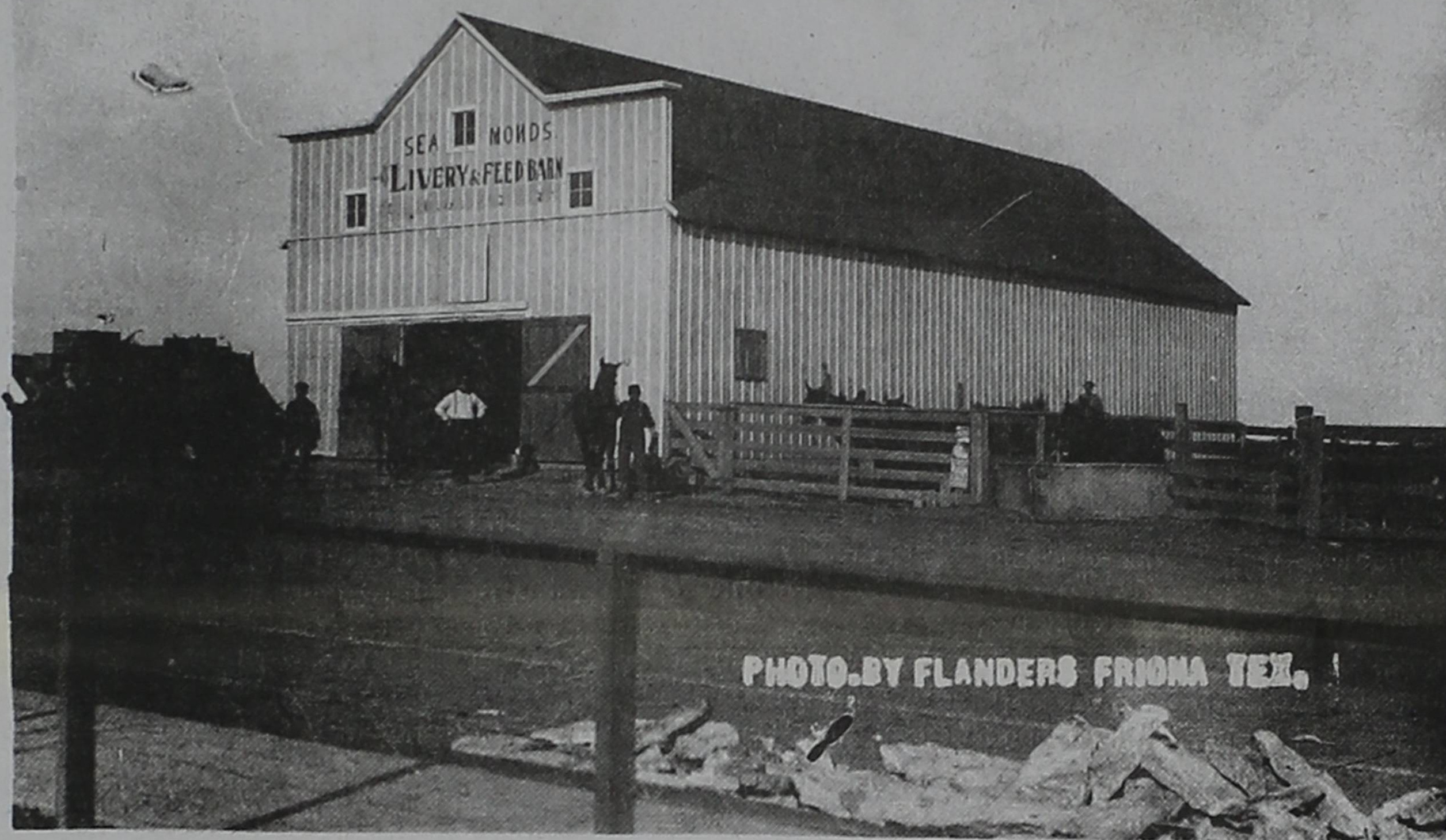

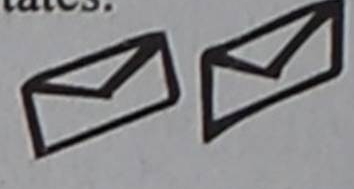
This photo was sent to us by the Panhandle Plains Historical Museum in Canyon. Does anyone know where this building was located or have any information about Charles M. and Luisa Flanders who moved to Friona from Iowa in 1907. The accompanying text from the museum said, "At the start of the 20th century adventurous photographers moved into the Texas Panhandle. The images they made helped drive and document the land boom that brought thousands of new settlers into the region. Between 1900 and 1910 a number of Panhandle photographers opened portrait galleries. The Flanders Photo Gallery served the small community of Friona during its boom years but could not survive the bad weather and droughts that drastically affected Friona's growth and economic development after 1910." If you know anything about this history please let us know here at the Friona Star.

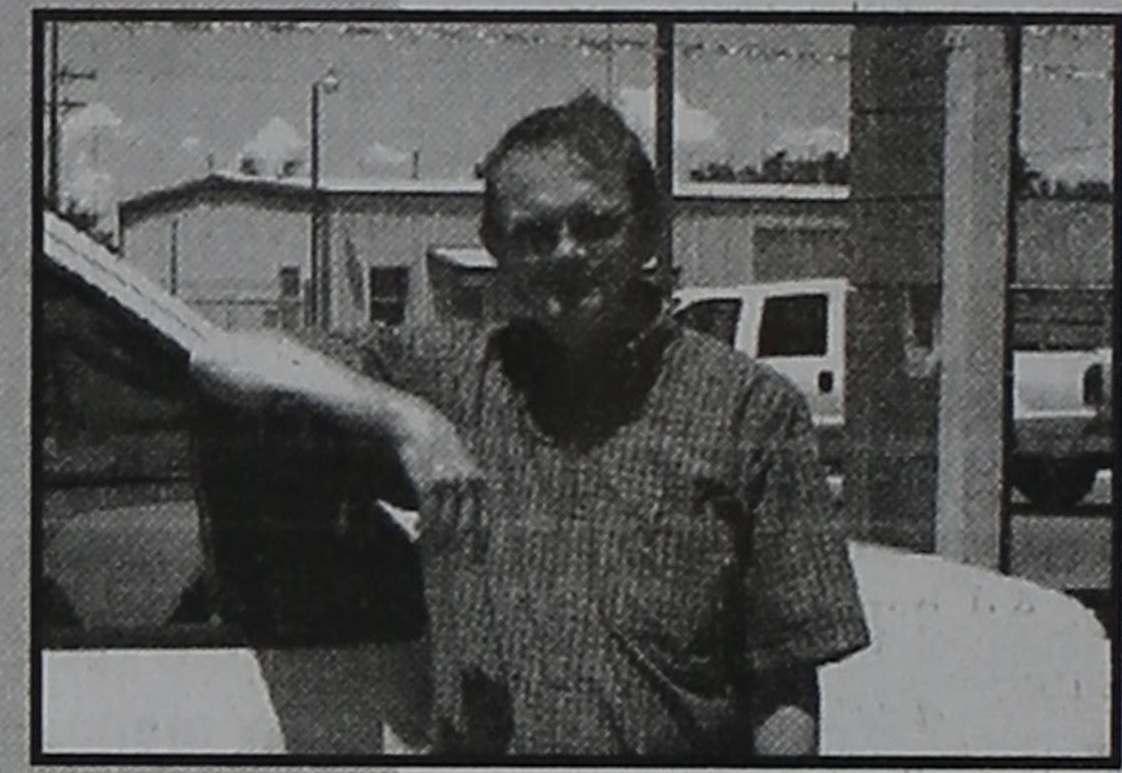
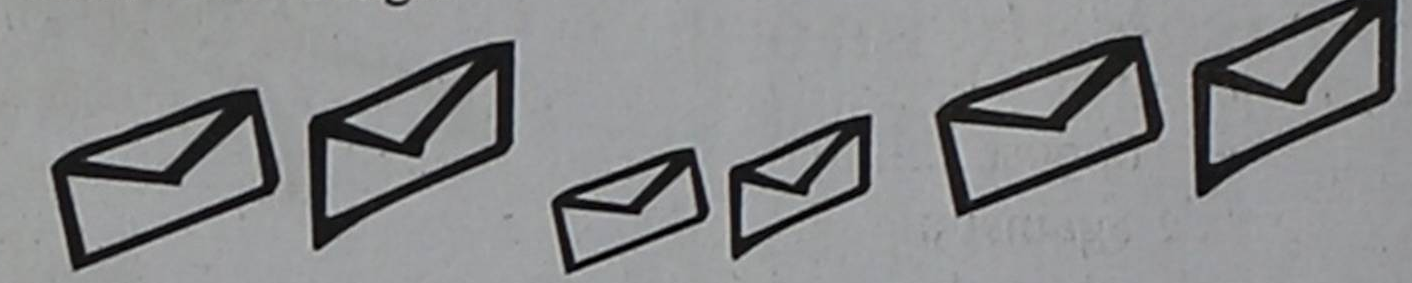

The Texas Education Agency announced this week that 44 percent of Texas public school campuses met federal Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) standards this year.

"I am disappointed that the federal accountability system fails to account for both the rigor and recent implementation of the STAAR system. I believe that Texas schools are successfully preparing students for college and careers at a much higher rate than is reflected in the recent release of AYP, and that there are many factors that go into that preparation which are not reflected. Educators and parents deserve to see an accurate picture of student progress and preparation, and the current federal system does not provide it. The conditions for a waiver of AYP should also be changed. They are burdensome and onerous and add nothing to the preparation of students. I believe that accountability as a whole is best left to the discretion of the states."

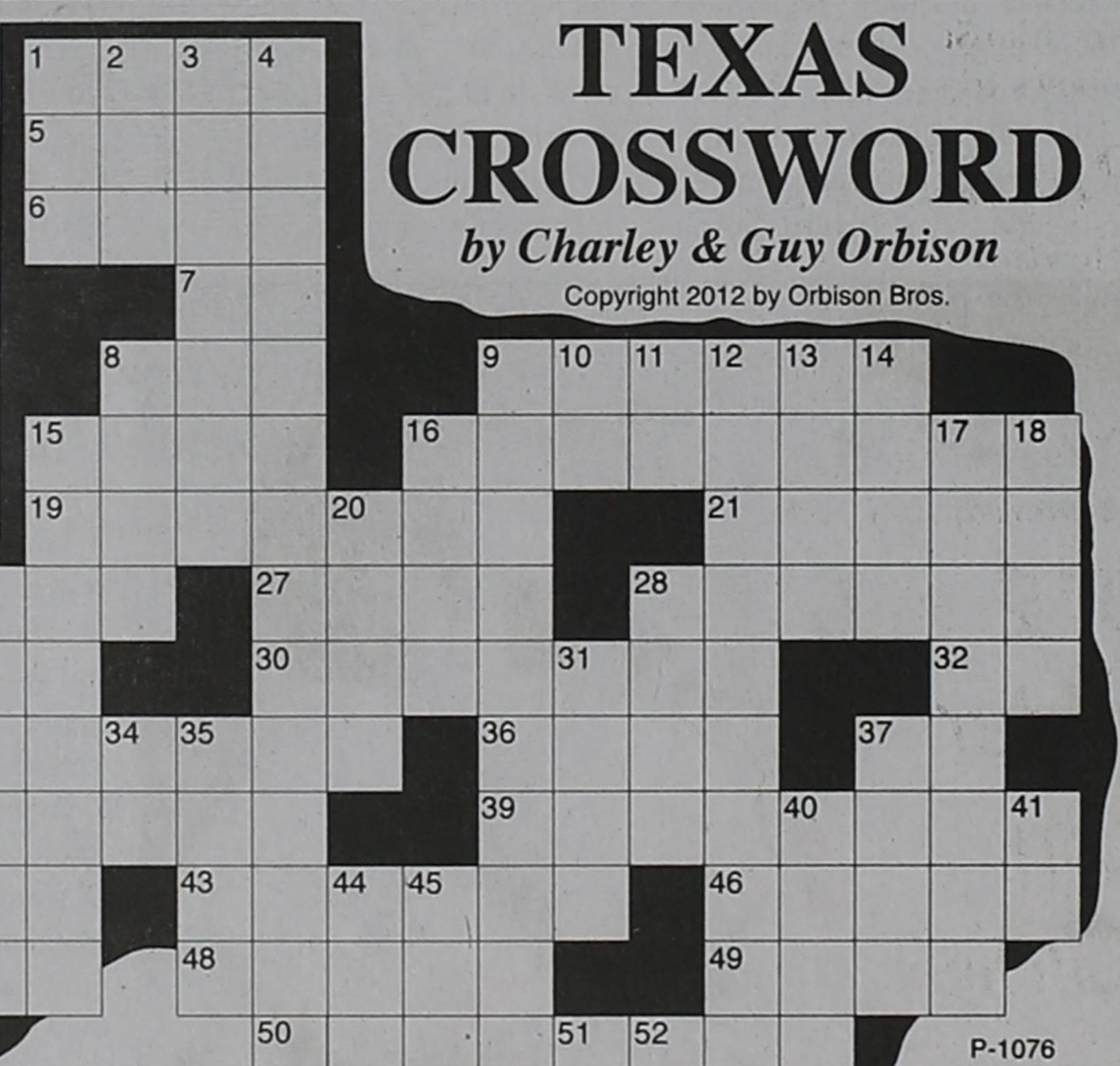

The Chieftains will scrimmage Panhandle here Sat-

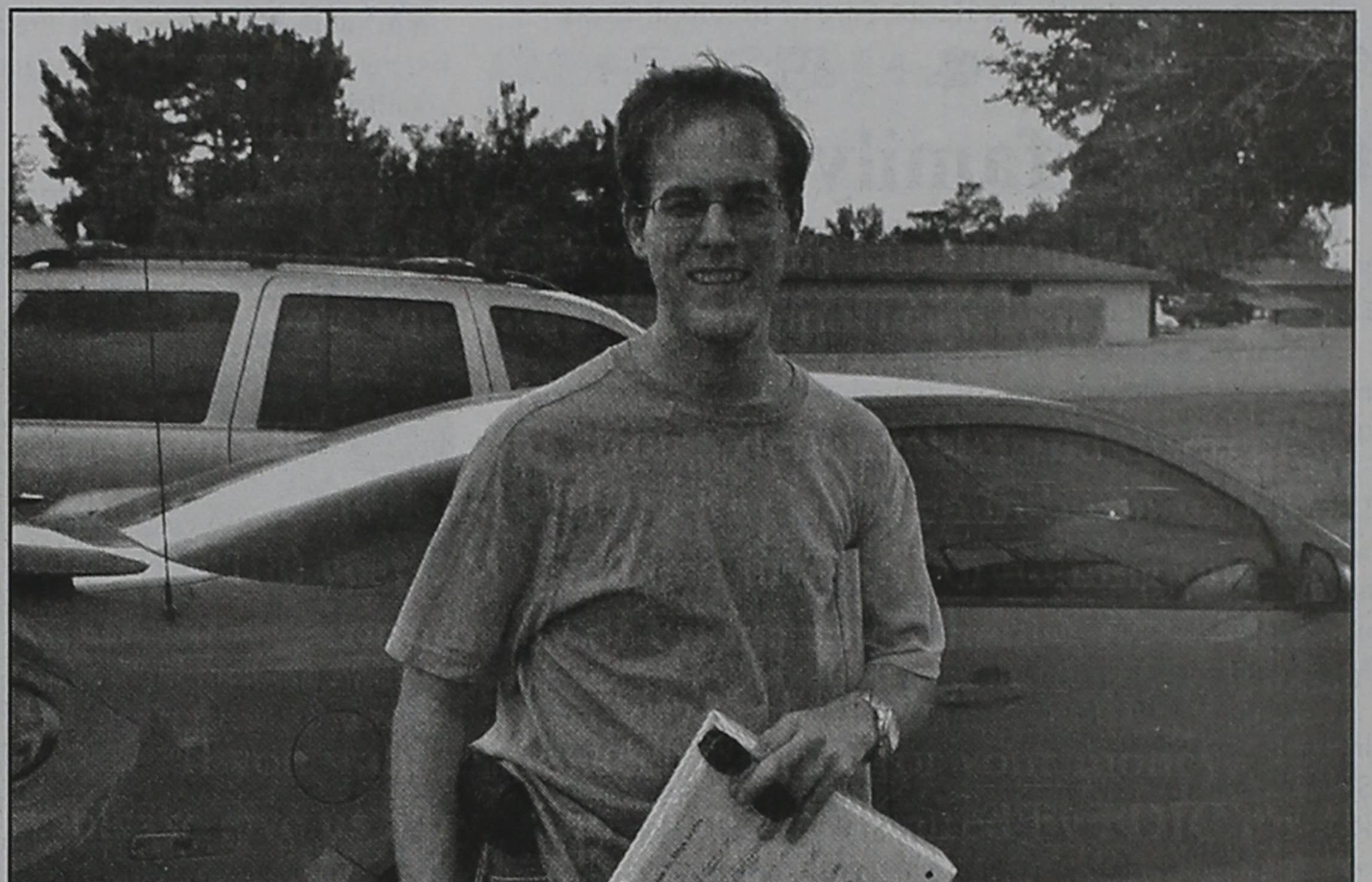

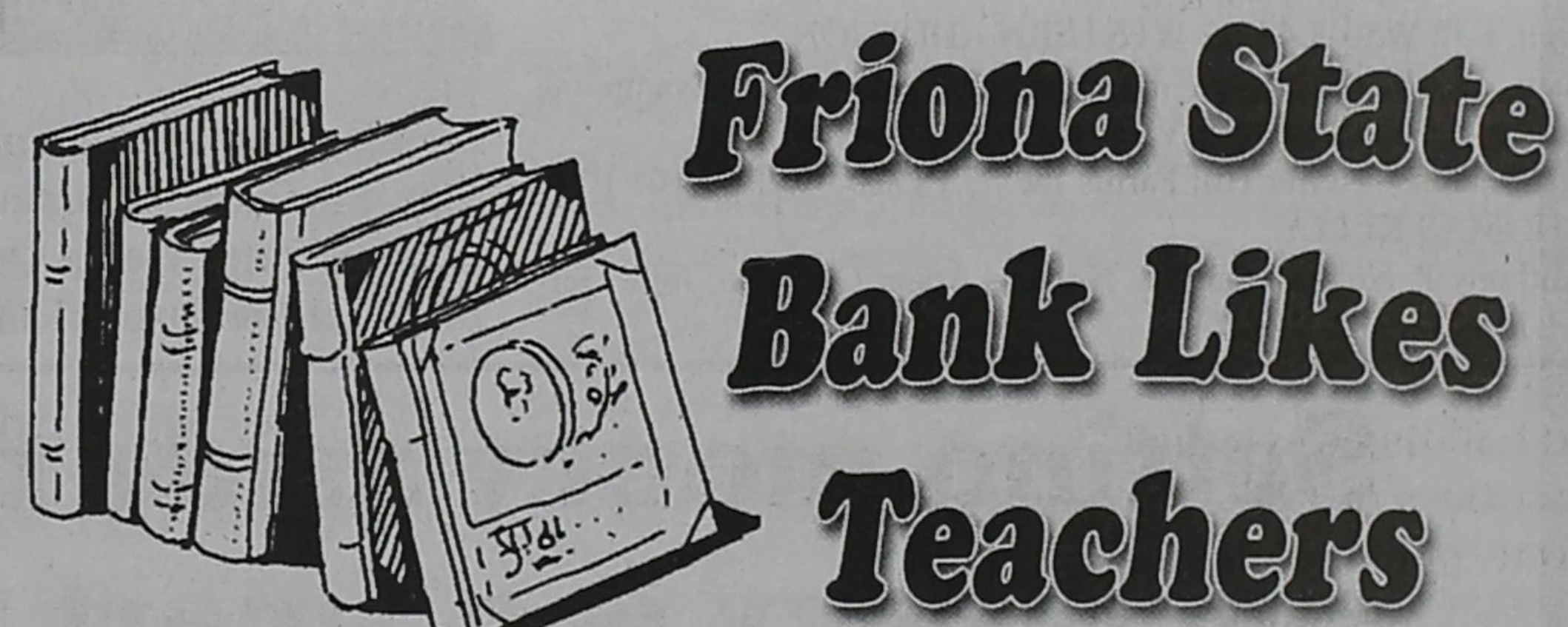

Panhandle Parables

There is nothing like a beautiful warm day with a 40 mph "breeze" as we say here in West Texas. The wind is something of which we seem to have plenty. We may lack in rainfall, or big snows, but never wind. It, at times is relentless. Living in this part of the world, one either gets used to the wind, moves, or stays upset all the time. It sure does a lot of damage for something that is unseen.

Sounds like someone else I know who, at times, is relentless. Satan, although in many occasions unseen, bombards the soul with all sorts of attacks. He may press on someone so hard they have to lean against him in order to continue. Yet at other times, he uses apparent calmness as his attack. 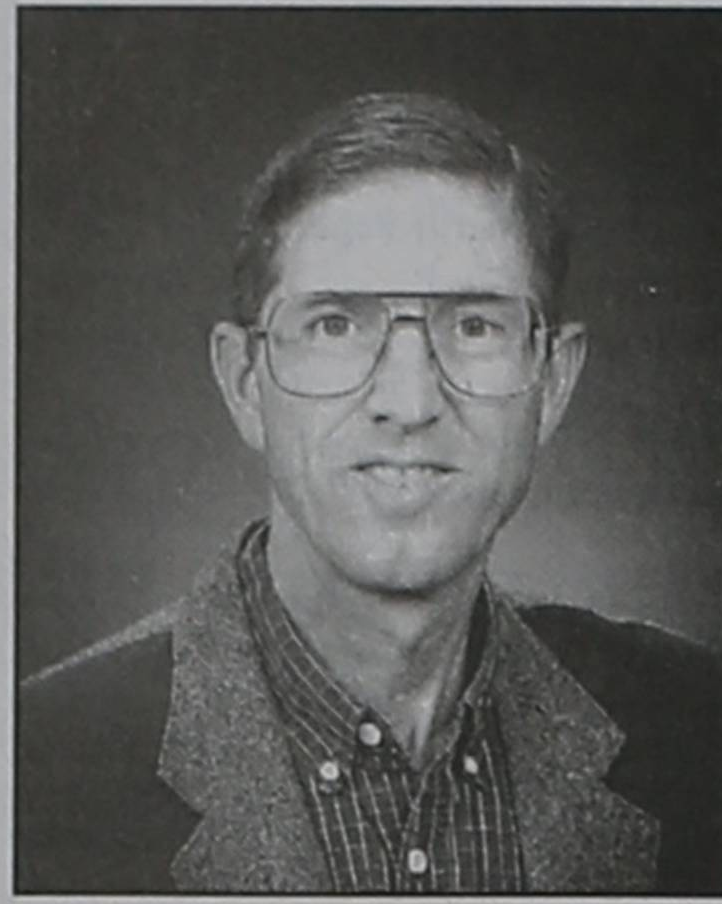
Ronnie was born April 20, 1957, in Friona, to Kenneth Leo and Elizabeth Ann Grubbs McLellan.

Billions of years or six days? (Pt 2)

BRETT HOYLE, Pastor, First Baptist Church

Attempts to press millions of years of evolution into the Bible's creation account is not a good idea, because God's word is clear he created in six days (Gen 1; Ex 20:11; Matt 19:4).

First, a careful reading of the creation order in Genesis 1 and the order of life from the theory of evolution do not agree. For example, the bible teaches you have the earth's existence before the sun, moon and stars of day 4. Also, on day 5 you have birds and sea creatures, but no land animals till day 6, which according to evolution, birds evolved from land reptiles, therefore you would need land animals before birds, but the Bible has birds before land creatures.

Next, if you insist on millions of years of evolution, Adam and Eve are not the pinnacle of the created order, but are an evolved creature, who came from the beasts, not one whom is over the beasts as God says in Genesis 1. In Matthew, 19:4, Jesus says God created male, female and marriage in the beginning, which is a reference to Adam and Eve's union in Genesis 2, which Jesus declared was in the beginning, not millions of years after the beginning.

Finally, if there had been millions of years of death, suffering, disease and pain, how could God pronounce creation "very good" at the end of Genesis 1. The reality is that He couldn't if death and suffering had been around for millions of years because death is not a good thing, but the result of sin. God did pronounce all of creation "very good" at the end of Genesis 1, because there was no death or disease before the fall of man in Genesis 3.

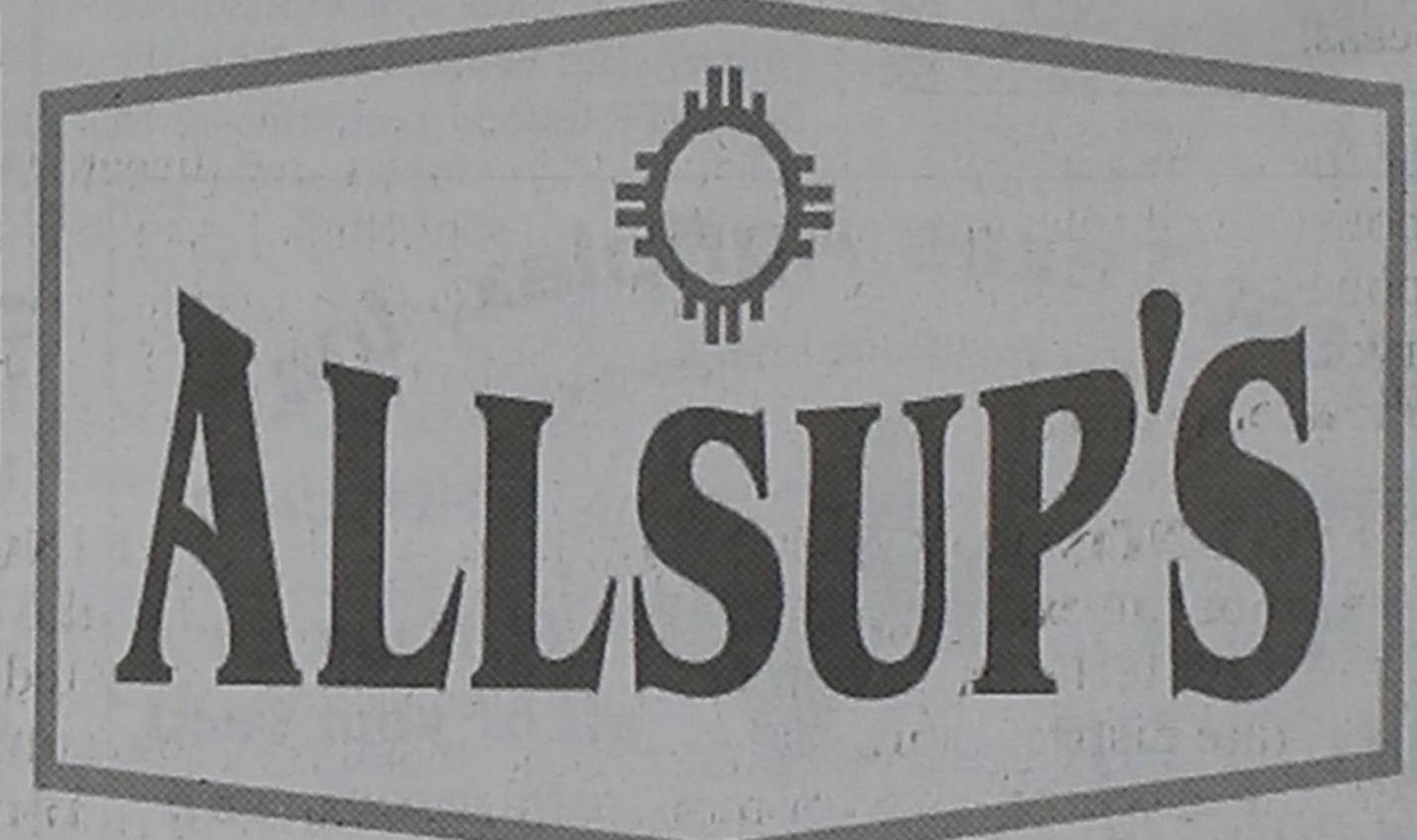

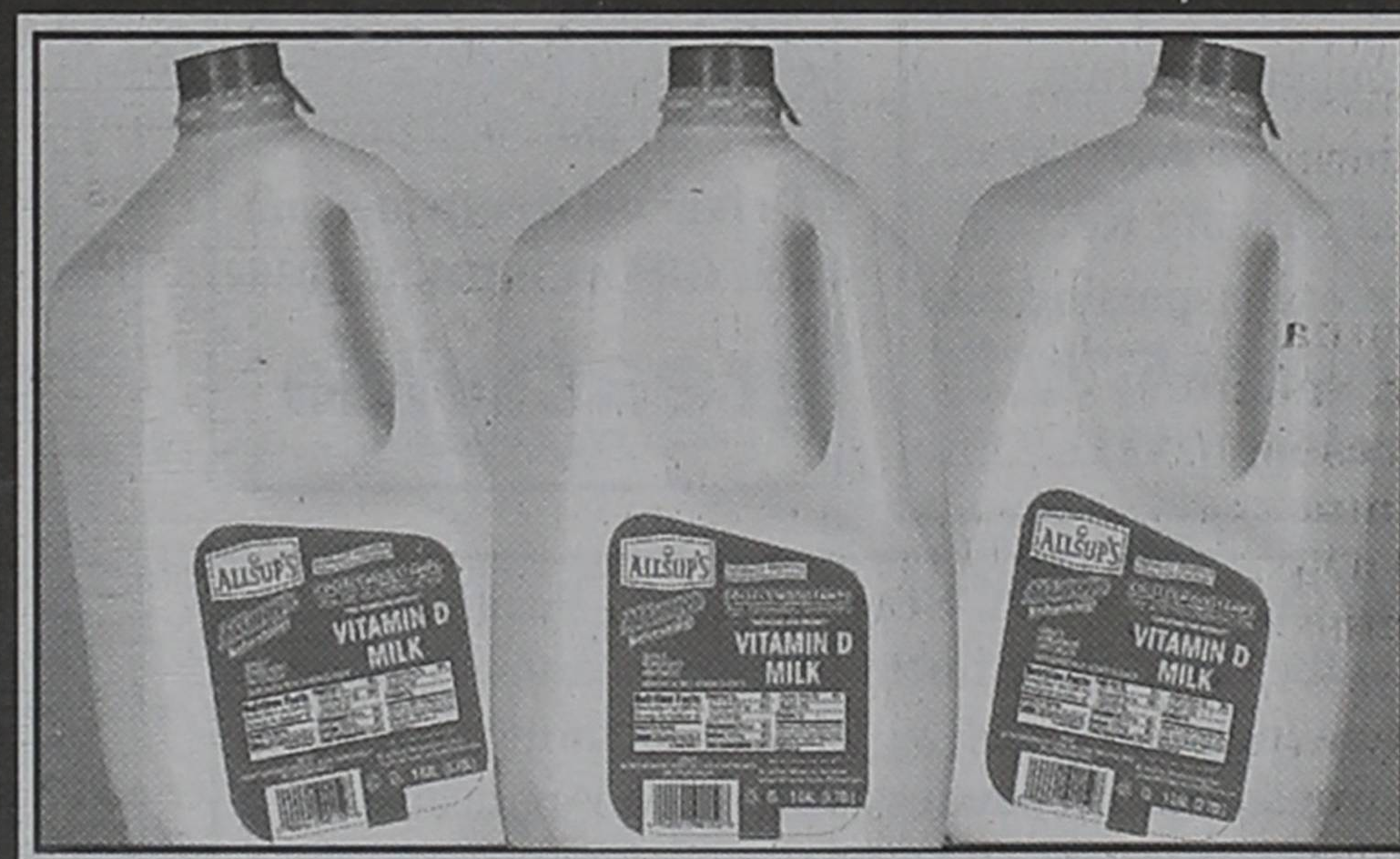

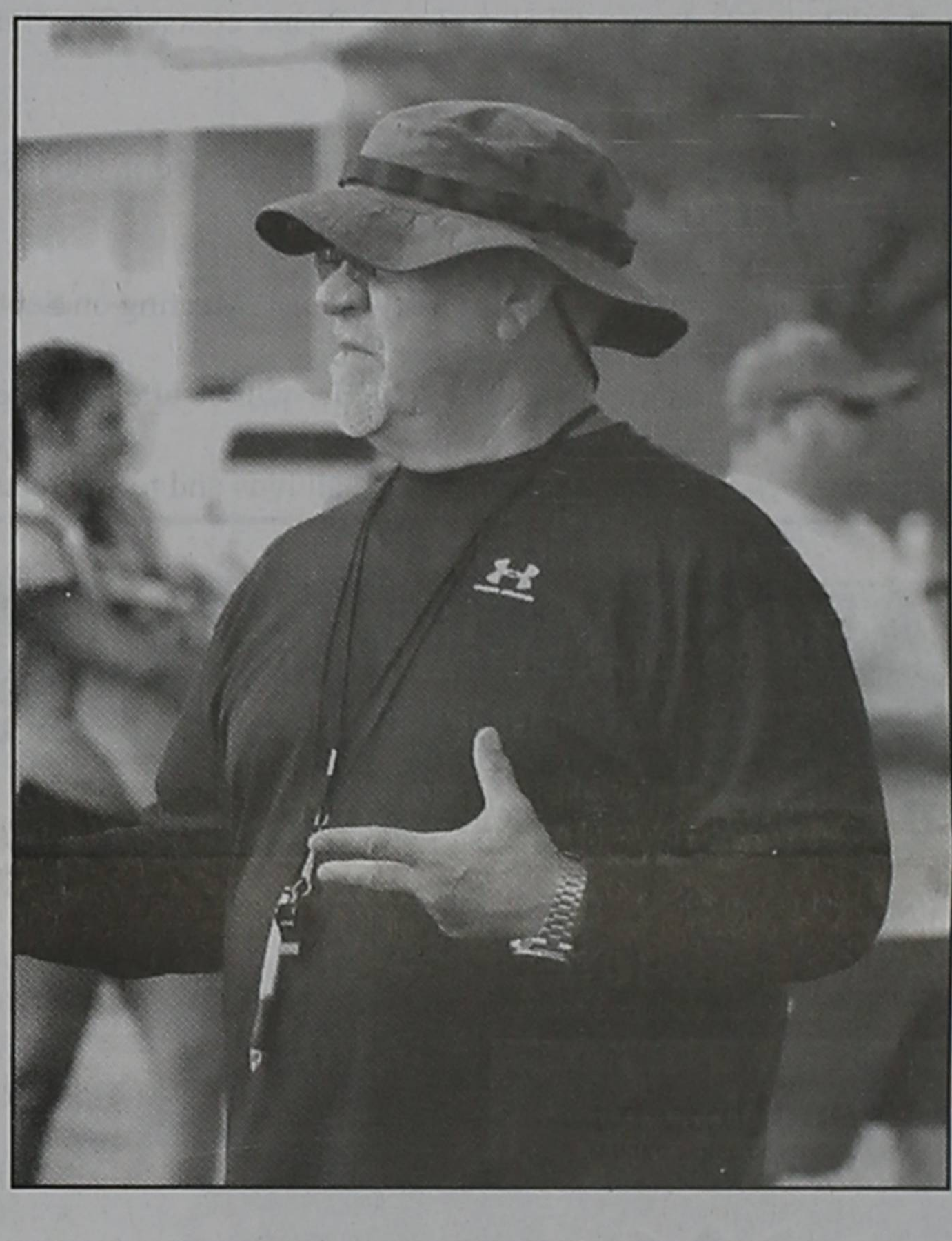

This application was submitted to the TCEQ on August 6, 2012. The application will be available for viewing and copying at the TCEQ central office, TCEQ Amarillo regional office, and the Friona City Hall, 623 Main Street, Friona, Parmer County, Texas, beginning the first day of publication of this notice. The facility's compliance file, if any exists, is available for public review in the Amarillo regional office of the TCEQ.

The executive director has determined the application is administratively complete and will conduct a technical review of the application. Information in the application indicates that this permit renewal would not result in an increase in allowable emissions and would not result in the emission of an air contaminant not previously emitted. **The TCEQ may act on this application without seeking further public comment or providing an opportunity for a contested case hearing if certain criteria are met.**

PUBLIC COMMENT You may submit public comments, or a request for a contested case hearing to the Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below. The TCEQ will consider all public comments in developing a final decision on the application. **The deadline to submit public comments is 15 days after newspaper notice is published.** After the deadline for public comments, the executive director will prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. Issues such as property values, noise, traffic safety, and zoning are outside of the TCEQ's jurisdiction to address in the permit process.

After the technical review is complete the executive director will consider the comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. If only comments are received, the response to comments, along with the executive director's decision on the application, will then be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments or who is on the mailing list for this application, unless the application is directly referred to a contested case hearing.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING You may request a contested case hearing. The applicant or the executive director may also request that the application be directly referred to a contested case hearing after technical review of the application. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court. Unless a written request for a contested case hearing is filed within 15 days from this notice, the executive director may act on the application. **If no hearing request is received within this 15-day period, no further opportunity for hearing will be provided.** According to the Texas Clean Air Act § 382.056(o) a contested case hearing may only be granted if the applicant's compliance history is in the lowest classification under applicable compliance history requirements and if the hearing request is based on disputed issues of fact that are relevant and material to the Commission's decision on the application. 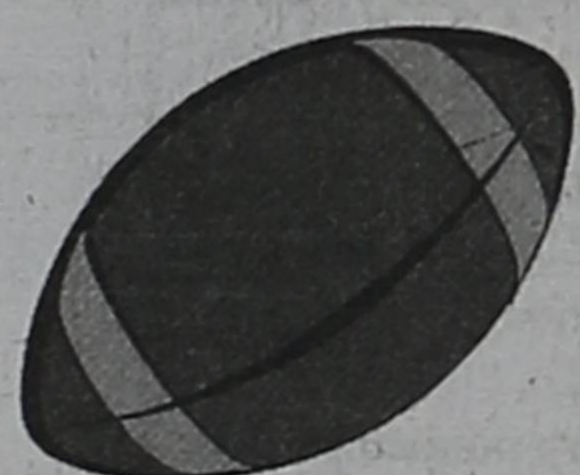


Meet the Chiefs and Squaws nite

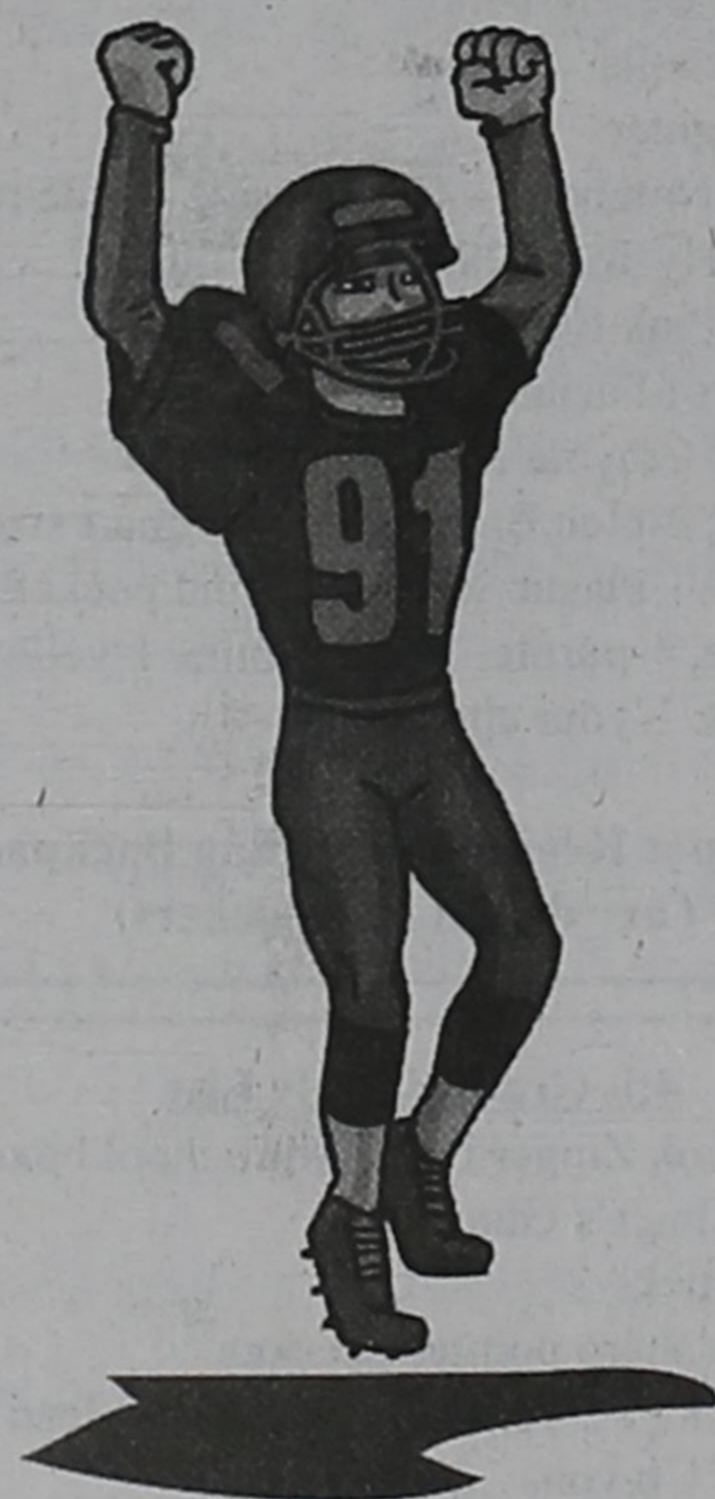

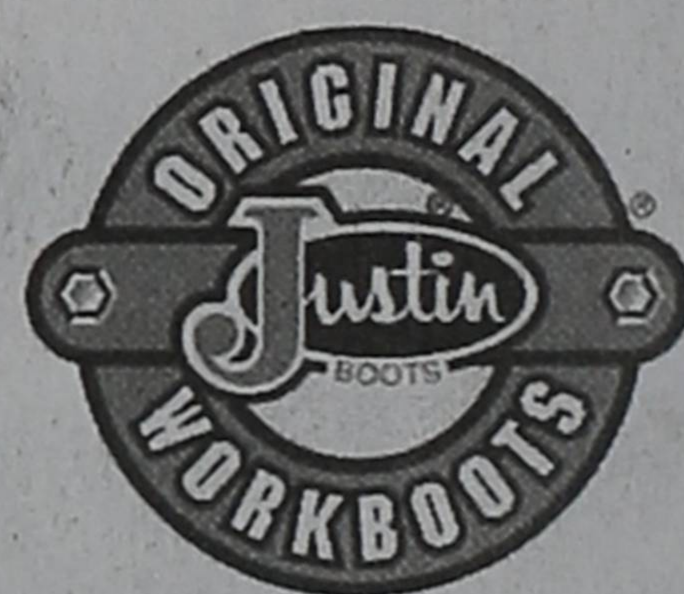
