Friends of the Friona Public Library membership drive

The Friona Friends of the Library promote the library and general literacy in the community and surrounding areas.

They help keep the Redeemer Literacy Center repaired and in working order. They partner with Region 16 Service Center to hold English classes and have recently added GED classes.

Accomplishments of local writers are celebrated with teas sponsored by the Friends. They assisted in the formation of Pens and Pages, an association of local writers. The Friends buy books for first graders at the Friona Primary School Book Fair, participate in Newspapers in Education, and support the summer reading program.

The Friends partner with the Pioneer Museum on research and displays, sponsors the Book Shoppe, and serves a Veteran's Day breakfast each year to honor local veterans.

The Friends of the Friona Public Library raises money to accomplish these programs through fund raising projects such as the raffling of Literacy Baskets donated by local mer-

chants and individuals. In 2013 the Friends will celebrate 50-years of library service to the patrons of the Friona Public Library. There will be special events throughout the year.

A critical piece of funding comes from membership dues. This year the 2012 membership drive starts November 1 and ends December 31. The Friends have about 400 mem-

bers and rely on this funding to sponsor projects. New members are welcome and encouraged. A membership application form is on page 2 of this Star. 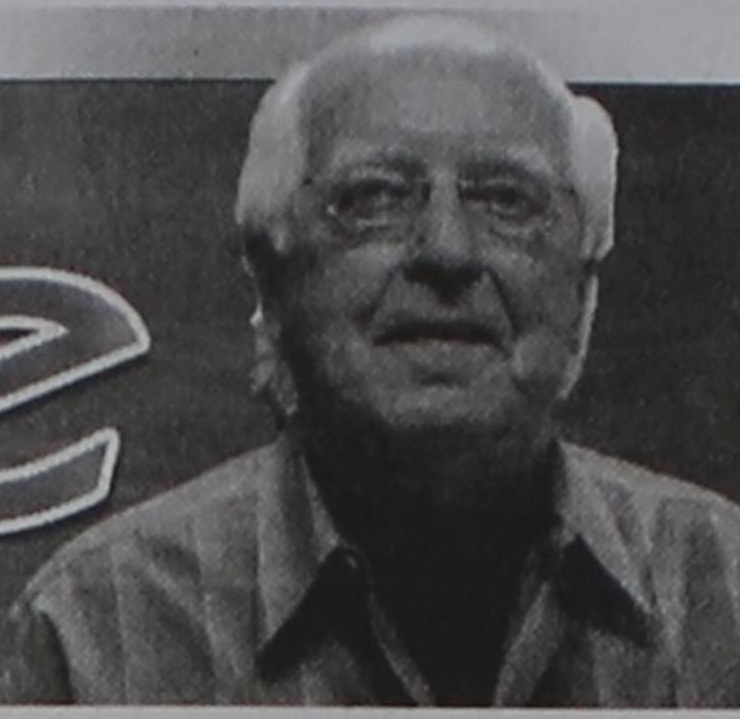

Letters to the Editor

Poverty rates are generally higher in rural areas than in urban centers. Also, residents of rural Texas are more likely than their urban neighbors to be self-employed or working for a small business without employer-sponsored health insurance. They are, therefore, more likely to be uninsured or underinsured.

As written, the Affordable Care Act would expand Medicaid eligibility to all adults below 138 percent of the federal poverty

level. The U.S. Supreme Court, however, ruled that states could not be compelled to participate in the Medicaid expansion.

That decision means that hundreds of thousands of Texans who fall below 138 percent of the federal poverty level, such as a family of three earning less than \$26,344 annually, will still struggle to find affordable health insurance if the state declines to participate in the Medicaid expansion.

Medicaid provides a crucial healthcare safety net for those rural residents most in need. And the expansion of Medicaid would bring in billions of dollars from the federal government by 2020, potentially financing the creation of tens of thousands of ongoing Texas jobs. Moreover, expanding Medicaid will help alleviate some of the costs of uncompensated care for the uninsured, reducing premiums for those with private insurance.

Tens of thousands healthcare jobs, lower insurance premiums for the currently insured and access to affordable healthcare coverage for hundreds of thousands of Texans, many of whom lack coverage today, all speak in favor of expanding Medicaid in the state, for rural Texas in particular.

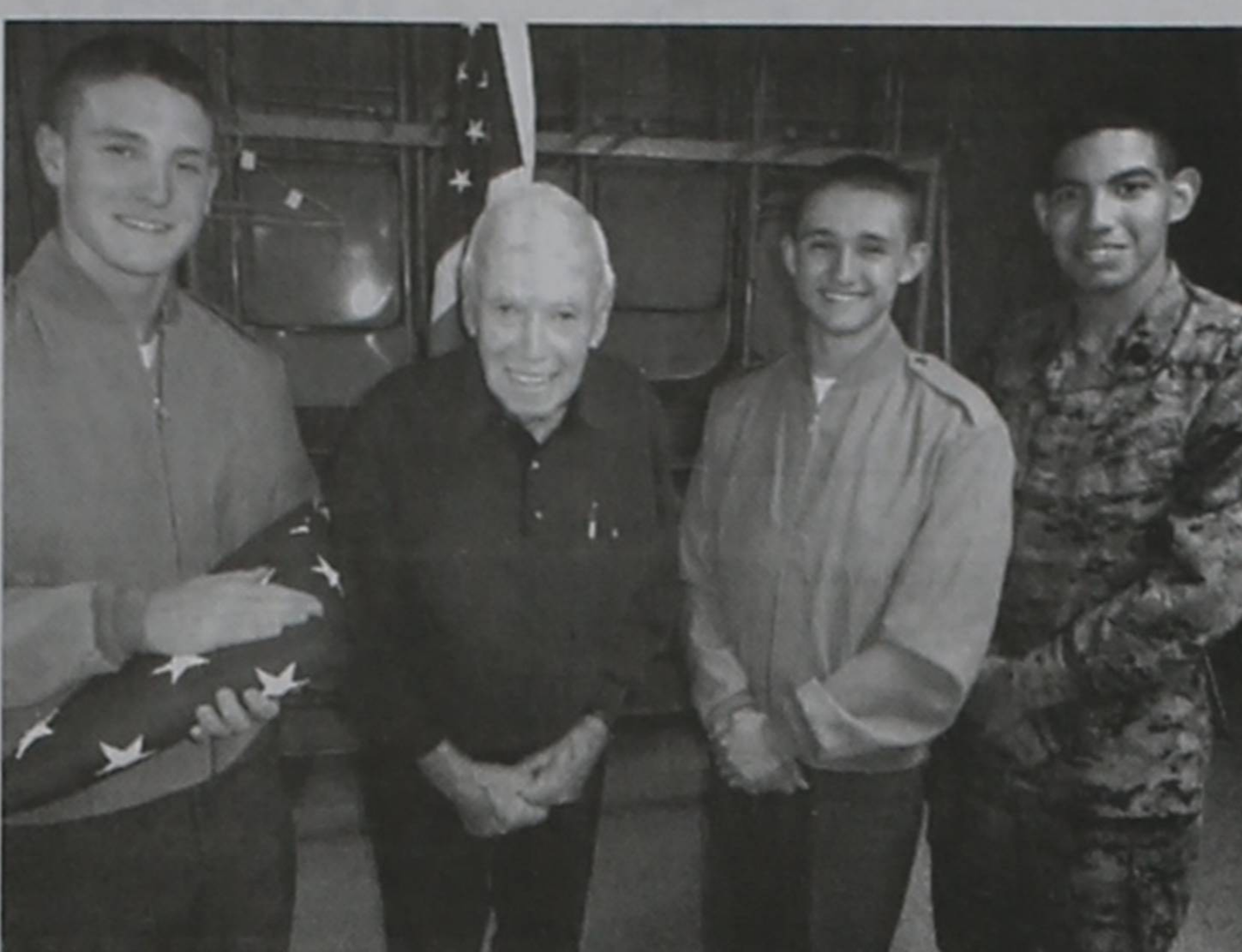
Just relax, and hit the ball

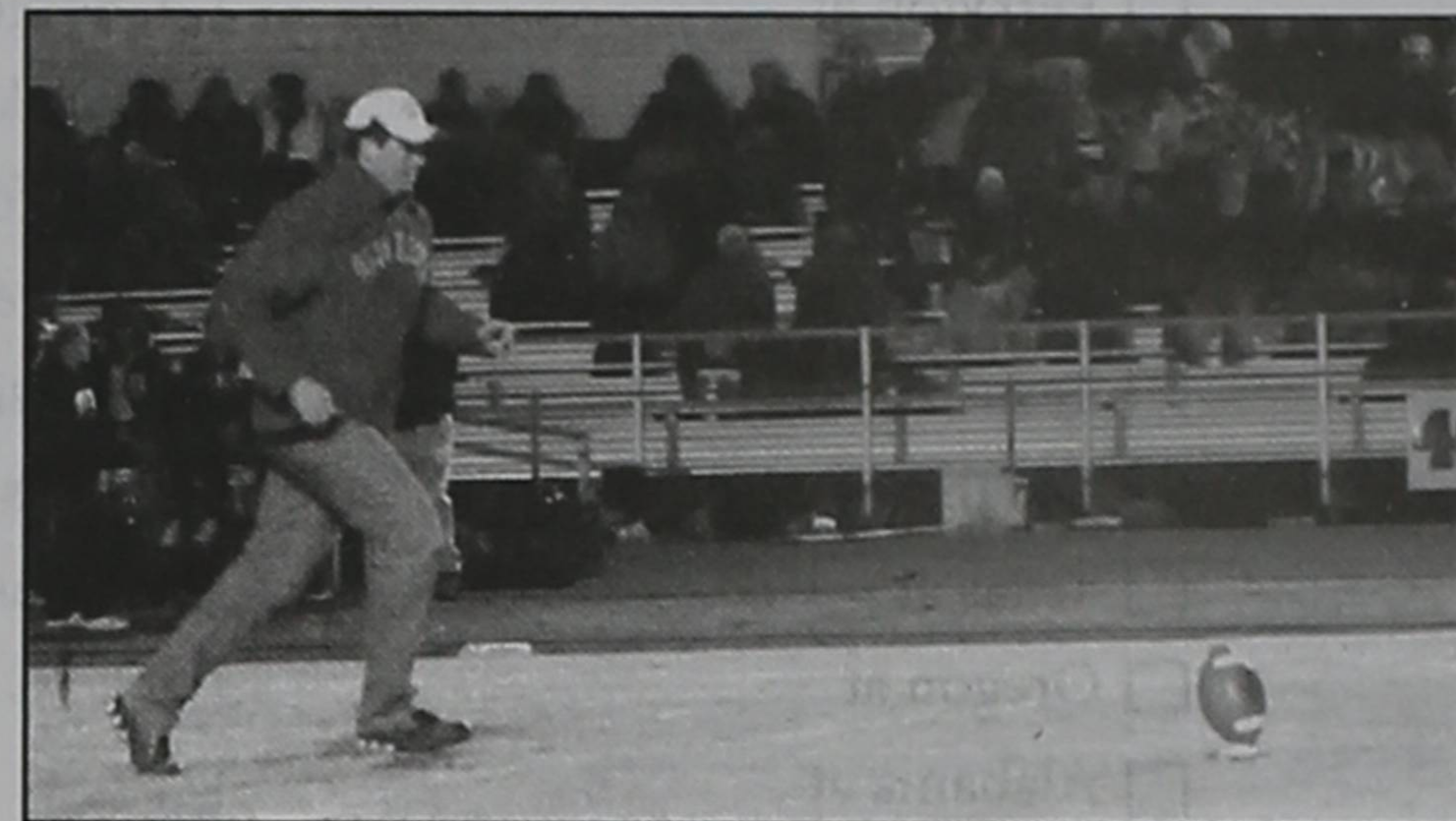

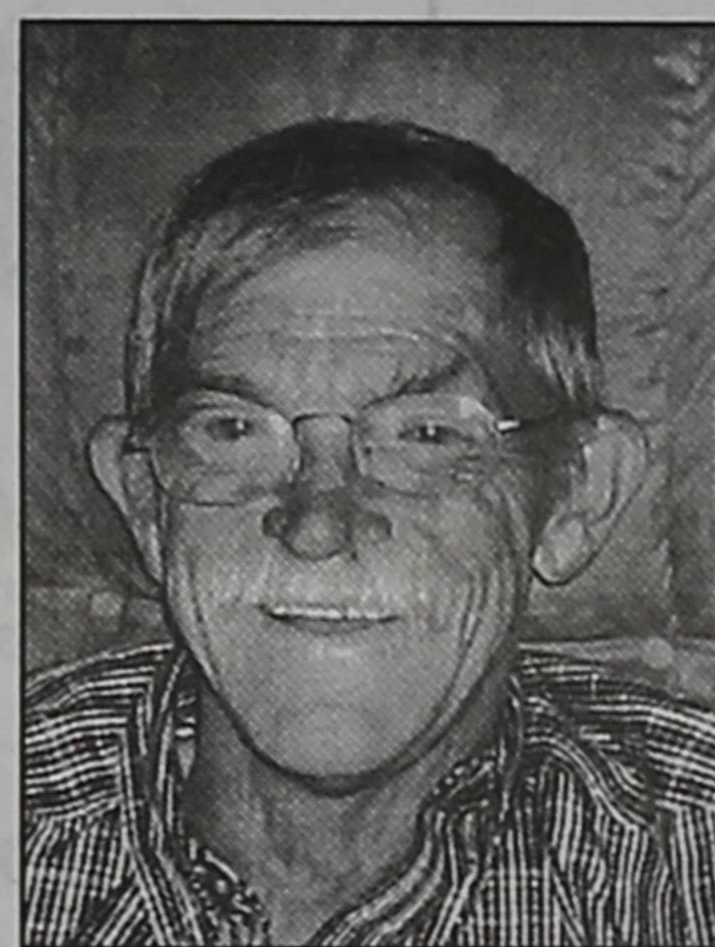

Gary Wayne McCormick was born December 22, 1952 in Pine Bluff, Arkansas to Robert Lee McCormick and Betty Sue Easterling McCormick. He graduated from Bovina High School and began work for the Texas Department of Transportation in the highway department. He moved to Lubbock from Bovina in 1977.

In Lubbock he was employed by Image Furnishings

for 20 years and for Texas Tech University in construction for 10 years. When his children were growing up he coached their baseball teams and umpired baseball games.

He was preceded in death by his parents.

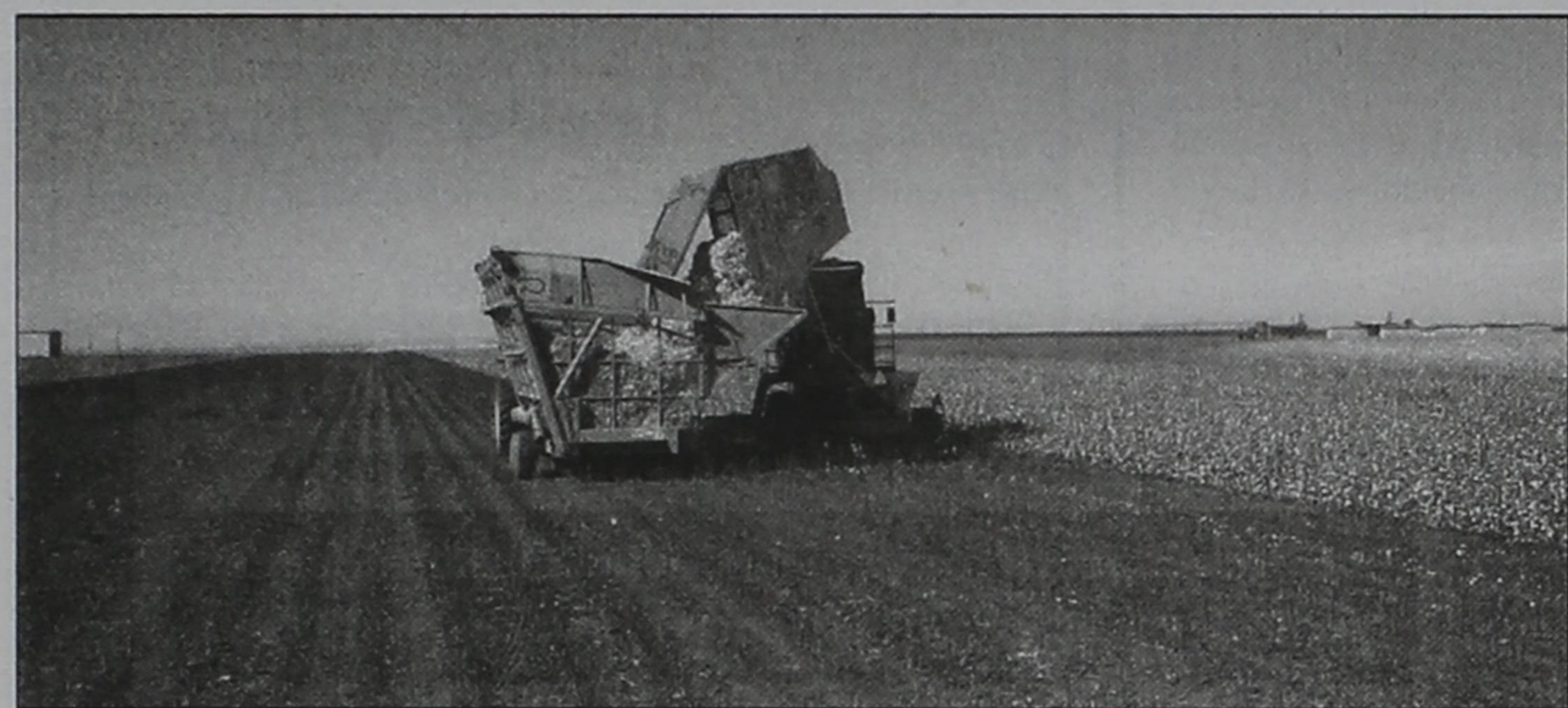

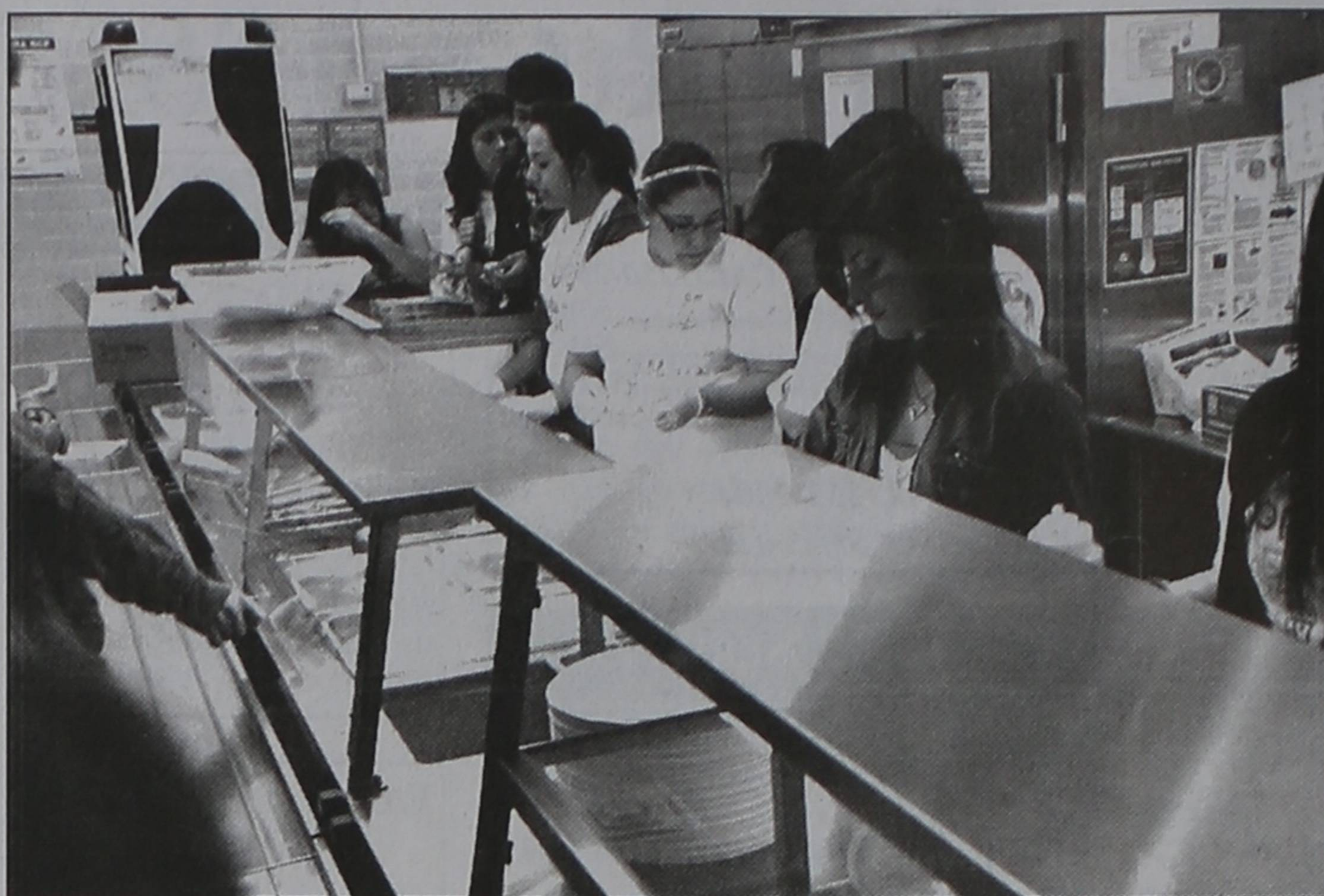

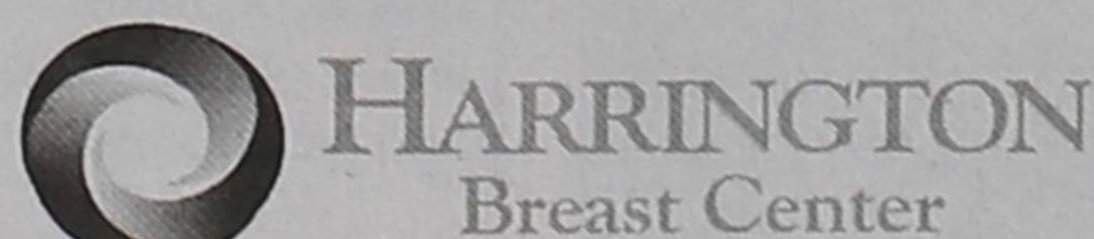

On what was probably the coldest night of the season, the Chiefs ran the ball 47 times and picked up a total of 138 yards rushing. Paco Martinez carried 23 times for 47 yards. Stephen Dominguez gained 69 yards on 13 carries and Omar Ramos had 13 yards on 7 carries before leaving the game with a dislocated elbow. Martinez attempted only 3 passes and completed one to Richard Rodriguez for negative -3 yards.

Just before the half the Chiefs held Bushland on a 4th and 4 attempt at about the Friona 20-yard line. The Chiefs took over and drove to the one-yard line but lost a fumble to stop the scoring drive.

Mason Loflin, returning to limited duty after a concussion two weeks ago, punted three times for 144 yards, a 34.67 average. Stephen Dominguez

returned three kickoffs for 68 yards, a 22.67 average. Brad Stowers was credited with 6 tackles (5 solo), Edgar Guerrero had 3.5 tackles and Eduardo Rojas and Richard Rodriguez each

had 4 tackles. The Chiefs travel to Littlefield this Friday, November 2, and host Dimmitt for the final game of the season Friday November 9. Game time is 7:30 p.m.



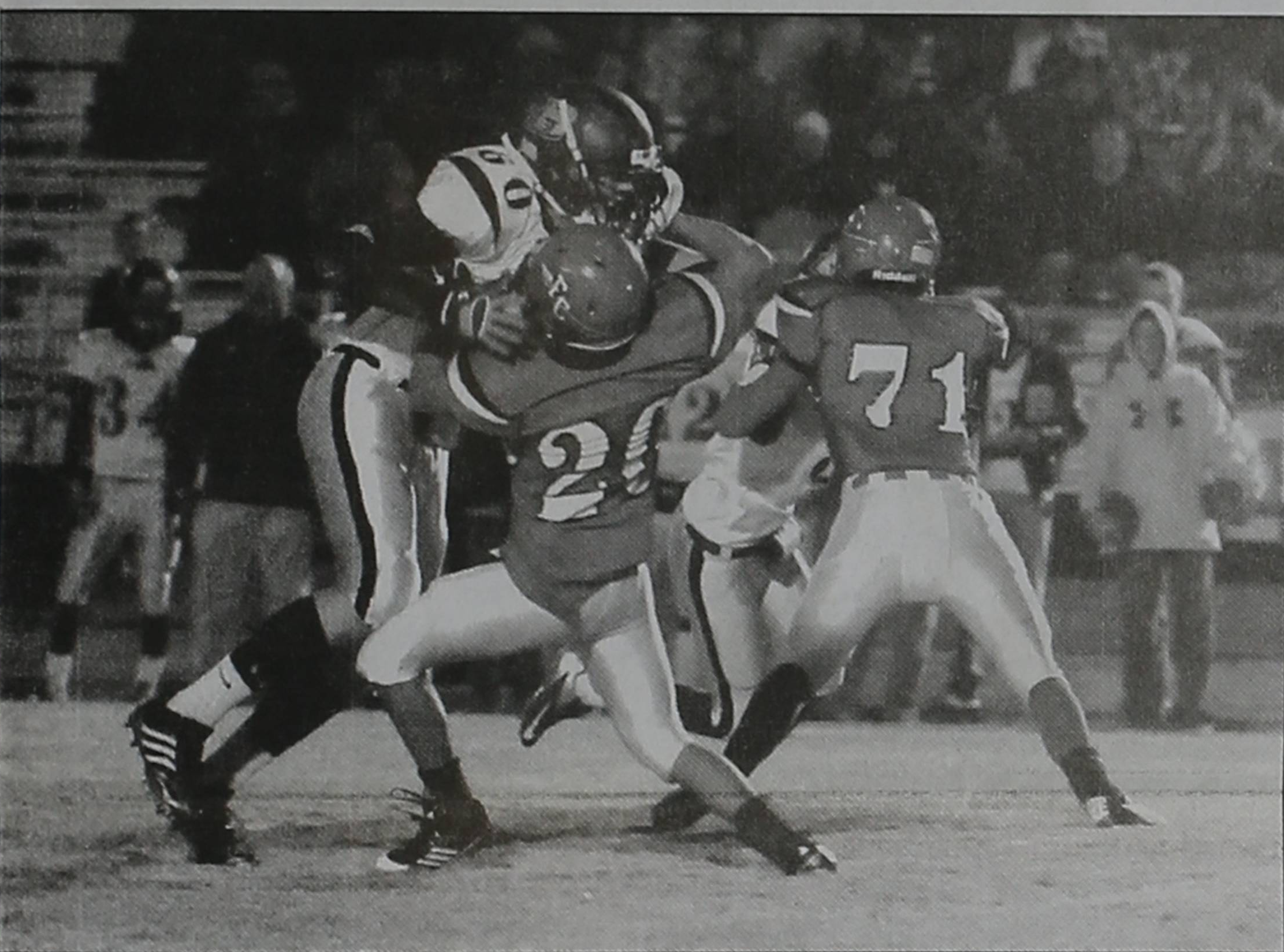

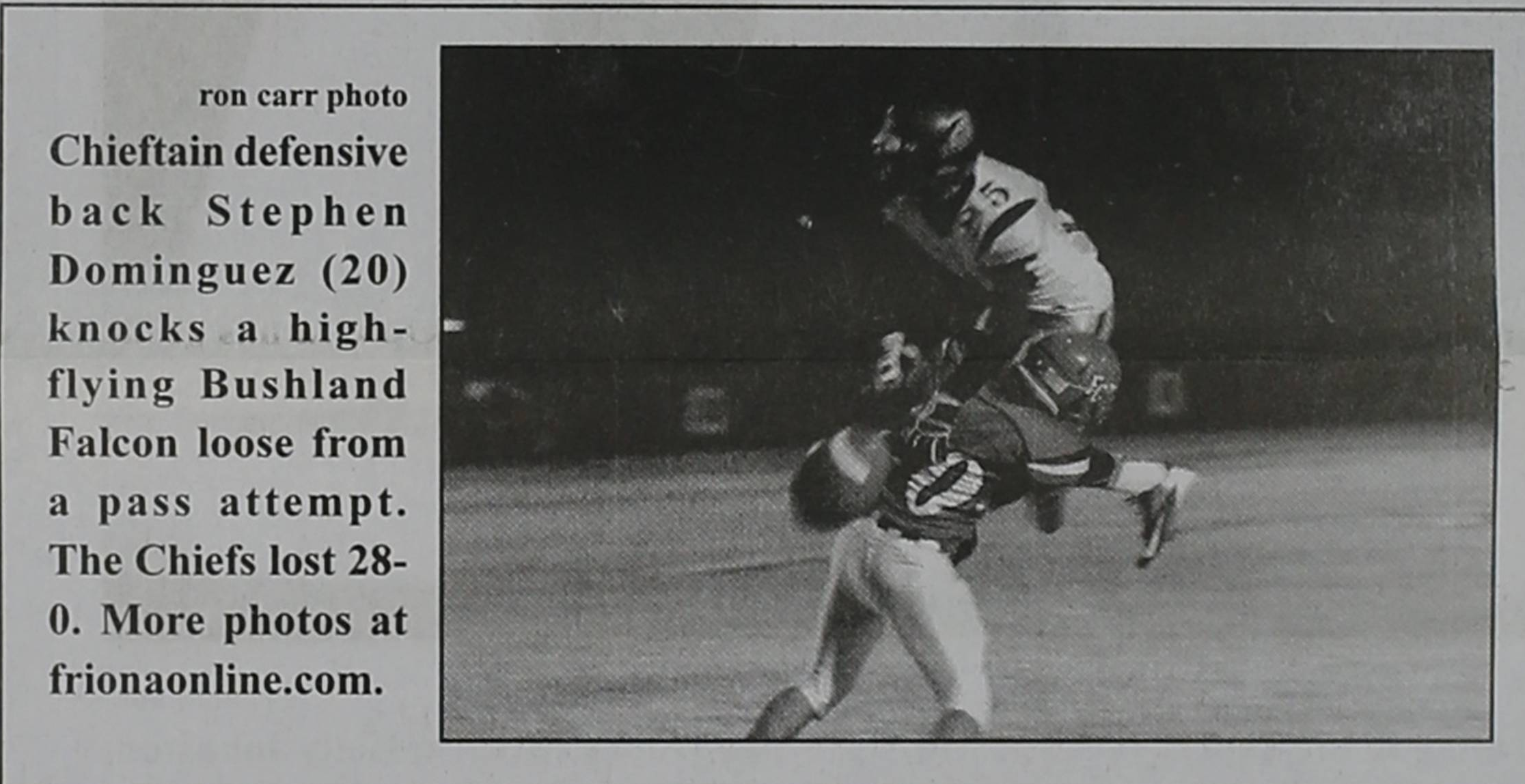
