According to the American Wind Energy Association, at the height of the wind energy sector's expansion in 2008 and 2009 wind turbine manufacturing employment peaked at more than 85,000 jobs at large turbine assembly plants and smaller manuand operation.

## Avoiding Holy Distractions

 BRETT HOYLE, Pastor, First Baptist Church1 Kings 6 is the marvelous account of Solomon constructing the Temple in Jerusalem. This amazing structure was a wonder of the ancient world, not only because it's vast amount of precious metals and quarried stone, but mainly because it was to be the central location of worship to the Lord God, who had claimed the Israelite nation as His own. Sadly, though, the Temple became a holy distraction from worshipping the Lord in spirit and truth. During the Temple construction, the Lord warned Solomon of this temptation in 1 Kings secure his relationship with the Lord, but to follow Him in loving, faith-filled obedience.
God basically told Solomon that the building is looking great, but I am more interested in your heart and soul. The temple was to remind people of God's holiness, their emptiness without him and the reality that God loves and forgives our sin when we approach Him on His terms. Church buildings can be a similar type of a holy distraction
today as well. Buildings are tools that facilitate the mission of the church, but they must not become a distraction from loving God with my whole heart and loving my neighbor as myself.
