Hospital sees change in Medicare patient enrollment

Important information regarding Medicare Advantage Plans and Medicare Drug Benefit

Parmer Medical Center and Friona Rural Health Clinic are experiencing an increase in patients that are coming to the hospital and clinic who are no longer enrolled in traditional Medicare. They are now enrolled in one of the Medicare Advantage Plans. Some may have chosen an Advantage plan not realizing it was not accepted by the local healthcare system. Others may have opted out of the Advantage Plan, but the information has not crossed over and they are still listed in the Advantage Plan system and not traditional Medicare. Others may not be aware that their plan has been changed and are surprised to discover they are now enrolled in an Advantage Plan.

The hospital wants to remind the community that we are unable to

accept Medicare Advantage Plans (such as Aetna or Humana) due to cost reimbursement (the way the hospital is paid).

The hospital encourages any and all Medicare or Medicare eligible recipients to go online to MyMedicare.gov to check their status or to call the hospital. It is important to check your status now in order to avoid unexpected and/or additional out-of-pocket expenses when using the hospital or clinic services. Please call 806 250-2754 and request a Medicare Plan Check. Our staff will be happy to assist you.

As a review, new types of Medicare Plans were approved in 2005 under Medicare Part C. These are also called Medicare Advantage plans, and are a form of managed care for Medicare beneficiaries. These plans offer benefits which differ from the original Medicare and also have different

deductibles and co-pay requirements, depending on the plan. A Medicare Advantage Plan is different from regular Medicare. It is often an HMO or PPO, where your choice of doctors, hospitals, and home health agencies is limited. Medicare Advantage also includes Private Fee for Service ("PFFS") plans. If you sign up for any Medicare Advantage Plan, you are no longer in the original Medicare payment system.

In addition, your physicians and your hospital have to be separately signed up as "providers" under the Medicare Advantage plans for you to be able to use them as an "in-network" provider and get the deductibles and co-pays that the Medicare Advantage plan promises. However, many physicians and hospitals are not signed up as providers, and you may not be able to use them without paying more out-of-pocket than the plan

promises. You cannot use the regular original Medicare while you are signed up under a Medicare Advantage plan.

The new Medicare drug benefit (separate from Medicare Advantage plans) took effect on January 1, 2006. You may also have been enrolled in a drug benefit plan that may affect the Medicare hospital services you receive. There are many choices in Medicare drug plans. You can sign up for a separate drug plan and keep the original Medicare. However, many Medicare Advantage plans offer a drug benefit plan as well, and if you sign up for the drug benefit, you may have also signed up for the Medicare Advantage plan without realizing it. Be sure to read your plan benefits carefully to know exactly what program you are enrolling in.

Certain people that have both Medicare and Medicaid may

be automatically enrolled in an Medicare Advantage HMO or PPO. If so, you have the right to choose whether you want to go back to regular Medicare or stay with an HMO or PPO. If you chose to sign up with a Medicare HMO or PPO, you have the right to change back to traditional Medicare. You should check to see if you have been enrolled in one of these plans.

In summary, enrollment in a Medicare Advantage Plan, or for Medicare drug coverage through a Medicare Advantage plan, can affect your hospital services. It can lead to your being charged more for the cost of Medicare services that the plan does not cover. Parmer Medical Center and Friona Rural Health Clinic do not participate in any Medicare Advantage Plans, so please let us know if you have enrolled in any Medicare Advantage Plan or in

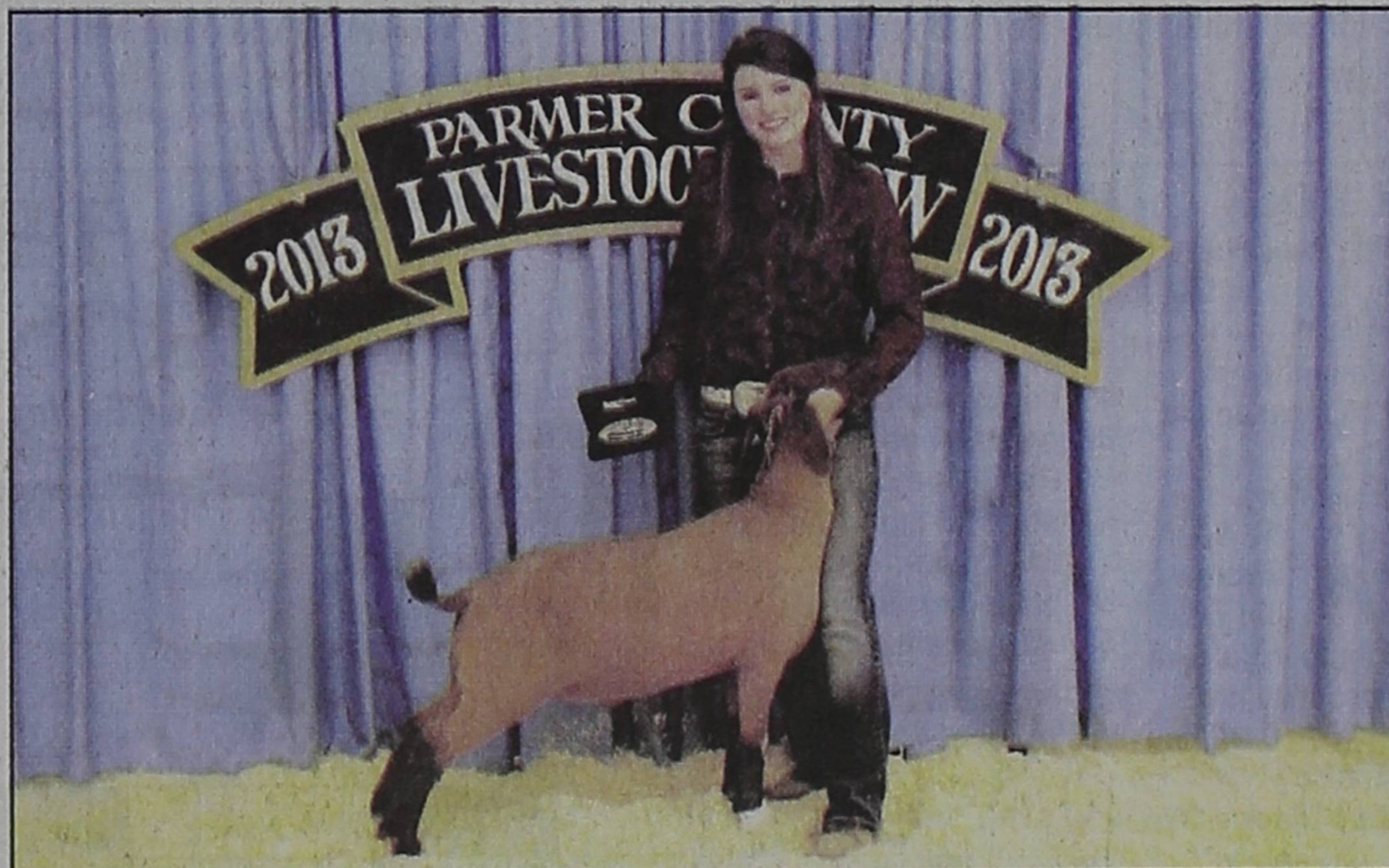
any drug plan before you request services.

If you plan to use Parmer County Community Hospital and/or Friona Rural Health Clinic as your hospital and primary care service, before you sign up for any new plan please contact us to determine whether or not you can still receive "in-network" services at Parmer Medical Center and/or Friona Rural Health Clinic and whether your own out-of-pocket expenses will increase. We at Parmer Medical Center and Friona Rural Health Clinic want to continue to serve your health care needs, and we do not want any misunderstanding to occur regarding your Medicare benefits or out-of-pocket costs.

Again, to check on your plan status, please go to MyMedicare.gov or call us at 806 250-2754 and ask for a Medical Plan Check. Call today.



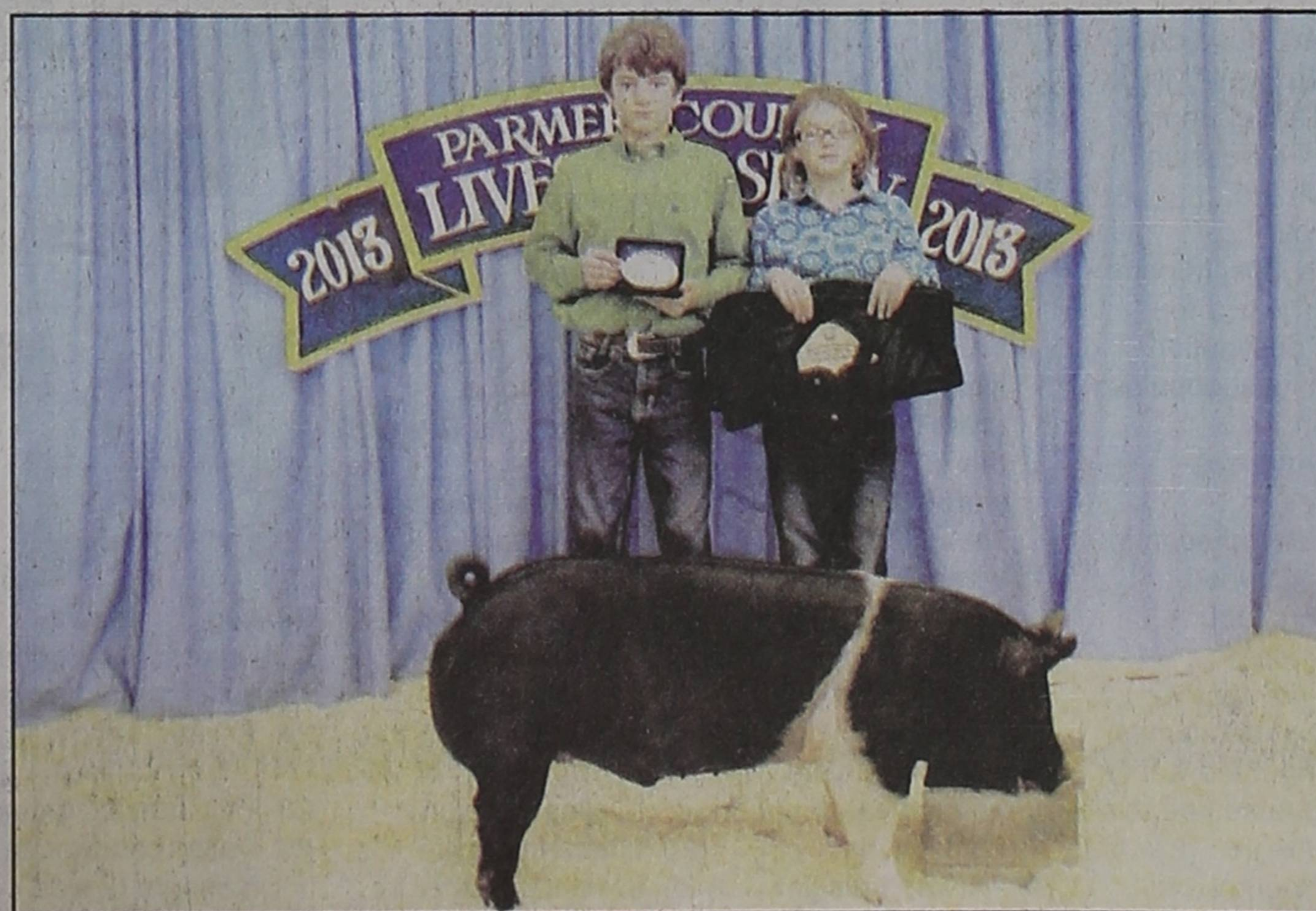

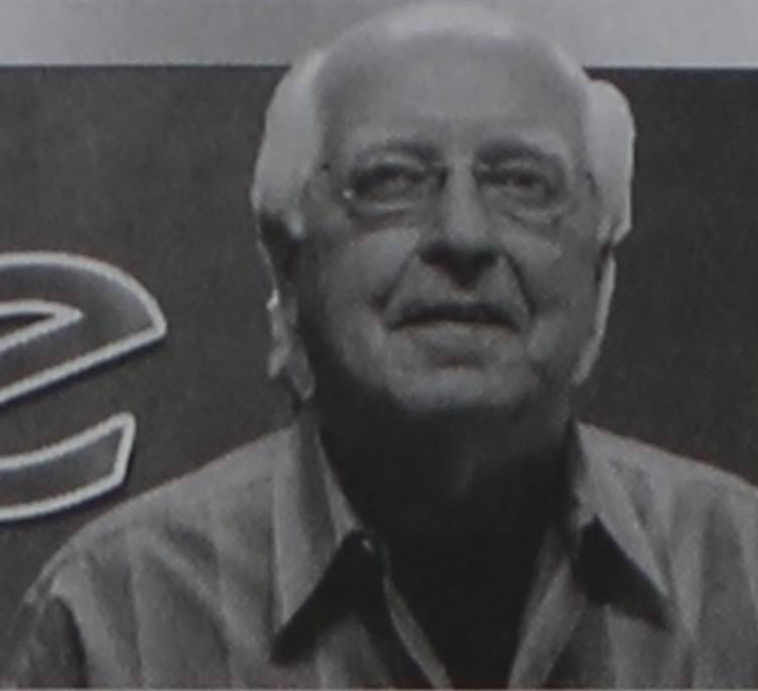

Neugebauer addresses constituent concerns

The following letter by Congressman Randy Neugebauer was published in the Abilene Reporter-News on Sunday, January 20th:

"As a member of the House of Representatives, I have the privilege of representing approximately 700,000 people.

"I try to be accessible to every single one of my constituents, but it simply isn't possible for me to directly connect with everyone. So I appreciate when district residents such as Doug Potter and R.W. Weeks write to the Reporter-News, because it gives me a chance to publicly address concerns that many people share.

"I've received letters from a number of constituents on the Congressional reforms mentioned by Mr. Potter in his letter dated January 11th. For instance, he proposes that members of Congress participate in Social Security, no longer vote themselves pay raises, participate in the health care system and abide by the laws they pass.

"However, a number of the proposed reforms touch on issues that either don't exist or already have been addressed. For instance, members of Congress are not exempt from the laws we pass. All 535 senators and representatives must abide by the same laws as every other American.

"I also have heard from a number of constituents who are angry about the idea that members of Congress get "free health insurance" provided by the government. But that is not how the system works.

"Members of Congress, as employees of the federal government, currently participate in the Federal Employees Health Benefits Plan (FEHBP) program along with nearly 2 million federal government employees across the country. Like most employer-based health insurance plans, it offers a cost share that requires me to pay a monthly premium for the plan I select. Members of Congress, our staffs and all federal employees will

be required to participate in the new health insurance exchange mandated by President Obama's health care law, which goes into effect in 2014.

"Another common misconception is that members of Congress do not pay into Social Security.

"This is false. I participate in Social Security and pay my Social Security taxes every month, so I understand why it's important to not only preserve benefits for seniors who've paid into the system, but also to implement smart reforms that keep the system afloat for workers currently paying their dues.

"I also understand concerns about raising Congressional salaries. Congressional pay raises are determined by an automatic cost-of-living adjustment. For the past two years, Congress has voted to prevent these increases. In this current environment of skyrocketing federal deficits, I oppose efforts to increase government salaries, and will continue to vote against any

legislation that raises these benefits.

"I am committed to eliminating wasteful government spending, and I believe the only way to do that is to ensure that government is transparent and accountable to the American people. I will continue to fight for responsibility with your tax dollars and work to rein in outrageous taxing and spending.

"My staff is always available to discuss issues like this. They are also available to assist you with government agencies, veterans' benefits and information on current legislation. You can visit my website at www.randy.house.gov to view the latest updates for my office or to email me. On the website, you'll find phone numbers of each of my four offices, or you can call us toll-free at 888-763-1611. And you are always welcome to visit any one of my offices in Abilene, Big Spring, Lubbock or Washington, D.C.



Lost your wallet?



You've looked everywhere, called the businesses you recently visited, checked your pockets and searched your car. Now what should you do?



- 1) File a police report. It may seem unnecessary but it is essential for fraud prevention. The police will give you a report number and you'll need this if you do become a victim of identity theft or fraud
- 2) Call us, your bank. Give us a copy of the police report and if you have a debit card, report it stolen and we'll get a new card issued with a new PIN.
- 3) Call your credit card companies and let them advise you on what to do. Some say don't close your card as it leads to other headaches and others say to close the cards. Also act fast to close department store cards. They may have less strict security procedures and employees may not be as stringent dealing with customers presenting store cards.
- 4) Notify the three major credit agencies: Equifax, TranUnion and Experian and ask them to put a Fraud Alert on your credit report. Get a copy of your credit report to check for fraudulent activities for a couple of months after you've reported your cards stolen.

A preventative step that will help you if you lose your wallet or it is stolen is to scan everything in your wallet and keep these scans printed out in a safe place or stored in a protected folder on your computer. You might consider scanning your health insurance cards and gift cards and anything else that would be hard to re-place.

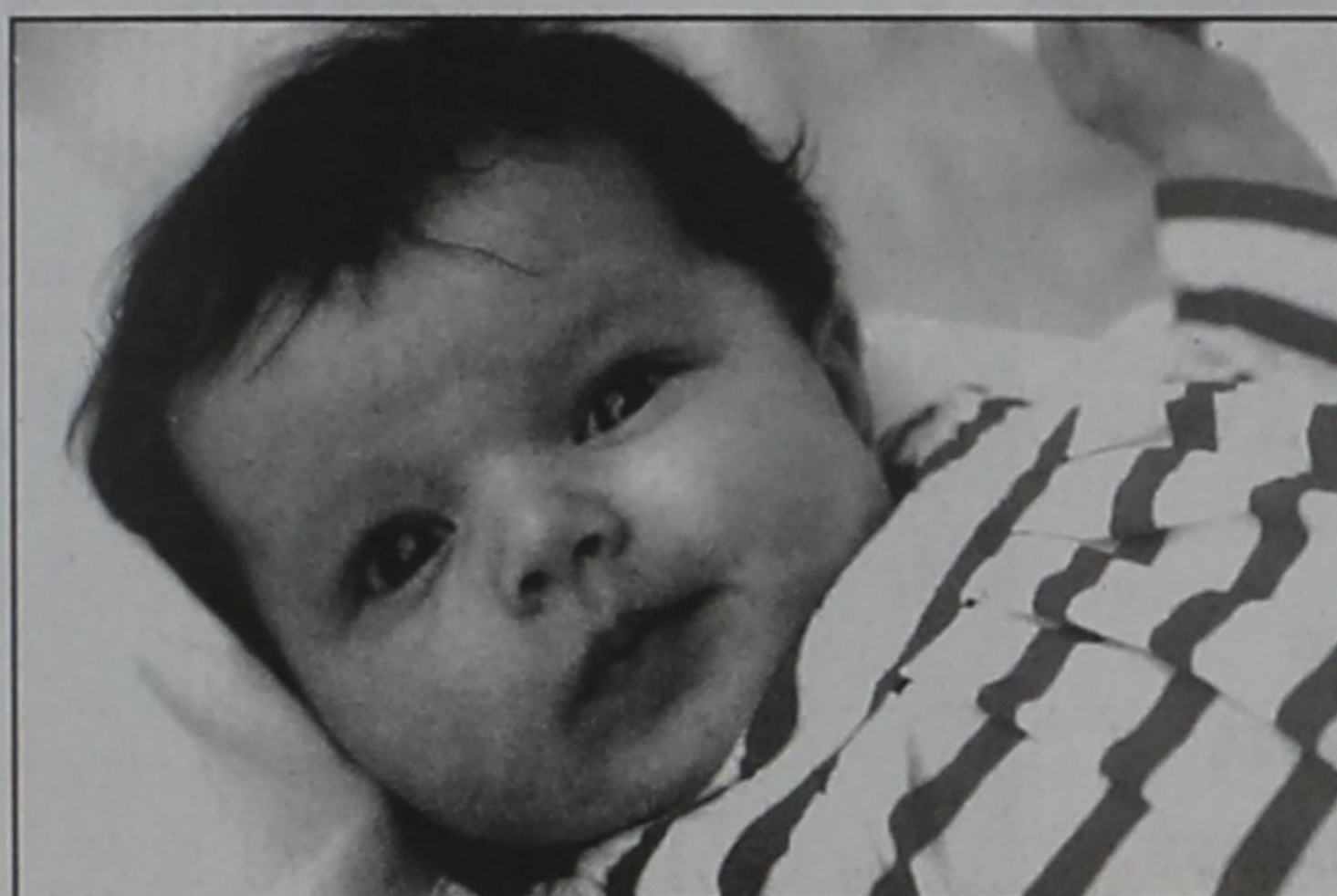
Lions Club News

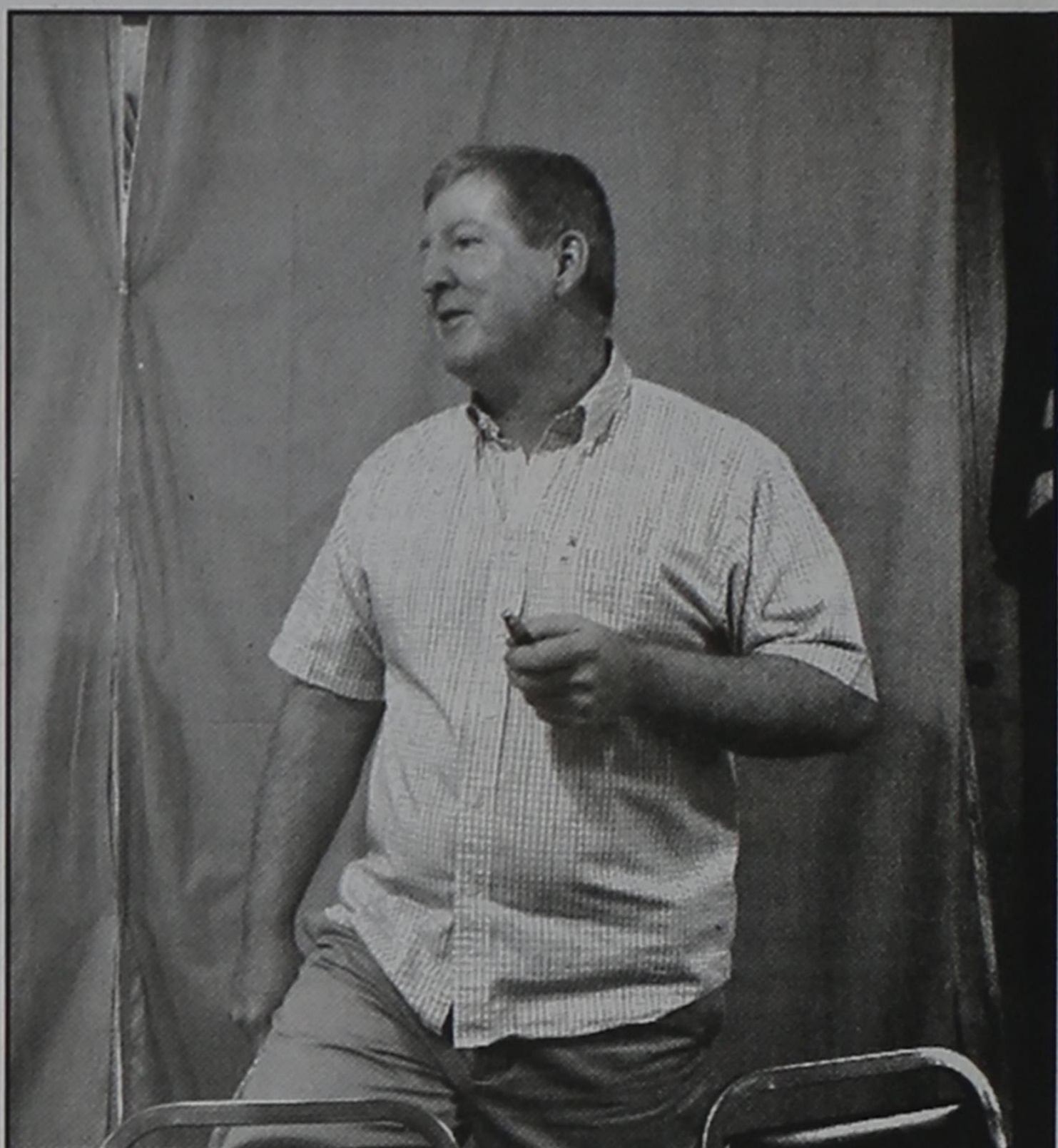

AgriLife: Step up and scale down program

Step Up & Scale Down classes are designed to be one hour so they could fit into a lunch hour. You can also schedule them right after work or first thing in the morning. No special equipment is needed so classes can be held in an office, meeting room, or your living room.

The weekly classes are designed to help participants move toward a healthier weight and will include a weekly weight check-in, weekly challenge, healthy recipes, and tips from "Dinner Tonight", exercise resources, and a weight-loss planner.

Cost for the 12-week program is \$50 per person and
