





SnackPak4Kids continues to grow here in our hometown. We have been blessed with generous donations and gracious volunteers.

At this time we are serving 27 children in the primary and elementary schools. We are exploring how best to serve junior high and to establish a summer program to meet the needs of hungry children. Many of the participating schools throughout the Panhandle have reported improvements in categories ranging from behavior to performance. You can't ask a child or any human to be at their best when they are starving. They are preoccupied with basics-food, shelter, and clothing. This preoccupation makes it difficult to succeed in areas such as analytical thinking, long-term planning, and creativity. School curriculum is very rigorous even in the lower grades and this provides us with the opportunity to assist these children by providing some basic nourishment during the weekends when they may not have adequate food.

"What difference does it make?"







The burn ban is still in effect in the county. Our drought conditions continue. Fortunately fire calls have been quiet. The volunteer firemen did answer a fire call about 5:20 p.m. Sunday at CR 12 and CR G west of Friona. It was a small fire and was quickly extinguished. Some old dead trees had caught on fire. One fireman said it looked like someone had been cutting firewood with a chain saw. Be careful during these dry times. We did receive a dusting of snow Tuesday night. Grass was covered Wednesday morning but it was gone by midday.

Oops! I got busy (or forgetful) and did not open the front door to the office Monday. The closed will receive cattle that would have previously been harvested and processed at Plainview.

The additional cattle going to Cargill's other three beef plants in the region will allow them to more consistently operate at capacity, 40 or more hours per week.

Cargill has no plans to reduce operations at any of its four remaining fed-cattle beef processing plants in the U.S. Cargill intends to maintain its position in U.S. beef production.

If the drought in Texas, the southern plains and other parts of the U.S. persists, the U.S. beef industry will likely need to reassess the situation in the near future and make adjustments due to the ongoing liquidation of the U.S. cattle herd which is at its lowest level since 1952. Cargill has taken the action it believes it needed to take to address this situation.

Mark your calendar for Thursday February 14, the date of the next Friona blood drive. Time will be from noon to 7 p.m. at Calvary Baptist Church fellowship hall. Now 16-year-olds are eligible to donate. Previously you had to be 18 or over. Watch next week's Star for more blood drive details.

County sales tax down

Texas Comptroller Susan Combs said state sales tax revenue in December was \$2.17 billion, up 9.4% compared to December 2011. The revenue in Parmer County did not follow that trend. Farwell receipts were up over the previous year but Friona and Bovina revenue was down.

Farwell received \$8,469.60, a 21.66% increase. Bovina received \$6,263. 98, down -1.61% and Friona's tax receipt was \$26,137.66, down a hefty -20.64%.

Ag marketing courses in Amarillo

Drought, record tight feed grain supplies in the U.S. and world markets, and the lowest cattle inventory in 60 years are just some of the factors that will lead to volatile markets in 2013, according to a Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service economist.

To help producers understand and manage their way through these markets using a variety of marketing tools such as futures and options, AgriLife Extension will host two workshops, said Steve Amosson, AgriLife Extension economist in Amarillo. The 2013 High Plains Short Course series, featuring two workshops at the Texas A&M AgriLife Research and Extension Center, 6500 W. Amarillo Blvd. in Amarillo, is co-sponsored by AgriLife Extension, Panhandle-Plains Land Bank and Tru Trading Co.

The first course, "Intro to Futures and Options," is set for 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Feb. 12. This

course is designed to help participants gain a better understanding of the basics of how futures and options can be used in agricultural markets, Amosson said.

The "Feedgrains Workshop" will be from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Feb. 13-14. This workshop will delve deeply into what and how fundamental and technical factors are affecting the feed grains market for the upcoming year, he said.

"We could easily see a \$3 swing in prices this year, so risk management is going to be critical," Amosson said. "The ultimate goal of this workshop is for the producer to be able to develop a written marketing plan for the 2013 crop."

Amosson and Dr. Mark Welch, AgriLife Extension grain marketing specialist in College Station, will be the primary instructors for both courses.

Guest speakers for the feed

grains workshop will include a panel of area lenders, brokers and grain merchandisers who will address key issues facing local producers in the upcoming marketing year. In addition, Krissy Scotten with the National Weather Service in Amarillo will provide the weather forecast for the upcoming growing season.

The cost is \$50 for the Feb. 12 event and \$125 for the Feb. 13-14 program. This will cover costs associated with instruction, breaks, meals and materials, Amosson said.

To register and pay for these courses, go to: http://agriliferegister.tamu.edu. While this is the preferred method of registration and payment, Amosson said payments will be accepted at the door.
