## Kinnamon railed against dying in Sunday executon

dawn. He finally tried to slip out
of leather restraint that kept
him connected to two intra-
venous tubes carrying a solu-
tion of lethal drags.
With a sister, niece and friend
sobbing loudly, Kinnamon's death marked the Kinnamon's the most bizarre executions in "I've got a few things to say," Kinnamon said as witnesses
filed into the death chamber about $5: 15$ a.m. CST. Thirty minutes later, after thanking dozens of people, criticizing capital punishment,
expressing love for his family expressing love for his family
and getting a drink of water from the prison warden, he was still talking.
"I can see no reason for my death," he said, then began
squirming, lifted his head and squirming, lifted his head and
shoulders and tried sliding his right arm from a leather strap. prison chaplain, Alex Taylor prison chaplain, Alex Taylor,
both stationed a few feet away at opposite corners of the gur
