





The couple will reside in Friona.










#### New novel with Friona connection

## Charlie's Web



## Judgment Day

Your judgment day is coming, and there is nothing you can do to avoid it. The wicked king, Jeroboam, found this out the hard way in 1 Kings 14. His son became very ill, which prompted him to send his wife to seek help from a godly, old prophet who had profoundly spoken to him years earlier. Unfortunately, the message she heard was one of judgment instead of healing and hope. God told Jeroboam that he was the most evil king Israel had and that his ill son would die, and that Jeroboam's entire family line would soon be cut off. This judgment was devastating and it did come to pass, just three years after Jeroboam died, as every male descendent was killed.

Jeroboam's judgment day was foretold and fulfilled, but the tragedy of the entire account is Jeroboam's lack of repentance before God in light of his great sins. This is even more startling because Jeroboam saw God's word fulfilled in many aspects, yet he had an unbelieving heart and chose not to turn to God. If he would have turned to God wholeheartedly his story may have ended up differently.

You will also have a judgment day. Are you like Jeroboam, who died clinging to his sins, or would you turn to God in repentance and faith. When one embraces Jesus as their Savior and Lord, their future is not set upon a fearful expectation of judgment, but upon the hope we have in Jesus Christ, who bore our judgment at Calvary.
