Cheeseburger Cook-Off, Summer Drama this weekend

The Cheeseburger Festival Cook-Off and Car Show will be held Saturday July 20, 2013 at the Friona City Park. Cook teams will compete for \$1,000 and \$300 prizes. Set-up and preparation for the teams and vendors will begin around 8:00 a.m. as the teams get their hamburger meat and cheese and prepare their cook sites.

Judging will get underway around 10 a.m. and public serving of the cheeseburgers begins at 11:30 a.m. Bracelets good for one cheeseburger and a pack of chips will cost \$7 and be available at the park gazebo. Each bracelet has four tabs. One tab is good for one-fourth of a cheeseburger so folks can sample four different burgers.

One team will win a People's Choice Award. You can vote with dollars at each camp site. One dollar=one vote. Winners will be announced about 2 p.m. Local boy Kris Gordon and his band will be performing again at the cook-off. As of Tuesday there were 10 cook teams and 34 ven-

dors signed up. Cheeseburger Cook-Off teams



Gurley to be full time county prosecutor

Friona native Kathryn Gurley, the District Attorney for Parmer and Bailey counties, will give up private practice to become a full time county prosecutor effective September 1, 2013. Mrs. Gurley will not take on private clients after that date. She will have one year after September 1 to settle her current private

practice cases.

She said the Parmer/Bailey district is one of only a few in Texas without a full time professional prosecutor. Districts with full time prosecutors qualify for increased state funding, one reason the decision was made.

She said mixing District Court trial dates and private practice had often caused prob-

lems and inconvenience for her private clients. She is in the first year of a four-year term as District Attorney and will be up for re-election in 2016. She will continue to office in Friona.

Expenses for the full time prosecutor will be split 60-40 between Parmer and Bailey counties.

Neugebauer Praises House Passage of Farm Bill

Congressman Randy Neugebauer (R-TX) released the following statement praising the House passage of the Farm Bill. H.R. 2642, the Federal Agriculture Reform and Risk Management (FARRM) Act of 2013, passed by a vote of 216-208.

"I'm really pleased that we passed a five-year farm bill and moved the ball down the field," Neugebauer said. "This bill is good policy for farmers, families, and taxpayers. It gives farmers risk management tools to protect against unpredictable losses. It ensures American families have access to safe, affordable, food. And it saves taxpayers nearly \$14 billion over the next ten years."

The bill repeals the outdated and unworkable permanent agricultural law and improves efficiency by consolidating more than 100 programs. Neugebauer's Crop Risk Options Plan (CROP Act) was included in the legislation. This shallow-loss coverage allows farmers to insure themselves against losses of up to 30% of their crop production.

"This is shared-risk, market-based legislation," Neugebauer said. "I'm looking forward to the House and Senate Agriculture Committees working together to craft a final bill that can be signed into law."


AgriLife crop news

By Monti Vandiver Extension Agent

Crops have responded well to precipitation and cooler temperatures over the last couple of weeks. The area corn crop has about as wide a range of maturity as I've ever seen this time of year, from just planted to tassel silking. More mature corn fields are nearing or at peak moisture demand which could exceed .45inch/day under hot windy conditions.

Most cotton has "turned the corner" and is squaring but I have not seen a bloom yet. Square sets have been outstanding ranging from the low 90s to near 100% with most fields around 96%. While we are not behind in heat unit accumulation the cotton crop is behind due to delayed planting and harsh environmental conditions which likely will result in a shorter than normal effective bloom period.



Texas Sales Tax Holiday Aug 9-11

Texas Comptroller Susan Combs reminds shoppers they can save money on certain items priced under \$100 during the state's annual sales tax holiday. This year, the sales tax holiday is scheduled for Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 9 -11.

The law exempts most clothing, footwear, school supplies and backpacks priced under \$100 from sales tax, which could save shoppers about \$8 on every \$100 they spend during the weekend.

"Texas families can take advantage of the sales tax holiday when doing their back-to-school shopping," Combs said. "The tax holiday applies to a variety of items ranging from pens to jeans to help shoppers around Texas save some of their hard earned money."

Lists of apparel and school supplies that may be purchased tax free can be found on the Comptroller's website at www.TexasTaxHoliday.org.

This year, shoppers will save an estimated \$74.1 million in state and local sales taxes during the Sales Tax Holiday.

The dates for the tax holiday weekend are established by the Legislature in the state tax code. The sales tax holiday has been an annual event since 1999.
