Friona FFA was well represented at the 85th Texas State FFA Convention in Dallas July 8-12, 2013. The Texas FFA Convention is held each year to recognize the efforts of FFA members across the state of Texas. This

year's attendance was 11,995 members and guests.

Texas Education Commissioner Michael Williams was one of the keynote speakers that addressed the convention.

Friona FFA was proudly represented by Sawyer Osborn who

ran for president of the Texas FFA Association. Sawyer was not elected president but as a state FFA officer his schedule will be full as he travels with the State President and First Vice

President when they visit local high schools in Area 1 during the months of October and April. Sawyer also serves on the FFA Board and will be present at the Vocational Agriculture Teachers Conference in Corpus Christi July 28-August 2, 2013.

Jacob Osborn and Blake Stowers received their Lone Star FFA Degree (State Degree) during the Wednesday evening session of the convention. Superintendent Kenny Austin was also recognized as a recipient of the Honorary State FFA Degree.

Blake Stowers competed at the State FFA Rodeo which was held in conjunction with the State FFA Convention. The rodeo was held in Alvarado, Texas. Blake finished 2nd place in the Saddle Bronc competition.

Friona FFA was also recognized at the convention as a Bronze recipient of the Golden Horizon Award which recognizes the efforts of FFA chapters across the state. The award is separated into single teacher departments and multi teacher departments. It is judged according to several criteria such as participation in Leadership Development events, Career Development events, stock shows, proficiency awards, Agri-Science Fair as well as FFA members that are serving or running for office at the district, area, and state level and numerous other factors of chapter participation.

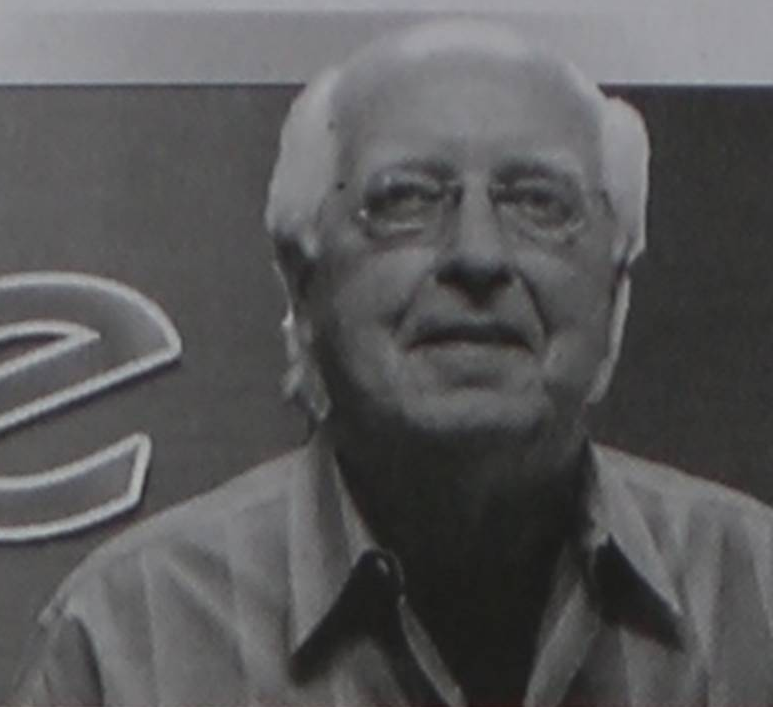

Friona news from may 1938

A few items from the May 13, 1938 Friona Star. First Baptist pastor Brett Hoyle brought the old paper by this week. It was stuck inside some old magazines that someone gave him. I always enjoy delving into the old newspapers and visiting Friona history.

Editor John W. "Uncle John" White, Friona's first mayor, wrote this:

In last Saturday's Amarillo News there was an item of news that probably was the most important item ever printed in any newspaper ever published. And I am afraid it attracted little attention of the average reader. It was to the effect that there had been invented a device for the converting of the direct energy of sun heat to the production of mechanical power.

By means of a thermopile an electric current is passed through water. It is well known that this means water can be broken up

into its component elements of oxygen and hydrogen. The hydrogen is burned as fuel to produce power, just as oil or coal is usually used. Thus is produced an unlimited amount of power from direct sunshine.

When this principle is worked out to its logical conclusion we will have at our command an absolutely unlimited amount of cheap power that forever free us from the nightmare of a diminishing supply of coal and oil upon which we now depend for power, light, and heat.

At the regular meeting of the Friona Woman's Club Wednesday afternoon it was voted that the club should sponsor a "Clean-Up" week for the city beginning Monday May 16 and continuing throughout the week. The ladies are asking that the local chamber of commerce, the Junior Woman's Club, the American Legion and

Legion Auxiliary, and Boy and Girl Scouts cooperate with them in this worthy effort.

The fact has been mentioned that there are in various parts of the city trash piles, junk piles, weeds, and open cess pools that make fire menaces and threaten property are a menace to the life and health and mar the beauty and cleanliness of our fair little city.

Beulah Williamson Fallwell

(This was on the front page of the May 13, 1938 Friona Star.)

The hearts of the good people of Friona were again filled with sorrow when it was made known that Beulah Williamson Fallwell, wife of our esteemed citizen William C. Fallwell had passed to the Great Beyond at eleven o'clock Friday night May 6th.

Mrs. Fallwell was born September 15th 1872 in Hempstead County, Arkansas, and had attained the age of 65 years, 7

months, and 21 days.

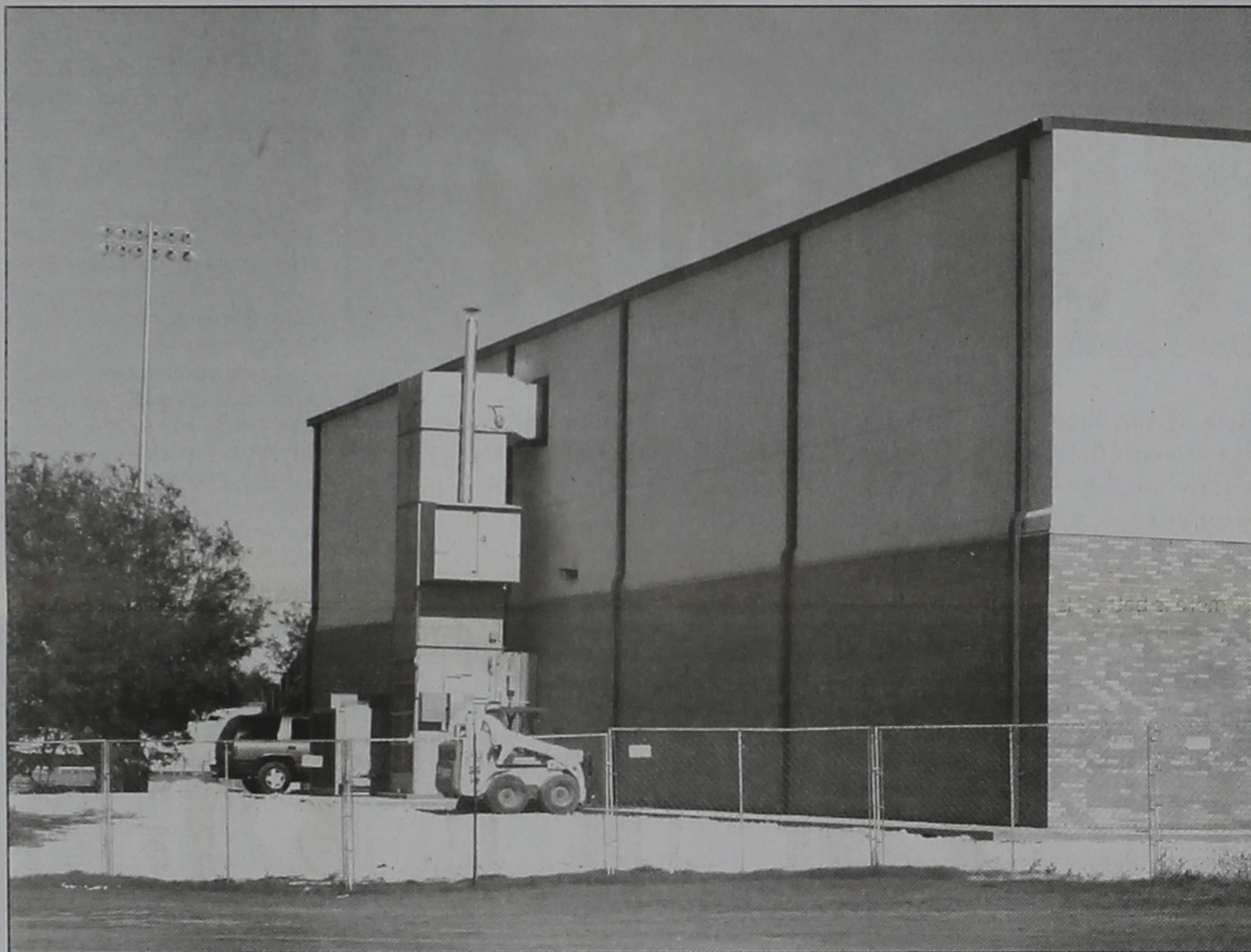
In 1895 Miss Williamson was united in marriage to William C. Fallwell and to this union were born three children, Wesley, deceased; Edna, now Mrs. J.N. Lunsford of Farwell; and Elbert, of Friona.

The Fallwells moved to the Panhandle in 1903, first settling southwest of Dimmitt and later moving to Hereford where they resided until they moved to Friona in 1930. Mrs. Fallwell united with the Church of Christ at an early age and continued as an active member of that church until failing health prevented.

She was a devout Christian, a loving wife and mother, a kind neighbor, and an esteemed citizen.

Letter to the Editor

Texas Democrats say:
Campaigning has begun for the next Texas governor. The Texas Democratic Party (TDP) sends frequent emails, usually with negative information about the Republican Party. The Friona Star will publish the TDP emails to assist voters. We hope along the way the TDP has something positive to say. Here is the most recent email.

Subject: Absentee Attorney General Democrats,

I'm writing today to tell you about the latest Abbott outrage--and to talk about the type of good government Texas needs. Almost all Texas families have been touched by the tragedy of cancer at least once.

And that's why it's shameful that Greg Abbott has neglected to fix the scandal-ridden Cancer Prevention and Research Institute of Texas (CPRIT)--even though his office is supposed to be providing oversight of the agency.

The goal of CPRIT is to reduce the number of Texans developing and dying from cancer. It provides Texas scientists with the money they need to do urgent medical research into cancer treatments.

But problems at the fund have gotten so bad that it had to stop awarding grants entirely. Now no money is going to cancer research due to charges of corruption and misuse.

Greg Abbott looked the other way as millions were awarded to firms of major Republican donors without oversight. In fact, recipients of these funds have donated over \$400,000 to Greg Abbott's campaign. This is exactly the type of cronyism and corruption we need to end in Texas.

During the four years Abbott's office served on the governing board of CPRIT he hasn't personally attended a single oversight meeting. Now Abbott's office is supposed to be investigating the scandal--a scandal his office failed to prevent.

Enough is enough. In November 2014 we need to elect trustworthy leaders that the great state of Texas deserves. Leaders that stand up for what's best for Texas families--not their campaign accounts.

Parents, sorry but the school supply lists say "No Trapper Keepers" again this

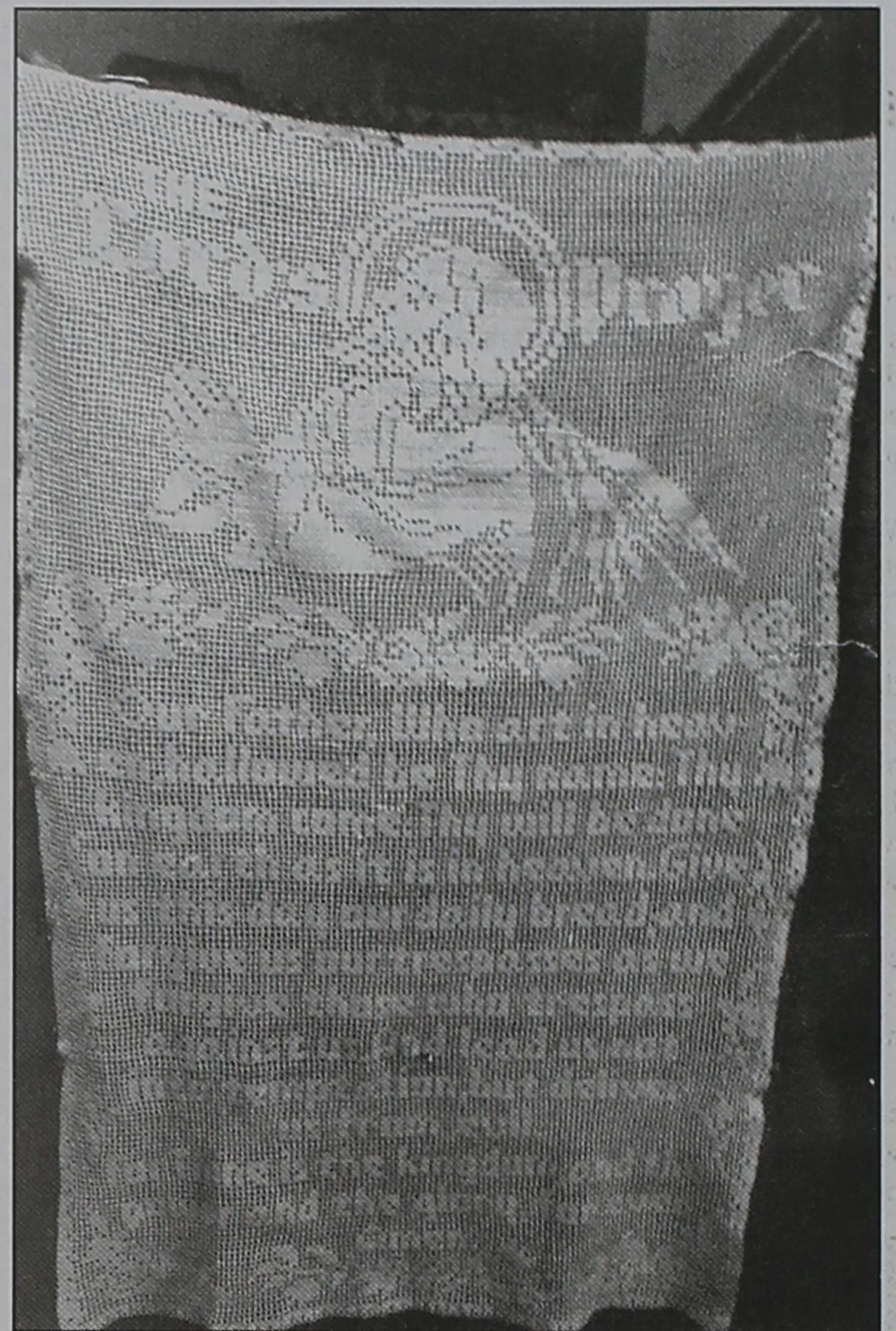
year. I believe the reason is they won't fit in the lockers.

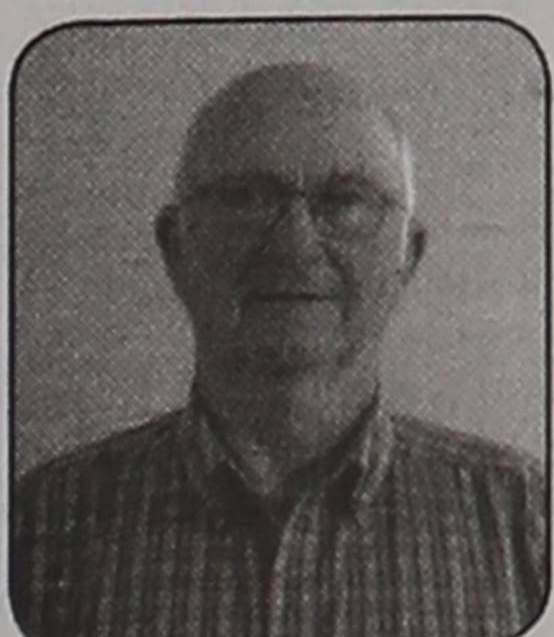

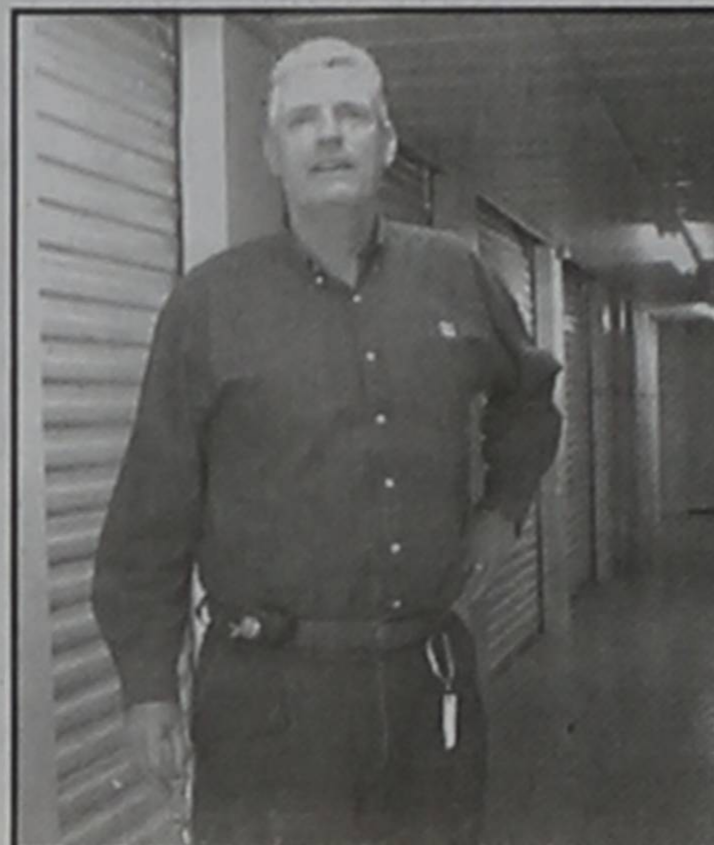

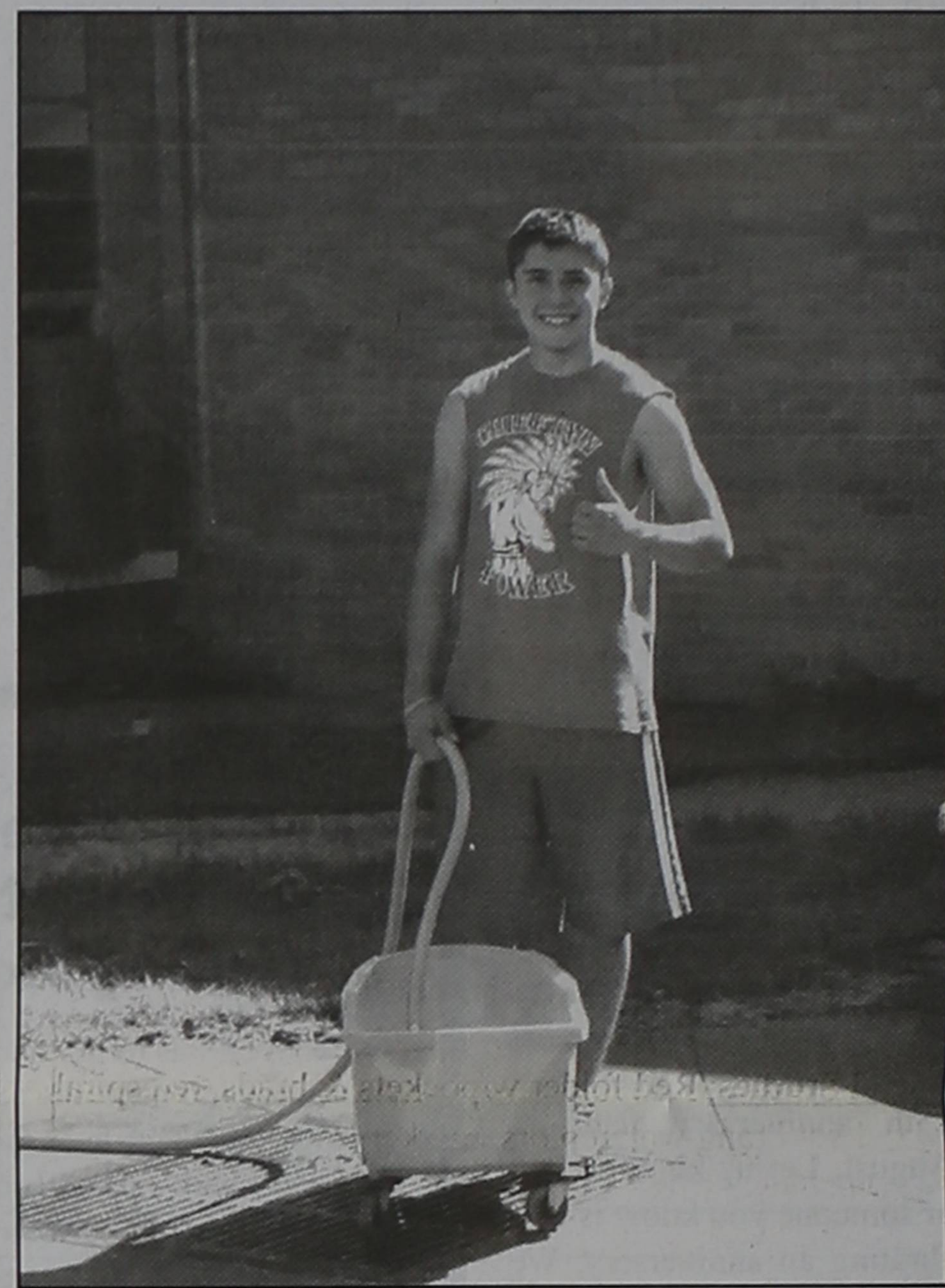

Many high school students are working at the high school this year. Esdras Rodriguez fills a mop bucket and gets ready to mop and wax the school hallways.

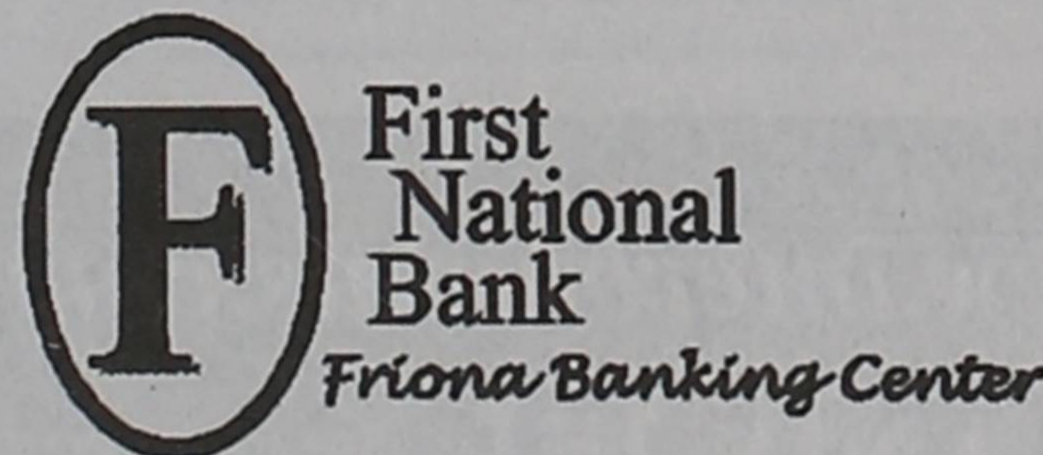

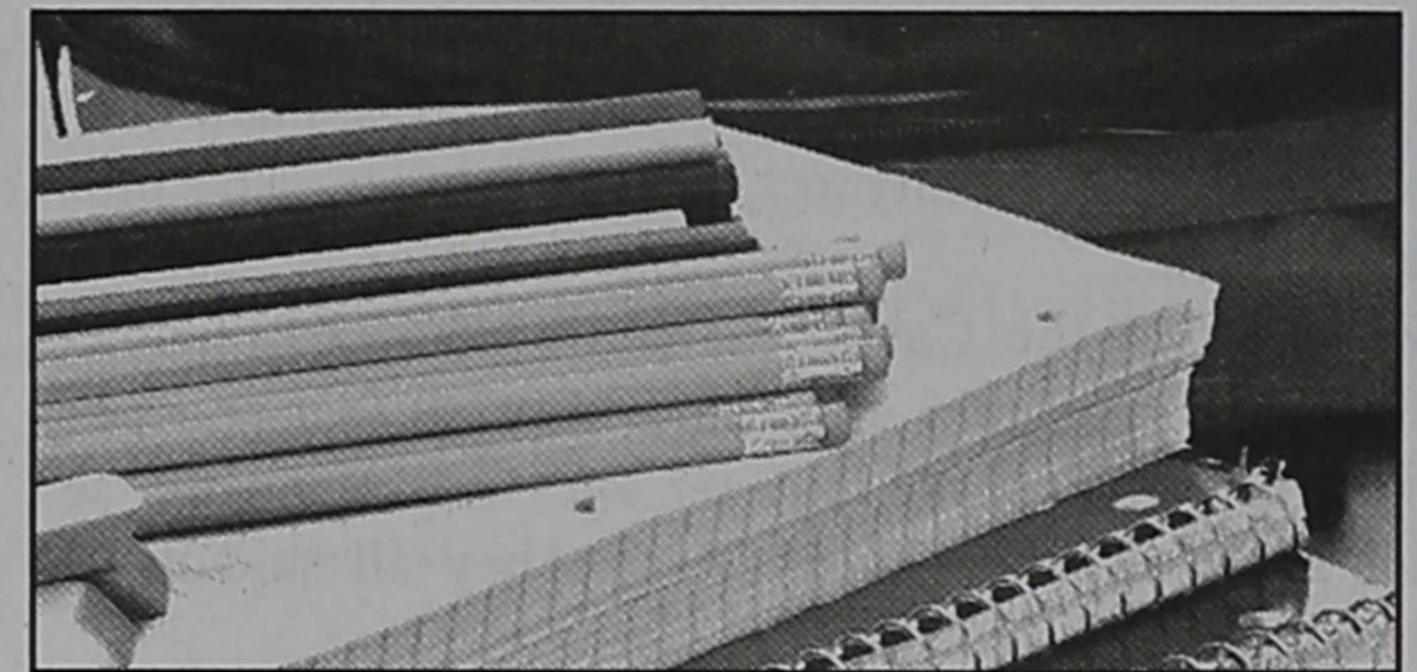
Last week we saw from the latter part of 1 Kings 16 that when evil prevails there is national instability, sharp division and an evangelistic sin culture. Under the reigns of King Omri and King Ahab in Israel sin had been normalized and they succeeded in doing more evil than all that were before them. When evil prevails in such a society there will be rampant idolatry. Idolatry is a matter of placing something or something before God. The reality is that we are all great idolaters, but when evil prevails there is rampant idolatry, which we see today in celebrity worship, hedonism, and greed.

When evil prevails there is often abundant sexual immorality. Did you know that right now revenues from pornography is greater than the NFL, NBA and MLB combined, with "sex" being one of the top searches in the web every day. Our society is rooting out traditional, biblical norms regarding sex and promoting pleasure as the standard for sexual morality instead of God's design and purpose.

Finally, when evil prevails there is a denial of ancient foundations. At the end of 1 Kings 16 we meet Hiel, an Israelite who rebuilds Jericho, and in so doing his firstborn and youngest sons die. Although rebuilding Jericho may seem like a noble task, if he took his history and God's word serious, he would know that it was a task cursed by God. His historic roots meant nothing, and the prestige of building this great city back meant everything. Prestige meant more than past foundations, and the result what disaster.

When evil prevails expect national instability, sharp division, an evangelistic sin culture, rampant idolatry, gross immorality and a denial of godly foundations. Although this paints a dark picture, don't forget that when evil prevails Jesus is the light who shines through the darkness and the darkness cannot conquer Him.

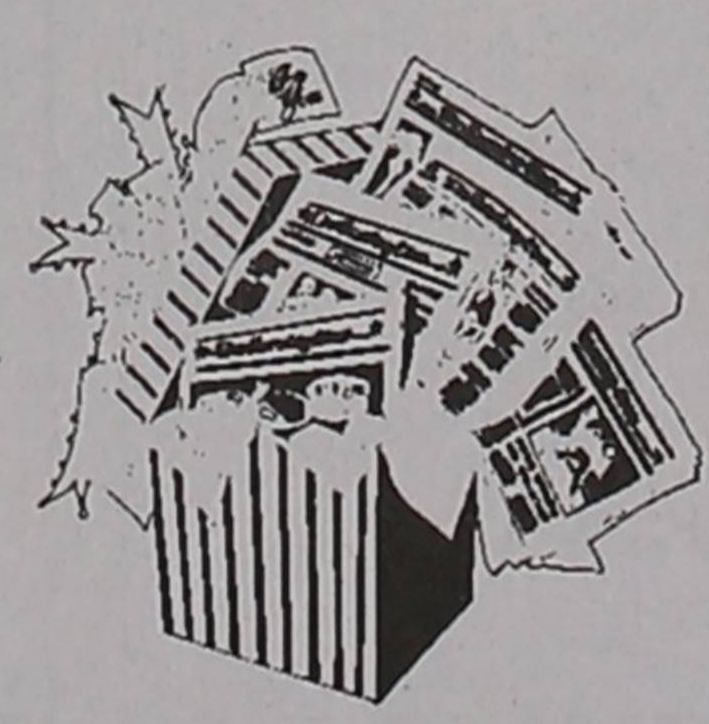

Prescribed burns help keep balance

Less than two years removed from the worst wildfire season in Texas history, it's no wonder that when fire is mentioned the first thing that comes to most Texans' minds is fear.

However, fires aren't always bad. In fact, as they can boost the health of the land.

For generations, Texans have used prescribed—or "good"—fire to help manage the landscape, depending on the flames, to clear brush, control vegetation, maintain wildlife habitats and even boost nutrients in the soil.

This week, Texas A&M Forest Service is joining with Texas Department of Agriculture, Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and Texas A&M AgriLife Extension to release *A Land in Balance: Benefits of Prescribed Fire*, a new video designed to raise awareness about the benefits of deliberate burning. The 15-minute video illustrates the utility of prescribed burning across different regions of Texas, how these fires are conducted and the benefits derived from the process.

"Prescribed burns save lives and are critical tools for private landowners to protect property," Texas Agriculture Commissioner Todd Staples said. "In Texas, we must be strategic with stewardship of the land and resources. It takes everyone coming together—first responders, local and state officials, public land managers and private landowners—to keep our landscapes healthy, and our citizens and communities safe."

According to state officials, prescribed burning isn't just good for the land, it's also good for people. Prescribed burning doesn't eliminate wildfires, but the strategic reduction of brush and other vegetation can decrease the intensity of wildfires when they do ignite.

"Prescribed burning helps reduce the risk of potential wildfires that may threaten

lives and damage communities, crops, livestock and wildlife," Sonora AgriLife Extension Center Superintendent Butch Taylor said.

Texas A&M Forest Service supports the use of prescribed fire and conducts burns on public lands. Landowners interested in learning more about prescribed fire and its applications may visit the Prescribed Burn Alliance of Texas website at <http://pbatexas.org>. "Our goal here at Texas

A&M Forest Service is to provide information and tools to residents across the state so that they can learn to better protect themselves," Texas A&M Forest Service Director Tom Boggus said. "That's what we are doing with this video. If we can help Texans better protect themselves, we can help Texans better protect Texas."
