WOMAN'S RIGHTS FROM NEW ANGLE

Woman's rights from a brand new angle forms a salient feature of the new comedy, "Introduce Me" that will be seen at the Wichita Theatre on Saturday night. This comedy is from the pen of the talented young author, Della Clark and while she is not in any sense a suffragette but is in every way a womanly woman, she believes firmly that the weaker sex is weak merely through an implied term and not so much as a matter of fact.

In her new play Miss Clarke has shown the wife as the source of success and income of the Nichol family. Herein shows the novel manner of Miss Clarke's handling of the situation for it is all done in a manner that does not lessen the audience's respect for the husband nor yet place him in the position of a dependent upon his wife.

"Introduce Me" finds George Nichol as an unsuccessful author, but his wife, under the name of Francis Everton, has written several books that have made her famous as well as giving the family a fine income. The husband does not even know his wife has written the books; she has kept it a secret from him, letting him believe an old aunt is giving her an allowance.

In an adroit and intensely interesting way Miss Clarke has developed her story so that the element of suspense is sustained to the very drop of the last curtain. She has worked in little details of domestic infidelity that always did come about just to have the "making-up" all the sweeter. In the end she has established the husband in a secure position of manly dignity and independence, but she has not failed to show that women have rights in this world and are of value and importance. And it might also be said that "Introduce Me" appeals as strongly to men as to women and it was just made for women.
