320. REWARD FOR CONVICTION OF PARTIES FISHING UNLAWFULLY IN LAKE WICHITA

"Article 510-B of the Penal Code of the State of Texas, provides that any person who shall take, catch, ensnare or entrap any fish by means of nets, seines or by muddying, ditching or draining in any lake, pool or pond, in any county within this State without the consent of the owner of such lake, pool or pond, shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 and in all prosecutions under this act, the burden of proof of such consent of the owner shall devolve and be upon the defendant." 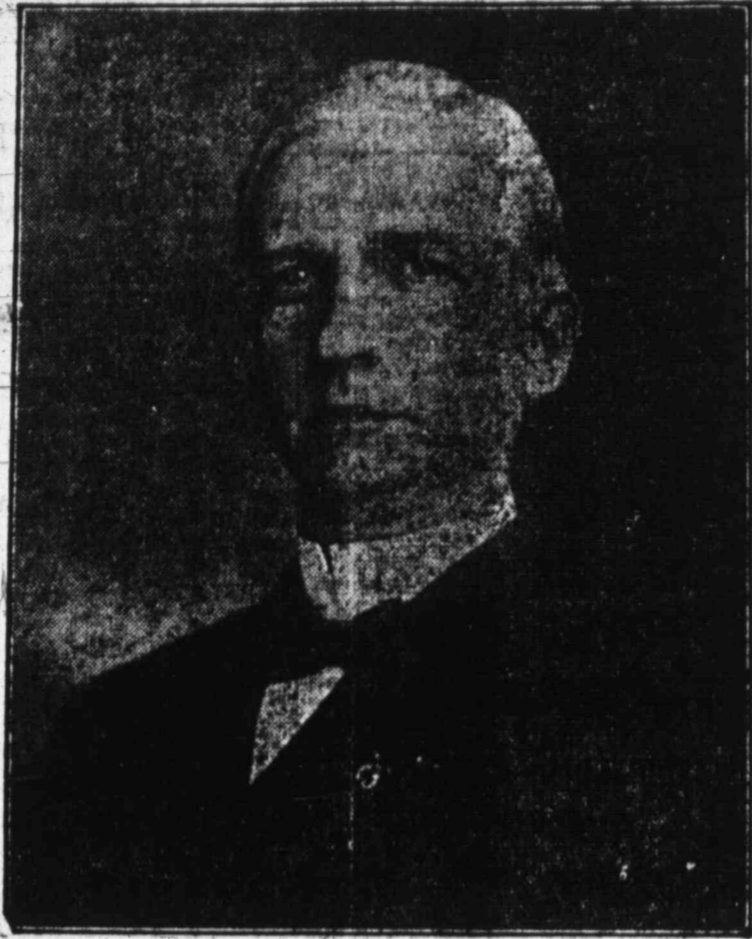

lips, should and has, not passed unwarded in the hearts of men. But this brave woman might have lived. Her death was by her own choosing. She and her husband, as heaven intended, were one. She lived for him and with him she died. In each others arms, heart beating against heart, they stood upon the deck as the ship went down. That last picture of the end of the Titanic has been painted, by the survivors of the disaster, in all its tragic beauty. And yet as we wonder and worship her memory and her heroism, we must realize that there was nothing so wonderful after all in her deed. Mr. and Mrs. Strauss were truly married. When that is said that is all there is to it. She loved him better than life. In that there is nothing new. It is an old, old story, almost as old as the sea itself. Mrs. Strauss loved her husband. Men tried to tear her from his side and place her in the life boats, but she clung to him with the desperation of a love that is of heaven itself. What God had truly joined together it was not in the power of man to put asunder. When the great Titanic sank, Mrs. Strauss died as she had lived—a WIFE.

No one saw and yet all know that Mr. and Mrs. Strauss, entwined in each others arms, went to their death with a smile of all surpassing beauty upon their lips. It is given to us to know that Mrs. Isidor Strauss has not died in vain.

Speaking of the good effects of the Robertson insurance law, which was denounced by certain people in Texas from one end of the State to the other, the Wichita Falls Times points out the vast benefits accruing from Texas insurance companies, whose organization and subsequent success were made possible by the Robertson law. "These local life insurance companies," the Times notes, "have flourished from the day they were organized and today as much life insurance is being written in Texas as before the Robertson law was passed." The Times remarks, also, that as a result of the law, Texas money, is being kept at home and "at least \$10,000,000 has been loaned by local companies to farmers that otherwise would have gone to New York. The same quarters which denounced the Robertson bill as injurious to Texas later on took up the same chorus on the I. & G. N. bill, which, we were told, would stop all railroad building in Texas and give the State a black eye among capital investors from which it would never recover. But, just as the life insurance business continued in Texas after the Robertson bill became a law, so has railroad building in the State continued since the I. & G. N. law went into effect, with little evident discomfiture, however, to those false prophets who will be just as eager with their advice and doleful forecasts the next time a bill is proposed which makes some demands of righteousness and equity upon capital. One bad feature of the Robertson law, however, is that it has permitted the organization of a bunch of grafting companies whose chief purpose is to dispose of its stocks to the sucker list, and hundreds of thousands of dollars have been taken away from men who believed they were investing in attractive and profitable propositions. This feature of the law, however, can be easily amended, and doubtless will in an early date.—Denton Record and Chronicle.

It is hardly fair to charge, that under the law, grafting life insurance companies have been organized without naming the companies that are doing the grafting. The people should be protected against that kind, and if there are such doing business in Texas it is the duty of every newspaper in the State to make the facts known. Without this is done, suspicion naturally points to all life insurance companies that are doing business in Texas.

ALCOHOL AND INSANITY.

While in almost every part of the civilized world alarm is felt, at the increasing ratio of insanity in the population, there are some localities which seem, on the other hand, to be becoming less infested, so to speak, with the virus of mental disease. One of these appears to be the State of Kansas which had in 1904, 56.2 commitments to its asylums per hundred thousand of population. In 1910 the number for each hundred thousand had fallen to 43.3, and in 1911 to 38.5, and the members of the State Board of Control, and the asylum officials are said to credit this to the stricter enforcement of the prohibition laws of the state and the consequent diminished consumption of alcohol. Of course there must be some leakage over the border, but it seems to be a fact that Kansas is practically a "dry state." The Journal of the American Medical Association says that it is not surprising that insanity should decrease with the diminished consumption of an article which is credited by alienists with the direct causation of at least 10, and probably a considerably higher, per cent of existing insanity, and which indirectly is a more or less important factor in a very much larger percentage of cases. The Kansas figures come reasonably close to those of the expert statistician.

Colquitt Will Attend.

Sherman, Texas, April 2.—Governor Colquitt has accepted an invitation to attend the opening game of baseball in Sherman to be played by teams of the Texas-Oklahoma league here next Saturday afternoon, and will pitch the first ball. The Sherman and Durant teams will play here, and the game will not be called until 4:30 o'clock p. m. Governor Colquitt will speak at p. m., and after the speaking will go to Austin College Athletic park.
